 - A. If you wish to address the Council regarding a specific agenda item, please complete a “Request to Address Council” card and give it to the Town Clerk prior to the beginning of the meeting. This process is voluntary and allows for citizens to be called to the speaker podium in alphabetical order. Comments and questions from the public must be directed to the Presiding Chair and Town Council Members (please do not address staff.) Town staff is available to address citizen concerns Monday through Thursday at Town Hall between the hours of 8am and 5pm.

In compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Compliance, persons who need special accommodations to participate in the Town Council meeting may contact the Town Clerk at least three business days prior to the date of the meeting to provide time for any such accommodation.

URGENCY ORDINANCE NO. 624**

**AN URGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE
TOWN OF PARADISE AMENDING URGENCY ORDINANCE NO. 612 RELATING TO
INTERIM HOUSING, ACCESSORY BUILDING(S) AND UNOCCUPIED
RECREATIONAL VEHICLES INSIDE THE CAMP FIRE AREA**

The Town Council of the Town of Paradise does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Emergency Findings.

This Urgency Ordinance is adopted pursuant to California Government Code Section 36934 and shall take effect immediately upon its approval by at least a four-fifths vote of the Town Council. The Council finds that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, based upon facts set forth in this Ordinance. The Council also finds that there is a significant need for Town residents who are currently in compliance with the Town code to have additional time to rebuild their primary residences.

Section 2. Extension of Urgency Ordinance

Section 19 of Urgency Ordinance 612 is hereby amended to read as follows, "This Ordinance shall expire on April 30, 2024."

Section 3. CEQA Exemption.

Adoption of this Ordinance is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to California Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(3) regarding projects to maintain, repair, restore, or replace property or facilities damaged or destroyed as a result of a declared disaster and Section 21080(b)(4) regarding actions to mitigate or prevent an emergency,

1 and CEQA Guidelines Section 15269(a) regarding maintaining,
2 repairing, restoring, demolishing, or replacing property or
3 facilities damaged or destroyed as a result of a disaster stricken
4 area in which a state of emergency has been proclaimed by the
5 Governor pursuant to the California Emergency Services Act,
6 commencing with Section 8550 of the California Government Code.

7 **Section 4. Severability.**

8 If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this
9 Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid,
10 such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining
11 portion of this Ordinance. The Town Council hereby declares that
12 it would have passed this Ordinance and every section, subsection,
13 sentence, clause or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that
14 any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or
15 phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

16 **Section 5. Effective Date and Publication.**

17 This Ordinance shall be and the same is hereby declared to be in
18 full force and effect immediately upon its passage by a four-
19 fifths (4/5) or greater vote. The Town Clerk of the Town of
20 Paradise is authorized and directed to publish a summary of this
21 Ordinance before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its
22 passage. This Ordinance shall be published once, with the names
23 of the members of the Town Council Members voting for and against
24 it, in the Paradise Post, a newspaper of general circulation
25 published in the Town of Paradise, State of California. A complete
26 copy of this Ordinance is on file with the Town Clerk of the Town

1 Council and is available for public inspection and copying during
2 regular business hours in the office of the Town Clerk.
