The City Manager introduced Erin Ellis-Reid as the new Economic Development Coordinator. She discussed her plans for the position and for the city. She opened for questions from Council. Councilmember Perry asked her several questions.

6. Appointment of Selection Committee for an Engineering Consultant Firm for the Purpose of Professional Services for a Virginia Street Sidewalk Project and Authorization to Advertise for Proposals

This agenda item was considered with items 11 and 12.

Council member Oxley left the room during this discussion and did not participate in discussion or voting.

The City Manager recommended appointing himself and the Mayor to all committees and adding David Kirk to the sidewalk project; Tim Richardson, Fire Chief, to the fire department addition; and Tyler Bragg to the city park project.

Councilmember Perry stated that he would like to be appointed to all the committees and cited his experience with various building projects.

The City Manager reported that he and the Police Chief have extensively researched the problem of parking on the sidewalks. The City Code and the State Code are the same on this issue and both allow parking on the sidewalks in certain circumstances. No change is needed in our code to solve the problem of a truck parking on the sidewalk to unload a delivery if it allows them not to interfere with the flow of traffic.

17. New City Hall vs New Construction

Council held discussion on whether to purchase the former BB&T building or build a new city hall.

Council member Oxley asked the administration their opinion. The City Manager stated several reasons that it would be beneficial to remain in the current building and make upgrades. More discussion ensued.

An architect/contractor has already visited the bank in December and is working on a plan for necessary city offices and the overall costs for necessary renovations.

Motion - *The City of Oak Hill enter negotiations with the owners of the BB&T bank building so as to ascertain an agreeable sale price for the possible future city hall. Furthermore, the negotiating team shall consist of the city's building commission and the Mayor and City Manager. Once a price is determined, the committee will report back to the City Council. If Council approves the proposed price, then the building commission or any other required entities shall commence with the sale of bonds to complete the purchase.*
