2. <u>Conduct Public Hearing for intent of the City of Port Lavaca to establish the Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) Program. Presenter is Jody Weaver</u>

3. <u>Consider Resolution No. R-031422-1 of the City of Port Lavaca to Establish the Property</u> Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) Program. Presenter is Jody Weaver

Motion made by Councilman District 2 Dent

WHEREAS, the 83rd Regular Session of the Texas Legislature enacted the Property Assessed Clean Energy Act, Texas Local Government Code Chapter 399 (the "PACE Act"), which allows the governing body of a local government, including a City or County, to designate an area of the territory of the local government as a region within which an authorized representative of a local government and the record owners of commercial, industrial, and large multifamily residential (5 or more dwelling units) real property may enter into written contracts to impose assessments on the property to repay the financing by the owners of permanent improvements fixed to the property intended to decrease energy or water consumption or demand;

WHEREAS, the installation or modification by property owners of qualified energy or water saving improvements to commercial, industrial, and large multifamily residential real property in the City of Port Lavaca, Texas will further the goals of energy and water conservation without cost to the public;

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that third-party financing of energy and water conserving projects through contractual assessments maintained by the City ("PACE financing") furthers essential government purposes, including but not limited to, economic development, reducing energy consumption and costs, conserving water resources, and reducing greenhouse gas emissions;

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted a Resolution of Intent to establish a PACE program for City on February 14, 2022, including a reference to the report on the proposed program prepared as required by Section 399.009 of the PACE Act and made the report available to the public on the City's website and for inspection in the City Manager's office;

WHEREAS, The City Council finds that the administration of the PACE program by a qualified non-profit organization as an independent third-party Authorized Representative contracted by the City and compensated by application and administration fees paid by the participating property owners, will enable the program to be administered without use of City resources, will assure the objectives of impartiality and confidentiality of owner information, and will be convenient and advantageous to the City;

WHEREAS, the City Council also finds that because no City funds will be expended for PACE financing of the Authorized Representative's services, the selection of such an independent third-party Authorized Representative is not subject to the Professional Services Procurement Act or other City purchasing requirements; and


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WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing on March 14, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. in the in the Council Chambers at City Hall, 202 n. Virginia Street, Port Lavaca, Texas 77979, at which the public hearing could comment on the proposed program, including the report available for public inspection as mentioned above and as required by Section 399.008(a)(2).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT LAVACA, TEXAS:

- 1. **Recitals.** The recitals to this Resolution are true and correct and are incorporated into this resolution for all purposes.
- 2. <u>Establishment of Program.</u> The City hereby adopts this Resolution Establishing the City of Port Lavaca Property Assessed Clean Energy Program ("Port Lavaca PACE"), herein called "the Program," and finds that financing qualified projects through contractual assessments pursuant to the PACE Act is a valid public purpose and is convenient and advantageous to the City and its citizens.
- 3. <u>Contractual Assessments.</u> The City will, at the property owner's request, impose contractual assessments on the property to repay PACE financing for qualified energy and water conserving projects available to owners of privately owned commercial, industrial, and large multifamily property.
- 4. **Qualified Projects.** The following types of projects are qualified projects for PACE financing that may be subject to such contractual assessments:
 - Projects that (a) involve the installation or modification of a permanent improvement fixed
 to privately owned commercial, industrial, or residential real property with five (5) or more
 dwelling units, and (b) are intended to decrease energy or water consumption or demand,
 including a product, device, or interacting group of products or devices on the customer's
 side of the meter that uses energy technology to generate electricity, provide thermal energy,
 or regulate temperature.
 - An assessment may not be imposed to repay the financing of facilities for undeveloped lots or lots undergoing development at the time of the assessment, or the purchase or installation of products or devices not permanently fixed to real property.
- 5. <u>Region.</u> The boundaries of the entire geographic area within the City's jurisdiction, including its extraterritorial jurisdiction, are included in the boundaries of the region where PACE financing and assessments can occur.
- 6. Third- Party Financing. Financing for qualified projects under the Program will be provided by qualified third-party lenders chosen by the owners. Such lenders will execute written contracts with the Authorized Representative to service the debt through assessments, as required by the PACE Act. The contracts will provide for the lenders to determine the financial ability of owners to fulfill the financial obligations to be repaid through assessments, advance the funds to owners on such terms as are agreed between the lenders and the owners for the installation or modification of qualified projects, and service the debt secured by the assessments, directly or through a servicer, by collecting payments from the owners pursuant to financing documents executed between the lenders and the owners. The City will maintain and continue the assessments for the benefit of such lenders and will enforce the assessment lien for the benefit

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of a lender in the event of a default by an owner. The City will not, at this time, provide financing of any sort for the Port Lavaca PACE program.

