I am writing to inform or remind you of an environmental/health hazard that has existed for two years. The structure at 219 Highland Avenue, Oak Hill, burned June 20, 2019. In the process of extinguishing the fire, trash, appliances, and who knows what was removed and piled at the back of the house by firefighters. This pile of trash remains a visual and health hazard for the neighborhood. It must be attractive to mice and rats at the least. My understanding is that while the city has approved the house for demolition, there is apparently a dispute between the owner and the insurance company, and a court case that has been continued repeatedly. The outside mess in front of and behind the house remains a health hazard.

In addition, for years prior to the fire there was an above ground swimming pool no longer in use but collecting rainwater throughout the year only to become a stagnant, green breeding ground for mosquitoes in the warmer months. Neighbors have put up with this for far too long particularly given the number of mosquito borne diseases that we are warned about.

I am requesting that you use whatever power you can to help rid the neighborhood of these hazards while the courts decide the fate of the structure. Thank you for any help you can provide.

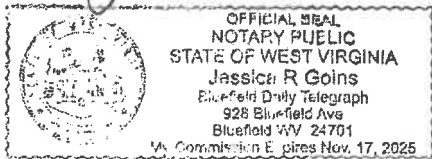
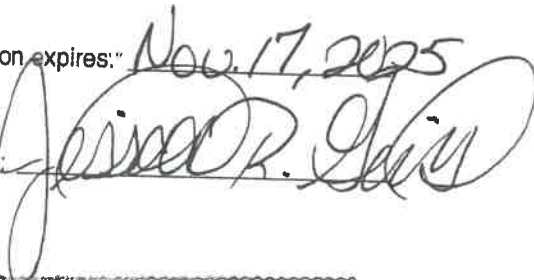

ORDINANCE

10.12.012 Recreational Trail Vehicles

A. Recreational Trail Vehicle Within Corporate Limits - The riding, operation or other use of Recreational Trail vehicles within or upon the streets, alleys, and parking lots within the corporate limits of Oak Hill is allowed with restrictions set forth in this section.

B. Helmet Required. — Operators and passengers of Street-Legal or unlicensed Recreational Trail vehicles shall wear size appropriate protective helmets that meet the current performance specifications established by the American national Standards Institute Standard, z90.1, the United States Department of Transportation federal motor vehicle safety standard no.218 or Snell safety standards for protective headgear for vehicle users.

C. Speed Limit. — Maximum speed limit for Street-Legal or unlicensed Recreational Trail Vehicles shall be 25 MPH or the posted speed limit, whichever is less.

D. Driver's License Required. — Operators of Street-Legal or unlicensed Recreational Trail Vehicles must be licensed pursuant to West Virginia code 17B-2-1.

E. Permitted hours of operation for Street-Legal or unlicensed Recreational Trail Vehicles sunrise to sunset.

F. Permits issued by the Rim Fire Trail are required for the operation of Recreational Trail Vehicles within the City of Oak Hill. Permits are to be displayed within the City as they are required to be displayed while operated on the Rim Fire Trail. Recreational Trail Vehicles or operators not meeting the eligibility requirements to obtain a permit issued by the Rim Fire Trail shall not operate within the City of Oak Hill. The requirement for a permit is suspended until such time as permits for the Rim Fire Trail are issued.

 9 in certain circumstances; providing for expungement; providing immunity from
 10 professional sanction, detainment, arrest, or prosecution in certain circumstances;

ARTICLE 63. SYRINGE SERVICES PROGRAMS.

§16-63-1. Definitions.

1 As used in this article, the term:

2 “Administrator” means a person having the authority and responsibility for operation of the
 3 syringe services program and serves as the contact for communication with the Director of the
 4 Harm Reduction Program.

5 “Applicant” means the entity applying for a license under this article.

6 “Board of Review” means the board established in §9-2-6(13) of this code.

7 “Director” means the Director of the Office of Health Facility Licensure and Certification.

8 “Fixed site” means a building or single location where syringe exchange services are
9 provided.

10 “Harm reduction program” means a program that provides services intended to lessen the
11 adverse consequences of drug use and protect public health and safety, by providing direct
12 access to or a referral to: Syringe services program; substance use disorder treatment programs;
13 screenings; vaccinations; education about overdose prevention; wound care; opioid antagonist
14 distribution and education; and other medical services.

15 “HIV” means the etiologic virus of AIDS or Human Immunodeficiency Virus.

16 “License” means the document issued by the office authorizing the syringe services
17 program to operate.

18 “Local health department” means a health department operated by local boards of health,
19 created, established, and maintained pursuant to §16-2-1 *et seq.* of this code.

