

Call to Order

Mayor Pro tem Peggy Gutjahr called to order at 6:04 pm.

Present:

• PRESENT: Mayor Pro-Tem Peggy Gutjahr, (virtual) Councilor Bill Brown, Councilor Joshua Ramsell and Councilor Jim Winters.

Present: City Manager Dr. Martin Moore, Municipal Clerk Lisa Adair, (virtual) Finance Officer Stephanie Finch and City Attorney Chris DeFillippo.

Final Budget (Manager/Finance Officer)

- City Manager Dr. Moore started a discussion couple of items that were added: the
 special revenue fund had a new fund added called the American Rescue Plan and the
 estimated projections for that fund will be over a million and the fund will be Federally
 regulated rather than State and the funding has to be spent by 2024. He then said he
 thought it would be wise to spread the money over the three years and reviewed the
 basic layout of where the general funds are with no changes or surprises.
- City Manager Dr. Moore explained the salary and wage expenses are up a bit, explained the street funds, the separate code enforcer position at 20 hours, assistant clerk at 25 so the extra meeting minutes can be taken care of as well as City Hall being opened two Fridays a month. He then explained the other change is offer to the firefighter/EMT \$17.00 for the first 6 months with the option of \$17.50 after. He then explained the repairs and projects, parks, Library and opportunities for grants, the digital sign is in the budget. He then asked for City Hall to get a vehicle within the year. He continued to review the budget.
- Mayor Pro tem Gutjahr asked if the Fire Chief's salary is included.
- City Manager Dr. Moore said yes it was included in the preliminary budget and continued explaining the final budget, covering grants, loans, and revenues.
- City Manager Dr. Moore went over the recap: the GRT is looking healthy, Capitol Projects, Appropriations Projects and other funds, and began a discussion.

American Rescue Plan (Council/Manager/Finance Officer)

- City Manager Dr. Moore started a discussion on the American Rescue Plan regarding how much of the funds to use in FY2022 and what the City is allowed to use it for: \$650,000 for possible use for drainage and streets (possibly Hillandale, 304, Damen, Horner and other streets with drainage issues), personal protective equipment, wastewater program for ditches.
- Finance Officer Stephanie Finch explained the difference between the wastewater and storm water, with wastewater being sewage.

- Council continued with the discussion, including projects serving disadvantaged communities, economic health, violence, mental health and substance abuse.
- City Manager said some things that would be beneficial to us in the economic development to get help Rio Communities promote itself as an entity.
- Councilor Winters said the project he has been intrigued with is the idea of having a
 public service nurse to analyze phone calls that come to the fire department as there
 are a lot of repeat callers, this would allow some of those callers to get into the
 programs they need and reduce the calls. He then explained some similar programs. The
 discussion continued
- City Manager Dr. Moore said he does not know if we can get additional law enforcement, but he recommends doing the project that we do know we can fund might be a good place to start and we can do budget amendments as needed and continued the discussion.
- Mayor Pro Tem Gutjahr asked if we can put money into contract services to providing more law enforcement and continued the discussion.
- Manager Dr. Moore explained what will be coming back to Council with a list of what we are recommending, which are contract services, infrastructure, and continued the discussion.
- Mayor Pro tem Gutjahr explained what we look at someplace on this side to be able to have a staging area for public if there is an emergency.
- Manager Dr. Moore said there is a place in there to pull in recreational programs in to this funding and continued the discussion.

With a 4-0 vote Council went into executive closed session at 7:04 pm.

 Councilor Ramsell moved with a roll call vote to go back into the special workshop session. The motion was second by Councilor Winters. Voting Yea: Mayor Pro-Tem Gutjahr, Councilor Brown, Councilor Ramsell, Councilor Winters. With a 4-0 vote Council returned back into the special workshop session at 7:30 pm.

Call to Order

Mayor Pro tem Peggy Gutjahr called to order the workshop at 3:00 pm.

Present:

 PRESENT: Mayor Pro tem Peggy Gutjahr, (virtual) Councilor Bill Brown, Councilor Joshua Ramsell and Councilor Jim Winters.

Present: City Manager Dr. Martin Moore, Municipal Clerk Lisa Adair, Finance Officer Stephanie Finch and Finance Clerk Angela Valadez.

Presentation: City Complex

- ❖ Jeremy from FBT began to present the City Complex: The focus room was keeping the current multi-purpose room and working recreation around that; renovating of the City Council room, rearranging restrooms for better public use; he explained storage areas, relocating the service room, and improving the library space, maintaining the current library restrooms, adding public space and more restrooms, and is hoping to reach an agreement on the final master plan.
- Councilor Ramsell asked if Council will be provided copies of the presentation.
- City Manager Dr. Moore said Council can be provided with copies and began a discussion regarding the Court room and Judges/Court Clerk office.

