## DISCUSSION REGARDING THE MONTHLY REVENUE AND EXPENDITURES REPORTS

Anthony Francisco stated that the tax collection for March is up 4.6%, which is down from the last few months. This is reflective of the Child Tax Credit expiring. The fuel prices are going up and this will reflect negatively in the next fiscal year's budget. Natural gas and electric prices will be increasing as well. It has been recommended to us by our insurance broker to raise premiums on our insurance policies to keep our fund balance up. The cost of fleet vehicles for the City for replacement vehicles has gone up significantly and there is a significant shortage of the vehicles to purchase.
