Quasi-Judicial Public Hearing: Second Reading of Ordinance 2021-24, an Ordinance of the City of Newberry, Florida, to voluntarily annex certain portions of unincorporated Alachua County: three contiguous Tax Parcels, 01861-001-00 (120.88 Acres ±, no address assigned), 01861-001-000 (59.0 Acres ±, no address assigned), and 1858-000-000 (158.04 Acres ±, 3200 NW 202ND Street).

Quasi-Judicial Hearing Second Reading: Ordinance 2021-14/LDR 21-10, an application by JBPro, Agent for M3 AVALON WOODS, LLC, Owner and also Agent for C L BRICE INC, Owner and CLB, Inc, Owner, to amend the Mixed Use Development (Development Order 20-02) for property located directly adjacent to the Easton-Newberry Sports Complex and identified as Alachua County Parcel Numbers 01874-200-000, 01874-100-000, 01874-001-000, and 01897-000-000, consisting of ± 196 acres.
