AGENDA ITEMS

1. Fiscal Year 2020 - 2021 Budget Review

Manager New presented a PowerPoint for this item.

He reviewed the Governmental Funds. After the last workshop, there was information received from the State regarding proposed revenues that will allow the Contingency Fund to be fully funded.

<u>Commissioner Clark</u> asked about a part time position in the Planning and Economic Development Department. <u>Manager New</u> responded the full-time position in the Clerk's Office will be splitting time between the two departments. <u>Mayor Marlowe</u> stated that the full-time position would be under the direction of the City Clerk and expressed his gratitude to both the Clerk and Manager for working together.

<u>Mayor Marlowe</u> asked for public comment. There was none.

Manager New reviewed the Propriety Funds.

- Electric Utility: 1.0% increase across residential and nonresidential.
- Water Utility: 1.79% increase across residential, nonresidential, and irrigation.
- Wastewater Utility: 0% increase in rates.

<u>Commissioner Clark</u> asked about defunding the Code Enforcement Officer. Discussion ensued.

<u>Commissioner Clark</u> asked about family insurance and lowering cost. A lengthy discussion ensued.

Manager New reviewed the CIP's.

- Roads
 - Priority 1: Maintain roads as dedicated
 - Priority 2: Improve City owned roads (unpaved to paved)
 - Priority 3: Improve county owned roads (unpaved to paved)
- Economic Development- Seaboard Drive
 - Segment 1: NW 1 Avenue South to State Road 26 (290 ft)
 - Segment 2: State Road 26 South to SW 5 Avenue (1,720 ft)
 - Segment 3: SW 5 Avenue to SW 15 Avenue (1,050 ft)
- Public Facilities
 - City Hall
 - Police Station

A lengthy discussion ensued regarding the CIP's and funding.