Accounts payable report

- Finance Officer Stephanie Finch began the accounts payable report, discussing items over \$500: Wells Fargo Financial Leasing for the leasing of the Dell Server in the amount of \$2,497.73; Municode for the annual website hosting fees in the amount of \$2,100; Tyler Technologies for Incode yearly maintenance fees in the amount of \$8,041.92; Robles, Rael, and Anaya for FY2020 attorney fees in the amount of \$1,833.88; TLC Plumbing for yearly HVAC Maintenance for City Hall in the amount of \$1,307.20; Albuquerque Economic Development 2021 Membership in the amount of 3,000; Valencia County Fiscal Office for FY2022 Law Enforcement Protection Agreement with the County (coming out of Law Enforcement fund) in the amount of \$112,785.36; Universal Constructors, Inc for street clean-up after flooding July 7, 2021 in the amount of \$21,244.14; Home Depot for library materials in the amount of \$622.40; TLC Plumbing for yearly HVAC Maintenance for the fire departments in the amount of \$677.70; Valencia County Fiscal Office for FY2022 Law Enforcement Protection Agreement with the County (taken out of LEP fund) in the amount of \$37,214.64; TLC Uniforms for shirts and uniforms in the amount of \$587.10.
- Mayor Pro tem Gutjahr said we might want to have a conversation about attending the Albuquerque Development function and began a discussion.

Resolution 2021-16 NMFA Loan Agreement

- Finance Officer Stephanie Finch said this is just the final documents saying you agree with all the terms of the loan.
- Mayor Pro tem Gutjahr said she understands that this is a ten-year loan and wondered if we were able to pay it off early and began a discussion.
- Councilor Winters said last time we wanted to pay the loan off early NMFA did not want to allow us to do that and continued the discussion.

Resolution 2021-xx BAR #4

• Finance Officer Stephanie Finch said this is for the MOU with Belen that you have approved for the youth program, and we will need to increase the budget by \$3,000; the operating transfers out for land acquisition and fire tanker purchase will increase the transfer out by \$305,000; Fire excise GRT will be increased by \$1,210; EMS GRT will increase by \$6,720; Capitol projects will increase by \$5,000 for land acquisition; Capitol Projects will increase by the budget by \$300,000 for the fire tanker.

Resolution 2021-xx Final Quarter

 Finance Officer Stephanie Finch gave an account of the balances and adjustments with revenues of \$1,209,634.96, expenses were \$998,457.50, and transfer ins and out came to a loss of \$278,271.96, which is not a loss because you have Capitol money; your ending cash balance in the general operating fund, including the reserve, is \$2,180,063.74 and explained corrections and various funds.

Resolution 2021-xx FY 2022 Final Budget

- Finance Officer Stephanie Finch said nothing has changed since we last reviewed.
- Councilor Ramsell said thank you very much.

City Funds Investment

- Finance Clerk Angela Valadez said after speaking with United Business Bank and discussing
 having our funds 100% insured and making a little money off what we have in the bank, she
 found the City had the option of placing all the money in the one account. She then explained
 the sweep account and even though it will all be in one account; the software will break it down
 into all the funds. She recommended going with this type of account.
- Mayor Pro tem Gutjahr asked if the rate was 1%.
- Finance Clerk Angela Valadez said no one is really offering that right now.
- City Manager Dr. Moore explained that we will not have to worry about our funds not being
 collateralized and while the interest rate it not great, but at least it is in one place and easy to
 track and began a discussion.
- Mayor pro tem Gutjahr said one of her concerns was being able to access it if it was needed and continued the discussion.
- Councilor Winters said the interest rate changes daily and asked how the rate is reported to the City.
- Finance Clerk Angela Valadez said she can get that at any time and believes they take an average and will ask the bank to make sure.

- Councilor Ramsell asked if we would be able to redo the rates if they get better.
- Finance Clerk Angela Valadez said she will discuss that with the bank and continued the discussion.
- Councilor Brown said well done and thanked finance for their effort.

ICIP (Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan) & setup public hearing date

- City Manager Dr. Moore suggested listing what we want to do or have a public hearing date to hear priorities, but because of the flood we might have different priorities, but right now the priorities are public safety equipment and applying for grants. He then said there are currently 8 priorities and suggested turning the 8 projects into 12 and ask for ICIP funding for those.
- Councilor Ramsell explained there are grants for some of the things we need for public safety and said maybe we can prioritize another item higher than public safety.
- Councilor Winters suggested making the drainage plan a priority and began a discussion.
- Mayor Pro tem Gutjahr suggested phasing the drainage plan and continued the discussion.
- City Manager Dr. Moore said the engineers are going to assess damage from the flood today and once that is done, I can ask them for the logical progression for phasing. This discussion continued.
- Council began a discussion regarding priorities, placing them in order: #1 drainage plan, #2
 Multipurpose building, #3 parks and open spaces, #4 Public safety, #5 Pavement
 Reconstruction, #6 Roadway beautification, #7 Roadways, trails, paths, #8 streetlights, adding
 #9 fire department complex, #10 public works complex, and #11 Valencia County wide public
 safety 700 MHZ State System.

Selection of dates for next public forums

- City Manager Dr. Moore recommend at least one or two more forums to address the community concerning where we want/need to go as a City.
- Mayor Pro tem Gutjahr said her point of view would be to have a couple of forums on issues
 the public is concerned about, dividing the community to have a forum that would pertain to
 their neighborhood.
- Councilor Winters said to wait till we get the drainage report from the engineers and speak to the different neighborhoods about the part of the plan that affects them.
- Council began a discussion on dividing the City into Neighborhoods.
- Mayor Pro tem suggested at the next meeting have the forum dates on the calendar for the public forums with topics and began a discussion.
- Councilor Brown asked about the flooding at City Hall, was the flooding due to ground or roof water.
- City Manager Dr. Moore said both and then explained the gutter system was overwhelmed creating flooding from the roof and ground, and having those gutters cleaned out before the last storm helped, and we did not have as much flooding as the previous storm.
- Council continued the discussion on the installation of the gutter system and flooding.
- Councilor Brown said it has been frustrating to spend so much money on the roof leakages. He then said the fire department has these 5' fans, perhaps we can get a loan from them the next time we get some water in the building.
- Manager stated that we will come back with some suggestions the next time for the areas of topic for the forum.

