#### **AGENDA ITEMS**

# **Major Capital Projects**

<u>Director Lee</u> presented the methods of financing for capital projects.

- Current revenues (pay-as-you-go)
  - Impact fees
  - Fuel taxes
  - Infrastructure surtaxes
  - Millage
  - Assessments
- Debt
  - Long-term
  - Short-term
  - Life of the asset should equal or exceed debt term.
- Grants

Mayor Marlowe asked for public comment. There was none.

Manager New presented the capital projects.

- Roads
  - o Priority 1: Maintain roads as dedicated
    - Paved roads:
      - High initial cost, paid by developer, rolled into lot costs
      - Lower annual cost to maintain
      - 30-year life cycle, then resurface
    - Unpaved roads:
      - Lower initial cost
      - Higher annual cost to maintain
      - City grades unpaved roads on a 3-week cycle
  - Priority 2: Improve City owned roads (unpaved to paved)
    - 2a. urban core area (high density, higher traffic counts)
    - 2b. rural area
  - Priority 3: Improve county owned roads (unpaved to paved)

Discussion ensued.

• Economic Development- Seaboard Drive

- Segment 1: NW 1 Avenue South to State Road 26 (290 ft)
  - Potentially included in FDOT SR 26 Twin Pairs
  - Estimated Cost:

• Street: \$609,000

• Utilities: \$139,000

- Segment 2: State Road 26 South to SW 5 Avenue (1,720 ft)
  - Estimated cost:

• Street: \$1,792,000

• Utilities: \$812,000

- Segment 3: SW 5 Avenue to SW 15 Avenue (1,050 ft)
  - Optional segment provides additional, needed connectivity.
  - Estimated cost:

Street: \$987,000

• Utilities: \$456,000

# Discussion ensued.

- Public Facilities
  - City Hall
    - City hall, Annex, Little Red School house, Public Works Administration Area
    - Currently at capacity using 6,124 sf building space
    - Project need is 12,000 sf
    - Renovate 3,100 sf City Hall
    - Add 9,000 sf new
    - Estimated cost: \$2.5 to \$3.5 million
  - Police Station
    - Blueprint for initiating local municipal police force
    - Annual operating cost: \$1.6 million
    - Annual ACSO cost: \$1.0 million
      - Contract terminates September 30,2022
    - Estimated cost:

• Land: \$100,000 to \$300,000

• Building: \$1.0 to \$1.4 million
