



#### **Summary:**

Review of the Adopted budget with amendment-1 for Fiscal Year 2022 2023.

#### **GENERAL SUMMARY/BACKGROUND:**

It is common practice to routinely review actual and anticipated expenditures associated with an adopted budget and make periodic adjustments, including a more significant Year End adjustment. Based on anticipated costs/savings associated with current budget commitments, staff is proposing a series of budget changes.

#### **Context & Staff Analysis:**

A budget amendment to the General Fund (1), Henderson Fund (51), Special Revenue Fund (100), Debt Service Fund (220) =, Cemetery Fund (450) and ARPA Fund (110) fiscal year 2023 budget is requested to appropriate additional revenue estimated from Ad Valorem tax, Building Permits, Site Plan review and others see attached exhibit A.

It is now necessary to amend the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Budget to reflect the total budget increase of \$104,833.00. Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends approval of the budget amendment for Fiscal Year 2023, as proposed.

#### **BUDGET IMPACT:**

Positive revenue from donations, but budget-neutral otherwise as it is a reallocation of funds within the General Fund

**WHEREAS**, the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 budget was adopted by the City Commission of the City of Pahokee, Florida (the "City") on November 13, 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, Budget Amendment No. 1 set forth in Exhibit "A", will increase the current budget for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 from \$9,638,585.00 to \$9,743,418.00 a difference of \$104,833.00: and

**WHEREAS**, the General Fund will increase both revenues and expenditures by \$687,610.00 to account for unexpected revenues and expenditures for day-to-day operations; and

**WHEREAS**, the Henderson Fund will increase both revenues and expenditures by \$15,594.00 to account for unexpected revenues due to increase in interest rate to cover expenses Cemetery Fund; and

**WHEREAS**, the Special Revenue Fund will increase both revenues and expenditures by \$22,268.00 to account for unexpected revenues and expenditures for Early pay-off of Note Payable; and

**WHEREAS**, the Debt Service Fund will increase both revenues and expenditures by \$22,801.00 to account for unexpected revenues and expenditures for Early pay-off of Note Payable; and

**WHEREAS**, the Cemetery Fund will increase both revenues and expenditures by \$37,000.00 to account for unexpected revenues and expenditures for day-to-day operations; and

**WHEREAS**, the ARPA Fund will decrease both revenues and expenditures by \$680,440.00 to account for unexpected deferral of both revenues and expenditures; and

**WHEREAS**, it is now necessary to amend the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Budget to reflect the total budget increase of \$104,833.00.

**WHEREAS**, the City Commission of the City of Pahokee, Florida, finds that approving Budget Amendment No. 1, attached hereto as Exhibit "A", is in the best interest of the City and its residents.

#### **GENERAL SUMMARY/BACKGROUND:**

Barfield Highway Change Order #24— This change order is for Barfield Highway Reconstruction. The change order is for compensation to Rosso Site Development (contractor) for additional exploratory work due to an unforeseen AT&T manhole drainage structure.

Rosso will perform the exploratory excavation work at S-143 & S-144, at Barack Obama/ 1<sup>st</sup> Street and Barfield Highway. Based on AT&T not being able to promptly relocate the manhole. Once this exploratory work is completed the design EOR will make the appropriate adjustments for the design.

The contractor, Rosso Site Development is entitled to compensation for the exploratory excavation for the AT&T manhole structure S-143 & S-144.

\$5,644.63 will be granted for this change order. FDOT will be covering the cost for this item.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE **PAHOKEE** FLORIDA. CITY OF APPROVING CHANGE ORDER NO. 24, AS SET FORTH IN EXHIBIT "A", PERTAINING TO RESOLUTION #2021-02 AND THE **FLORIDA** DEPARTMENT TRANSPORTATION (FDOT) **GRANT FUNDING** AWARD, CONTRACT G-1753, FM# 442030-01-54-1 IN CONNECTION WITH THE BARFIELD HIGHWAY RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 2019-14 adopted by the City Commission of the City of Pahokee, Florida ("CITY") on March 26, 2019, the City and the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) entered into a grant funding Agreement for Construction and Construction Inspection (CEI) Engineering Services pertaining to S. Barfield Road from East Main Street to East 7th Street; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution 2021-02, the City approved the grant funding award for the reconstruction of Barfield Highway in the amount of \$3,891,096.63 to Rosso Site Development, Inc. and authorized the Mayor to execute the necessary agreement; and

