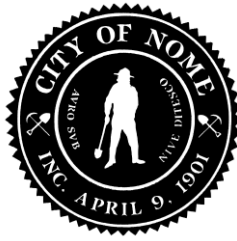

D. June 7, 2021 Nome Public Safety Advisory Commission Regular Meeting Minutes,

- Commissioner Piscosa inquired into commissioners present, based on commissioners listed at the top of the agenda.
- City Manager Steckman noted the formatting error auto-generated by Municode software. He suggested the minutes be tabled until the next meeting. There were no objections.

CITIZENS' COMMENTS

No citizen comments.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. Discussion of Nome Police Department (NPD) Accreditation

- City Manager Steckman stated he and Chief Heintzelman were in discussions with the City Manager of Soldotna and their Chief of Police regarding achieving police accreditation and the

fees incurred. Once he knew the costs, they would be brought back to Public Safety Advisory Commission and City Council.

NEW BUSINESS

A. Nome Community Center - Safe Housing (presentation)

- City Manager Steckman detailed the Housing First Project's goal to address homelessness in Nome. He noted the project as self-sustaining with a long-term financial plan.
- Rhonda Schneider, Executive Director of Nome Community Center (NCC), recounted past examples where NCC provided stable, secure housing for Nome residents and both the direct and indirect benefits. She noted their case management procedure for follow-up with their residents.
- Liz Johnson (NCC) described the Housing First model as an evidence-based approach. She noted NCC's resources and experience working with the homeless community. Their records show 23 of last year's 225-day shelter occupants fit HUD's chronic homeless definition, 100 or more days without stable housing, further identifying obstacles chronic homeless experience each day. She detailed the evaluation process NCC uses, the compilation of statistics; all passed to the State of Alaska.
- Rhonda Schneider (NCC) detailed the grant-funding, which covers 2/3 costs of operating. The resident's PFD and income are applicable towards the remaining 30 percent of the budget, among other finances. She stated their estimates to operate are around three-hundred thousand dollars. NCC has budgeted for a full-time case manager employed by NCC to provide behavioral health services for residents.
- City Manager Steckman opined similar success within the State with similar programs and could potentially have similar success.
- Commissioner Noffske opined his interest and stated support for the Housing First project. He inquired into what was needed from the commission to move the project forward.
- City Manager Steckman suggested a motion of support; however, it was up to the commission. City Council will also receive a presentation at their December 13, 2021, regular meeting.
- Rhonda Schneider commented that if the PSAC were in favor, a letter of support would be significant towards the grants application process.
- Commissioner Piscoya declared her support and requested copies of the information presented.
- Commissioner Traverse opined his support, suggesting significant benefits to the community.

A motion was made by C. Noffske and seconded by C. Travers to provide a letter of support for the Nome Community Center and their Housing First Project.

- 5) City Manager Steckman stated the emergency services radio project has to go out to bid currently.
- 6) C. Piscoya thanked the public for their attendance and the Nome Community Center for their presentation and time.
- 7) C. Travers had no comment.

ADJOURNMENT

A motion was made by C. McGarry and seconded by C. Noffske to adjourn; hearing no objections, the Nome Public Safety Advisory Commission adjourned at 6:57 PM.

(d) Each member of the commission shall be appointed for a three-year term, with the exception of original members, three of whom shall be appointed for a one-year term, three of whom shall be appointed for a two-year term, and three of whom shall be appointed for a three-year term.

(e) The commission shall choose a chairman and vice chairman, who shall conduct the business of the commission according to Robert's Rules of Order and who shall hold their offices for one year, but may be re-elected to the same or other positions. The commission shall designate a single commissioner responsible to forward reports of concern related to department conduct received by any commissioner to the city manager. The city clerk or the clerk's designee shall provide administrative support for meetings of the commission.

(f) Five appointed members of the commission constitute a quorum for the conduct of business. The commission shall meet quarterly and at such other times as directed by the city council. The commission is subject to the Open Meetings Act, AS [44.62.310](#). All meetings of the commission shall be open to the public except as otherwise provided for executive sessions in Alaska Statutes. Once approved by the commission, a copy of the commission meeting minutes shall be delivered to the city clerk for inclusion in the council's next meeting packet.

(g) Each appointed member of the commission shall be compensated in an amount to be determined by resolution of the city council from time to time.

(h) Purposes. The public safety advisory commission is established to:

(1) Advise the city council on matters relating to public safety and health.

(2) Promote and foster communication by and between members of the public and the public safety department.

(3) Encourage the highest ethical standards in the public safety department.

(4) Promote the provision of quality law enforcement services to all residents with sensitivity, cultural understanding and racial equity.

(5) Provide an alternative method for accepting citizen concerns relating to officer conduct or suggestions for changes in public safety department practices.