Professions Service agreement for Legal Services: Between the City of Rio Communities and Robles, Rael & Anaya, P.C.

Council began a discussion on the contract.

Manager Report

- Manager Dr. Moore said we have been dealing with a number of issues including rainstorms, flooding, working with County Emergency Manager and Homeland Security for the relief for the flooding. He then explained there was an update on the damaged roads and if there is a pattern of maintenance on the roads there might be some help and it might include the Manzano Expressway and the DOT is also involved in that discussion. He then said the engineers are looking at the flood damage now.
- Manager Dr. Moore gave an update on the Library, with the shelving almost complete, emailing the members for a meeting and then an initial orientation of the library board, setting dates to get the books in and will meet with the Librarian from Belen and continued the discussion on the library dedication.
- City Manager Dr. Moore said the roads are milling and they will be all uniform asphalt when we repave and if we are able to, we would like to do some asphalt curbing to prevent some water damage and continued the discussion.
- Mayor Pro tem Gutjahr asked where we are on the sign.
- City Manager Dr. Moore explained the City is doing a request for quotes and the flooding kind of curbed our progress.
- Councilor Ramsell asked regarding the gutters can we go back to the contractors regarding this matter.
- City Manager Dr. Moore said he has asked Gordon to pull the plans and we will take it to the attorney to see if there is anything we can do and began a discussion.
- Councilor Brown asked about the zip code status and have we had a chance to ask them if there has been any decision made.
- Manager Dr. Moore said we had not received anything from the postal service and the annual zip code map has not changes and we need to go to the Congressional staff. The discussion continued.
- Councilor Brown asked how was the conference that Dr. Moore had attended.
- Manager Moore began a discussion on highlights of the conference, including we should be receiving a disbursement of \$500,000 and we are looking into what we can use it for, and we will have to report to the feds; they recommended that we contact the feds and let them know how we want to spend it and they will say yes or no. The discussion continued.

Council General Discussion & Future Agenda Items

- Councilor Ramsell asked about the new engine for the fire department, have they drafted specs.
- Manager Moore said yes, there have been initial conversations.
- Councilor Winters said we have talked about having recognition of people in the public sector that have been an asset to the city and it would be nice if we could do something simple to recognize some of these people.
- Councilor Brown had no discussion items.
- Mayor Pro tem Gutjahr had no discussion items.

Roll Call

Approval of Agenda

 Councilor Winters moved to approve the agenda as written. The motion was second by Councilor Ramsell. Voting Yea: Mayor Pro Tem Gutjahr, Councilor Brown, Councilor Ramsell, Councilor Winters. With a 4-0 vote the agenda for the City Council regular business meeting was approved as written.

Approval of Minutes: City Council Special Business Meeting Minutes 7/07/2021 & City Council Regular Workshop & Business Meeting Minutes 7/12/2021

Councilor Ramsell moved to approve the City Council Special Business Meeting Minutes 7/07/2021 & City Council Regular Workshop & Business Meeting Minutes 7/12/2021. The motion was second by Councilor Winters. Voting Yea: Mayor Pro Tem Gutjahr, Councilor Brown, Councilor Ramsell, Councilor Winters. With a 4-0 vote the minutes for the special business meeting held on July 7, 2021 and the city council regular workshop and business meeting held on July 12, 2021 were approved as written.

Presentations

- Jeremy from FBT gave a presentation to Council, highlighting of City Hall Phase I office and storage space and Phase II recreation and public space including the existing multi-purpose room.
- Mayor Pro tem Gutjahr said we have been working with FBT for a while now to fit the needs of the building into our budget.
- Councilor Brown said he thinks it is a comprehensive plan that meets our needs and those who have put it together have done a good job.

Public Comment

No public comments. There were 3 residents present at the City Council meeting.

Manager Report

- Manager Dr. Martin Moore said 2 issues that are out in the community right now, there have been rains and floods and we the engineers will be doing assessments on the damage; he received a call from the fire chief that there are sandbags and the public can call City Hall or the Fire station if they need some; we have been working on getting the roads cleaned; there are a lot of weeds coming up and we are in the review process of the public works applications so that we can start to handle these issues; talked with Public Works director to talk to some contractors to help with the weeds.
- Mayor Pro tem Gutjahr asked about contacting the fire department for sandbags.
- Manager Dr. Moore explained the process.
- Mayor Pro tem Gutjahr said that maybe we should have a number to call non-emergency number 505-865-9130 after hours and call City Hall during the day. The discussion continued.
- Manager Dr. Moore said we will be working directly with the US department of treasure on the American Rescue Plan funds so we will continue to pass information on to Council and the public as we get it.

