DISCUSSION ITEMS

Easter Egg Hunt Debrief

The Easter Egg Hunt was a success. Thank you cards will be given to Mountain Life Church for their help on the day of the hunt, as well as to others who donated. For next year, a horn would be helpful to start the hunt. A barrier would also be helpful to keep participants in designated areas.

Baseball / Baseball Field Cleanup

The Committee chose to hold the cleanup on April 18th at 4:30pm at the baseball field. Weeds need pulled and the field raked, as it is covered in goat heads. Committee Member Sullivan will bring his trailer to haul away the weeds and debris.

A coach has been found for the 6-8 year old team. A coach is still needed for the 8-10 year old team. Mayor Good suggested contacting the bank as a sponsor this year.

Farmers Market Ideas

The Committee will have an activity for July 20, August 17, and September 21st. One option was to bring snow cones and water, and have a game or craft. These will be decided upon as the dates get closer.

Bike-A-Thon – May 10

The Bike-A-Thon fundraiser was set for May 10th. The Committee chose to have the money go toward the Bike Park. Mayor Good stated that the Bike Park has been moved and will be placed closer to the skate park instead of behind the school. Brundage Mountain will donate tickets for this event, and St. Luke's may donate helmets. A bike safety course was suggested, as well as teaching participants how to work on their bikes. Committee Member Crow will talk to Officer Sauerland and see if she will again ride along with the participants. Committee Member Sullivan was able to get two bicycles donated as prizes from the Boise Bike Project.

Mural Project

The Committee chose to help with the mural project in the form of creating the flyers, advertising, and possibly having a paint day as one of their activities at the farmers market this summer.
