1. Ranked Choice Voting Presentation



AN OPEN PRIMARY IS A PRIMARY ELECTION THAT DOES NOT REQUIRE A VOTER TO DECLARE THEIR PARTY AFFILIATION TO PARTICIPATE.

HOW OPEN PRIMARIES WORK

- ALL voters will use the same unified primary ballot where they will select the ONE candidate they like best in each race regardless of party.
- Top four vote-getters will advance to the general election.


RANKED CHOICE CENERAL ELECTIONS

RANKED CHOICE VOTING ALLOWS VOTERS TO RANK CANDIDATES IN ORDER OF PREFERENCE.

VOTERS CAN RANK AS MANY OR AS FEW CANDIDATES AS THEY WOULD LIKE.




WHERE IS RANKED CHOICE VOTING USED?



- Presidential Primaries in 2020
- RCV used for Primaries and special elections
- RCV planned for General Elections in 2022
- RCV used for Statewide/Presidential Primaries
- RCV used for Party Elections
 RCV used for state/federal elections
- Ranked Ballots used for Military & Overseas Voting

SAMPLE GENERAL BALLOT



A candidate's designated affiliation does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the political party or group approves of or associates with that candidate, but only that the candidate is registered as affiliated with the political party or political group.



HOW TO USE YOUR BALLOT!

- Step 1: Choose your top candidate. This is your first-choice candidate and will be the vote that is considered first.
- Step 2: If you have a second choice (not required), you may select another candidate. This **must** be different from your first-choice candidate.
- Step 3: If you have a third or fourth choice (not required), you may choose another selection. This **must** be different from your first and second choices.







- The official winner will not be declared until all votes are counted including early, election day, affidavit and absentee votes.
- Round by round vote totals will be released to the public.

RCV BENEFITS

- Eliminates the spoiler effect,
- Helps ensure that winners are elected with the support of a true majority of voters.
- Building a winning coalition requires a combination of strong 1st choice support and an ability to find common ground with the supporters of other candidates.

QUICK RECAP

- Alaska's elections are changing in 2022.
- Now is the time to prepare and educate.
- Change #1: Open Primaries
 - Increase participation among all Alaskans
 - All voter receive the same ballot, vote for one candidate
 - Top 4 voter getters move on.
- Change #2: Ranked Choice Voting in General Election.
 - Voter rank as few or as many candidates as they like
 - Winner must get majority support
 - Counting will be transparent

SPECIAL ELECTION UPDATE:

June 11: Special primary election; by mail

August 16: Special general for US House using Ranked Choice Voting AND regular primary election

November 8 : Regular election using Ranked Choice Voting