Discussion, Consideration, and Decision – Approval of Accounts Payable

- Finance Officer Finch asked if there were any questions or do you wish to touch on anything for the public.
- Mayor Pro tem Gutjahr said something she would like the public to know that at the beginning
 of the Fiscal Year we have a lot of renewals for the entire year, such as maintenance for the
 server and the building, subscriptions to different companies and yearly contracts.
- Motion made by Councilor Winters to pay our bills, Seconded by Councilor Brown.
 Voting Yea: Mayor Pro Tem Gutjahr, Councilor Brown, Councilor Ramsell, Councilor Winters.
 With a 4-0 vote accounts payable was approved for payment.

Discussion, Consideration, and Decision - Resolution 2021-16 NMFA Loan Agreement

- Finance Office Finch explained at the end of May/June that we applied to the NMFA for a loan
 to pay for a fire truck and explained the loan is for 10 years the fire protection will be paying for
 it, we are currently paying for some other fire trucks in the amount of \$54,000 and those will be
 paid off in 2022 and the first payment for the new fire truck will take place after that loan is
 paid for.

On July 15, 2021, Ms. Jaylynn Ruel, a resident at 304 Brugg Dr., petitioned the Commission for a variance to her property, specifically, to waive setback requirements between property lines and a horse shelter. Over the course of two hearings (the first, on July 1, was tabled as the Commission did not have the necessary quorum), the Commission heard testimony from Ms. Ruel and her neighbors. In the end, Ms. Ruel failed to demonstrate that the property on which the horse shelter was located (and thus, the illegal setbacks) was the result of physical irregularities in the property (e.g., too narrow, shallow, or steep or other limiting physical conditions). The Commission unanimously disapproved her petition for variance.
- 2. The Commission voted unanimously to change P&Z meeting time, from 6:60 Pm to 5:30 PM.
- 3. Commission reviewed latest version of Abatement ordinance (Draft 5) and the stand-alone Cannabis ordinance and voted to forward with recommendations to City Council for their review.

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

Proclamation

Pursuant to the Regular Local Election Act, NMSA 1978, Sections 1-22-2 to 1-22-19 (1969, as amended through 2021), I, Maggie Toulouse Oliver, New Mexico Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority vested in me, do hereby issue the following proclamation:

That a Regular Local Election is called to be held throughout the State of New Mexico and in each county and precinct thereof on November 2, 2021; and

That a Regular Local Election shall be a nonpartisan election, and the names of all candidates shall be listed on the ballot with no party or slate designation; and

That that all municipalities that have opted to elect their officers on the Regular Local Election ballot, where applicable, shall conduct the runoff election pursuant to Section 1-22-16 NMSA 1978, either as a top-two runoff election or as a ranked-choice runoff election; and

That the City of Las Cruces and the City of Santa Fe shall conduct a ranked-choice runoff election on the same ballot as the Regular Local Election to be held on November 2, 2021; and

That the City of Albuquerque shall conduct a top-two runoff election following the Regular Local Election, should one be necessary. If a top-two runoff election is needed, it will be held on December 21, 2021; and

That a Regular Local Election shall be held to elect qualified persons to membership on a local governing body and, where applicable, to elect municipal officers for the following offices:

CITY OF RIO COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE NO. 2021 - XX

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING CANNABIS PRODUCTION, CANNABIS MANUFACTURING, CANNABIS RETAILING AND OTHER CANNABIS RELATED ACTIVITIES

- whereas, the Cannabis Regulation Act (NMSA 1978 §§ 26-2C-1 26-2C-42) has authorized a variety of uses related to the legalization of medical and recreational commercial cannabis activities, which legalization has the potential to greatly expand the legal cannabis market; and
- WHEREAS, Cannabis cultivation, production, manufacturing, and consumption creates strong odors, can involve the use of significant amounts of energy and water; and require security and other measures to reduce the risk of theft or other diversion to the illegal cannabis market, including possession and use by persons under the age of twenty-one; and
- WHEREAS, Cannabis is an intoxicating drug, making it appropriate to regulate the hours during which cannabis products may be sold and the areas in which cannabis products may be consumed; and
- **WHEREAS,** the smoking of cannabis products may create health risks due to exposure to secondhand smoke and vaporized cannabis concentrates; and
- WHEREAS, N. M. S. A. 1978, § 3-17-1. The governing body of a municipality may adopt ordinances or resolutions not inconsistent with the laws of New Mexico for the purpose of providing for the safety, preserving the health, promoting the prosperity and improving the morals, order, comfort and convenience of the municipality and its inhabitants.
- WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Rio Communities, New Mexico finds that it will promote the public health, safety, and welfare to enact provisions regulating the use of Cannabis.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED AND ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF RIO COMMUNITIES, AS FOLLOWS:

The CITY OF RIO COMMUNITIES (City) ORDINANCE, titled "Commercial Cannabis Activity Application Requirements and Performance Standards" shall read as follows:

- SECTION 12 ENFORCEMENT
- **SECTION 13 PENALTIES**
- SECTION 14 SEVERABILITY CLAUSE
 - **1.1. Definitions**. All terms defined in the State of New Mexico Cannabis Regulation Act, as amended, are hereby adopted, and incorporated herein.
 - **1.2. Cannabis Production.** This subsection shall apply to all applicants seeking a permit to allow for the growth of cannabis plants in quantities greater than six (6) mature and six (6) immature cannabis plants. The applicant shall provide:
 - a certified survey plat depicting the proposed location for the growth of cannabis, including outdoor and indoor growing, which identifies the total area to be covered.
 - b. a map which identifies the nearest school or daycare and evidence that the nearest school or daycare is greater than three hundred feet (300') from the perimeter of the property proposed for cannabis production.
 - c. the document(s) provided to the Regulation and Licensing Division (RLD) which applicant(s) utilized to apply for a producer's license pursuant to the Cannabis Regulation Act, or a copy of the actual license issued to the applicant by the RLD.
 - 1. If the applicant fails to provide documentation or provides incomplete or otherwise insufficient documentation regarding the status of their license application through RLD, the Planning Director shall inform the applicant of the deficiencies in writing and shall take no further action on the application until the deficiencies are remedied. If the applicant fails to correct the deficiencies indicated in the letter deeming the application incomplete within sixty (60) calendar days of receipt of notice of deficiencies, the application shall be considered withdrawn, and it will be returned to the applicant.
 - 2. The City Council may issue a Special Use Permit only upon receipt of the applicant(s) license from RLD or a certified copy of such license, and completion of the applicable CITY OF RIO COMMUNITIES permitting process.
 - d. the production of cannabis for commercial manufacturing, sale, or consumption shall be limited to those areas of the City of Rio Communities zoned C-2

- (Community Commercial and Retail Use) and C-3 (Heavy Community Commercial and Retail Use).
- e. the granting of a Special Use Permit by the City Council shall follow the process outlined in Article 7 (Section 4.7.4) of the Zoning Code (Ordinance 2021-76, 2021).
- **1.3. Cannabis Manufacturing.** This subsection shall apply to all applicants seeking a permit to allow for the manufacture of cannabis products, packaging of cannabis products, and the purchase, acquisition, sale, or transport of wholesale cannabis products to other cannabis establishments. The applicant shall provide:
 - a. a map which identifies the nearest school or daycare and evidence that the nearest school or daycare is greater than three hundred feet (300') from the perimeter of the property proposed for cannabis manufacturing activity.
 - b. the document(s) provided to the Regulation and Licensing Division (RLD) which applicant(s) utilized to apply for a manufacturing license pursuant to the Cannabis Regulation Act, or a copy of the actual license issued to the applicant by the RLD.
 - 1. If the applicant fails to provide documentation or provides incomplete or otherwise insufficient documentation regarding the status of their license application through RLD, the Planning Director shall inform the applicant of the deficiencies in writing and shall take no further action on the application until the deficiencies are remedied. If the applicant fails to correct the deficiencies indicated in the letter deeming the application incomplete within sixty (60) calendar days of receipt of notice of deficiencies, the application shall be considered withdrawn, and it will be returned to the applicant.
 - 2. The Planning Director may issue a permit only upon receipt of the applicant(s) license from RLD or a certified copy of such license, and completion of the applicable CITY OF RIO COMMUNITIES permitting process.
 - c. the manufacturing of cannabis for retail sale or consumption shall be limited to those areas of the City of Rio Communities zoned C-2 (Community Commercial and Retail Use) and C-3 (Heavy Community Commercial and Retail Use).
 - d. the granting of a Special Use Permit by the City Council shall follow the process outlined in Article 7 (Section 4.7.4) of the Zoning Code (Ordinance 2021-76, 2021).
- **1.4. Cannabis Retailers.** This subsection shall apply to all applicants seeking a permit to allow for the sale of cannabis and cannabis products to qualified patients, primary caregivers, reciprocal participants or directly to consumers. Cannabis consumption room or area shall be allowed commercially only in a designated co-located area of a Cannabis Retailer.
 - a. The applicant shall provide:
 - a map which identifies the nearest school or daycare and evidence that the nearest school or daycare is greater than three hundred feet (300') from the perimeter of the property proposed for cannabis retail.
 - 2. the document(s) provided to the Regulation and Licensing Division (RLD) which applicant(s) utilized to apply for a cannabis retail license pursuant to the Cannabis Regulation Act, or a copy of the actual license issued to the applicant by the RLD.
 - If the applicant fails to provide documentation or provides incomplete or otherwise insufficient documentation regarding the status of their

license application through RLD, the Planning Director shall inform the applicant of the deficiencies in writing and shall take no further action on the application until the deficiencies are remedied. If the applicant fails to correct the deficiencies indicated in the letter deeming the application incomplete within sixty (60) calendar days of receipt of notice of deficiencies, the application shall be considered withdrawn, and it will be returned to the applicant.