- 7. Authorized Representative. The City Council will designate Texas PACE Authority, a non-profit organization, to act as the Authorized Representative with authority to enter into written contracts with the record owners of real property in the City to impose assessments pursuant to the PACE Act to repay the financing of qualified projects on the owners' property, to enter into written contracts with the parties that provide third-party financing for such projects to service the debts through assessments, and to file written notice of each contractual assessment in the real property records of Calhoun County, all on behalf of the City. The Authorized Representative may, make technical and conforming updates as necessary so long as the changes are consistent with the resolution to establish the PACE program and the statute. The City Manager or her designee will be the liaison with the Authorized Representative.
- 8. **Enforcement.** The City will enforce the collection of past due assessments and may contract with a qualified law firm to assist in collection efforts.
- 9. **Report.** The final report on the Port Lavaca PACE program, prepared in accordance with Section 399.009 of the Texas Local Government Code is attached and incorporated into this resolution. The City will post the resolution and report on the City's website.
- 10. <u>Amendment of Program.</u> The City Council may amend the Port Lavaca PACE Program by resolution. However, another public hearing is required before the Program may be amended to provide for City financing of qualified improvements through assessments.

4. <u>Consider a Services Agreement authorizing administration of Texas Property Assessed</u> <u>Clean Energy (PACE) Program for the City of Port Lavaca. Presenter is Jody Weaver</u>

Former Development Services Director Carpenter was in attendance via ZOOM to address Council. She said that the Texas Property Assessed Clean Energy (TX-PACE) is a voluntary program that creates jobs, improves the environment, and saves Texas companies money on their utility bills. Local governments across the state are taking advantage of the Texas PACE statute and establishing programs to further provide quality and valuable services to their constituencies, stakeholders, and taxpayers.

The Texas PACE Act, Chapter 399 of the Local Government Code, is a local adoption model. The Texas "PACE in a Box" model was created by over 130 PACE stakeholders to facilitate a consistent, user-friendly approach to TX-PACE design and implementation. The model has been unanimously adopted by every local government establishing a TX-PACE program in Texas.

The model plug and play program contains consumer protection underwriting and technical best practices and model documents. "PACE in a Box" has minimal impact on government staff, adds no additional cost to the general taxpayer or burden to the treasury, and is administered by a nonprofit that does not

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compete with the private sector. Texas PACE Authority administers the uniform "PACE in a Box" model as a public service on behalf of local governments and is funded through user fees and grants.

PACE is 100% financing for energy and water efficiency improvements to industrial, commercial, multifamily residential, and non-profit buildings. PACE is essentially a long-term (typically 10-20 year), low-cost loan for such improvements as:

- HVAC modification or replacement
- Light fixture modifications such as LED
- Solar panels
- Solar hot water
- Gray water reuse
- Rainwater collection system
- Water use efficiency improvements
- Energy or water-efficient manufacturing processes and/or equipment
- Automated energy control systems
- Insulation, caulking, weather-stripping or air sealing
- High-efficiency windows or doors

Staff recommends approval of a Services Agreement authorizing administration of Texas Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) Program for the City of Port Lavaca.







9. <u>Consider City of Port Lavaca's annual optional Homestead Tax exemption within the Calhoun County Appraisal District for the 2022 tax year. Presenter is Susan Lang</u>

Finance Director Lang advised Council that each year, the governing bodies are asked to review their Optional Homestead, 65 and Over, and Disable Person exemptions for the coming tax year. Calhoun County's Appraisal District has asked that we notify the Appraisal District no later than April 1, 2022, if any changes are to be made for the 2022 tax year.

Local Optional Homestead Exemption

Just as the title says, this exemption is *optional*, and is up to the local jurisdiction to determine (within the guidelines of the State Legislature) the amount of exemption granted. Fiscal Year 2021-22 is the second year for the City to grant this optional exemption on a principal residence at the rate of 10%. Sixty-one percent (61%) of Single-Family residences in the City take advantage of this generous exemption. This exemption affords homeowners, collectively, with \$27,547,535 in reduced value against their property taxes, which amounts to 5% of the City's total taxable property values.