20 “Location” means a site within the service area of a local health department. A location
21 can be a fixed site or a mobile site.

22 “Mobile site” means a location accessible by foot or vehicle that is not at a fixed indoor
23 setting.

24 “Syringe services program” means a community-based program that provides access to
25 sterile syringes, facilitates safe disposal of used syringes, and is part of a harm reduction program.

26 “Syringe stick injury” means a penetrating wound from a syringe that may result in
27 exposure to blood.

28 “Syringe stick injury protocol” means policies and procedures to prevent syringe stick
29 injury to syringe exchange staff, including volunteers, community members, and to syringe
30 exchange participants.

31 “Service area” means the territorial jurisdiction of the syringe services program.

32 “Sharps waste” means used syringes and lancets.

33 "Staff" means a person who provides syringe services or harm reduction services on
34 behalf of a program.

35 "Syringe" means both the needle and syringe used to inject fluids into the body.

§16-63-2. Application for license to offer a syringe services program.

1 (a) All new and existing syringe services programs shall obtain a license from the Office
2 for Health Facility Licensure and Certification.

3 (b) To be eligible for a license, a syringe services program shall:

4 (1) Submit an application on a form approved and provided by the office director;

5 (2) Provide the name of the program;

6 (3) Provide a description of the harm reduction program it is associated with and the harm
7 reduction services provided in accordance with §16-2-3 of this code;

8 (4) Provide the contact information of the individual designated by the applicant as the
9 administrator of the harm reduction program;

10 (5) Provide the hours of operation, location, and staffing. The description of hours of
11 operation must include the specific days the syringe services program is open, opening and
12 closing times, and frequency of syringe exchange services. The description of staffing must
13 include number of staff, titles of positions, and descriptions of their functions;

14 (6) Provide a specific description of the applicant's ability to refer to or facilitate entry into
15 substance use treatment;

16 (7) Provide a specific description of the applicant's ability to encourage usage of medical
17 care and mental health services as well as social welfare and health promotion;

18 (8) Pay an application fee in amount not to exceed \$500, to be determined by the director
19 by legislative rule; and

20 (9) Provide a written statement of support from a majority of the members of the county
21 commission and a majority of the members of a governing body of a municipality in which it is
22 located or is proposing to locate.

§16-63-3. Program requirements.

23 (a) To be approved for a license, a syringe services program shall be part of a harm
24 reduction program which offers or refers an individual to the following services which shall be

- 27 (2) Vaccinations;
- 28 (3) Birth control and long-term birth control;
- 29 (4) Behavioral health services;
- 30 (5) Overdose prevention supplies and education;
- 31 (6) Syringe collection and sharps disposal;
- 32 (7) Educational services related to disease transmission;
- 33 (8) Assist or refer an individual to a substance use treatment program;
- 34 (9) Refer to a health care practitioner or treat medical conditions; and
- 35 (10) Programmatic guidelines including a sharps disposal plan, a staff training plan, a data
36 collection and program evaluation plan, and a community relations plan.

37 (b) A syringe services program:

- 38 (1) Shall offer services, at every visit, from a qualified licensed health care provider;
- 39 (2) Shall exclude minors from participation in the syringe exchange, but may provide
40 minors with harm reduction services;
- 41 (3) Shall ensure a syringe is unique to the syringe services program;
- 42 (4) Shall distribute syringes with a goal of a 1:1 model;
- 43 (5) May substitute weighing the volume of syringes returned versus dispensed as
44 specified. This substitution is only permissible if it can be done accurately and in the following
45 manner:
 - 46 (A) The syringes shall be contained in a see-through container; and
 - 47 (B) A visual inspection of the container shall take place prior to the syringes being weighed;

- 57 (F) Procedures for obtaining or making referrals;
- 58 (G) Opioid antagonist administration;

- 60 (I) Completion of attendance logs for participation in mandatory training;
- 61 (9) Maintain a program for the public to report syringe litter and shall endeavor to collect
- 62 all syringe litter in the community.
- 63 (c) Each syringe services program shall have a syringe dispensing plan which includes,
- 64 but is not limited to the following:
- 65 (1) Maintaining records of returned syringes by participants for two years;
- 66 (2) Preventing syringe stick injuries;

- 68 (4) Tracking the number of syringes collected;
- 69 (5) Tracking the number of syringes collected as a result of community reports of syringe
- 70 litter;
- 71 (6) Eliminating direct handling of sharps waste;
- 72 (7) Following a syringe stick protocol and plan;

73 (8) A budget for sharps waste disposal or an explanation if no cost is associated with
74 sharps waste disposal; and

75 (9) A plan to coordinate with the continuum of care, including the requirements set forth in
76 this section.

