4. A request to rezone three (3) parcels from Commercial, General (CG) to Commercial, Central Business District (C-CBD) for the "Bounds Properties" consisting of ±0.9 acres.

Quasi-Judicial Public Hearing: First reading of Ordinance 2023-18/LDR 23-11, an application by Norfleet Construction Group, LLC on behalf of Bounds Properties, LLC to change the zoning designation from Commercial, General (CG) to Commercial, Central

Business District (C-CBD) for the "Bounds Properties" generally located at the southwest corner of State Road 26/West Newberry Road and Southwest 257 Street consisting of approximately 0.9 acres; identified by Alachua County Tax Parcel Numbers: 02231-000-000, 02232-000-000, and 02233-000-000.

5. A request for a large-scale Future Land Use Map Amendment from Agriculture to Public on ±93 acres

Legislative Public Hearing: Second reading of Ordinance 2023-09/CPA 23-05, an application by the City of Newberry to amend the Future Land Use Plan Map of the Comprehensive Plan by changing the future land use classification from Agriculture to Public on a site consisting of approximately 93 acres; identified by Alachua County Tax Parcel Numbers 02538-008-000 and 02538-009-001.

Attorney Adams read Ordinance 2023-09 on first reading by title only.

Principal Planner Perez provided the staff overview and report with a PowerPoint.

6. A request to rezone the existing municipal cemetery, wastewater treatment facility, and future environmental park from Agricultural (A) and Residential, Single-Family (RSF-2) to Public Facilities (PF) consisting of ±217 acres.

Quasi-Judicial Public Hearing: Second reading of Ordinance 2023-11/LDR 23-08, an application by the City of Newberry to amend the Official Zoning Atlas of the City of Newberry by changing the zoning designation from Agricultural (A) and Residential, Single-Family (RSF-2) to Public Facilities (PF) on property generally located on the east side of County Road 337, between Southwest 15 Avenue and Southwest 30 Avenue, consisting of ±217 acres; identified by Alachua County Parcel Numbers: 02536-000-000, 02538-001-000, 02538-004-000, 02538-005-000, 02538-007-000, 02538-008-000, 02538-010-000, and 02538-009-001.

7. Approval of Ranking and Authorization to Negotiate a Contract for Construction Manager at Risk Services for City Hall

Travis Parker, Director, Parks and Recreation presented the item with a PowerPoint.

In the interest of public disclosure, Commissioner Marden stated he has known Jennifer Denault, Scorpio Construction, Project Development & Marketing, for approximately 30 years. He and Ms. Denault discussed Scorpio applying for this project, but he had no influence on the ranking of applications for this project. Commissioner Marden stated he would be fair and impartial in this decision.

Matthew Marino, Oelrich Construction, and Jennifer Denault, Scorpio Construction, spoke.

Motion made by Commissioner Farnsworth to:

- 1) Accept the Ranking Committee's rankings.
- Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to begin negotiations with the top ranked firm to execute an agreement and other associated documents, for Construction Manager at Risk Services.
- 3) Authorize that should the City Manager, or designee, fail to negotiate a satisfactory contract with the top ranked firm, the City Manager, or designee, shall begin negotiating with the 2nd ranked firm and continue to follow this process until a satisfactory agreement is reached.

Jamie Jones, Assistant City Manager, Public Works & Utilities presented the item with a PowerPoint.

1) Authorize the City Manager to execute a Task Order with CHW Professional Consultants for the Newberry Environmental Park Master Plan in the amount of \$220,000.

2) Authorize the City Manager to approve change orders up to 10% of the contract amount.

The Commissioners were then polled on appointing to Planning and Zoning Board and Historic Architectural Review Board Seat 5, Jordan Fairfield was selected. The Commissioners were then polled on appointing to Historic Architectural Review Board Seat 6, Paula Willis was selected.

10. RBDG Grant Award (Agri-Tech)

Dallas Lee, Assistant City Manager/CFO presented the item with a PowerPoint. The City of Newberry has been awarded a \$55,000 grant through the CDBG RBDG program to advance the Agri-Tech Innovation Park project. The funding will enable the engagement of a qualified consultant to create an incubator business plan and provide economic development consulting services. The grant and \$20,000 of supplemental funds from the City's Duke Energy Grant make up a total project cost of \$75,000.

Motion made by Commissioner Marden to authorize the City Manager and/or Mayor to execute required agreements and other documents for the RBDG grant program, Seconded by Commissioner Farnsworth.

11. Power Cost Adjustment

Dallas Lee, Assistant City Manager/CFO presented the item with a PowerPoint. The city had a significant drop in wholesale power cost. As the Power Cost Adjustment (PCA) is directly linked to these costs, staff has been able to reduce the PCA. This reduction is particularly beneficial for our customers as we are heading into summer, a period of typically higher power usage. Moreover, this change allows the city to start rebuilding the rate stabilization fund.
