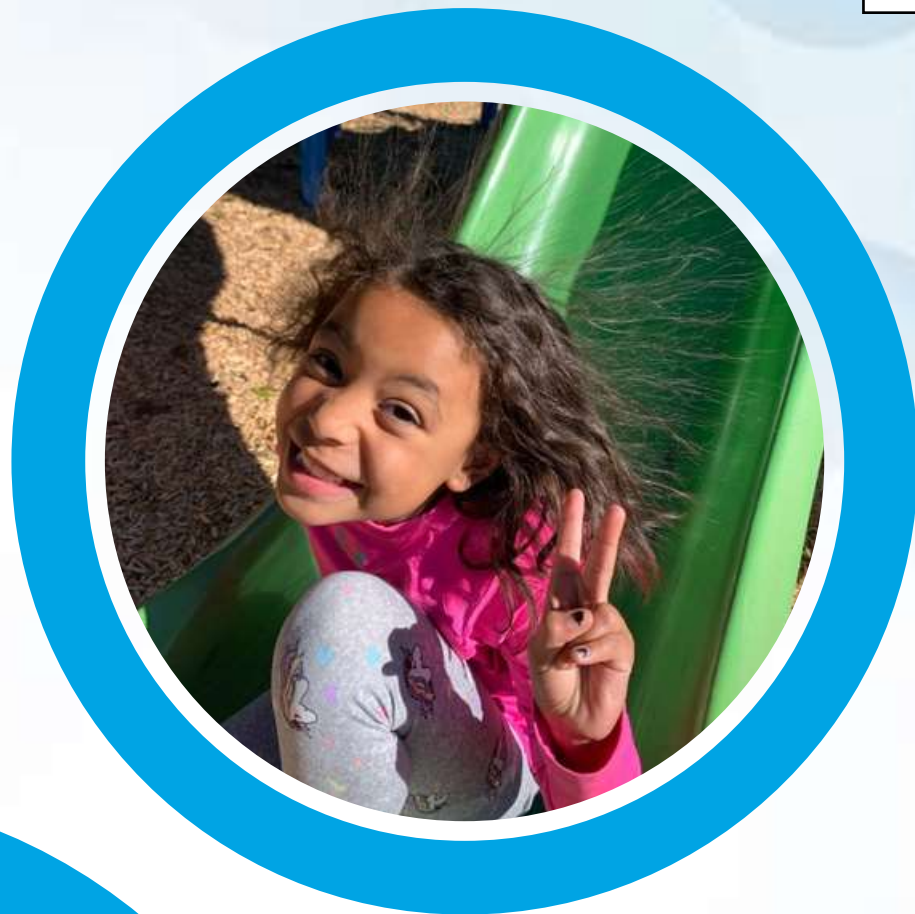
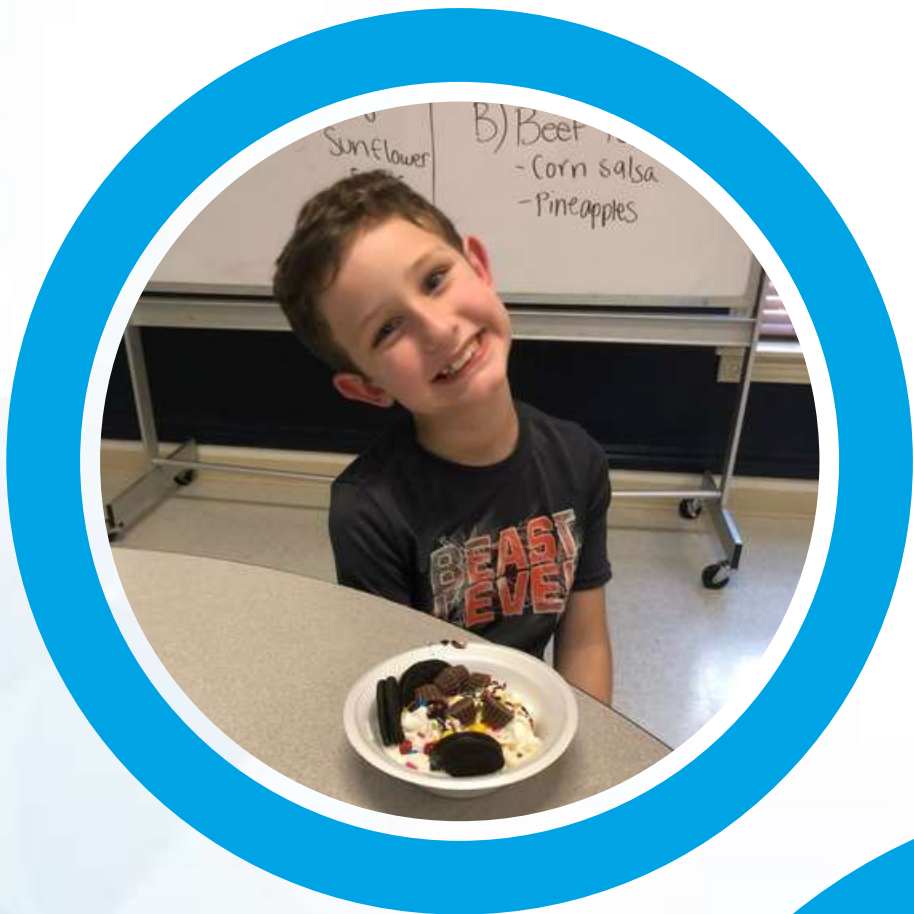

