- June
 - End of fiscal Year
- July
 - Beginning of fiscal year
- August
 - o Departments begin compiling CIP items
 - Request for the CIP are to be over \$2500
- September
 - o CIP items discussed
 - Informal budget discussions begin
- October
 - o Capital Improvement Program (CIP) request are due to City Hall October 26
 - o Department Heads meet with City Administrator over budgets
- November
 - o Department Heads submit their finalized budget to City Hall November 23
 - Meet with City Administrator to discuss
 - May take place outside of normal monthly meetings

• December

- City Administration prepares the budget for city council
- o December 12
 - Police budget and CIP
 - December 19
 - Public Works budget and CIP
- January

- o January 9
 - Parks, Wellness budget and CIP
- o January 16
 - Community Development, Library, and all other budget items and CIP
