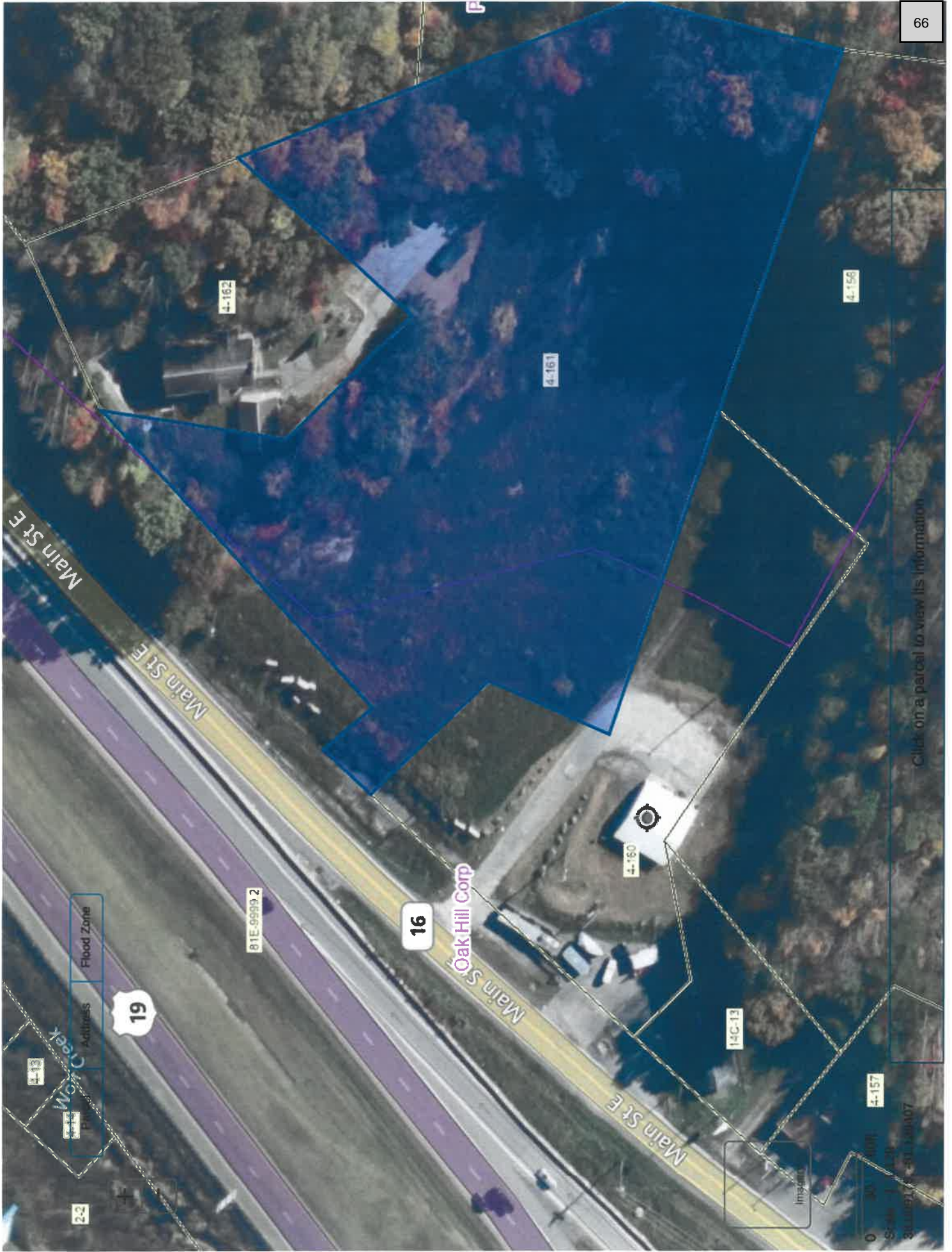

The City Of Oak Hill NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Oak Hill, in the State of West Virginia, as follows:

SECTION 1: **AMENDMENT** “11.18 West Virginia State Building Code” of the OakHill Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

BEFORE AMENDMENT

11.18 West Virginia State Building Code

The State Building Code (new version) with the exception of the current edition of the International Property Maintenance Code was adopted by the Oak Hill City Council on 8/10/2020.

The State Building Code (new version) with the exception of the current edition of the International Property Maintenance Code was adopted by the Oak Hill City Council on 8/~~08~~~~10~~/2020.