Reaves Park: The Why

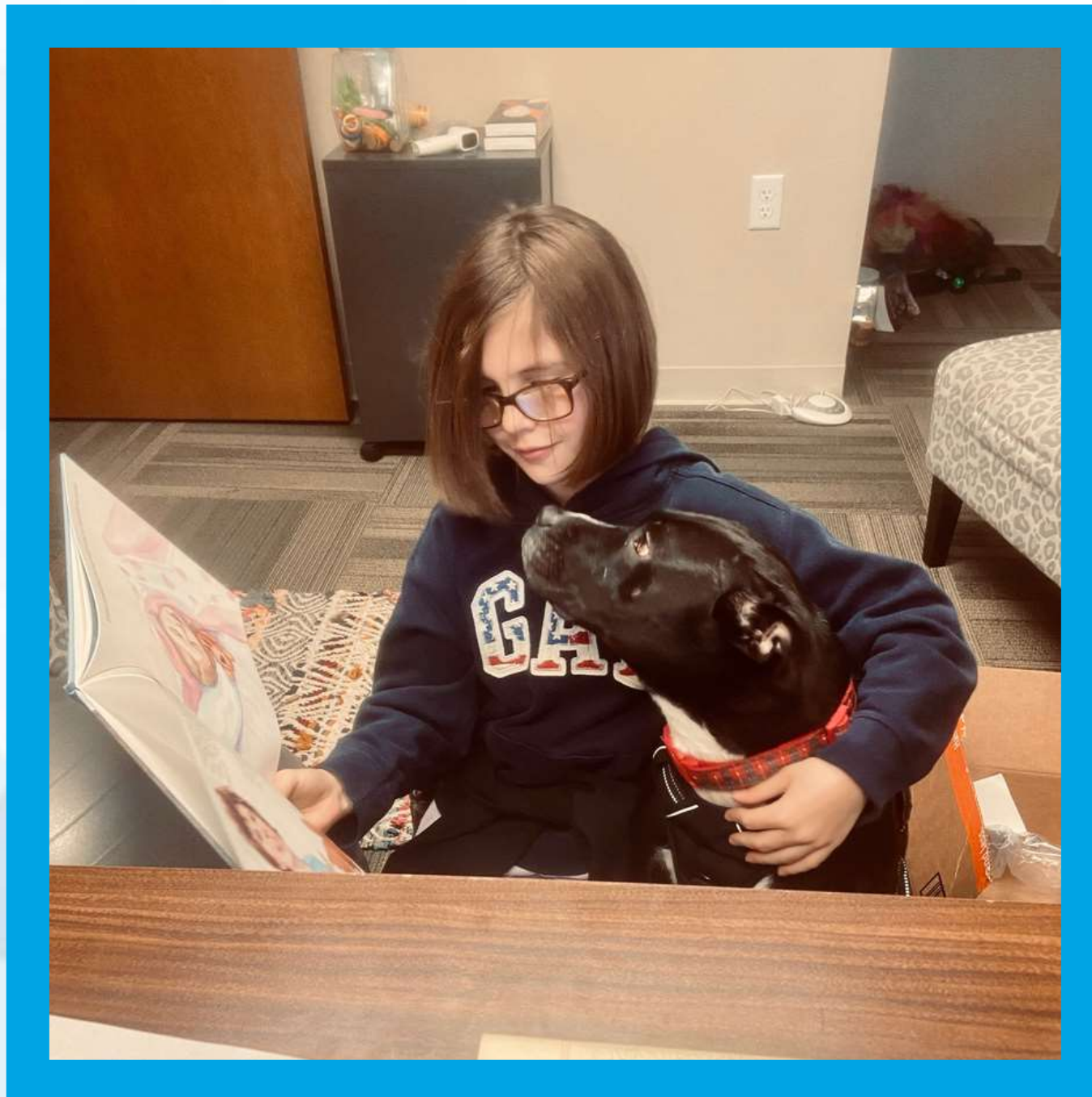
