Mayumi Windler - Ward 2

Ms. Windler expressed concerns about the City's increasing use of bonds to finance projects and questioned the long-term impact of additional debt. She also noted that the City Attorney should represent the City as a whole.

Megan Straughan - Ward 2

Ms. Straughan, a social worker, spoke in support of unhoused residents and urged Council not to remove the encampments without alternative housing options.

*

Ella Crenshaw - Ward 6

Ms. Crenshaw stated that tent encampments can be managed safely and sanitarily with the proper resources. She encouraged the City to allow unhoused residents to remain in place.

*

Marguerite Larson - Ward 6

Ms. Larson emphasized the community and support systems formed within unhoused encampments and expressed concern that relocating residents disrupts those connections. She encouraged compassionate solutions.

Miscellaneous Comments, continued

Cindy Rogers - Ward 4

Ms. Rogers discussed concerns with the proposed TIF Ordinance. She raised concerns about economic analysis, staffing capacity, and potential impacts on school funding.

*

Derek Hal – Ward 4

Mr. Hal spoke on behalf of the unhoused at Francis Cate Park, stating that residents are working together to maintain cleanliness, safety, and accountability within the encampment.

*

Brooklyn Bills - Ward 4

Ms. Bills described efforts by residents to establish rules, maintain cleanliness, and address concerns, emphasizing that stability is needed to move toward permanent housing.

*

Cara Tate – Ward 4

Ms. Tate shared her experience with homelessness and re-entry and efforts to access housing and mental health services. She urged the City not to force relocation and asked for expanded temporary shelter options.

*


Nancy McCormick - Ward 4
