## AGENDA ITEMS

## 1. Public Comments

<u>Mr. Milton McNeill</u> presented a letter and petitions<sup>1</sup> from the surrounding homeowners requesting SW 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue be paved.

Manager New explained that the City maintains the road, however it is a County owned road. Discussion of Capital Improvements will be at another workshop in which the petitioners are encouraged to participate.

## 2. Discussion of Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Budget

<u>Manager New</u> and <u>Director Lee</u> provided an overview of the 2020-2021 Operating and Capital Budget.

Director Lee reviewed the budget timeline. A few important dates are:

- July 13<sup>th</sup> Commission votes on Preliminary Fire Assessment Rates
- July 27<sup>th</sup> Commission votes on Preliminary Millage Rate
- August 24<sup>th</sup> Commission votes on Final Fire Assessment Rates
- September 14<sup>th</sup> First Budget Hearing
- September 28<sup>th</sup> Second Budget Hearing

Manager New reviewed the budget guidelines and policies.

He reviewed the accomplishments from the last budget:

- Increase in General Fund Reserves (\$1.4m as of FYE 2019)
- Diversification of revenues
  - Franchise fees-electric and natural gas
  - Local option fuel tax
  - Mosquito control fee
- Increased funding for public safety
- Increased funding for repair and replacement of assets (infrastructure, facilities, vehicles)
- Funded expansion of infrastructure (SR26 Water main)
- Development of equitable water and wastewater rates
- Competitive electric rates
- Lowered solid waste rates

- Continued funding of Economic Development initiatives
- Save residents approximately \$750k annually by contracting for law enforcement services (\$190/resident)

Manager New presented items for Commission consideration:

- Revenue diversification
- Millage rate
- Law enforcement
- Personnel expenses
- Capital Improvement Program (CIP)- Renewal/Replacement and Expansion/Enhancement
- Utility rate adjustment
  - Price index rate adjustment proposed for utility rates.

There is no proposed change in Fire Assessment.

Manager New then reviewed the long-term considerations:

- Facility expansion
  - o City Hall
  - Police Station
- Street and roads
  - o Repaving/maintaining existing paved streets
  - Paving existing unpaved streets in urban core
  - Paving existing unpaved streets in rural areas
- Law enforcement

<u>Director Lee</u> reviewed the revenues. He explained where the tax dollars are going between the County, School Board, and City.

Manager New discussed revenue diversification and revenue options.

Manager New explained the impact of COVID-19 to sales tax and the State of Florida.

Director Lee went over the expenses: unsure of how COVID-19 will affect these.
