4. RECEIVE STATUS REPORTS OF CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

a) Upper Docks at City Harbor - Presenter Matt Glaze

The contractor has completed the upper dock portion and is working on the ramp. The existing culvert was excavated and inspected. Staff repaired leaking joints in the concrete pipe and backfilled with cement stabilized sand.

b) Renovations to Nautical Landing Marina Breakwater, TPWL Grant - Presenter Matt Glaze

The plans are complete awaiting Texas Parks and Wildlife approval to bid the project. Urban Engineering submitted required documents on Texas Parks & Wildlife online system.

c) Disposal of dredge materials at Smith Harbor - Presenter Jim Rudellat

The project is complete. We are waiting on Derrick Construction to complete the closeout documents.

d) Repairs at Tracts 9 and 10 - Presenter Jim Rudellat

CRG Environmental is scheduled to be on site on December 30th to record the condition of the property that has been leased by RLB Contracting, including this area involved in the voluntary restoration, prior to the lease being taken over by Encore Dredging.

b) Limited Phase II Environmental Site Assessment of Harbor of Refuge Tracts 16, 17, and 17A - Presenter Jody Weaver

CRG has presented a proposal for the Phase II Soil and groundwater sampling and lab analysis required in order to have the information to respond to TCEQ's RFI. The total cost of this additional work is \$29,284.00. At the December City Council meeting, Council approved acceptance of the proposal and authorized General Fund dollars to be provided to the Port Revenue Fund for this expenditure, which this amount is to be reimbursed to the General Fund at a later date.

City Harbor

a) Upper Dock Repairs - Presenter Matt Glaze

The Contractor is complete with all concrete work. The railing has been ordered.

f) Moorings for Poor Boys' Bait - Presenter Jim Rudellat

Poor Boys Bait needs five (5) pilings; Lencho Reyna told me he could put them in.

g) Disposal of Dredge Materials at Smith Harbor - Presenter Jim Rudellat

Various proposals for removal of materials were discussed. No action taken.

h) CDBG-MIT Coastal Resilience Project / Restore Grant - Presenter Jody Weaver

There is no activity to report on this item. No action taken.

Harbor of Refuge

i) Voluntary Restoration of Harbor of Refuge Tract 16 - Presenter Jody Weaver

RLB did not complete the 18" of clay backfill nor 6" of topsoil required for the voluntary restoration work. I will solicit local bids to complete this work and will provide this cost information to Mr. Cullen to handle reimbursement from RLB Contracting. Additionally, I received an email from the COE stating that they are going to want "some" spartina grass planted along the shoreline. I have asked for a clarification on the definition of "some", but I have not heard back.

j) Limited Phase II Environmental Site Assessment of Harbor of Refuge Tracts 16, 17, and 17A - Presenter Jody Weaver

As you recall, in December, City Council contracted with CRG Environmental to perform additional Phase II ESA work in order to respond to questions posed by the TCEQ, as well as conduct a Phase I ESA on the entire upland area south the Harbor of Refuge channel.

CRG is scheduled to install the wells needed for the additional Phase II work on January 20th. Once the wells are properly developed, they will sample shortly after that. CRG will submit a brief summary response letter now to let TCEQ know that we're moving forward with getting the information needed to respond to their questions

k) Proposed Brush Operations and Clean-up at Harbor of Refuge -

- Presenter Jody Weaver

I have contracted GIS Engineering to perform a survey to determine the volume of wood chips that are on site at the Harbor of Refuge brush staging site. Once we have this information, we will consider the value of spending dollars to move some of the chips to the Victoria Landfill site. We are moving toward presenting a conceptual plan to Commissioners Court and the City Council to locate an air burner at the County's recycle center in February. I am working to have an aerial topographic survey done of the proposed site as we understand it holds water in a heavy rain, so additional site work will be required to utilize the site as we hope. If all are in agreement, we will move forward with a TCEQ permit application and purchase of the air burner.

3. RECEIVE HARBOR MASTER'S OPERATIONS, PROMOTION/DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITY REPORT

a) City Harbor

Gonzales contracting gave me a price to make the repairs to the washed areas behind Scully's. Should be starting work the week of January 24^{th} .

Received bids from Gonzales Contracting and Lester Contracting. Still awaiting bid from Silva Construction.

Staff Concrete completed all the work at the high dock with the exceptions of the handrail on the ADA ramp.

b) Nautical Landings Building

January 13, 2022, Barefoot Construction started door replacement.

c) Nautical Landings Marina

Dominic Diodato - Awaiting signature and surrender of title.

Matt Estes - City Attorney is getting signatures from family.

Horizon Environmental has been onsite zero (0) times since last PC meeting.

d) Smith Harbor

Poor Boys Bait needs five (5) pilings. Lencho Reyna told me he could put them in.

e) Harbor of Refuge

GIS has been contracted to calculate the volume of the chip piles. Chief Rangnow has a presentation set up for the cameras January 31, 2022. December 31, 2021, CRG Texas Environmental did visual site inspection on Tracks 3,11,16, 17 & 17A.

