TOWN OF PARADISE RESOLUTION NO. 14-

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PARADISE DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND AUTHORIZING ABATEMENT AND REPAIR AT FIRE STATION 81 WITHOUT OBSERVANCE OF PUBLIC BIDDING REQUIREMENTS

WHEREAS, on September 25, 2014, there was a strong rain storm that severely damaged Fire Station 81 at 767 Birch Street, Paradise; and,

WHEREAS, based on the memorandum attached hereto, the damage to Fire Station 81 must be abated and repaired immediately to timely provide fire protection and rescue services to Paradise citizens; and,

WHEREAS, to protect the health and safety of the public, the Town must take swift action to immediately abate and repair the damage to Fire Station 81.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PARADISE as follows:

Section 1. The above statements are true and correct.

Section 2. The above facts constitute an emergency situation.

<u>Section 3.</u> Based upon the above facts, the Council finds that competitive solicitation for bids to repair Fire Station 81 at 767 Birch Street, Paradise, would cause the level of fire protection and medical rescue services to be inadequate. In addition, the public interest and necessity demand the immediate expenditure of public money to safeguard life, health and property by hiring private contractors to abate the damage and to repair Fire Station 81 at 767 Birch Street, Paradise, without observance of the requirements of the Public Contract Code relating to public works contracts, bids and notices.

<u>Section 4.</u> The Town Manager is authorized to execute contracts with contractors to abate and repair Fire Station 81 in accordance with the Town's property insurance guidelines and to take whatever actions are necessary to implement this Resolution.

SUBJECT: Urgency relating to rain damage at Fire Station 81

DATE: October 1, 2014

In the early morning hours of September 25, 2014, the Town of Paradise experienced an unexpectedly strong rain storm that severely damaged Fire Station 81 at 767 Birch Street, Paradise. At the time of the storm the station was staffed with fire crews; however, due to the severity of damage the crew has to be relocated to Station 83 at 1250 Wagstaff Rd. until such time that Station 81 can be restored to a livable condition. Estimates to remove water and dry the structure, demolish and abate structural items that were damaged beyond repair, and reconstruct the station to a livable condition are very preliminary at this point, but will exceed the \$5,000 property insurance deductible.

As a result of the rain storm, the following damage was done to the building: Significant water damaged throughout the station and apparatus bay (garage) including, exterior and interior walls and sheetrock, within the void space in the ceiling including sheetrock and insulation, and behind and in cabinets throughout the station, flooring and some station furnishing and contents.

In order to provide timely fire and rescue services to the citizens of Paradise, the damage at the fire station must be corrected immediately based on the following facts: Station 81 provides emergency fire and rescue services to a large portion of the Town of Paradise including the central, south and west geographical areas. The inability to staff and respond from Station 81 will severely delay response to these areas of Town jeopardizing public safety as engines will now have to respond a greater distance from Station 82 at 5545 South Libby Rd. in southeast Paradise and Station 83 in north central Paradise to cover the Station 81 primary response area.
