Kick-off meeting with John Besterio, GLO grant manager. On March 28, 2022, we should be ready for the approval of the engineering agreement with Mott McDonald at a Special Council meeting. Once contract is executed, Mott McDonald will begin work to apply for the Army Corps of Engineers permit.

Harbor of Refuge

h) Voluntary Restoration of Harbor of Refuge Tract 16 - Presenter Jody Weaver

We received approval of our voluntary restoration plan last May. RLB agreed to complete the restoration work at no cost to the city, but that work was never completed. The work must be done without delay to avoi

with TCEQ and/or the US Army Corps of Engineers. The work involves providing 18" of clay soil and 6" of topsoil over an area about 150'x95' and graded to drain.

Bids were solicited from 3 local contractors: Gonzales Contracting, Lester Contracting, and Sylva Construction. Contract was awarded to Lester Contracting for this restoration.

i) CRG Environmental updates - Presenter Jody Weaver

<u>Wetlands Determination in the old landfill area of the Harbor of Refuge:</u> I have contracted with CRG for a lump sum fee of \$5,600 to identify aquatic features within the property and provide a written report documenting those findings. We should have that report by the latter part of April.

Surface Soil Sampling in Tracts 11/12: As you recall an area of distressed vegetation was found on Tract 11/12 when a site inspection was done at the end of December 2021. I contracted with CRG for a lump sum fee of \$3,800 to take surface soil samples and perform a chemical analysis. Last Friday CRG notified me that the did get a "hit" on petroleum hydrocarbons in one sample. It was some older asphalt-like material. No PAH's (polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbon) were detected so nothing to be concerned about. They will write up a letter report for the file, but no additional action is required.

Limited Phase II Environmental Site Assessment

CRG was out collecting groundwater samples and met with the wetlands guy on Thursday March 10, 2022.

j) Downtown Waterfront Master Plan update report - Presenter Jody Weaver

On February 7th the Selection Committee met with representatives from LJA to review the proposed scope of the study and allow LJA to get a first-hand view of our waterfront assets. They recently submitted a professional services agreement and a work authorization proposal for \$50,000 as follows:

Initial consultation: \$5,000 estimate Analysis and Needs Assessment: \$10,000 flat fee Concept Plan: \$8,000 flat fee Master Plan: \$25,000 flat fee Reimbursable expenses: \$2,000 estimate

Council is expected to approve this Monday night and an initial site visit is tentatively set for March 31st; at which time they are independently assisting the Visioning Committee with discussions regarding the gateway's signs on Highway 35.

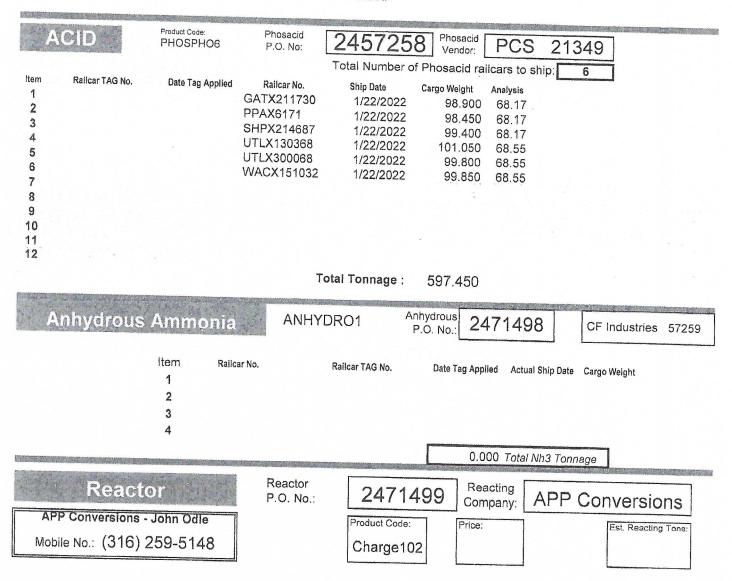

SUBJECT: CDBG-MIT GRANT COASTAL RESILIENCY PROJECT / RESTORE GRANT

CDBG-MIT COASTAL RESIDLIENCEY:

At the Council meeting on March 14, Council approved the professional services agreement (PSA) with our grant administrator KSBR. The engineering PSA will be ready for approval on April 25, as it is taking longer than expected to get GLO approval of the contract wording. As we've discussed previously, once the engineering contract is executed, Mott McDonald will begin work to apply for the Army Corps of Engineers permit which is expected to take at least a year to secure.

By way of review, the project scope includes the construction of breakwaters/living shorelines and enhancing the shorelines by creating marsh habitats and oyster reefs-fish habitats. The project is proposed to extend from near the tip of Fisher Harbor up to near the Bayfront Peninsula and then from the north side of the peninsula up to near Scullys.