For the average homestead, the reduction amounts to a savings of \$88.50 per year in property taxes. For the City, this exemption reduces the property tax revenue by over \$200,000 each year.

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The City has the option to grant the Homestead exemption up to a maximum of 20%, but the minimum exemption cannot be less than \$5,000, if granted. Meaning, if the value of a Homestead is such that the current 10% exemption only grants \$3,500 in exempt value, the exemption, by default, will amount to \$5,000 as a minimum.

Local Optional 65 and Over Exemption

This optional exemption may be increased or decreased with little oversight from the State Legislature. The City currently grants \$10,000 for individuals over 65 as an additional exemption, which matches the required mandatory exemption imposed on school districts. Approximately 25% of the City's single family residential properties receive the exemption, which amounts to a total of almost \$70,000 in reduced property tax revenue to the City each year. The optional 65 and Over exemption reduces the taxable property values by two percent (2%) each year. Individuals receiving this exemption receive a \$79 reduction in property taxes each year.

Staff has provided seven (7) years of trending information for each option for your review, and we hope this information will be useful for this year's decision-making effort.



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18. <u>Consider awarding construction contract to Lester Contracting, Inc. to complete the Voluntary Restoration work at the Harbor of Refuge Tract 16. Presenter is Jody Weaver</u>

Interim City Manager Weaver advised Council that in 2020, RLB Contracting excavated a slip along the shoreline of their leased Tract 16, in order to make repairs to a barge. The excavation was done without the knowledge or consent of the City. A short time after this excavation was performed, the surge from Hurricane Hannah caused erosion of the sides of the excavation and exposed some trash cells. Staff worked with the US Army Corps of Engineers and Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to permit a voluntary restoration of the disturbed final cover of the old landfill, which staff had contracted with Urban Engineering to prepare.

Staff received approval of city's voluntary restoration plan in May of 2021. RLB agreed to complete the restoration work at no cost to the City, but that work was never completed and the city is working on a settlement agreement with RLB at this time.

The work must be done without delay to avoid issues with TCEQ and/or the US Army Corps of Engineers. The work involves providing 18" of clay soil and 6" of top-soil over an area of about 150' x 95' then graded to drain. A copy of the plans is on file in the office of the City Secretary.

Bids were received from 3 contractors and the bid tabulation is as follows:

Sylva Construction, LLC \$ 39,900.00 Gonzales Contracting, Inc. \$ 38,280.00 Lester Contracting, Inc. \$ 35,892.50

Staff recommendation is to award a construction contract to Lester Contracting, Inc. for this restoration work in the amount of \$35,892.50. Lester Contracting has stated they can begin soon after the contract is awarded.



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19. <u>Consider award of a construction contract to Lester Contracting for the Brooks Lift</u> Station reconstruction project. Presenter is Jody Weaver

Interim City Manager Weaver advised Council that the January 2020 Urban Engineering Lift Station Assessment Report, the Brooks Lift Station (on Half League Road in City park) is described as in "unsafe/very poor condition" and was recommended for complete reconstruction. In addition, the existing station has a capacity of 0.36 MGD, but sees peaks flows of over 0.5 MGD. Urban Engineering was authorized under Task Order No. 23 to prepare plans and bid documents for this lift station replacement and upgrade. The proposed upgrade will have a total capacity of over 0.8 MGD allowing for future growth. Bids were advertised in the Port Lavaca Wave Newspaper and invitations sent to several plan rooms and the following contractors:

Bids were due on February 24, 2022 and only Lester Contracting. Inc. responded with a Bid. Tabulation is as follows:

Total Base Bid	\$ 611,112.00

Total Base Bid + Alternate No. 1	\$ 670,652.00

Financial Impact:

Weaver said that \$500,000.00 was originally budgeted for this lift station replacement. This amount was reduced to \$300,000.00 last year after receiving bids on the Lynnhaven Lift Station and comparing the scopesof the two projects. To date \$32,800.00 has been encumbered for the Brooks Lift Station to pay for the engineering services.

The Base Bid amount is \$611,112.00, which staff recognizes is over twice the budgeted funds. Nearly \$70,000.00 of this is to demolish the existing lift station, which were overlooked when comparing the scope with Lynnhaven. Staff is currently looking at a change order which would reduce this demolition cost by only demolishing the above ground structure and simply backfilling the wet well in place. Other reasons for the higher-than- expected bid are basically a function of the state of our present economy and skyrocketing prices of materials.

