<u>Consideration to Pave Approximately Three Miles of an Extension of the White Oak Rail</u> Trail

Bill Wells with Mt. State Trail Alliance explained to Council that a grant had been received through the ARC WV Trail Network to extend the White Oak Rail Trail from Carlisle to Glen Jean. This grant required matching funds and Mr. Wells has received notice that the Department of Highways matching funds have been rescinded.

He presented a plan to replace the matching funds that includes a \$30,000 contribution from the City of Oak Hill in lieu of paving.

There was discussion on the issue and the question arose whether the City would own the portion of trail and where the money would come from.





ORDINANCE

10.12.012 Recreational Trail Vehicles

- A. Recreational Trail Vehicle Within Corporate Limits The riding, operation or other use of Recreational Trail vehicles within or upon the streets, alleys, and parking lots within the corporate limits of Oak Hill is allowed with restrictions set forth in this section.
- B. Helmet Required. Operators and passengers of Street-Legal or unlicensed Recreational Trail vehicles shall wear size appropriate protective helmets that meet the current performance specifications established by the American national Standards Institute Standard, z90.1, the United States Department of Transportation federal motor vehicle safety standard no.218 or Snell safety standards for protective headgear for vehicle users.
- C. Speed Limit. Maximum speed limit for Street-Legal or unlicensed Recreational Trail Vehicles shall be 25 MPH or the posted speed limit, whichever is less.
- D. Driver's License Required. Operators of Street-Legal or unlicensed Recreational Trail Vehicles must be licensed pursuant to West Virginia code 17B-2-1.
- E. Permitted hours of operation for Street-Legal or unlicensed Recreational Trail Vehicles sunrise to sunset.
- F. Permits issued by the Rim Fire Trail are required for the operation of Recreational Trail Vehicles within the City of Oak Hill. Permits are to be displayed within the City as they are required to be displayed while operated on the Rim Fire Trail. Recreational Trail Vehicles or operators not meeting the eligibility requirements to obtain a permit issued by the Rim Fire Trail shall not operate within the City of Oak Hill. The requirement for a permit is suspended until such time as permits for the Rim Fire Trail are issued.

SANITARY BOARD (3 year term) after initial appt.

155.03 MEMBERSHIP. The Sanitary Board shall be composed of the Mayor or the City Manager and two residents of the City appointed to the Board by Council. No other officer or employee of the City, whether holding a paid or unpaid office, shall be eligible to appointment on the Board until at least one year after the expiration of the term of his public office. The term of the members of the Board appointed by Council shall be for three years and the Mayor or City Manager shall serve as such during the term of his office, the present members of the Board heretofore duly appointed and their terms are hereby confirmed. The successive successors of each such member shall be appointed to the term of three years. Vacancies shall be filled by Council for any unexpired term which may hereafter occur, in the same manner as the original appointment. PLANNING COMMISSION (3 year term) after initial appt.

147.01 CREATION; MEMBERS.

- (a) There shall be a Planning Commission which shall consist of seven members.
- (b) The members of the Planning Commission must be:
 - (1) Residents of the Municipality; and
 - (2) Qualified by knowledge and experience in matters pertaining to the development of the Municipality.
- (c) At least three-fifths of all of the members must have been residents of the City for at least three years prior to nomination or appointment and confirmation.
- (d) The members of a municipal planning commission must fairly represent different areas of interest, knowledge and expertise, including, but not limited to, business, industry, labor, government and other relevant disciplines. One member must be a member of Council or a designee and one member must be a member of the Administrative Department of the City or a designee. The term of membership for these two members is the same as their term of office.
- (e) Members shall serve three-year terms. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term and made in the same manner as original selections were made.
- (f) The members of the Planning Commission shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses actually incurred in the performance of their official duties.

- (g) Nominations for the Planning Commission membership shall be made by the City Manager and confirmed by Council.
- (h) An individual may serve as a member of the Planning Commission, a county planning commission, a multicounty planning commission, a regional planning commission or a joint planning commission, at the same time.
- (i) The Council may remove members of the Planning Commission for missing three consecutive meetings, neglect of duty or malfeasance. The Council shall provide the member with a written statement of the reason for removal and an opportunity to be heard on the matter.
- (j) Members shall serve, have the powers and perform the duties provided by West Virginia Code 8A-2, as the same shall be amended from time to time. (Amended 4-9-18)

BD. of ZONING APPEALS (3 year term)

1311.01 CREATION; MEMBERSHIP; TERMS; VACANCIES. The City Council shall establish a Board of Zoning Appeals to hear appeals on zoning issues. The Board shall be established in accordance with the Code of West Virginia, Chapter 8A, Article 8, as amended, with all the rights and responsibilities accorded therein.

- A. The Board shall consist of five members to be appointed by Council.
- B. Members of the Board shall:
 - 1. Be residents of the City for at least three (3) years preceding the appointment;
 - 2. Not be a member of the Oak Hill Planning Commission; and,
 - 3. Not hold any other elective or appointive office in the City of Oak Hill.
- C. Upon the establishment of the Board, the members shall be appointed for the following terms: one for a term of one (1) year; two (2) for a term of two (2) years; and two (2) for a term of three (3) years. The terms shall expire on the first day of January of the first, second and third year, respectively, following their appointment. Thereafter, members shall serve three-year terms. If a vacancy occurs, the City Council shall appoint a member for the unexpired term.
- D. The members of the Board shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses actually incurred in the performance of their official duties.

