Measure V Oversight Committee Meeting Minutes

4:00 PM – April 25, 2023

1. OPENING

The April 25, 2023 meeting of the Measure V Citizen Oversight was called to order by Sharon Simonton at 4:00 p.m. who led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT: Ronald Baker, Patricia Elkerton, Gail Larsen (joined via Teams at 4:12 p.m.), George Morris, Jr., Chris Rehmann, Dee Riley, Sharon Simonton, Vice Chair.

BOARD MEMBERS ABSENT: Chris Buzzard, Linda Dye and Gail Larsen (joined via Teams at 4:12 p.m.)

Interim Town Manager Marc Mattox introduced Senior Accountant Emily Marchi.

2. ITEMS

2a. **MOTION by Elkerton, seconded by Morris,** Approved minutes from the April 4, 2023 Special Measure V Oversight Committee meeting. Roll call vote was unanimous with Buzzard, Dye and Larsen absent and not voting.

2b. Senior Accountant Emily Marchi provided an update on the final 2nd quarter report of the MVOC for the fiscal year ending in 2022/2023.

MOTION by Rehmann, seconded by Morris, Approved the final 2nd quarter report from the Measure V Citizens Oversight Committee to the residents of the Town of Paradise for the fiscal year ending 2022/2023. Roll call vote was unanimous with Buzzard and Dye absent and not voting.

2c. Senior Accountant Emily Marchi provided a preliminary report on the 3rd quarter report of the MVOC for the fiscal year ending in 2022/2023.

MOTION by Morris, seconded by Elkerton, Approved the preliminary report from the Measure V Citizens Oversight Committee to the residents of Paradise for the 3rd quarter of the 2022/2023 fiscal year. Roll call vote was unanimous with Buzzard and Dye absent and not voting.

2d. Interim Town Manager Marc Mattox provided an overview of the proposed Measure V budget for the 2023/2024 fiscal year including updates on the police and fire vehicles on order; the new fire station to be built on Pearson; fleet

management equipment; and animal control salaries which have been reduced to a proposed \$100,000 to be taken out of Measure V revenues.

MOTION by Elkerton, seconded by Morris, Approved the proposed Measure V expenditures for the 2023/2024 fiscal year. Roll call vote was unanimous with Buzzard and Dye absent and not voting.

2e. **MOTION by Riley, seconded by Rehmann,** Approved the cancellation of the May 23, 2023 Measure V Oversight Committee Budget meeting. Roll call vote was unanimous with Buzzard and Dye absent and not voting.

Town Clerk Dina Volenski handed out a roster of all MVOC members at Chair Buzzard's request.

Paradise Residents Elected Officials Citizen Stakeholders

Paradise residents voted in Measure C, a half percent (0.50%) transaction and use tax, effective April 1, 2015, which automatically expired March 31, 2021. During the November 6, 2018 election, Paradise residents voted in Measure V, a ten year continuation of Measure C, effective April 1, 2021. The ballot measure requires a nine person citizen oversight committee to ensure the funds are spent in accordance with the voter approved measure. The language states, in part, the funds will be used to preserve public services such as police protection, fire suppression, street maintenance, animal control, and other services for residents of the Town of Paradise.

Attached is the final quarterly report from the Citizen's Oversight Committee to the residents of Paradise for the 3rd quarter of the 2022/23 fiscal year. The Committee meets quarterly and all meetings are open to the public. The Committee will report every quarter on revenues and expenditures.