77 (d) If an applicant does not submit all of the documentation required in §16-63-2 of this
78 code, the application shall be denied and returned to the applicant for completion.

79 (e) If an applicant fails to comply with the program requirements, the application shall be
80 denied and returned to the applicant for completion.

81 (f) A license is effective for one year.

§16-63-4. Procedure for revocation or limitation of the syringe services programs.

1 (a) The director may revoke, suspend, or limit a syringe services program's ability to offer
2 services for the following reasons:

3 (1) The syringe services program provides false or misleading information to the director;

4 (2) An inspection indicates the syringe services programs is in violation of the law or
5 legislative rule;

6 (3) The syringe services program fails to cooperate with the director during a complaint
7 investigation; or

8 (4) Recission of the letter of approval from a majority of the county commissioners or the
9 governing body of a municipality.

10 (b) The director shall send written notice to the syringe services program of revocation,
11 suspension, or limitation of its operations. The written notice shall include the following:

§16-63-5. Administrative due process.

1 (a) A syringe services program who disagrees with an administrative decision may, within
2 30 days after receiving notice of the decision, appeal the decision to the department’s board of
3 review.

4 (b) All pertinent provisions of §29A-5-1 *et seq.* of this code apply to and govern any hearing
5 authorized by this statute.

6 (c) The filing of a request for a hearing does not stay or supersede enforcement of the
7 final decision of the director. The director may, upon good cause shown, stay such enforcement.

§16-63-6. Administrative appeals and judicial review.

1 (a) A syringe services program who disagrees with the final administrative decision may,
2 within 30 days after the date the appellant received notice of the decision of the board of review,
3 appeal the decision to the Circuit Court of Kanawha County or in the county where the petitioner
4 resides or does business.

5 (b) The filing of the petition for appeal does not stay or supersede enforcement of the final
6 decision or order of the director. An appellant may apply to the circuit court for a stay of or to
7 supersede the final decision or order for good cause shown.

8 (c) No circuit court has jurisdiction to consider a decision of the board if the petitioner has
9 failed to file a request for review with the board of review within the time frame set forth in this
10 article.

§16-63-7. Reporting requirements; renewal; rulemaking.

1 (a) A syringe services program shall renew its license annually on the anniversary date of
2 license approval.

3 (b) A syringe services program shall file an annual report with the director. The report shall
4 include:

5 (1) The total number of persons served;

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6 (2) The total numbers and types of syringes, and syringes dispensed, collected, and
7 disposed of;

8 (3) The total number of syringe stick injuries to non-participants;

9 (4) Statistics regarding the number of individuals entering substance use treatment; and

10 (5) The total and types of referrals made to substance use treatment and other services.

11 (c) The office shall promulgate and propose rules and regulations under §29A-1-1 *et seq.*
12 of this code to carry out the intent and purposes of this article. Such rules and regulations shall
13 be in accordance with evidence-based practices. The office shall promulgate an emergency rule
14 by July 1, 2021. The emergency rule shall effectuate the provisions of this article in accordance
15 with evidence-based practices.

§16-63-8. Immunity.

1 (a) Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the contrary, an employee, volunteer, or
2 participant of a licensed syringe services program may not be arrested, charged with, or
3 prosecuted for possession of any of the following:

4 (1) Sterile or used syringes, hypodermic syringes, injection supplies obtained from or
5 returned to a program, or other safer drug use materials obtained from a program established
6 pursuant to this article, including testing supplies for illicit substances.

7 (2) Residual amounts of a controlled substance contained in a used syringe, used injection
8 supplies obtained from or returned to a program.

9 (b) A law-enforcement officer who, acting on good faith, arrests or charges a person who
10 is thereafter determined to be entitled to immunity from prosecution under this section is not liable
11 for the arrest or filing of charges.

12 (c) An individual who is wrongly detained, arrested or prosecuted under this section shall
13 have the public record associated with the detainment, arrest or prosecution expunged.

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14 (d) A health care professional, or an employee or volunteer of a licensed syringe services
15 program is not subject to professional sanction, detainment, arrest, or prosecution for carrying out
16 the provisions of this article.

17 (e) A business that has syringe litter on its property is immune from civil or criminal liability
18 in any action relating to the needle on its property unless the business owner acted in reckless
19 disregard for the safety of others.

§16-63-9. Civil penalties and injunctive relief.

1 (a) The Office of Health Facilities Licensure and Certification may assess an administrative
2 penalty of not less than \$500 nor more than \$10,000 per violation of this article.

3 (b) The Office of Health Facilities Licensure and Certification may seek injunctive relief to
4 enforce the provisions of this article.

§16-63-10. Coordination of care.