4. RECEIVE DECEMBER 30, 2021, SITE CONDITIONS REPORT FORM CRG ENVIRONMENTAL FOR TRACTS 16, 17, AND 17A AT THE HARBOR OF REFUGE.

- Much of the usable site area has been recently graded. New base aggregate has been placed in select areas to facilitate improved heavy equipment and truck access.
- Waste oils / fluids in a number of the drums/containers have been recently removed.
- Encore is working to consolidate the remaining containers. If containing liquids, placing containers into secondary containment or on pallets.
- Empty containers are being crushed for off-site removal (CMC Recycling).
- There are several large piles of used tires, construction mat wood and metal debris awaiting disposal.
- In areas of former landfill operations, there are indications of obvious landfill debris (i.e., orange foam insulation) on the surface, beneath the grass cover (on the northern portion) and areas of what appear contain brush vegetative debris.
- While there does not appear to be obvious indications (i.e., no odors, staining, stressed vegetation, etc.) related to historical chemical disposal, it is likely TCEQ will want confirmation. The field observations are consistent with historical accounts that suggest the landfill only accepted household trash and vegetative debris.
- The area identified on the National Wetlands Inventory Mapper did not appear to be "wetlands" but looked like a change in the vegetative cover related to the landfill area/cell contents.

5. RECEIVE DECEMBER 30, 2021 SITE CONDITIONS REPORT FROM CRG ENVIRONMENTAL AND DISCUSS STATUS OF LEASE OF TRACTS 3, 11 AND 12 AT THE HARBOR OF REFUGE

Parcel 3

- The southern gates to Parcel 3 were open permitting access for the inspection.
- The site area had been recently mowed.
- There were no indications of stained or distressed vegetation. There was minor staining on the concrete surface near the building.
- There were four, 275-gallon totes marked as "unregulated weed killing compound" present on the site. One near the pipe racks to the north, two near the building to the south and one outside the fenced parcel to the south adjacent to the rear access road. One tote near the building was connected to a riser for an underground/underbrush piping system. Other than the totes, no other containers were observed.
- Two other pipe stick-ups were observed onsite. One near the back gate and one near a debris pile on the site. It appeared the piping was placed to disperse the weed killing compound at various locations around the site area, beneath the road and along the rear fencing.
- Heavy equipment (cranes and manlift), two small 'office' trailers, a former floating dock structure, piping, and other metal 'debris' were present on-site.
- The inspector could not access the building but managed to inspect at least a portion of the visible area. The inside of the building looked reasonably clean, but visibility was restricted such that a full inspection of the building was impossible.

Parcel 11 & 12

- The gate to Parcel 11 & 12 was locked but only restricted vehicle access.
- The site area was largely overgrown knee to waste high grass.
- There were no indications of stained vegetation.

- There was an area of poorly developed possibly distressed grass cover on Parcel 11. The inspector could not determine if the poor vegetation was related to a stressing agent, was slow to recover from surface traffic / equipment storage, or natural conditions (i.e., winter, minimal growth, etc.). No use of the area was noted from a review of historic aerial photographs.
- There was a two, 275-gallon totes assumed to be weed killing compound present on the site near the northern boundary of Parcel 12. These totes may actually be off Parcel 12 to the north.
- Piping and other metal 'debris' were present on-site adjacent to the previously mentioned totes.
- LaQuay is staging dredge piping in the channel to the west of Parcel 12.

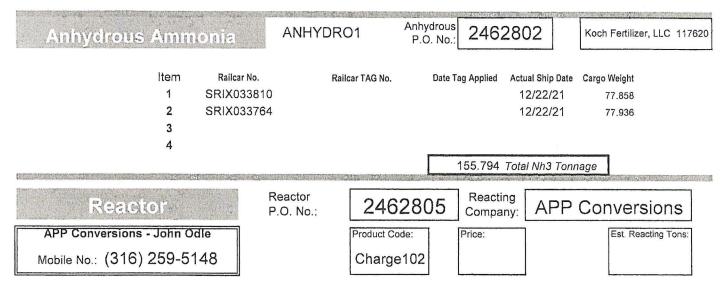

On behalf of our client the City of Port Lavaca, CRG Texas Environmental Services, Inc., (CRG Texas) is pleased to provide you with this response to the Request for Information for the above-referenced site. We expected that additional information would be required to move this site forward toward an acceptable agency closure. This correspondence is being provided to comply with your request for additional information within 90 days from the date of your original correspondence and to provide you with an overview of the on-going activities to satisfactorily characterize the site. Your comments are listed below, followed by our responses.

