4. Request for final plat for the Lakota Subdivision

Quasi-Judicial Public Hearing: Resolution 2023-19/SD 23-01, a request by CHW, Agent for Jilanne Belcher, Owner for approval of the Lakota subdivision final plat on a site consisting of approximately 45 acres generally located at the northwest corner of Southwest 15 Avenue and Southwest 170 Street; Alachua County Tax Parcels 04371-001-001 and 04379-000-000.

Mayor Marlowe read the quasi-judicial procedures and presentation order.

Attorney Walker read Resolution 2023-19 by title only.

Clerk Rice swore in Principal Planner Perez.

5. A request for a small-scale Future Land Use Map Amendment for a portion of the municipal cemetery from Agriculture to Public on ±2.5 acres

Legislative Public Hearing: Second reading of Ordinance 2023-10/CPA 23-08, an application by the City of Newberry to amend the Future Land Use Plan Map of the Comprehensive Plan by changing the Future Land Use classification from Agriculture to Public on a site consisting of approximately 2.5 acres; identified by Alachua County Tax Parcel Number 02538-004-000.

Attorney Walker read Ordinance 2023-10 by Title only.

Principal Planner Perez provided the staff report and recommendation.

Quasi-Judicial Public Hearing: Second reading of Ordinance 2023-13/LDR 23-09, an application by the City of Newberry to amend the Official Zoning Atlas of the City of Newberry by changing the zoning designation from Residential, Single-Family (RSF-2) to Public Facilities (PF) on property located at 120 Northwest 260 Street consisting of ±4.3 acres; identified by Alachua County Parcel Number: 02035-000-000.

Director Thomas presented the staff report with a PowerPoint. Discussion ensued.

Frances Bradley, representing the Newberry Main Street Organization (NMSO), spoke supporting appointing an NMSO member to the Historic Architectural Review Board (HARB). The NMSO's accreditation would benefit from having a member on the HARB, especially in the historic preservation activities criteria. Staff was directed to confirm whether NMSO having a member on the HARB is a Main Street accreditation requirement before starting the nomination process.

9. Commercial Development Fee Refund Application - Newberry Town Center Fitness Center (Because It Matters) Resolution 2020-29

Director Thomas stated that this is a Commercial Development Fee Refund Application as authorized by Resolution 2020-29. He presented the staff report with a PowerPoint. The NTC Fitness Center project paid a total of \$17,744 in development fees. Therefore, the maximum allowable refund per Resolution 2020-29 would be \$13,872.

Discussion ensued.

Frances Bradley encouraged everyone to come to the Newberry Main Street Organization's Spring Festival on Saturday, April 1, 2023.

Gail Watson expressed concern from residents in the northwest section of the City with the 30 mph speed limit, when other residential areas have posted speed limits of 15 and 25 mph. Discussion ensued. The Commission directed staff to research setting a standard speed limit lower than 30 mph in all residential areas of the City.

Tripp Norfleet spoke requesting consideration of an Impact Fee percentage smaller than 80 per cent.

Jeff Holcomb spoke in opposition of Newberry's LDR for Solar Farm setbacks.
