Setting date for public hearing on 2021 amendment to urban renewal plan for Central Urban Renewal Area

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Oelwein, Iowa (the "City") has created the Central Urban Renewal Area and has approved an urban renewal plan for that Area; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa requires that, before a city approves any new urban renewal project to an urban renewal plan, a city must amend the existing urban renewal plan to include that new project; and

WHEREAS, an amendment to the urban renewal plan for the Central Urban Renewal Area has been prepared which proposes to increase the annual amount of tax increment revenues that would be devoted to the City's forgivable loan program related providing incentives for expanding existing business, encouraging development of new business, improving buildings and building facades and providing for renovation of upper stories into housing units; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary that a date be set for a public hearing on that plan amendment;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the City Council of the City of Oelwein, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. This City Council will meet at the Oelwein Community Plaza, Oelwein, Iowa, on February 8, 2021, at \_\_\_\_\_ p.m., at which time and place it will hold a public hearing on the proposed 2021 urban renewal plan amendment for the Central Urban Renewal Area.

Section 2. Pursuant to Section 403.5 of the Code of Iowa, the City Administrator is hereby designated as the City's representative in connection with the consultation process which is required under that section of the urban renewal law.

Section 3. The City Clerk shall publish notice of the hearing on the amendment for the Central Urban Renewal Area, the same being in the form set out as follows, which publication shall be made in a legal newspaper of general circulation in Oelwein, which publication shall be not less than four (4) nor more than twenty (20) days before the date set for hearing.

Notice Is Hereby Given: That at \_\_\_\_\_ p.m., at the Oelwein Community Plaza, on February 8, 2021, the City Council of the City of Oelwein, Iowa, will hold a public hearing on the question of amending the urban renewal plan for the Central Urban Renewal Area to increase the annual amount of tax increment revenue that would be devoted to the City's forgivable loan program related to providing incentives for expanding existing business, encouraging development of new business, improving buildings and building facades and providing for renovation of upper stories into housing units. The current amount of \$75,000 per year would be increased to an amount equal to 90% of the incremental property tax revenues that are generated each year in the Central Urban Renewal Area, minus any amounts committed to prior projects.

A copy of the amendment is on file for public inspection in the office of the City Clerk.

At that time and place, any interested person may file written objections or comments and may be heard with respect to the subject matter of the hearing.

#### CITY OF OELWEIN, IOWA CENTRAL URBAN RENEWAL AREA

#### 2021 AMENDMENT URBAN RENEWAL PLAN

#### February, 2021

The Urban Renewal Plan for the City of Oelwein Central Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area") is hereby amended in accordance with the provisions of Section 403.5 of the Code of Iowa to give information about increasing the amount of annual incremental property tax revenue that is proposed to be devoted to the City's forgivable loan program.

The program involves the use of incremental property tax revenues to expand existing business, encourage development of new business, improve buildings and building facades and provide for renovation of upper stories into housing units. Forgivable loans are provided to building owners in the maximum amount of \$25,000 for the purpose of new business creation, acquisition of property, expansion of an existing business or renovation of property, including façade. Forgivable loans are provided in the maximum amount of \$50,000 for renovation of upper stories into housing units. The project is coordinated by the Oelwein Housing Committee, a division of the Oelwein Area Chamber and Development and all applications must be approved by the Oelwein City Council.

The following information is provided in accordance with the requirements of Section 403.17 of the Code of Iowa:

Outstanding general obligation debt of the City	\$7,740,000
Constitutional debt limit of the City:	\$13,655,000

Proposed debt to be incurred each year in Urban Renewal Area: 90% of the incremental property tax revenues that are generated in the Central Urban Renewal Area in that year, minus any amount committed to prior approved projects

#### RESOLUTION NO.

Resolution Voluntarily Extending Leave from the Emergency Family and Medical Leave Expansion Act

WHEREAS, the United States Federal Government passed the Families First Coronavirus Response Act that provided additional leave through the Emergency Family and Medical Leave Expansion Act related to the Coronavirus; and

WHEREAS, the provisions for leave ended December of 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus Pandemic has not subsided, and employees may need additional leave as provided in 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City should extended this leave voluntarily until June 30, 2021 to ensure that all employees can use the leave as needed; and

WHEREAS, The City should provide two weeks of leave due to the Coronavirus under the following criteria:

- A federal, state, or local quarantine or isolation order related to COVID-19.
- The employee has been advised by a healthcare provider to self-quarantine due to concerns related to COVID-19.
- The employee is experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 and seeking a medical diagnosis.
- The employee is caring for an individual who is subject to (1) a federal, state, or local quarantine or isolation order related to COVID-19; or (2) advice by a healthcare provider to self-quarantine due to concerns related to COVID-19.
- The employee is caring for a son or daughter of the employee if the school or place of care of the son or daughter has closed or the child care provider of such son or daughter is unavailable due to COVID-19 precautions.
- The employee is experiencing any other substantially similar condition specified by the Secretary of Health and Human Services in consultation with the Secretary of the Treasury and the Department of Labor.

; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oelwein will only provide the additional leaves to employees who have not exhausted their leave in 2020; and

WHEREAS, the two weeks of additional leave will only be used for illness related to the Coronavirus; and

WHEREAS, the city will not extend the leave of 10 weeks of paid expanded family and medical leave at two-thirds the employee's regular rate of pay where an employee is unable to work due to a bona fide need for leave to care for a child whose school or child care provider is closed or unavailable for reasons related to Coronavirus; and

WHEREAS, the city shall extend the expansion of the emergency sick leave so that employees can use their accumulated sick time to attend to anyone in their family (as defined in the City's Personnel Manual) for Coronavirus related illness; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Oelwein, Iowa voluntarily extends leave from the Emergency Family and Medical Leave Expansion Act with special provisions along with the extension of the expansion emergency sick leave until June 30, 2021.

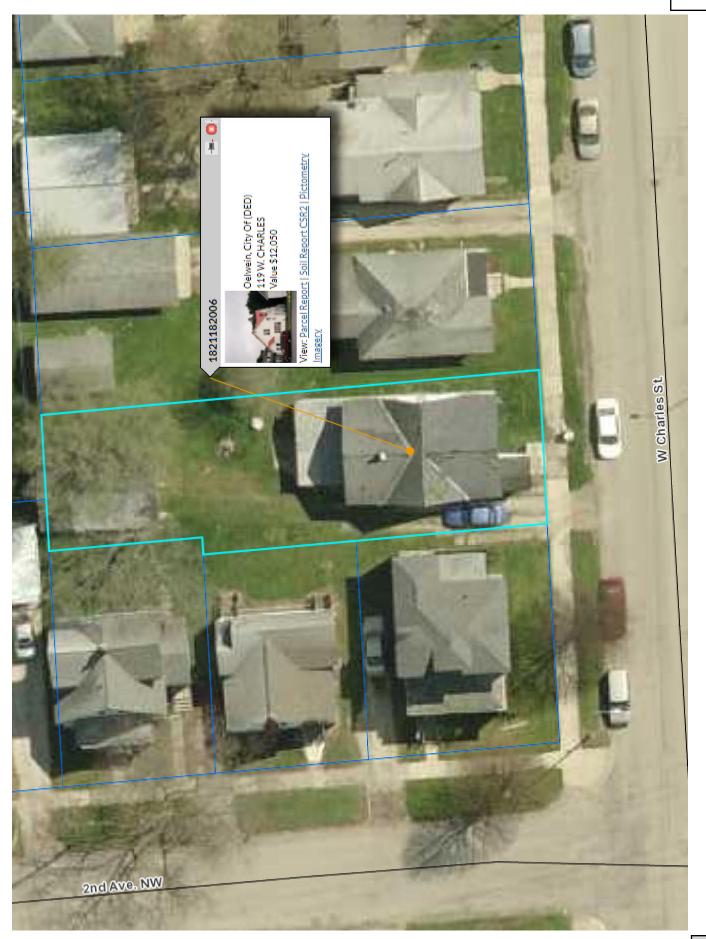

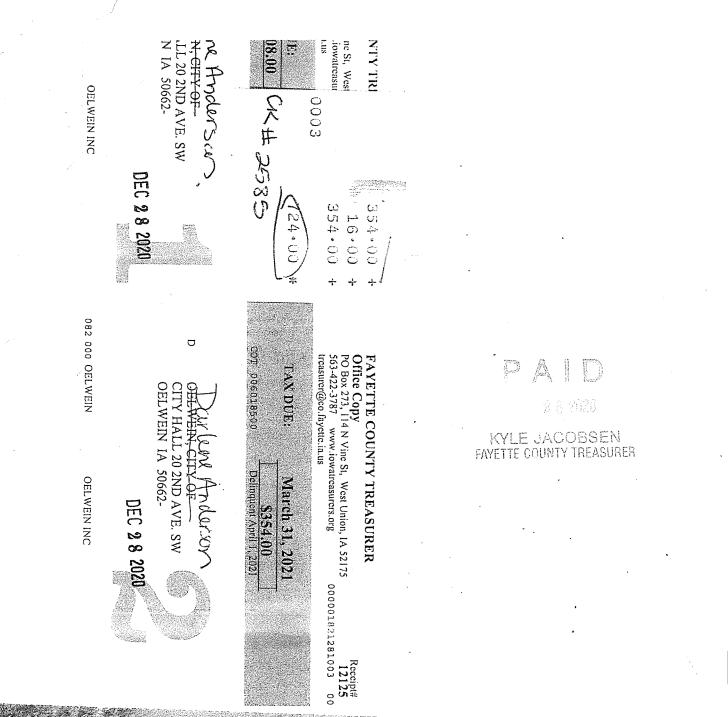

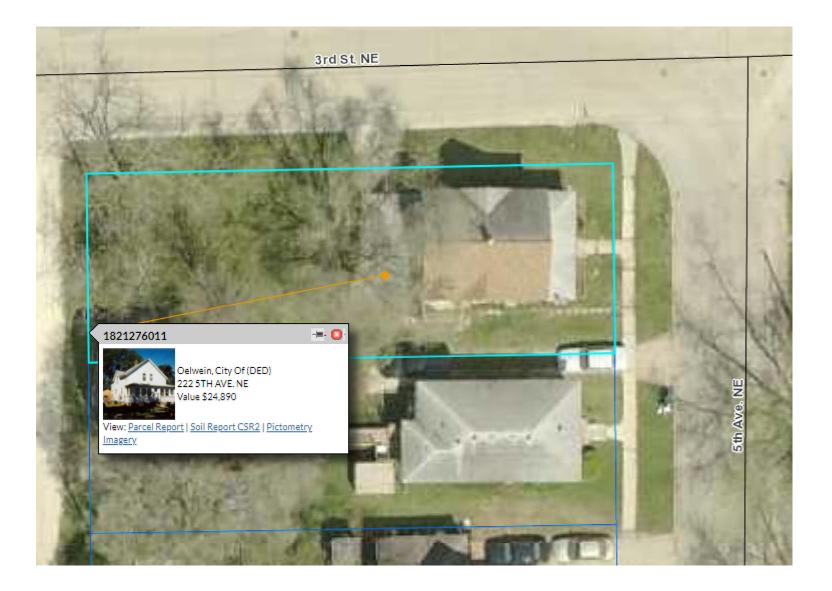

- 1. Dennis Paul Recognition of 34 Years of Service
  - 1. The City thanks and appreciates Denny's service to the city.

#### Consent Agenda

- 2. Consideration of a motion to approve the minutes of the December 21, 2020 Council minutes with the correction to Consent Agenda Claims Resolution in the amount of \$651,189.21
  - 1. The wrong number was provided to council after a misread from a spreadsheet. All checks were paid and no issues occurred, however the amount must be corrected formally.
- 3. Consideration of a Class 'B' Native Wine Permit Refund for Farmers Daughters Quilts
  - 1. This business applied for the wrong permit. They are requesting a refund and will apply for the correct permit after talking to their insurance company.

#### Resolutions

- 4. Consideration of a Resolution Setting date for public hearing on 2021 amendment to urban renewal plan for Central Urban Renewal Area
  - This public hearing will allow the city to capture more funds for the downtown improvement program. The program has been successful in helping 10 building owners and providing \$125,000 in funding in two years. New funding will help even more building with their roofs, windows, HVAC, and upper story housing. The City Administrator recommends setting the date for the public hearing.
- 5. Consideration of a Resolution Voluntarily Extending Leave from the Emergency Family and Medical Leave Expansion Act