 - a. Provided; that the section entitled “Fire Prevention” and identified as Section 101.4.5 is deleted and not considered to be a part of the rule.
 - b. The Board of Appeals shall be appointed by the Fayette County Commission and shall be the same Board of Appeals utilized by Fayette County.
 - 2. The 2015 edition of the International Plumbing Code, First Printing.
 - 3. The 2015 edition of the International Mechanical Code, First Printing.
 - 4. The 2015 edition of the International Fuel Gas Code, First Printing with the following exception: Section 404.10 Underground Piping systems shall be installed a minimum depth of 12 inches (305mm) below grade. If the minimum depth cannot be maintained, the piping system shall be installed in conduit or shielded in an approved manner.
 - 5. The 2009 edition of the International Energy Conservation Code, for residential building.
 - 6. The 2015 edition of the International Residential Code for One and Two Family Dwellings, First Printing, Appendix E Manufactured Housing Used as a Dwelling, with exceptions:
 - a. Section G2415.10 (404.10) Underground Piping systems shall be installed a minimum depth of 12 inches (305mm) below grade. If the minimum depth cannot be maintained, the piping system shall be installed in conduit or shielded in an approved manner.
 - b. Section R303.6.1 Light Activation: The control for activations of the required interior stairway lighting shall be accessible at the top and bottom of each stairway without traveling any steps. The illumination

of exterior stairways shall be controlled from inside the dwelling units. Exceptions: 1. Lights that are continuously illuminated or automatically controlled. 2. Interior stairways consisting of less than three steps.

- c. Section R311.3.1 Landings at door, where a stairway of two or fewer risers is located on the exterior side of door, other than the required exit door, a landing is not required for the exterior side of the door.
 - d. Section R311.7.4 Stair Treads and Risers: 311.7.4.1 Riser Heights- the maximum riser height shall be eight and one-quarter (8 1/4) inches. 311.7.4.2 Tread Depth - The minimum tread depth shall be nine (9) inches.
 - e. Section R313: Automatic Fire Sprinkler Systems, in its entirety, is specifically excluded from the scope of this rule series.
 - f. Section R403.1.7.1: Building Clearances from Ascending Slopes is not applicable to this rule.
 - g. Section 403.1.7.2: Footing Setbacks from Descending Slope Descending Slope Surfaces is not applicable to this rule.
 - h. Chapter 11 entitled Energy Efficiency, is deleted and not considered to be part of this rule.
7. The ANSI/ASHRAE/IESNA Standard 90.1 2010 edition for commercial buildings. 2009 ICC/ANSI A117.1 American National Standards for Accessibility and Useable Building and Facilities.
 8. The 2015 International Existing Building Code, First Printing, with the following exception:
 - a. Omit reference to International Fire Code and substitute NFPA Life Safety Code 2018 Edition.
 9. The 2017 edition of the National Electric Code, NFPA 70.
 - a. For renovations in one- and two-family homes where no new square footage is involved, arc-fault circuit interrupter (AFCI) protection shall not be required, except for in bedrooms. For renovation in one- and two-family homes where square footage is added but no electrical service is installed, arc-fault circuit interrupter (AFCI) protection shall not be required.
 10. 2015 Edition of the International Swimming Pool and Spa Code.
 11. The following structures are not subjected to inspection by local jurisdictions:
 - a. Group U utility structures and storage shed comprising an area not more than 150 square feet which have no plumbing or electrical connections and are used only for residential storage purposes. (examples include sheds that are for residential storage of lawnmowers, tools, bicycles or furniture). Not included are those utility structures and storage sheds which have plumbing or electrical connections are a non-residential use or for storage of explosives or other hazardous explosive materials.

13. Unlawful acts: penalty; injunctive relief upon violation.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to erect, construct, alter, repair, remove, demolish, maintain, fail to maintain, provide, fail to provide, occupy, let another to occupy or permit another person to occupy any premises, property, structure or equipment regulated by the City of Oak Hill Building Code, or cause same to be done, contrary to or in conflict with or in violation of any of the provisions of the code, or fail to obey a lawful order of the code official, or to remove or deface a placard or notice posted under the provisions of this code.
- b. Penalty. 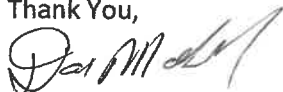

This letter is to formally request the creation of a Government Access Channel between the City of Oak Hill, West Virginia and Altice USA, Inc. (D.B.A Optimum). Section 611 (47 CFR § 76.1505) of the Federal Communications Act requires Altice USA, Inc. (D.B.A. Optimum) to provide P.E.G. (Public, Education, Government) channel capacity to the City of Oak Hill (WV Code §24D-1-3 Municipal Cable Franchise Authority) with minimum technical support. Blue Horizon Media, LLC. (D.B.A. New River Network) shall provide all technical means in addition to financial operating support at no cost to the City of Oak Hill. The Government Access Channel shall be based on a High Definition video platform with all equipment provided by Blue Horizon Media, LLC. meeting a minimum resolution of 1280x720p 59.94 fps. Optimum HD channel support shall be dependent on available QAM system bandwidth. HD support may require the channel be moved to a higher tier to accommodate the needed bandwidth. This channel shall provide 100% West Virginia created programming with an emphasis on Oak Hill and Fayette County. Local businesses/churches will have access to independent programming at a minimal cost. Area schools will have independent access at no charge to the school or Fayette County Board of Education. Blue Horizon Media, LLC. shall act as the liaison between the City of Oak Hill and Suddenlink to create said channel. I formally request the City of Oak Hill to add this item on a future agenda. Such channel would be a major asset to the city with no cost involved in creating or maintaining a Government Access Channel.