1. The TCEQ does not accept lab-filtered groundwater samples to be representative of the in-situ groundwater. Please resample groundwater using low flow sample collection techniques. Please note, groundwater can only be filtered in the field with a 10-micron (or larger) filter if the turbidity measurement of the groundwater to be sampled is greater than 10 nephelometric turbidity units (NTUs). Filtering through a 10-micron (or larger) filter ensures that the sample collected represents the groundwater with its naturally suspended solids (e.g., colloidals) and does not exclude any of the solids that could migrate with the water in the saturated zone.

Please ensure that the groundwater monitoring well is properly developed, and the groundwater's physical parameters have stabilized, before determining if the groundwater sample should be filtered. Additionally, for metals analyses, the groundwater sample obtained using a 10-micron (or larger) filter still corresponds to a total metals analysis for comparison of sample results to TRRP Tier 1 groundwater protective concentration levels (PCLs);

The TCEQ does not accept groundwater samples collected from temporary wells that were not properly completed or developed per Title 16 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 76;

Response: The temporary well installation and sampling techniques employed to date were used for screening purposes only to determine what, if any, actual impacts might be present and to plan for additional characterization as may be needed. TCEQ has accepted groundwater water samples from temporary wells in the past particularly under the auspices of the Leaking Petroleum Storage Tank Program (RG-411 allows for the use of temporary wells). However, given the potential constituents of concern (COCs), we understand and concur that representative, in-situ groundwater samples must be collected from properly constructed, permanent monitoring wells. We will be installing 4 permanent monitoring wells to collect the needed groundwater samples to evaluate potential constituents of concern, establish the site groundwater classification, and to delineate the COCs to the critical residential assessment levels based on a Class 1 groundwater resource.

2. Please note, the TCEQ cannot accept a Class 3 groundwater resource classification demonstration or Tier II PCLs when a site is not subject to the TRRP;

Response: I understand that information was offered prior to the site's formal inclusion under TRRP. Historically, I have found that some TCEQ coordinators prefer to review information as it is acquired and will consider the available data during their initial evaluation. We will adhere to formal Agency process going forward. Item #5.

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 Soil confirmation samples of polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs) were analyzed by the laboratory outside of the analytical method's holding time. New confirmation samples will need to be collected. Please note, confirmation samples of PAHs need to be collected in the area with the highest concentration of total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH);

Response: We will be collecting new samples for PAH analyses during the upcoming field efforts. The offered analyses, albeit outside of holding time, was selected from the initial sample with the highest TPH concentration and was again used for screening purposes. PAH compounds are normally very persistent in the environment.

4. Please provide additional information pertaining to the site's history, including information on potential source areas, historical site operations, and known releases. It is unclear if the correct target COCs were chosen for the assessment. Also, please clearly define the areas of the site for which the City of Port Lavaca is seeking "no further action" (NFA) determination from the TCEQ;

Response: A Phase I ESA is currently being updated for the parent tract area which includes approximately 65 acres. Areas within the 65 acre parent tract on the site were used as a landfill / solid waste disposal site from June 7, 1948 to October 10, 1977. Historical accounts suggest the landfill accepted only household / domestic trash and vegetative debris. There have been no reports of potential chemical disposal.

The referenced environmental studies are being conducted to specifically evaluate portions of Tracts 16 and 17 which have been more recently occupied for other industrial purposes. RLB Contracting, Inc., (RLB) leased 26.66-acres of land at the Harbor of Refuge identified as Tracts 16, 17, and 17A. RLB, a civil and marine construction company specializing in maintenance dredging, and levee projects, operated at Harbor of Refuge Tract 16 since September 1, 2002 and Tract 17 and Tract 17A since January 2012.

Since January 1, 2022, Encore Dredging has occupied the above-referenced Harbor of Refuge and will continue similar maintenance dredging and other marine projects under a two-year lease agreement (January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2023). Maps will be provided with the next submittal to illustrate the areas in question.

The COCs in question were selected for the initial property evaluation based on the historical site operations (landfill and dredge maintenance) and the preliminary site inspection as part of an earlier Phase I. Analyses included total petroleum hydrocarbons, volatile organic compounds, and RCRA 8 metals. Polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons and semivolatile organic compounds were to be analyzed in the event TPH compounds were detected in the > C12 carbon range. While TPH concentrations did not exceed screening levels, the sample was offered for PAH analyses for screening purposes as mentioned previously. If the TCEQ has additional COC concerns, we are open to further discussions on the preferred analytical testing.

5. Please note, the City of Port Lavaca will need to fully assess the areas that it is seeking NFA by identifying the source area(s) and delineating to the critical residential assessment level based on a Class 1 groundwater resource. For additional information, please refer to the TCEQ guidance document: "Determining Which Releases are Subject to TRRP" available on TCEQ's public webpage at: https://www.tceq.texas.gov/remediation/trrp/guidance.html.

Response: The site evaluation is on-going. Future correspondence will provide the requested information.

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We understand that there is additional work to be completed before TCEQ will be able make a final determination on the status of this site. Field efforts are scheduled, weather permitting, over the next few weeks and we will provide you with an updated deliverable, as may be appropriate for the accumulated data.