The total budget for the \$13,645.005 grant funds are as follows:

- Construction: \$11,648,175
- Engineering: \$1,109,350
- Environmental: \$100,000
- Administration: \$787,480

RESTORE: (update provided by Jessica Carpenter, who is working with us on this grant as a consultant)

It has been several months since CoPL had submitted the RESTORE application for the sunken barges to TCEQ. In this bucket there are three (3) projects. CoPL application was the second of the 3 projects to be submitted. TCEQ has reviewed the CoPL application for the sunken barge removal project. There were application revisions and budgetary revisions. TCEQ's review was to ensure the application and budget was satisfactory to be submitted to U.S. Treasury, as this is the funding source for the grant. After several back and forth revisions and discussions the CoPL application has been deemed substantially complete and satisfactory to be submitted to U.S. Treasury along with the other 2 projects in this mitigation fund bucket.

The next steps under the U.S. Treasury review process will be to provide the letter of non-significance from the Texas Historical Commission. I have already reached out to request this letter. As well as, to update and complete the environmental checklist. There were significant gaps under the initial submittals and reviews. I am currently working on the environmental checklist. There is clear direction from TCEQ as to what it should contain and the resources to provide this information. If it is deemed a Subject Matter Expert (SME) must provide some of the checklist information this will be addressed as the checklist is processed. The procurement questionnaire is also underway by the CoPL Finance Department. There is a 3-month to 4-month window to complete the aforementioned supplemental documents while under the U.S. Treasury review process.

Item #4.

There is also the matter of barges just outside the boundary of Smith Harbor that will be remaining after ans RESTORE barge removal grant project is completed. I have communicated with both Texas General Land Office (GLO) and National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) to see if there is priority for these entities to remove the remaining sunken barges. GLO has the Derelict Vessel Removal program. There is tangible interest in removing the remaining barges by GLO under this program. I will have ongoing communications with GLO until a priority list or written confirmation of removal is established for CoPL. NOAA has a Marine Debris Removal grant program. I have researched and communicated to understand if the sunken barges remaining would qualify under the NOAA program. Under this Marine Debris Removal grant there is the Abandoned and Derelict Vessel program. This would be a competitive grant. It does appear that the remaining sunken barges would be applicable under this NOAA competitive grant. However, I am confident GLO will prioritize removal of the remaining sunken barges, but I am not eliminating a second opportunity for another grant through NOAA.

Standard Operating Procedures Rail Cars

Helena chemical, located at South Virginia occasionally performs a chemical process called "reacting". Prior to performing this process several rail cars are brought in through the City of Port Lavaca via railroad. These rail cars contain hazardous materials in the form of Anhydrous Ammonia and Phosphoric Acid. Helena chemical does notify us via email and phone when they plan on bringing the hazardous material through the city. The Fire Department does attempt to escort the rail cars through the city when possible. Daily duties such as incident response, hydrant maintenance, training, and building inspections do hinder that attempt at times. The Fire Department maintains a close working relationship with Helena Chemical. We have held multiple training events to familiarize fire department personnel on the operation of equipment used in the reaction process as well as emergency shut down procedures. The rail cars in the event of an accident or the event a rail car was to derail.

Short story for now...

No real issues identified in soil, to date

There's some low concentration arsenic in shallow gw. Source undetermined. Could be a site, farm or bay source but we'll have to do more work to figure it out. Groundwater appeared to be going toward the bay the day we sampled. Even that shallow zone meets a Class 2 groundwater designation...I thought It would be Class 3!

I could see TCEQ wanting more soil sample work...to see if we missed any source areas.

Maybe expanding the COCs at least initially (pesticides, herbicides). Also, monitoring the wells for arsenic for a time. Sadly, I think they'll bring it into TRRP (affected groundwater) which will mean completion of an Affected Property Assessment report (APAR), looking at receptors and other potential exposure pathways, determining critical PCLs, etc. Much of what we've done can be used to support the APAR development so we won't be starting from scratch.

Also attached is the wetlands determination document. There's more "wet" out there than I thought so yes, there will need to be COE consultation as development progresses. No surprise really.

I've been rather poor in my agency "reads" of late, so I won't even hazard a guess as to what else they might want. Let me know if you have any comments or would like to discuss.

This letter of findings provides the results of a preliminary waters of the U.S. (WOTUS) investigation performed by BIO-WEST, Inc. (BIO-WEST) for the 174-acre subject property in Calhoun County, Texas (Appendix A, Figure 1). The area of this investigation (subject property) is focused on 174 acres of developed and undeveloped property surrounding the Harbor of Refuge, west of Virginia Street in Port Lavaca, Texas. The centermost point of the subject property is approximately 28.594196°, -95.616686° (WGS 1984).