5 (a) A syringe service program shall coordinate with other health care providers in its
6 services to render care to the individuals as set forth in the program requirements.

7 (b) In the event that the syringe services program is closed, the syringe services program
8 shall notify the participant of the closure of the service, prior to closure, in a conspicuous location,
9 and provide an individual with a transition care plan.

10 (c) The Bureau for Medical Services shall submit a state plan amendment to permit harm
11 reduction programs to be an eligible provider, except that the syringe exchange services shall not
12 be eligible for reimbursement under the state plan.

13 (d) Upon passage, any existing provider not offering the full array of harm reduction
14 services as set forth in this section shall cease and desist offering all needle exchange services.
15 Any provider offering the full array of harm reduction services shall have until January 1, 2022, to
16 come into compliance with this section. Any new provider shall have until January 1, 2022, to
17 come into compliance with the provisions of this section.

The City of Oak Hill by order of the Council requires you to demolish the residential structure located at 46 Beaver Rd., described as Lot 46 Martha SD 1945 Cont 1.40, District 9, Map 59E, Parcel 28, Parid 09 59E002800000000.

The Oak Hill City Council requires performance to begin within 20 days following service of this order. Council will consider a resolution authorizing the City to perform, or caused to be performed, the demolition in question upon the failure of you to do so. This resolution will be considered during the next regular Council meeting following the expiration of the period of time given to you for the demolition of the structure. City Council meets the second Monday of each month.

You or other interested persons have the right to appeal at any time after proceedings are initiated, and before the expiration of period of time during which you, pursuant to order must have begun performance of demolition. Appeal is to the Circuit Court of Fayette County for a temporary injunction restraining further proceedings under Municipal Code 11.04 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Oak Hill pending final disposition of the cause.

9.13 - DANGEROUS DOGS

9.13.010 - Purpose and intent.

The purpose of this article is to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Oak Hill. It is intended to be applicable to "dangerous" dogs, as defined herein by insuring responsible handling by their owners through registration, confinement, and liability insurance.

9.13.020 - Definitions.

When used in this article, the following words, terms, and phrases, and their derivations shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Animal control officer or *animal warden* means any person employed, appointed, or designated by council who is authorized to investigate and enforce violations relating to animal control or cruelty under the provisions of Chapter 9 of this Code.

At large means that a dog is not under the direct control of the owner.

Dangerous dog means any dog that, because of its aggressive nature, training, or characteristic behavior, presents a risk of serious physical harm or death to human beings or domestic animals, or would constitute a danger to human life, physical well-being, or property or other domestic animals if not kept under the direct control of the owner. This definition shall not apply to dogs utilized by law enforcement officers in the performance of their duties. The term "dangerous dog" includes any dog that, according to the records of either any city, any county, any state, or any law enforcement agency:

- (1) Has, when unprovoked, bitten, attacked, endangered, or inflicted injury on a human being on public or private property, or when unprovoked, has chased or approached a person upon the street, sidewalks, or any public grounds in a menacing fashion or apparent attitude of attack, provided that such actions are attested to in a sworn statement by one (1) or more persons and dutifully investigated by any of the above referenced authorities; or
- (2) Has severely injured or killed a domestic animal while off the owner's property; or
- (3) Has been used primarily or in part for the purpose of dog fighting or is a dog trained for dog fighting; or
- (4) Has previously been declared a dangerous dog by another municipality, any county, or any state.

Direct control means immediate, continuous physical control of a dog such as by means of a leash, cord, secure fence, or chain of such strength to restrain the dog and controlled by a person capable of restraining the dog, or safe and secure restraint within a vehicle. If the controlling person is, always, fully and clearly within unobstructed sight and hearing of the dog, voice control shall be considered direct control when the dog is actually participating in training or in an official showing, obedience, or field event. Direct control shall not be required of dogs participating in a legal sport in an authorized area or to government police dogs.

Impoundment means the taking or picking up and confining of an animal by any police officer, animal control officer, animal warden, or any other public officer, under the provisions of this chapter, Chapter 3 of the City Code or any applicable West Virginia Code provision.

Muzzle means a device constructed of strong, soft materials or of metal, designed to fasten over the mouth of any animal to prevent the animal from biting any person or other animal.

Owner means any person, partnership, corporation, or other legal entity owning, harboring, or keeping any animal, or in the case of a person under the age of eighteen (18), that person's parent or

legal guardian. An animal shall be deemed to be harbored if it is fed or sheltered for three (3) or more consecutive days. This definition shall not apply to any veterinary clinic or boarding kennel.

Sanitary condition means a condition of good order and cleanliness to minimize the possibility of disease transmission.