WHEREAS, the contractor has encountered an existing AT&T manhole drainage structure at Barack Obama/1st Street and Barfield Highway that was not shown on the original plans; and

WHEREAS, a change order is necessary to compensate Rosso Site Development, Inc. for the exploratory excavation work at the AT&T manhole drainage structure S-143 and S-144; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Pahokee finds that a Change Order #24 is necessary to compensate the contractor in the amount of \$5,644.63 for the exploratory excavation work located at S-143 and S-144 of the AT&T manhole drainage structure for the Barfield Highway Reconstruction Project: and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, FLORIDA, AS IT FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Adoption of Representations.</u> The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby confirmed as being true, and the same are hereby made a specific part of this resolution.

## ORDINANCE NO. 2023 - <u>08</u>

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING A POLICY FOR THE DISPOSAL OF CITY-OWNED SURPLUS PROPERTY; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 166.021(1), Florida Statutes, municipalities have the power and authority to acquire and dispose of real property and other property declared surplus for a valid municipal purpose; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the Pahokee ("City Commission") desires to establish a policy for the disposal of city-owned surplus property determined obsolete or for which the continued use is uneconomical or inefficient, or which serves no useful function; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission further desires to establish a policy wherein the City of Pahokee can account for the sale, trade, donation and/or conveyance of real property and other property declared surplus; and

WHEREAS, any property owned by the City which has become obsolete, or which has outlived its usefulness, or which has become inadequate for the public purposes for which it was intended, or which is no longer needed for public purposes, may be declared surplus property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

#### Section 1. Adoption of Representations.

The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and the same are hereby made a specific part of this Ordinance.

#### Section 2.

The City Commission of the City of Pahokee hereby declares that any property owned by the City which has become obsolete, or which has outlived its usefulness, or

which has become inadequate for the public purposes for which it was intended, or which is no longer needed for public purposes, may be disposed of in accordance with the procedures set forth herein.

#### Section 3.

The City Commission desires to dispose of property in accordance with the following procedures:

- 1. The City Manager, after evaluation and good faith analysis, shall advise the City Commission in a written memorandum reasons why certain property should be declared surplus property.
- 2. Once the City Manager prepares a written Memorandum addressed to the Commission, a surplus Resolution shall be prepared by the City Attorney and shall be placed on the next available City Commission Meeting Agenda.
- 3. Under no circumstances may the City Manager dispose of City-owned property in the absence of a Resolution of the City Commission deeming the subject property as surplus property.
- 4. The City Manager shall then determine the most appropriate method to dispose of surplus items and report the decision at the next regular City Commission meeting. Such methods may include, but shall not be limited to, the following:
  - (a) Annual surplus equipment sale; (b) Sale; (c) Trade; (d) Donation.
- 5. The City Manager may require a surety bond for certain property, as the City Manager may deem appropriate.
- 6. The City Manager shall then advertise in a newspaper of general circulation that the disposal the surplus will be awarded by sealed bid or auction and awarded to the highest bidder. The City Manager may reject any and all bids as he/she deems appropriate.
- 7. Proceeds from the sale of the property shall go into the general fund of the City, unless the equipment was acquired by utilizing police forfeiture funds.

#### Section 4. Severability.

If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

#### Section 5. Inclusion in Code.

It is hereby the intention of the Commission of the City of Pahokee and it is hereby provided that the provisions of this Ordinance may become and be made a part of the Code of Pahokee, Florida.

#### Section 6. Conflict and Repealer.

All ordinances, parts of ordinances or code provisions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

#### Section 7. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage.