  - The federal government ended their expanded FMLA. Local governments have the option to extend it for their organizations. Expanding this option will ensure all employees have this benefit during the pandemic. The goal is that each employee can have access should they need the expanded sick time. The progress of the vaccine will be monitored and will play into this benefit. The City Administrator recommends approving the resolution.
- Consideration of a Resolution Directing the Sale of the City's Interest in 17 1st Street NE, 19 1st Street NE, 102 1st Avenue NE, 225 2nd Avenue SE, 119 West Charles, 129 5th Avenue NE, 322 4th Avenue SE, 222 5th Avenue NE, Oelwein, Fayette County, Iowa



1. The City is ready to sell properties. Each property is going to an adjacent property except for 225 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave SE. While the original plan was to offer to adjacent property owners, council did discuss trying to get as much money as possible for each property. Council will need to decide with the information provided if they want to pull this sale and only approach the adjacent property owner. The City was approached by the interested buyer before we advertised that we would be selling properties. The City Administrator recommends approving the resolution.

#### Motions

- 7. Consideration of a motion approving Pay Request to Lansing Brothers Construction in the amount of \$51,700.00 for 2020 House Demolition Project Group 5
  - 1. All work has been completed to pay this request. The City Administrator recommends approving the pay request.
- 8. Consideration of a recommendation from Planning, Finance, Enterprise and Economic Development Committee re: Demolition Assistance Application for 820 3rd Avenue SW
- 9. Consideration of a motion to postpone rental inspections due to Covid-19
  - There is no current metric that the city uses to determine if rental inspection should be paused. While the city could use positivity rate, picking a number to go by is arbitrary. Fayette County as of January 7 has a 19 percent 14 day positivity rate. The seven-day positivity rate is 12 percent. It is the recommendation of the City Administrator to continue to push back the start date of rental inspections to March 1, 2021 and hopefully allow for more vaccinations to occur in Oelwein.
- 10. Consideration of a motion to approve Pay Request No. 1 to Maguire Iron in the amount of \$189,496.30 for work completed on West Elevated Water Storage Tank
  - 1. Work has been completed as Maguire pauses before coming back in the spring. The City Administrator recommends approving the pay request.