Chris,

As requested, I am drafting this e-mail to explain the request for the equipment to be upgraded that serves the county of Greenbrier, WV access channel.

Currently the channel utilizes a approximately 10 year old standard definition Leightronix Nexus unit that provides a composite analog output on both video and audio to Suddenlink's encoder. The video is confined to a 4:3 aspect ratio as limited by the Nexus unit and the internal configuration of the Suddenlink encoder. The MPEG2 file codec standard on the Nexus unit is now considered obsolete in the broadcasting industry as a stored file container format. It has since be replaced by MPEG4, h.264, and the latest h.265 in the industry. Basically, the unit is 3 formats behind the current technology as of the current year. In the following bullet style format I will give a few examples of what upgrading will do for the channel:

1. Currently, government agencies, places of worship, and civic organizations are all creating content in a high definition H.264 format. With the current Nexus unit, it takes a tremendous amount of time (typically a 1:1 ratio or 2:1 ratio, minute for minute or 30 seconds for every minute) to render a converted video from 720p-1080i 16:9 to 480i 720x480 4:3. With a upgraded playout server that can utilize h.264 as a native format it would allow "drag-and-drop" capabilities. This would eliminate hours of added workload to convert from a standard to non-standard format prior to uploading.
2. Currently programming is transferred via FTP protocol over a public Suddenlink internet connection. The upload speed at best is 20 Mbps in the local area. Programming currently takes between 30 minutes to 1 hour to upload to the Nexus unit in a MPEG 2 format. H.264 offers in excess of a 50% reduction of the size of file being transferred. This would cut upload times from 30 minutes to 1 hour down to 15 minutes to 30 minutes per programming spot. Also, the Nexus unit requires files to be transferred via the proprietary WIN LGX software. This requires the video file be downloaded to a remote PC and then be re-uploaded using the WIN LGX software. The new playout server can utilize services such as DropBox & Google Drive thus eliminating the need to re-upload files. With a combined time savings of 1 to 2 hours to download and re-upload files the difference is substantial.
3. It is recognized among the broadcast industry that composite video is no longer a industry standard means of transferring video signals. HD-SDI is considered by many as the minimum standard for modern broadcasting. It can be agreed upon that all new equipment being manufactured are being designed with HD-SDI and HDMI as the minimum technical standard in the design. HD-SDI gives the capability to transfer such things as CEA-708, programming information, and multi-channel audio. Composite video simply transfers a analog video signal with line 21 CEA-608 capabilities. If the current Nexus unit would fail, no off the shelf replacement currently exists as composite equipment are not widely manufactured in our current time. Having HD-SDI capabilities ensures the channel can purchase and replace equipment that is readily available for purchase. Also, it gives the channel the ability to adapt and maintain compliance with future FCC orders such as CEA-708 pass through that requires HD-SDI as a transport means.

Note: I am very familiar with TS multiplexing and have installed and programmed units from Tandberg, Drake Digital, Wegener, Motorola, and Blonder Tongue just to name a few. I dealt a lot previously with the ATSC 19.392 ASI standard with the difference on QAM being the 38 Mbits channel width. I have the ability to have a very in depth conversation about multiplexers and TS encoders as I have purchased, installed, and currently own equipment that serve the purpose of the previously stated. I am up for a open discussion about the encoding bitrate as I have have logged many hours both with the MPEG2 ATSC standard and the H.264 IP streaming standard. If you would prefer H.264 in your TS I can swap the [REDACTED] with a [REDACTED]

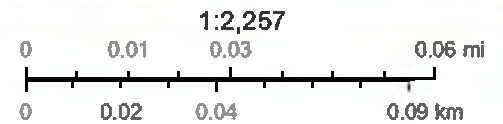
Map 30A Parcel 1

A. Bed and breakfast inns shall comply with the following:

1. The structure should be virtually indistinguishable from the surrounding houses;
2. Breakfast (or brunch) shall be the only meal served;
3. The meal shall be served to overnight guests only;
4. Cooking facilities in the rooms shall be prohibited;
5. Bed and breakfast inns shall be owner-occupied;
6. Parking must be paved and drained as approved by the City Manager, and at a ratio of 1 space per guest room plus 2 spaces for the resident family or innkeeper;