Under restraint means that an animal is secured by a leash, led under the control of a person physically capable of restraining the animal and obedient to that person's commands, or securely enclosed within the real property limits of the owner's premises.

9.13.030 - Procedure for declaring a dog dangerous.

- (a) An animal control officer, animal warden, or any adult person may request, under oath, that a dog be classified as dangerous as defined in section 9.13.020 by submitting a sworn, written complaint on a form approved by the police department to the police department. Upon receipt of such complaint, the police department or other designee shall notify the owner of the dog that a complaint has been filed, and that an investigation into the allegations as set forth in the complaint will be conducted.
- (b) Criteria to be considered during the above investigation shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - (1) Provocation;
 - (2) Severity of attack or injury to a person or domestic animal;
 - (3) Previous aggressive behavior of the dog;
 - (4) Site and circumstances of the incident; and
 - (5) Statements from interested parties.
- (c) At the conclusion of an investigation, the City Manager may:
 - (1) Determine that the dog is not dangerous and, if the dog is impounded, may waive any impoundment fees incurred and order the release of the dog to its owner; or
 - (2) Determine that the dog is dangerous and order the owner to comply with the requirements for keeping dangerous dogs set forth in section 9.13.050, and if the dog is impounded, release the dog to its owner after the owner has paid all fees incurred for the impoundment.

Notification of dangerous dog declaration.

- (a) Within five (5) business days after declaring a dog dangerous, the city shall notify the owner by certified mail of the dog's designation as a dangerous dog and any specific restrictions and conditions for keeping the dog as set forth in section 9.13.050. The Chief of Police, City Manager, Code Enforcement Official, and the Animal Control Officer shall all be notified of any designation of any dog as a dangerous dog. Such notification shall describe the dog and specify any requirements or conditions placed upon the dog owner. The police department will keep a record of any designation of a dog as a dangerous dog.
- (b) If the city cannot, with due diligence, locate the owner of a dog that has been seized pursuant to this article, the city shall cause the dog to be impounded for not less than five (5) business days. If, after five (5) days, the owner fails to claim the dog, the city may cause the dog to be humanely destroyed.

9.13.040 - Appeal from dangerous dog declaration.

If the City Manager determines that a dog is dangerous at the conclusion of the investigation conducted under section 19.13.030, that determination shall be final unless the dog owner applies to a court of competent jurisdiction for any remedies that may be available within thirty (30) days after receiving notice that the dog has been finally declared dangerous. The appeal shall be a civil proceeding for the purpose of affirming or reversing the city's determination of dangerousness.

9.13.050 Keeping of dangerous dogs.

The keeping of a dangerous dog, as defined in section 19.13.020, shall be subject to the following requirements:

- (1) *Leash.* No person having charge, custody, control, or possession of a dangerous dog shall allow the dog to exit its kennel, pen, or other proper enclosure unless such dog is securely attached to a leash no more than six (6) feet in length. No such person shall permit a dangerous dog to be kept on a chain, rope, or other type of leash outside its kennel or pen unless a person capable of controlling the dog is in physical control of the leash.
- (2) *Muzzle.* It shall be unlawful for any owner or keeper of a dangerous dog to allow the dog to be outside of its proper enclosure unless it is necessary for the dog to receive veterinary care or exercise. In such cases, the dog shall wear a properly fitted muzzle to prevent it from biting humans or other animals. Such muzzle shall not interfere with the dog's breathing or vision.
- (3) *Confinement.* Except when leashed and muzzled as provided in this section, a dangerous dog shall be securely confined indoors or confined in a locked pen or other secure enclosure that is suitable to prevent the entry of children and is designed to prevent the dog from escaping. The enclosure shall include shelter and protection from the elements and shall provide adequate exercise room, light, and ventilation. The enclosed structure shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition and shall meet the following requirements:
 - a. The structure must have secure sides and a secure top, or all sides must be at least six (6) feet high;
 - b. The structure must have a bottom permanently attached to the sides or the sides must be imbedded not less than one (1) foot into the ground; and
 - c. The structure must be of such material and closed in such a manner that the dog cannot exit the enclosure on its own.
- (4) *Indoor confinement.* No dangerous dog shall be kept on a porch, patio, or in any part of a house or structure that would allow the dog to exit such building on its own volition. In addition, no such dog shall be kept in a house or structure when the windows or screen doors are the only obstacle preventing the dog from exiting the structure.
- (5) *Signs.* All owners, keepers, or harborers of dangerous dogs shall display, in a prominent place on their premises, a sign easily readable by the public using the words "Beware of Dog".
- (6) *Liability insurance, surety bond.* The owner of a dangerous dog shall present to the city proof that he/she has procured liability insurance or a surety bond in the amount of not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) covering any damage or injury that may be caused by such dangerous dog. The policy shall contain a provision requiring the city to be notified immediately by the agent issuing the policy if the insurance policy is canceled, terminated, or expires. The liability insurance or surety bond shall be obtained prior to the issuing of a permit to keep a dangerous dog. The dog owner shall sign a statement attesting that he shall maintain and not voluntarily cancel the liability insurance policy during the twelve-month period for which a permit is sought unless he ceases to own or keep the dog prior to the expiration date of the permit

