The City Manager reported that the owner of the Exxon Gas Station and Car Wash filed a petition of injunction to stop the demolition process on that structure. This item will have to be excluded from any motions made. There was discussion on this issue and Councilmember Perry asked the City Manager to contact the DEP concerning the tanks at the gas station.

The City Manager requested for all the bid openings be handled in one motion (items 1, 2, and 3) because the bids are given in total but with a separate price for each structure. The bidders were told that the jobs would be awarded according to the lowest total bid.

Reclaim Company - \$28,938 (Exxon Station \$9,500)

Empire Salvage - \$18,000 (Exxon Station \$8,000)

There was a lengthy discussion on this amendment that would allow all terrain vehicles on city streets. The City Manager recommends adopting both new state ordinances but adding the following for city streets:

Helmets must be worn; hours of allowed use would be from sunrise to sunset; the rider must have a valid driver's license, and the speed limit will be the lower of the posted limit or 25 mph.

Motion - Accept this as the 1st reading of the amendment to OHMC 10.12.010 and in the next month council will review the state codes and the proposed amendment to gain a more in depth understanding.