1311.02 ALTERNATE MEMBERS.

- A. The City Council may appoint up to three (3) additional members to serve as alternate members of the Board of Zoning Appeals.
- B. Alternate members of the Board shall meet the eligibility criteria included in Section 1311.01.
- C. The term for an alternate Board member is three (3) years. The City Council may appoint alternate members on a staggered term schedule.
- D. An alternate member shall serve on the Board when one of the regular members is unable to serve. The alternate member shall serve until a final determination is made in the matter to which the alternate member was initially called on to serve.
- E. The Board of Zoning Appeals shall establish rules and procedures for designating an alternate member.
- F. An alternate member shall have the same powers and duties of a regular Board member.

BUILDING COMMISSION (5 year term)

153.01 CREATION; MEMBERS; TERM. The City does hereby create and establish a building commission, pursuant to West Virginia Code Article 8-33, as amended, to be known as the Oak Hill Building Commission. The Commission shall have all the powers, rights and duties as set forth in West Virginia Code Article 8-33, subject to the provisions hereinafter set forth. The number of members for such Commission shall be set at five, with the original Board of the Commission consisting of five members; with one member appointed for one year, one member appointed for two years, one member appointed for three years, one member appointed for four years and one member appointed for five years.

Upon the expiration of an original Board member's term, the new appointment shall be for five years. No more than two-thirds of the members of such Board may be from the same political party and no member may be employed by the United States Government, the State or any county or political subdivision thereof or any political party. Appointment of members shall be made by Council.

Vacancies on such Board shall be filled as specified by West Virginia Code Article 8-33. All members of such Board shall be residents of the City. Provided, however, that the Commission shall not undertake any project or exercise any of the powers authorized by the provisions of West Virginia Code Article 8-33, in support or furtherance of any project, unless such project is first approved by Council and the Commission first authorized to do so by Council by resolution duly adopted at a regular or special meeting and made of record in the minutes of such meeting. Beautification Commission (4 year term)

149.01 CREATION; MEMBERS; DUTIES. There is hereby created the Beautification Commission of the City, which may be referred to as the Beautification Commission.

The Commission shall consist of ten members which shall include the Mayor, the City Manager, a member of Council and seven members from the public at large. The public members shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject to approval of Council, or by Council, and shall hold office during the term of Council under which such appointments were approved or made.

At the first meeting after the appointment of the public members, the Commission shall elect from its membership a chairperson and a secretary and shall adopt such rules and thereafter hold such meetings as shall be necessary or convenient for the transaction of its business.

The Commission shall advise and recommend to the Mayor or Council such programs or projects as would, in the opinion of the Commission, improve the beauty and enhance the general welfare of the City. All projects or programs involving any expenditure of public money shall first have the approval of Council, although the implementation thereof may be delegated by Council to the Commission.

The Mayor or Council may request the advice or cooperation of the Commission for any project or program connected with the beautification, cleanliness and general welfare of the City. (Ord. 8-3-93)

The West Virginia Municipal League and its 230 member cities, towns and villages will be active in advocacy and call for robust national investment and innovative, non-partisan and common sense solutions in Washington DC in 2021, including:



1) Solid Funding for Key Domestic Appropriations that Support Local Communities: Congress should maintain and enhance its investment in FY2022 critical areas:

- Appalachian Regional Commission POWER Grants
- HUD Community Development Block Grants
- EPA Clean Water SRF & Drinking Water SRF
- U.S. Department of Transportation (BUILD Grants) (TAP) & (TCSP) program.
- Economic Development Administration (EDA)
- EPA Brownfield grants
- USDA Rural Development Funding
- FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant, SAFER firefighter DOJ COPS Grants
- Adjust Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership eligibility criteria
- National Endowment for the Arts
- Historic Preservation Fund

WVML and West Virginia cities support a return to congressionally-directed grant projects in the appropriations process, or "earmarks" to support public-purpose projects by under a process that is transparent, equitable, and based upon merit criteria.

2) A Bold Infrastructure Authorization: It is time to rebuild together and get serious about \$1+ trillion National Infrastructure legislation - including FAST reauthorization, water/sewer infrastructure, broadband



and telecommunications, smart cities technologies, renewable and reliable energy, clean vehicle infrastructure, brownfields, and green infrastructure.

3)Support for Appalachian Innovation & Economic Diversification: While West Virginia maintains faith and support in our traditional economic approaches, our state needs support for economic sector diversification and innovation. Including support for the "Marshall Plan for Middle America"

4) Resources for Healthy & Resilient Communities: West Virginia's citizens and families are among the most unhealthy in the nation, and need resources & new approaches to tackle these challenges. Funds appropriated for substance abuse, overall health

and essential medical benefits, hazard mitigation, resiliency planning, and disaster recovery,

- 5) Tax Incentives for Revitalization of Downtowns: Many West Virginia cities are determined to restore grand but deteriorated downtown buildings for new economic investment and improved quality of life that can retain and attract young and entrepreneurial workers and families. Therefore it is essential to continue the Historic Rehabilitation Tax Credit and pass the REHAB Act.
- 6) Support for Anchor Institutions in Communities: The new economy in cities is being built in large part around anchor institutions including hospitals, health systems, colleges and universities, innovation districts, and other anchors. WVML urges Congress to appropriate funding for a new, \$50 million



"Anchoring Neighborhoods, Communities & Housing to Opportunities for Revitalization" (ANCHOR) program.