period. The owner shall provide the city with notice of any cancellation on the liability insurance policy. If the owner proves to the satisfaction of the city that insurance is not available, the owner may post with the city, of an equivalent amount, payable to any person injured by the dangerous dog.

- (7) *Mandatory spaying or neutering.* Within thirty (30) days of the determination that a particular dog is dangerous, the owner of said dog shall have it spayed or neutered and provide the city with a written statement from the veterinarian who performed the operation verifying the same.
- (8) *Notification of escape.* The owner or keeper of a dangerous dog shall notify the city immediately if such a dog escapes from its enclosure or restraint and is at-large. Such immediate notification shall also be required if the dog bites or attacks a person or domestic animal.
- (9) *Failure to comply.* It shall be unlawful and a misdemeanor for any owner of a dangerous dog registered with the city to fail to comply with the requirements and conditions set forth in this section. An owner or keeper of a dangerous dog who fails to register the dog shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and fined two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00). Each day that the dangerous dog is not registered shall be a separate offense. The fine for any other violation of this section, for which the specific fine amount has not been set forth, shall be one hundred dollars (100.00) with each day that the offense continues being a separate citable offense. Any dog found to be in violation of this section 9.13.050 shall be subject to immediate seizure and impoundment. In addition, failure to comply with the requirements and conditions set forth in section 3-505 may result in the city revoking the permit providing for the keeping of such animal. Other ordinances pertaining to penalties for injuries inflicted by dogs shall be in addition to the penalties set forth herein.

9.13.060 - Permit and tag required for a dangerous dog.

- (a) The owner of a dangerous dog shall, within three (3) business days after classification of the dog as dangerous or upon acquisition of such a dog, obtain an annual permit from the City of Oak Hill Code Enforcement Department to harbor the dog. The fee for such permit shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00) per year.
- (b) At the time the permit is issued, a red tag shall be issued to the owner of the dangerous dog. The tag shall be always worn by the dog to identify it clearly and easily as a dangerous dog. The owner or keeper of a dangerous dog who registers but fails to place the foregoing red tag on said dog shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and fined two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00). Each day shall be a separate citable offense.
- (c) The permit for maintaining a dangerous dog shall be presented to an animal control officer or law enforcement officer upon demand.

9.13.070 - Notification of intent to impound.

- (a) When the city intends to impound a dog declared to be dangerous for violation of section 3-505, it shall notify the owner or custodian of the dog, by certified mail, of the intended impoundment at least five (5) business days prior to the intended impoundment except as provided in section 3-508.
- (b) The notice of intent to impound shall inform the owner or custodian of the dog that he may request, in writing within five (5) business days prior to the intended impoundment, a hearing before the City Manager or his designee to contest the intended impoundment and finding of violation.
- (c) Upon request by the owner or custodian of the dog for a hearing pursuant to subsection (b) hereof, a hearing shall be held within ten (10) business days after the request for a hearing. Notice of the date,

time, and location of the hearing shall be provided by certified mail to the dog's owner or custodian requesting such hearing.

- (d) If the owner or custodian requests a hearing pursuant to subsection (b) hereof, no impoundment shall take place until conclusion of the hearing, except as authorized in section 3-508.

9.13.080 - Immediate impoundment.

- (a) A dog previously declared to be dangerous may be immediately impounded without a pre-impoundment hearing when the City Manager or Chief of Police determines such immediate impoundment is necessary for the protection of public health or safety. Such immediate impoundment may be ordered for violation of section 9.13.060 or when the dog bites a person or domestic animal.
- (b) The owner or custodian of the dog immediately impounded pursuant to subsection (a) hereof shall be notified of the impoundment by certified mail within five (5) days after the dog's impoundment.
- (c) The notice of impoundment shall inform the owner or custodian of the dog that he may request, in writing, a hearing before the City Manager to contest the impoundment within five (5) days after the mailing of the notice of impoundment.
- (d) Upon request by the owner or custodian of the dog for a hearing under subsection (c) hereof, a hearing shall be held within ten (10) business days after such request. Notice of the date, time, and location of the hearing shall be provided by certified mail to the dog owner requesting the hearing.

9.13.090 - Impoundment hearing.