#### PARKS MONTHLY REPORT, DECEMBER 2020 PARKS / CEMETERY / AQUATICS / CAMPGROUND / TRAILS

#### **Park and Recreation**

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This month in the park department, we have been completing our daily disinfecting of areas and cleaning the downtown every morning. I have been meeting with contractors for competing bids on several projects. We received the replacement slide for Red Gate Park, which we found, was damaged when we checked the equipment over from the first delivery. We spread more milkweed seed at Red Gate Park to develop a monarch waystation as a part of our pollinator project. Jay has been busy with the maintenance of the equipment this past week. Jay also took the south gate off City Park to straighten it out and paint it. We finished painting the office at the park maintenance building, which was in need of some fresh paint as we hold committee meetings their now. The trails committee met this week on Tuesday evening to go over our progress on writing grants, easements, and raising funds. I got the committee to start work on the state recreation trails grant through the DOT for matching funds for future trail development. On Wednesday morning, I attended a zoom meeting with upper explorer land with the enhancement committee where we talked about TAP funding for trails. At Woodlawn, we will have a full burial on Friday that we will be preparing this morning. Jay and I took advantage of the final warm weather with the help of Chris and Dan with the Cemetery to install the roof structure for the shelter job at Platt Park. The foundation was failing on the old structure so we were able to pull the roof off and save it as we will replace some trim pieces and paint the top in the spring to finish this job. The employees will also finish pouring the sidewalk to the north to connect to the east/west sidewalk to make this shelter wheelchair accessible and will install a drinking fountain as well. Saturday the 12<sup>th</sup> we came in to clear sidewalks from the snow event we received the previous night. I made an order for supplies in bulk for the upcoming season from rite price this past week. Jay has been continuing his efforts with the maintenance of the equipment at the shop. We had 2 cremation burials and 2 full burials at Woodlawn Cemetery this month. Dylan and I met with Doug Bryan again to look further into the Lake Oelwein project to knock out some details. I talked with the DNR Decorah fish hatchery to let them know where we were with his project and gave them a good idea of what fish the campers have been catching in the lake the last several years. I have been talking with the contractors about the red gate project so they have their information to City Hall before they start and we will met last week so everyone is on the same page with timelines. Last week I met with Fayette county economic development and tourism director, Mallory Hanson to demonstrate their trail counters that we are looking to purchase for the City to give us some much needed data point for grant writing. Both Mallory and Fayette county conservation director, Rod Marlatt came to Oelwein to talk with the trails committee to offer their assistance with trail development this past month.

Registered Sex Offenders against Minors January 21, 2010 Reviewed 4/9/15, 6/12/18, 9/8/20 Revised 10/20/11, 1/12/21

- The purpose of this policy is to ensure that the Library is in compliance with Iowa State law that excludes sex offenders (defined as a person who is required to be registered in the Iowa Sex Offender Registry) convicted of sex offenses against minors from public libraries. This policy adopts the definitions of Iowa Code Chapter 692A, as amended
- The Library Director acts as "library administrator" for purposes of Iowa Chapter 692A. The Library Director may give the written permission required by Iowa Code Section 692A.113(f) for sex offenders convicted of sex offenses against minors to be present on library property. Such permission may be granted after consultation with law enforcement and/or other appropriate governmental officials. The Director will give strong deference to the recommendations of law enforcement personnel. Permission may be granted only for a single, specific visit. Individuals may appeal this decision, as it relates to them, to the Library Board of Trustees.
- Sex offenders convicted of sex offenses against minors may be eligible for some library service.
  - They may register for a card directly via telephone or by designee.
  - They may access information resources via telephone or online.
  - They may make arrangements for a person of their choosing to select, check out, and return materials using that card.
  - Under any of these circumstances, the sex offender convicted of sex offenses against minors will remain responsible for all activity on their card.
  - The issuance of a library card to individuals who have been convicted of a sex offense involving a minor does not grant those individuals permission to enter the library or to be present on library property.
- Persons barred from library property under the law will not be served by the library's homebound delivery service.
- Registered sex offenders convicted of sex offenses against minors may not loiter, as defined under Iowa Code Section 692A.113(g), as amended, within three hundred (300) feet of library property.
- Violations of this policy will be immediately reported to law enforcement.