This is an improvement project that has been needed to be done for many years and staff does not recommend postponing. Neither does staff realistically expect any reduced pricing if this project were to out for bids again. Several utility contractors were actively solicited to bid, including a few plan rooms and the general response was they were already too busy.

To award the Base Bid project with a cost of \$611,112.00 city needs \$343,912.00 of additional funds. There is about \$457,250.00 in the Utility Construction Account Fund which is set aside for the 12" water line between the two towers. Recall, this project was put on the back burner pending additional study. Staff would like to reassign \$350,000.00 of these funds to the Brooks Lift Station project in order to award this Base Bid now.

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Staff recommendation:

Staff recommends that Council award a construction project Lester Contracting, Inc. in the amount of \$611,112.00 for this project. To fully fund the award, staff recommends that \$350,000.00 of funds reserved for the 12" waterline link project be reassigned to this project.

The applicant is currently state, and county licensed at her existing daycare. She will continue to maintain compliance with all state and local licensing criteria.



2. Consider the 2022 Police Department Security Project. Presenter is Colin Rangnow

Police Chief Rangnow and Finance Director Lang introduced Daniel Croasmun, Project General Manager for Brown & Root Industrial Services, LLC to answer any questions on this project.

Finance Director Lang advised Council that during the 2021-2022 Fiscal Year Budget process, staff discussed and City Council later approved, the Police Department Security Project which included the following funding for:

Perimeter Fencing	\$ 48,408
Access Control System and Cameras	\$ 91,592
Total Budgeted	\$ 140,000

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Lang reminded Council that the purpose and scope of this project was to accomplish the following:

- Accomplish the priority actions identified in the Golden Crescent Regional Planning Commission
 which supports the Texas Homeland Security Strategic plan by preventing terrorist attacks and
 organized criminal activity.
 - o Perimeter fencing drastically reduces a potential physical attack on the critical infrastructure housed by PLPD for the region.
- Securing the City's fleet investment, which are equipped with weapons, costly radio and camera equipment.
- Preservation of evidence vehicles which require security to process.
- Safeguarding and securing juveniles held in custody.
- Ensuring safety and security of all on-duty personnel and to effectively manage access to the department.

Several factors shook out of our estimates when we began to look into executing the project:

- The quotation from Texas Department of Criminal Justice was several years old and included "swing gates" which were no longer conducive to our application and would require too much maintenance.
- The quotation from VCS did not include any trenching or boring for the pathways to the gates, and would require electricians to perform this work, and was not included in the original cost assumptions.
- Additionally, the boring and trenching would also break-up the parking lot, which would also require resurfacing that was not included in the original cost assumptions.
- The outrageous inflation and materials shortage factor that was unforeseen.
- The need for project management services to coordinate which aspects of the project should be performed first, second, simultaneously, etc.


Staff reached out to one of our cooperative purchasing organizations, BuyBoard, and inquired about the Job Order Contracting (JOC) services that were pre-bid and awarded based upon the RSMeans and local pricing coefficients. That means the City receives a discount from the RSMeans pricing index. It is our hope that we can take advantage of the JOC's in-house project management, design and build efficiencies which will reduce the amount of time it would take to bid each aspect of complicated repair and build projects throughout the City. Staff interviewed and requested project scope and pricing from two (2) JOC pre-approved contractors in our area and they are as follows:

The original quotation provided by Brown & Root amounted to \$456,466. This figure encompassed an entire asphalt parking lot rebuild around the perimeter of the Police Department, but we asked them to only do one portion of the parking lot and to requote with sealcoat and restripe to the other portion of the parking lot. The revised quotation, with reduced scope, came in at \$466,486, which was greater than the original quotation received in January due to the rapidly escalating prices for materials, which seem to change daily.

The project will require a budget amendment in the amount of \$326,486.

Staff recommends City Council grant the authority to the City Manager to approve and execute the JOG with Brown & Root as provided in the attached proposal and authorize a budget amendment in the amount of \$326,486 from the General Fund Unreserved Fund Balance.

3. <u>Consider start date for the increased Republic services for brush and bulk approved at the</u> January 10, 2022 regular scheduled Council meeting. Presenter is Jody Weaver

Interim City Manager Weaver reminded Council that on January 10, 2022, Council approved an extension to the Republic Services contract for five (5) years with an increase to the brush/bulk limit per household to 12 cy and adding light construction debris. The cost for the increased limit and the light construction debris is \$2.00 per customer.