- (a) If, after a hearing on impoundment, the City Manager or his designee finds no violation of section 9.13.050 or that the dog has not bitten an individual or a domestic animal, the dog shall be returned to its owner or custodian if already impounded or shall not be impounded as intended.
- (b) Incident to the finding and conclusions made at the impoundment hearing, the City Manager or his designee may impose reasonable restrictions and conditions for the maintenance of the dog in addition to those set forth in section 3-505 to insure the health and safety of the public and the animal. Such conditions may include, but shall not be limited to:
 - (1) Posting of bond or other proof of ability to respond to damages;
 - (2) Specific requirements as to size, construction, and design of a kennel in which to house the dog;
 - (3) Requirements as to type and method of restraint and/or muzzling of the dog;
 - (4) Photo identification or permanent marking of the dog for purposes of identification; and
 - (5) Payment of reasonable fees to recover the costs incurred by the City of Oak Hill in insuring compliance with this section.

9.13.100 - Destruction.

- (a) The City Manager or Chief of Police may order the destruction of a dog that it determines to be extremely dangerous to public health or safety, a dog that has made an extremely vicious attack upon an individual, or a dog declared dangerous whose owner is unable or unwilling to adequately restrain it.

- (b) The city shall give written notice by certified mail of its intention to destroy such dog to the owner or custodian of the dog who may request, in writing, within ten (10) business days after delivery of such notice a hearing before the City Manager to contest the intended destruction.
- (c) If no hearing is requested pursuant to subsection (b) hereof, the dog shall be destroyed pursuant to applicable provisions of law.
- (d) If a hearing is requested pursuant to subsection (b) hereof, such hearing shall be held by the City Manager or his designee within ten (10) business days after the request, and the dog shall not be destroyed prior to the conclusion of the hearing.
- (e) The dog owner shall be responsible for payment of all boarding costs and other fees as may be required for the city to keep the animal humanely and safely during any legal proceeding.

9.13.110 - Appeal from order of humane destruction.

If a section 9.13.100 hearing results in the City Manager or his designee ordering a dangerous dog to be humanely destroyed, that decision shall be final unless the dog owner applies to a court of competent jurisdiction for any remedies that may be available within ten (10) days after receiving notice of the destruction order. If an appeal is timely filed, the City Manager or his designee shall suspend the destruction order pending the final determination of the court. The appeal shall be a civil proceeding for the purpose of affirming or reversing the City Manager's destruction order.

9.13.120 - Change of ownership.

- (a) Any owner of a dangerous dog who sells or otherwise transfers ownership, custody, or residence of the dog shall, within ten (10) days after such change of ownership or residence, provide written notification to the city police department of the name, address, and telephone number of the new owner. It also shall be the responsibility of the person transferring ownership or custody of the dog to provide written notification of the dog's classification as dangerous to the person receiving the dog. The previous owner shall furnish a copy of such notification to the city along with written acknowledgment by the new owner of his receipt of such notification. The Oak Hill Police Department shall notify the code enforcement department and the Animal Control Officer of any changes of ownership, custody, or residence of the dog within three (3) business days after receiving the required information from the previous dog owner.
- (b) Any person receiving a dog classified as dangerous must obtain the required permit, tag, and enclosure prior to acquisition of the dog from the city code enforcement department. The new owner shall comply fully with the provisions of this article pertaining to obtaining liability insurance, payment of fees, and maintenance, control, and ownership of a dangerous dog.

9.13.13 - Continuation of dangerous dog declaration.

Any dog that has been declared dangerous by this city, another municipality, any county, or any state shall be subject to the provisions of this article as long as it remains in the city. The person owning or having custody of any dog designated as a dangerous dog by any municipality, county, or state government shall notify the City Manager or his designee within ten (10) days of moving the animal into the City of Oak Hill. The restrictions and conditions applicable to dangerous dogs and contained within this article shall remain in force while the dog remains in the city.

At a regular meeting of the Council of the City of Oak Hill, West Virginia, held in the City Hall, Tuesday evening, July 7, 1959, at 7:30 o'clock, p.m. there were present Jos. S. Keatley, Mayor, H. R. Cole, Treasurer and E. N. Goode, Clerk, and the following members of the Council:

Also present, W. R. Bennett, City Manager and H. E. Janney, Chief of Police.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read, approved and signed. This being the first meeting for the new Councilmen elected June 2, 1959 to assume office, and after having taken their Official Oath, a motion was made, seconded and carried, that the present Mayor, Jos. S. Keatley be named chairman of the meeting and E. N. Goode, Secty.

