Screening for clinical depressions and follow up plan

Diabetes screening for people with schizophrenia or bipolar disorder diagnosis who are prescribed ant-psychotics









What We Do



79% of Adults Seen have a Serious Mental Illness 73% of Children have a Serious Emotional Disturbance








THE CONTINUUM OF CARE AT RED ROCK

Adapted from a model by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), the Continuum of Care recognizes the need to provide the appropriate level services in order to address behavioral health problems & disorders.

NOTE: The appropriate treatment level & intensity are dependent on the specific needs of the individual. As needs change, levels of care are adjusted for appropriate individualized care.

"Behavioral health is the promotion of mental health, resilience and wellbeing; the treatment of mental and substance use disorders; and the support of those who experience and/or are in recovery from these conditions, along with their families and communities."







Cleveland/McClain Counties Catchment Areas











Pilot Update

The goal of the Pilot is to identify a treatment approach that does not produce a brine stream, and can reliably provide potable reuse quality product water.