Staff is also in discussions about a needed increase to water and sewer rates following a recent utility rate study. That is a topic of discussion during the workshop portion of this meeting.

With the assumption that the \$2.00/customer fee increase will be passed directly through to the customer, staff would recommend making that change at the same time council makes the change to the utility rates. Staff anticipates that Council will consider the first reading of an ordinance to make a change to the water and sewer rates at the regular scheduled council meeting on April 11, 2022.

Staff Recommends making May 1st the effective date of the new solid waste rate with Republic and the 12-cy limit. Staff will reflect the \$2.00 increase on the customer bills they receive in June 2022. Make the water/sewer rate change effective with the May water usage which would be reflected on the bills received by the customers in June 2022. Consider the amendments to the fees ordinance at the regular scheduled council meetings on April 11 and May 9, 2022.

4. Consider purchase of an Air Burner for burning of brush. Presenter is Jody Weaver

Interim City Manager Weaver advised Council that Republic Services collects brush once a month from residents and places it in a location at the Harbor of Refuge near the gun range, where it is reduced to chips once a year. Recently we had the existing piles surveyed and determined that there is 7300 cubic yards of chipped brush piled at the Harbor of Refuge. Republic Services will accept these chips in Victoria, but we will need to transport them. The cost to transport was estimated to be about \$200/30 yards or around \$50,000 before the fuel prices started going up.

In an effort to clean up this area at the Harbor of Refuge and find a long-term solution to manage our brush disposal, we discussed last April about purchasing an air curtain burner. Air burners work by safely burning wood waste within a confined area. Curtain technology captures and reburns emitted smoke particles for a clean burn with a burning process that is as emission-free as possible.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) will not permit an air burner to be located within 300 feet of land which is covering old landfill cells. The 74-acre property at the Harbor of Refuge is the City's old landfill, which was closed in the late 1970's, but the closure survey does not indicate where the cells are located. In talking with Judge Meyer, I was able to look over the closure surveys for the County's landfill site, which is now the location of the County's recycle center and found that the actual location of the cells is shown on the survey and there is available room to locate an air burner and remain at least 300 feet from these cells.

Wayne Shaffer and I met last year with Commissioners Vern Lyssey and David Hall to discuss the possibility of working with the County to locate an air burner in the south corner of the tract of land where the County's recycle center is. After further discussion we realized that the City and County have an opportunity here to provide a "one-stop-shop" so to speak where the citizens can bring their solid waste, including brush for disposal or recycling. We do currently offer a recycle bin for City residents to drop off recyclables each Saturday morning, which includes two haul offs each month, however we typically fill the container at most once a month. We have realized that many City residents are taking their recycling to the County's facility along with other solid waste for disposal. By combining resources and working together, we can work toward providing a quality facility for the City and County residents in one place.

Obviously, there is still much planning and many details to work out before executing a formal interlocal agreement, but the Commissioners Court did vote to agree to the concept of a Community Solid Waste Center and consented to locating an air burner on County-owned property, at the current recycle center, in the application to TCEQ for placement/operation of the air burner.

An air burner powered by diesel is an option, but for a long-range solution, we were thinking that a unit powered by electricity would be the best. I reached out to Victoria Electric Coop a couple of months ago for a budget estimate on the cost to bring 3-phase power to the proposed location of the air burner, southwest of the County's recycle center. The estimate cost was \$96,000.

Attached is a copy of the most recent quotation for an electric air burner of \$160,591.61, with a 26–28-week lead time. (I spoke with the sales rep on Thursday and they will be implementing a 10% price increase in the near future). The accompanying email states that should we find that we are unable to get a TCEQ permit for this location for some reason or are not ready for delivery yet, we can put the order on hold and even cancel it within 4 weeks of scheduled delivery, which would be 22 weeks from the order date. I have tasked Wayne with getting the TCEQ application put together with the assistance of Air Burners, Inc., Urban Engineering and myself as needed.

Attached is a conceptual layout for the Community Solid Waste Center. There will be costs associated with hauling and compacting fill material, (it is recommended by the manufacturer NOT to place the air burner on a concrete slab), providing electricity for the unit, as well as construction of a limestone road for the Republic trucks to bring the brush from US 87 and another limestone road for the public use to drop off brush. We do not have cost estimates for this work yet, but we can expect this to be \$100K-\$150K. In addition, once we are ready to begin routine burning operations, at least one additional employee will be needed on staff to perform this function. The County employee will man the facility to accept brush/bulk from the public two full days a week. Conceptually County personnel will share in the operation of the burner to account for brush coming in from the County, but the City personnel is obviously responsible for burning all that will be coming from Republic trucks in the City.