- Continuing work on VistiOakHillWV.com Website
 - One big factor we have come across is some legal policies we need to get lined out with Mr File that will be required for the website. I have reach out to him for advice.
- Continuing work of the Bike Friendly Community Application
 - I have included Ms Johnson, Chief Whisman, and Mr Kirk on the application process to gather the correct information needed.
- While researching other EDA's in Southern WV it has come to my attention that most have a board/committee that meet regularly to set coals, create vision and mission statement, and governance policies. I propose that Oak Hill creates a Community and Economic Development committee that consists of stakeholders in some of the following areas.
 - local government
 - Finance
 - Legal
 - Healthcare
 - Board of Education
 - construction/development/infrastructure
 - entrepreneur
 - utilities
 - regional development
 - CVB
- I have already created a document with many goals, mission and vision statements and governance policies for the committee to review once it is created.
- Partnered with Heads up Community to offer a notification app to Oak Hill residents as a mass communication tool. People will be able to download an app and select Oak Hill to get notifications about things happening in the city such as events, weather warnings, utility issues, street closures. Myself, Ms Vaughn, Ms Coffman, and Ms Falk will have the ability to send notifications through the app. This allows us to have a more direct form of communication with the public where social media may leave gaps. This should be live later this week and we will be able to make a public announcement for the service.
- In contact with Chick-Fil-A to bring Food Truck to set up in Oak Hill City Limits in an effort to hopefully bring a brick-and-mortar location to Oak Hill.
- Working with the Fayette Trail Committee to gather information for the Needlseye Trail project to move forward in compliance with the National Environmental Protection Act, National Historic Preservation Act, and US Fish and Wildlife Service for Section 7 Endangered Species Act Compliance. Along with information that contractors will need to hit the ground running once they are selected so there are no delays in the timeline.
- Mr Lively sent a suggestion to contact Mast General store, about the Bessie's location on Main Street. An email has been sent to them with information regarding the location and other general information about the City including demographics, amenities, economics and the new promotional video.

City Manager's Report

July 2022 for August 8, 2022 Meeting

I have spent most of July getting my feet wet in my new position as city manager. I am still working with Valerie on the Clerk-Treasurer position, and she is doing a wonderful job.

After our regular council meeting in July, Dae Dae and I looked at the house on Broadway owned by Mr. Hopkins. There has been no further improvements to the house. I also spoke with Allen Ballard's office. He has not been able to contact Mr. Hopkins, but he does feel like the homeowner needs to consult an engineer before proceeding with further improvements.

I would like to pursue demolition of this structure through the grant funds we are receiving from DEP. I believe it meets the criteria they have established. There are still a few requirements of the program we are trying to meet, but I will have the application prepared by the deadline of August 15.

We are working on compiling a list of other structures to include in this program.

The crews are finishing drainage and sewer projects on Trump and Miller Avenues. Dae Dae discovered a water leak on Trump Avenue and contacted WVAWC to fix the leak before we paved the street. The pavers will return as soon as the leak is fixed. All the other streets in the paving project list are complete.

The James Ellis marker is ready to be placed in the Russell Matthew Park on Broadway Ave. The sign supervisor from the Lewisburg division of the DOH is aware of the location and will be preparing the site for installation. We will have a ceremony for the unveiling of the sign at a date to be determined. The Mayor and Councilman Smallwood are working on the details of the ceremony.

Dae Dae and I along with Councilmen Perry and Smallwood met with WVAWC officials to discuss the location of the logo on the water tower. The logo should be completed by the middle of September if not earlier.

While there I spoke with Brian Janney, the crew supervisor for the Oak Hill area and he gave me a list of the paving they are doing on the cuts they have in this area. I will try to work on a solution with him to have these cuts fixed in a timelier manner.

As you can imagine, we have had several calls from residents who have water issues. Several have asked for the creek to be dredged. The City cannot enter the creek to dredge without a permit from the DEP and they are not issuing those permits.

I appointed community members of the city park project steering committee as follows: **Frankie Pauley** – Local business owner and golf disc enthusiast; **Alison Ibarra** – Owner of Pinheads; **Chris Carnifax** – Operations Manager at Ace; **Jaret Brantley**, Operations for Camp Royal and skatepark specialists; **Brad Compton** – Oak Hill Little League President; **Courtney Vargo** – Basketball representative. I have talked with each of these listed except Courtney Vargo and I will reach out to her.

The city members of the committee are Councilman Perry, Councilman Smallwood, Chief of Police (safety committee), David Kirk, and me.
