PUBLIC HEARINGS AND ORDINANCES

1. Use of Public Funds for Litigate and Advertise to Educate and Inform the Electorate.

Legislative Hearing: First Public Hearing of Ordinance No. 2020-26, An Ordinance Of The City Of Newberry Authorizing The Use Of Public Funds For Purposes Of Litigating And Advertising To Educate And Inform The Electorate Of Alachua County's Proposed Charter Referendum; Asserting The Appropriate Legislative Findings As To The Expenditure Of Public Funds And The Benefits Accruing To The City Therefrom; Asserting That Such Expenditures Will Serve A Proper Public Purpose; Repealing All Ordinances In Conflict And Establishing An Effective Date.

Attorney Maltby read Ordinance 2020-26 by title only on first reading and provided a summary of what the ordinance will allow the City to do. He provided a few updates on City of Alachua's lawsuit with Alachua County.

A lengthy discussion ensued.

Mayor Marlowe read four Whereas clauses in the Ordinance.