Options for Council Consideration:

- 1. Continue to deliver brush to the Harbor of Refuge site, chip annually and pay to haul the chips to the Victoria landfill or possibly Alcoa for use as cover of the mud pits.
 - As you recall it is the recommendation of the Port Commission to discontinue the use of the Harbor of Refuge as a staging ground for the City brush so the area can be cleaned up and marketed for lease.

- 2. Agree to the concept to establish a Community Solid Waste Center with the County and continue to work on the TCEQ application for the air burner permit and the County interlocal agreement. Once the permit is in hand, finalize the interlocal agreement, place the order for the VEC 3-phase power and for the air burner (at an increased cost) and begin work on the site and road work.
 - With this option, the cost of the burner will be an estimated 10% higher (\$16,000+/-).
- 3. Agree to the concept to establish a Community Solid Waste Center with the County and place the order now for the air burner unit for delivery in October 2022; continue to work on the TCEQ permit application and the County interlocal agreement. Once the TCEQ permit is in hand place. finalize the interlocal agreement with the County, place order for the VEC 3-phase power and begin site foundation work. If we need to delay shipment or cancel order we can do that up through August.
 - This option puts some pressure on the time-table to complete the permit application, pay VEC for the 3-phase power extension and perform the site work. Realistically we may not be fully ready for delivery of the unit by October, but we are able to delay delivery if necessary.

Note that these expenses are not in the FY 2022 budget, so all costs would be paid from General Fund Reserves.





The major highlights of the Report are as follows:

Property Tax collections as reported by CCAD - are \$4,401,846 for the year as of February. Collections in FY21-22 are 90.66% of total adjusted tax levy. Total current year Property Taxes Outstanding as of February is \$452,947.

In the General Fund, revenues through 3/31/22 are 71.1% of budget. In addition:

- 1. Current Property Tax collections are \$4,114,864 for the year as of March. Collections in FY21-22 are 103.6% of budget.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT LAVACA, TEXAS:

Section 1. Purpose.

The following amendments are to be made to the following Section of Chapter 10 of the Code of Ordinances. All insertions are made with colored letters and all deletions are shown as bold text-strikethroughs.

Chapter 10 - Animals, Article I. General, Sec. 10-5. - License required.

- a) All dogs and cats three months of age or older which are kept, harbored or maintained within the city limits shall be licensed. Cat and dog licenses shall be issued by the city or its agent upon payment of the required fee for each dog and cat. Prior to the issuance of a city license, the owner of the dog or cat must present a certificate from a licensed veterinarian showing the dog or cat has an active vaccination been vaccinated for rabies within the preceding three years. The owner shall state its name, address, and telephone number along with the breed, color, age, name, and sex of the dog or cat to be licensed. Said license shall be good until September 30 from the date of issuance expire with the expiration of the vaccination certificate, or one (1) year from the date of issuance in the case of a one-year license.
- b) Upon payment of the license fee, the city shall issue to the owner a license certificate and a metallic tag for each animal so licensed. The tag shall have stamped thereon, **the year** of issuance and the number corresponding to the number on the certificate.

Section 2. Severability.

It is specifically declared to be the intention of the City Council that sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this ordinance are severable and if phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid by the valid judgment of decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or sections.

We did not get the review and staff approval of this plat complete in time for the Regular April Planning Board meeting, but we have learned that CCISD must have this approved, and the building permit issued prior to the end of April or risk loss of funding.

The Planning Board is meeting with a Special Meeting at 5:30 pm Monday night prior to the Council Meeting.

Background: CCISD has a FEMA grant to construct a FEMA Dome for the emergency evacuation measures for CCISD. The FEMA Dome is a new addition to the emergency management plan for the school district. CCISD has coordinated with the City and the County throughout the planning of this project.

An access easement has been recorded across the drainage ditch that adjoins Sandcrab Boulevard, providing legal access from Sandcrab Boulevard to the FEMA Dome property. The property has access to public water and sewer on Sandcrab Boulevard.

CCISD has attended a pre-development conference with the City of Port Lavaca re-development team. The preliminary and final plat as presented meet all requirements of the platting process.


Recommendation:
