Item 1. Welcome and introductions.

Item 3. Discussion and possible action related to the proposed agreement between the City and the Norman Economic Development Coalition for disbursement of American Rescue Act funding.

Chairman Thompson introduced Mr. Lawrence McKinney, Norman Economic Development Coalition (NEDC) Chief Executive Officer (CEO).

Mr. McKinney said the City Council designated \$1 million from American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding to be used for economic development, specifically helping small businesses, incubators, and entrepreneurs through grants with participation from NEDC, Norman Regional Health System (NRHS), Moore-Norman Technology Center (MNTC), Cleveland County, and Norman Public Schools (NPS). He said NEDC recently moved to Main Street and shares offices with Norman Chamber of Commerce and VisitNorman. He said NEDC currently rents office space to two incubator customers, but needs more space for incubator programs. The City discussed purchasing a building and allowing NEDC to run the incubator programs charging affordable rent for start-ups. He said NEDC would like to begin a program within the next 18 months focusing on minorities, including women and veterans. He said NEDC has several commitments from local citizens to serve on an Oversight Advisory Board. NEDC is looking at vacant buildings in Downtown Norman with open space, training space, offices space, etc., and one property currently being considered would support 30 companies while other buildings being considered would support approximately 12 to 15 companies.

Ms. Kathryn Walker, City Attorney, said with NEDC's recommendation on the agreement, Staff will move the agreement forward to Council for review and approval. She said under the agreement, the City will receive quarterly and annual reports to ensure applications meet ARPA guidelines. She said the agreement can be reviewed for approval by Council on June 14th; however, a conference or study session will be held prior to that date with a presentation to Council.

Mr. McKinney said NEDC will prepare a presentation on the history of incubators in Norman and Ms. Walker said she would follow that up with a presentation on the agreement.

She said the City would like to enter into a similar agreement with United Way and use the process United Way already has in place to evaluate non-profit requests. She said United Way is the most qualified entity as they are very familiar with the non-profit agencies in Norman.

Ms. Walker said United way will vet the non-profit applications and make recommendations to the Economic Development Advisory Board (EDAB) or City Council. Agencies would then contract with the City and the City would be responsible for reporting.

Member Farzanah said United Way is an excellent organization for this program and he is sure they will be very thorough in vetting applications.