Chairman Keatley announced that nominations were in order for Mayor, whereupon, a motion was made (Baumgartner) that Jos. S. Keatley be named Mayor for a term of 4 years beginning July 1, 1959, which motion was duly seconded (Gwinn) and unanimously carried.

Mayor Keatley then called for nominations for Ass't. Mayor, whereupon, a motion was made (Gwinn) that G. A. Baumgartner be named Ass't. Mayor for a period of 4 years, beginning July 1, 1959, which motion was duly seconded (Mc.Lain) and unanimously carried.

Upon motion duly made (Baumgartner) seconded (Mullins) and carried all City Officials were reappointed.

Current Invoices were eard by the Clerk, and upon motion duly made seconded and carried, all were approved for payment.

City Manager presented license applications for the year beginning July 1, 1959, and upon motion duly made (Gwinn) seconded (Mc.Lain) and carried, all were approved.

Mr. J. F. Williams appeared before the Council and applied for a license to operate a trash truck, he having bought out H. G. Riddle.

After discussion, and upon motion duly made (Mullins) seconded (Mauritz) and carried, license were granted.

Mr. Bob Prowse owner of the Fayette Collecting Service, appeared before the Council for consideration of his City License fee which is \$100.00 per year.

After discussion, a motion was made (Mauritz) that the fee be reduced to \$25.00 for the year of 1959-60, which motion was duly seconded (Mullins) and carried. Vote 4 for and 2 against.

The Council authorized W. R. Bennett, City Manager to proceed with the proposed South Hills Sewer Project, if and when sufficient money is available.

Council authorized H. E. Janney, Chief of Police to have a "do not turn on red" added to the traffic signal at the intersection of Central Avenue and Main Street.

The " No Left Turn " sign located at the intersection of Oak Hill Avenue and Main Street was discussed. The Council referred the matter to the Chief of Police.

Jack Manning, operator of the V. F. W. Club appeared before the Council, at the request of Chief Janney, because of many complaints against the club.

Mr. Manning asked the Council for a chance to make the club a quieter place, due to the fact he has only been operating for a month.

The Council agreed to give him another chance, but if the noise continues, the club will be closed.

Upon motion duly made (Mullins) seconded (Brown) and carried, it was ordered that \$1.50 per hour for street employees be inserted in the new budget for the year of 1959-60.

Upon motion duly made (Mullins) seconded (Mauritz) and carried, it was ordered that the sum of \$12,000.00 be placed in the new budget for a Street Sweeper, provided sufficient money is available for same.

Chief Janney asked the Council to purchase a new Police Cruiser, due to the condition of the present one. Chief Janney presented prices from 4 car dealers; as follows:

After discussion, the Council voted to place \$1,500.00 in the new budget for a new Cruiser.

The following resolution, was duly and regularly adopted by the Council:

"WHEREAS, the Council is advised that the State Road Commission of West Virginia, proposes to construct an Expressway around and through certain portions of the City of Oak Hill, and in the vicinity of the Riner Addition to said City the proposal is to have the grade of said Expressway some 20 feet below the existing grade of the Street known as Oyler Avenue.

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Oak Hill does hereby request that said Expressway be bridged by Oyler Avenue on its existing level and in its existing location so as to provide access by way of Oyler Avenue from adjoining and adjacent territories to present U. S. Route 21.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the State Road Commission be, and it hereby is, requested to take over and make a part of the State Road System, said Oyler Avenue between its intersection with Thomas Drive and said U. S. Route 21."

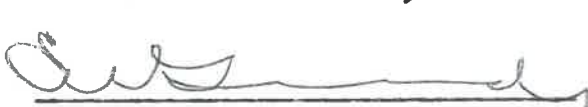

15.38.310 Keeping Of Fowl

- A. The Board of Zoning Appeals may approve a conditional use permit for the keeping of fowl in R-1, Low Density Residential District, R-2 Medium Density Residential District, and R-3 High Density Residential District. The conditional use shall comply with the following:
1. The keeping of fowl shall be explicitly for non-commercial use only.
 2. Any resulting product of the fowl (such as eggs) can only be for personal consumption and not sold for profit.
 3. The fowl permitted are hens, ducks, or any combination of both over four (4) months of age, up to a total number of six (6) per residential property.
 4. Keeping of male chickens (roosters) over four (4) months of age are prohibited.
 5. No other type of fowl is permitted.
 6. The fowl must be kept in a pen, coop, or enclosure no less than twenty-five (25) feet from any neighboring structure owned by another person or corporation.
 7. Said pen, coop, or enclosure shall be a minimum of ten (10) square feet in size per each fowl kept on the premises and comply with all setback requirements.
 8. Any violations of OHMC 9.08.030 at the premises at any time shall immediately nullify this conditional use permit.