- ii. The Planning Director may issue a permit only upon receipt of the applicant(s) license from RLD or a certified copy of such license, and completion of the applicable CITY OF RIO COMMUNITIES permitting process.
- 3. an affidavit that the proposed cannabis retail location is not within six hundred (600) feet of any other cannabis retail location that was in operation at the time of the application submission to the City.
- b. A vertically integrated cannabis establishment or an integrated cannabis microbusiness must apply for a permit pursuant to the provisions of this subsection, provided the establishment or microbusiness intends to sell cannabis or cannabis products to qualified patients, caregivers, reciprocal patients, or consumers, regardless of an existing permit for cannabis production or cannabis manufacture.
- c. the sale of cannabis and cannabis products shall be limited to those areas of the City of Rio Communities zoned C-2 (Community Commercial and Retail Use) and C-3 (Heavy Community Commercial and Retail Use).
- d. the granting of a Special Use Permit by the City Council shall follow the process outlined in Article 7 (Section 4.7.4) of the Zoning Code (Ordinance 2021-76, 2021).
- Regulation and Licensing Division, and a Special Use Permit has been issued by the City Council, the licenses of retailers of cannabis products shall allow them to sell and deliver cannabis products, and the licenses of dispensers of cannabis products and club cannabis licenses shall allow them to sell, serve, deliver and permit the consumption of cannabis products on their licensed premises on Mondays from 7:00 a.m. until midnight, on other weekdays from after midnight of the previous day until 2:00 a.m., then from 7:00 a.m. until midnight, and on Sundays after midnight of the previous day until 2:00 a.m., then from noon until midnight. Dispenser, retail, and club licenses shall close their places of business during voting hours on the days of the biennial primary election of each even numbered year and the biennial general election held upon the first Tuesday in November of each even numbered year, and on the days of City elections for City officers, and on the days of such other elections as may be prescribed by rules and regulations promulgated by the State of New Mexico.

It is unlawful for any licensed retailer of cannabis products to sell or deliver cannabis products, or for any licensed dispenser or club to sell, deliver, serve or permit the consumption of cannabis products, on their licensed premises during hours other than those prescribed by this section.

1.6 Cannabis consumption areas.

- a. A cannabis consumption area in which consumption is limited to consumption by qualified patients or reciprocal participants may be located inside any cannabis retailer; provided, however, that smoking of cannabis products in such consumption areas is only allowed if the cannabis consumption area occupies a standalone building from which smoke does not infiltrate other indoor workplaces or other indoor public places where smoking is otherwise prohibited pursuant to the Dee Johnson Clean Indoor Air Act, NMSA 1978, Chapter 24, Article 16.
- b. Cannabis consumption areas that are open to consumers are also subject to the following:
 - the smoking of cannabis products is only allowed within a licensed cannabis consumption area that occupies a standalone building from which smoke does not infiltrate other indoor workplaces or other indoor public places where smoking is otherwise prohibited pursuant to the Dee Johnson Clean Indoor Air Act, NMSA 1978, Chapter 24, Article 16; and
 - 2. access to cannabis consumption areas open to consumers is restricted to persons twenty-one years of age and older.
- **1.7 Business Registration.** Any person engaged in commercial cannabis activities must comply with the City of Rio Communities business registration process as outlined in City of Rio Communities Ordinance 2013-09.

1.8 Security/Fencing

- a. Each commercial <u>and non-commercial</u> cannabis producer, cannabis research laboratory, and cannabis testing laboratory is required to erect and maintain a lockable fence of sturdy construction measuring at least six feet (6') in height enclosing and screening from view the area where cannabis is located. The enclosure <u>at commercial locations</u> shall remain securely locked during nonbusiness hours.
- b. Cannabis cultivation and production for personal use in quantities and as permitted by the New Mexico Cannabis Regulation Act and the Lynn and Erin Compassionate Use Act is allowed anywhere in the City, subject to the following: Cannabis cultivation and production for personal use must be conducted inside an enclosed and locked dwelling unit or an appropriate accessory structure (e.g., a controlled-environment agricultural structure).
- **Mobile Units**. Cannabis sales from mobile, portable, or temporary units or drive-through locations are prohibited.
- **1.10 Smoking of Cannabis in Public Place**. Smoking of cannabis products in a public place, except as permitted by state law, is prohibited.
- **1.11 Existing Medical Cannabis Establishments**. Any medical cannabis establishment existing as of the date of the passage of this Ordinance shall not be required to comply with the location requirements of Section 2.

- **1.12 Enforcement.** A Code Compliance Officer as designated by the City, or a certified Valencia County Sheriff's deputy per agreement between the City of Rio Communities and Valencia County, New Mexico may issue citations for violation of this Ordinance.
- 1.13 Penalties. With the exception of violations punishable by State law, any violation of this Ordinance may be enforced in any court of competent jurisdiction. The maximum penalty per violation shall be five hundred dollars (\$500). Each day during the time in which a violation occurs shall be deemed a separate violation. Nothing herein shall prevent the City of Rio Communities from seeking injunctive relief, if appropriate.
- **1.14 Severability Clause**. Should any portion of this Ordinance be declared unenforceable after a final, non-appeal decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

11-6-1 NUISANCE

- A. For the purposes of this chapter the word "nuisance" is defined as any person within the City doing an unlawful act, or omitting to perform a duty, or suffering or permitting any condition or thing to be or exist, where such act, omission, condition or thing either:
 - 1. Injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, or safety of others; or
 - 2. Offends decency; or
 - 3. Is offensive to the senses; or
 - 4. Unlawfully interferes with, obstructs, or tends to obstruct or renders dangerous for passage, any public or private street, highway, sidewalk, stream, ditch, or drainage; or
 - 5. In any way renders other persons insecure in life or the use of property; or
 - 6. Essentially interferes with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property or tends to depreciate the value of the property of others.
- B. A public nuisance consists of knowingly creating, performing, or maintaining anything affecting any number of citizens without lawful authority that is either:

- 1. Injurious to public health, safety, morals, or welfare; or
- 2. Interferes with the exercise and enjoyment of public rights, including the right to use public property.