Limited Wetlands Investigation

Waters of the United States, which includes wetlands, are regulated by the Clean Water Act (CWA) under the authority of the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). A considerable number of court rulings and regulatory agency guidance documents have historically sought to more clearly define the limits of USACE and EPA jurisdiction under Section 404 of the CWA. On June 19, 2006, the Supreme Court of the United States in the consolidated cases Carabell v. United States and Rapanos v. United States, 547 U.S. 715 (2006), issued a divided opinion seeking to interpret the term WOTUS. On June 5, 2007, the USACE and EPA issued a Memorandum of Agreement and joint guidance post-Rapanos with the intent to establish a detailed methodology in making jurisdictional determinations. On December 2, 2008 the USACE and EPA released additional guidance in determining whether they have jurisdiction over potential WOTUS based upon the U.S. Supreme Court's decision. The intent of the various court rulings and guidance documents were to more clearly define and develop a process to determine whether a body of water is or is not a WOTUS.

The purpose of the study was to determine the approximate sizes and locations of areas that could potentially be classified as WOTUS, which includes, but is not limited to, wetlands and creeks/streams. To classify an area as a wetland, specific technical criteria with regards to vegetation, soils and hydrology must be met. Study methods included the following: 1) review of U.S. Geological Survey topographic maps, Natural Resources Conservation Service maps and local county soil survey maps; 2) review of historical color, black and white, and infrared aerial photographs; and 3) review of the U.S. Federal Emergency Management Agency floodplain maps and National Wetland Inventory maps. A wetland delineation according to the 2010

Regional Supplement to the Corps of Engineers Wetland Delineation Manual: Atlantic and Gulf Coastal Plain Region was **not** conducted. However, a field verification visit was conducted within the subject property to confirm the presence or absence of WOTUS as well as to determine the boundaries of each feature, if present.

If the technical criteria are met, an evaluation is conducted to determine whether or not the USACE and/or EPA would call the area in question a WOTUS and thus claim jurisdiction. To classify a WOTUS as adjacent, the Rapanos Guidance states that one of the following three criteria is satisfied:

- There is an unbroken surface or shallow sub-surface connection to jurisdictional waters. This hydrologic connection may be intermittent.
- They are physically separated from jurisdictional waters by man-made dikes/barriers, natural river berms, beach dunes, and the like.
- Their proximity to a jurisdictional water is reasonably close, supporting the science-based inference that such wetlands have an ecological interconnection with jurisdictional waters.

Almost all naturally occurring rivers, streams, and tributaries feeding said rivers and streams will most likely be considered WOTUS. However, certain man-made ditches, road side ditches, and upland drainage ditches constructed in and draining only uplands may not be considered jurisdictional, especially with the absence of an ordinary high-water mark (OHWM). The OHWM is the line on the shore established by the fluctuations of water and is indicated by physical characteristics such as a clear, natural line impressed on the bank, shelving, changes in the character of soil, destruction of terrestrial vegetation, the presence of litter and debris, or other appropriate means that consider the characteristics of the surrounding areas. An OHWM combined with a defined bed and bank can be used by the USACE to determine the jurisdictionality of creeks, streams, channels, and other linear waters of the U.S.

According to U.S. Geological Survey Topographic Maps (*Port Lavaca East, Texas*), the landscape within the subject property is relatively flat but then develops a heavy slope heading south-southeast towards Lavaca Bay. In addition, two linear drainage features are present within the subject property draining to Lavaca Bay.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service National Wetland Inventory (NWI) maps were referenced to identify any features present within the subject property (Figure 3). According to the NWI maps, multiple NWI features are present within the subject property. During the field verification visit, many of these features were confirmed as wetlands, however several areas located on a peninsula in the eastern portion of the subject property, noted on NWI maps as a wetland complex, are not present.

It is the professional judgement of BIO-WEST that the linear drainage features that tie directly into Lavaca Bay are potentially jurisdictional features within the subject property. Additionally, it is BIO-WEST's professional judgement that all of the wetlands found on the subject property would be considered jurisdictional because of the direct connection to and physical distance from a traditionally navigable water and relatively permanent water, many are directly adjacent to either the drainages or Lavaca Bay, and are located within the mapped 100-year floodplain of Layaca Bay. These findings were interpreted from a desktop evaluation of historical aerial photography, infrared aerial imagery, national wetlands inventory data, county soils maps, and United States Geological Service Topographic maps of the area, and field verification.

Conclusions and Findings

• The preliminary WOTUS investigation and field verification revealed the subject property contains two linear drainage features connecting to Lavaca Bay as well as portions of Lavaca Bay. The subject property also contains multiple wetlands, consisting of palustrine emergent and estuarine emergent wetlands. It is the professional judgement of BIO-WEST that the drainage features, all of the wetlands, and Lavaca Bayou would be considered jurisdictional by the USACE, BIO-WEST's experience, and the most up to date EPA and USACE guidance.

The USACE and the EPA are the final authority over the jurisdictional status of both wetlands and waters of the U.S. per Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. The findings discussed in this report are the professional judgment of BIO-WEST and have not been verified by the aforementioned regulatory government agencies.

Professional Recommendations

It is BIO-WEST's professional judgment that in accordance with the findings of this investigation and the potential for site development, agency coordination would be required if any WOTUS are impacted.