11-6-2 ENUMERATION OF NUISANCE ITEMS

The maintaining, using, placing, depositing, leaving or permitting to be or remain on any public or private property in the City of any of the following items, conditions or actions are defined and declared to be and found to constitute a nuisance; provided however, this enumeration shall not be deemed or construed to be conclusive, limiting or restrictive.

- A. Weeds and other vegetation that are rank, noxious, poisonous, harmful, unhealthful, or any growth whatsoever of an offensive nature or which is deleterious to health and safety; or
- B. Any accumulation of rubbish, trash, refuse, junk and other abandoned materials, metals, lumber, or other things; or
- C. Any accumulation of motor vehicles not in operating condition; or
- D. Any condition which provides harborage for rats, mice, snakes and other vermin, or provides a vector for the transmission of infectious disease between humans or from animals to humans; or
- E. Any building or other structure in such a dilapidated condition that it is unfit for human habitation or kept in such an unsanitary condition that it is a menace to the health of people residing in the vicinity thereof or presents a dangerous fire hazard in the vicinity where it is located; or
- F. All unnecessary or unauthorized noises and annoying vibrations, including animal noises; or
- G. All disagreeable or obnoxious odors and stenches, as well as the conditions, substances or other causes that give rise to the emission or generation of such odors and stenches; or
- H. The carcasses of animals or fowl not disposed of after death; or
- I. The pollution of any public well or cistern, stream, lake, canal, or body of water by sewage, dead animals, creamery or other industrial wastes or other substances; or
- J. Any building, structure or other place or location where any activity that is in violation of local, state or federal law is conducted, performed or maintained; or

K. Any accumulation of stagnant water permitted or maintained on any lot or piece of ground.

11-6-3 NUISANCE PROHIBITED

It is unlawful for any person to cause, permit, maintain or allow the creation or maintenance of a nuisance. Any violation of this section shall be deemed a misdemeanor and subject to the penalties set forth in Section 7 of this Ordinance or, in the alternative, remedied by the City with a lien placed on the property for all costs assumed by the City pursuant to Section 9 of this Ordinance.

11-6-4 RESPONSIBILITY OF PROPERTY OWNER

Each property owner within the City, whether a natural person or other legal entity, shall be responsible, under the provisions of this chapter, for each individual tract of property owned and the owner's responsibility established herein will extend to abutment of other adjoining property lines. When any portion of the property abuts on a public road or alley, the property owner's responsibility shall extend to the center of the road or alley; provided however, that this section shall not restrict in any manner the maintenance of the full alley and street by the City of Rio Communities.

11-6-5 NOTICE TO ABATE

Whenever a nuisance is found to exist within the City or within the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction, a sworn officer of the City shall give written notice to the owner or occupant of the property upon which such nuisance exists or upon the person causing or maintaining the nuisance.

11-6-6 CONTENTS OF NOTICE

The notice to abate a nuisance issued under the provisions of this chapter shall contain:

- A. An order to abate the nuisance or to request a hearing within a stated time, which shall be reasonable under the circumstances: and
- B. The location of the nuisance, if the same is stationary; and
- C. A description of the alleged nuisance; and
- D. A statement of acts necessary to abate the nuisance; and
- E. A statement that if the nuisance is not abated as directed and no request for hearing is made within the prescribed time, the City will abate such nuisance and assess the cost thereof against such person and any applicable property.

11-6-7 COMPLAINT AND PENALTIES

- A. In the event the owner or occupant of the property where the nuisance violation of this chapter exists, has failed within the prescribed time, to abate the nuisance in accordance with the Notice described in Section 7 of this Ordinance, then any sworn Law Enforcement officer, building inspector/code enforcement officer or fire marshal may file a complaint charging violation of this chapter with the municipal court demanding that the owner of the property, or the occupant thereof, or both, be held to answer to the court for the violation of this chapter.
- B. Upon conviction thereof, the owner shall be subject to penalty as provided in Title 1, Chapter 4 of this code, and each day on which such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense. These penalties shall be in addition to payment of any city costs for cutting or removal, or both.
- C. When judgment is against the defendant in an action to abate a public nuisance, he shall be adjudged to pay all court costs and a reasonable fee for the complainant's attorney, when the suit is not prosecuted exclusively by the City attorney.
- D. In the alternative to a complaint filed in municipal court, pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 30-8-8(B), A civil action to abate a public nuisance may be brought, by verified complaint in the name of the state without cost, by any public officer or private citizen, in the district court of the county where the public nuisance exists, against any person, corporation or association of persons who shall create, perform or maintain a public nuisance.

11-6-8 GENERAL PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS OF CHAPTER/CONTINUING VIOLATIONS

- A. Whenever in this chapter an act is prohibited or is made or declared to be unlawful or an offense or a misdemeanor or a petty misdemeanor, or whenever in this chapter the doing of any act is required or the failure to do any act is declared to be unlawful, and no specific penalty is provided therefor, the violation of any such provision or the failure to perform any such act shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding hundred dollars (\$300.00) or by imprisonment not to exceed ninety (90) days or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.
- B. Each day any such violation or failure to perform such act shall continue shall constitute a separate offense and a separate violation of an ordinance of this City, unless otherwise specifically provided.

11-6-9 ALTERNATIVE METHOD OF ABATEMENT

- A. As an alternative to filing a Complaint pursuant to Section 8 of this Ordinance, or in the event that a person is convicted of violating this article and still refuses to remove the nuisance, an officer of the City may proceed to abate such nuisance and shall prepare a statement of costs incurred in the abatement thereof.
- B. Any and all costs incurred by the City in the abatement of a nuisance under the provisions of this chapter shall constitute a lien against the property upon which such nuisance existed, which lien shall be filed, proven and collected as provided for by law. Such lien shall be notice to all persons from the time of its recording and shall bear interest at the legal rate thereafter until satisfied.

11-6-10 EMERGENCY ABATEMENT

- A. Notwithstanding any other provision in this code if, in the opinion of the inspector, the conditions at a property constitute an imminent hazard, the inspector may order immediate abatement of the hazard without notice. Such abatement of an imminent hazard shall be limited to the work necessary to remove the hazard, and may include disconnection of utilities, securing of the structures or emergency cleaning of the property to abate any violations found.
- B. The city shall pay the cost and expense of such abatement from any appropriation made available for that purpose.
- C. A lien shall be recorded with the Valencia County Clerk's Office for all the costs incurred by the city as a result of abating the property.
- D. Whenever the inspector finds that any structure contains an imminent hazard or health hazard, the inspector may declare such structure unfit for human occupancy and order it to be vacated or to remain vacant. A structure declared unfit for occupancy and ordered vacated or to remain vacant under the provisions of this section shall not be leased, rented, or occupied, until it has been inspected and deemed fit for occupancy by the city. The city shall reinspect, for the purpose of reoccupancy, within three business days of the receipt of a written request by the owner, their agent or responsible party.

11-6-11 CONFLICTING PROVISIONS

Any city ordinance or part of ordinance which is in conflict with the provisions of this article is hereby superseded to the extent that this article provides more specific standards or stricter standards of compliance.

CHAPTER 11 HEALTH AND SAFETY

ARTICLE 7 DANGEROUS BUILDINGS

SECTION 1 DANGEROUS BUILDING OR DEBRIS

SECTION 2 CONFLICTING PROVISIONS

11-7-1 DANGEROUS BUILDING OR DEBRIS

- A. Whenever any building or structure is ruined, damaged and dilapidated, or any premise is covered with ruins, rubbish, wreckage or debris, the governing body of the City of Rio Communities may, by resolution find that the ruined, damaged and dilapidated building, structure or premise is a menace to the public comfort, health, peace or safety and requires the removal of the building, structure, ruins, rubbish, wreckage or debris from the municipality.
- B. A copy of the resolution shall be served on the owner, occupant, or agent in charge of the building, structure or premise. If the owner, as shown by the real estate records of the county clerk, occupant, or agent in charge of the building, structure or premise cannot be served within the municipality, a copy of the resolution shall be posted on the building, structure or premise and a copy of the resolution shall be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Rio Communities pursuant to NMSA 1798, Section 14-11-2. [Requirements for publication of legal notice or advertisement]
- C. Within ten (10) days of the receipt of a copy of the resolution or the posting and publishing of a copy of the resolution, the owner, occupant or agent in charge of the building, structure or premise shall commence removing the building, structure, ruin, rubbish, wreckage or debris, or file a written objection with the municipal clerk asking for a hearing before the governing body of the municipality.
- D. If a written objection is filed as required in this section, the governing body shall:
 - 1. Fix a date for a hearing on the resolution and the objection; and
 - 2. Consider all evidence for and against the removal resolution at the hearing; and
 - 3. Determine if the resolution should be enforced or rescinded.
- E. Any person aggrieved by the determination of the governing body may appeal to the district court by:
 - 1. Giving notice of appeal to the governing body within five (5) days after the determination is made by the governing body; and

- 2. Filing a petition in the district court within twenty (20) days after the determination made by the governing body. The district court shall hear the matter de novo and enter judgment in accordance with its findings.
- F. If the owner, occupant, or agent in charge of the building, structure or premise fails to commence removing the building, structure, ruins, rubbish, wreckage or debris:
 - Within thirty (30) days of being served a copy of the resolution and the posting and publishing of the resolution as required in section 11-7-1B of this Ordinance; or
 - 2. Within five (5) days of the determination by the governing body that the resolution shall be enforced; or
 - 3. After the district court enters judgment sustaining the determination of the governing body, the City of Rio Communities may remove the building, structure, ruins, rubbish, wreckage or debris at the cost and expense of the owner. The reasonable cost of the removal shall constitute a lien against the building, structure, ruin, rubbish, wreckage or debris so removed and against the lot or parcel of land from which it was removed. The lien shall be foreclosed in the manner provided in NMSA 1978, Sections 3-36-1 through 3-36-6.
- G. The municipality may pay for the costs of removal of any condemned building, structure, wreckage, rubbish, or debris by granting to the person removing such materials, the legal title to all salvageable materials in lieu of other compensation.
- H. Any person or firm removing any condemned building, structure, wreckage, rubbish or debris shall leave the premises from which the material has been removed in a clean, level and safe condition, suitable for further occupancy or construction and with all excavations filled.

11-7-2 CONFLICTING PROVISIONS

Any city ordinance or part of ordinance which is in conflict with the provisions of this article is hereby superseded to the extent that this article provides more specific standards or stricter standards of compliance.
