ELLIE JEAN PROJECT UPDATE

- -Prices were confirmed again on December 12th, 2025, with *Creative Playscapes* (see attachment 1&2) as the same quoted on February 19th, 2025, of \$199,075.00
- -Quote from Gilbert Horner Paving for 50x22ft handicapped parking spaces (3), \$4,300.00
- -Site clearing to be completed by Public Works, any other site prep required has been coordinated with a robust volunteer workforce that has reached out to the Town over the weekend.
- -No construction project managed by current administration has ever gone over budget.
- -Current Fund balance/Cash on hand \$2,854,836.81

TIMELINE RECAP

- July 22, 2023-Ellie Jean Project hosts Fundraiser for last Ellie Jean Playpark initiative.
- March 15, 2024-Town accepts \$42,000.00 from ELJ and passes resolution to complete project.
- November 10, 2024-Town conducts fundraising softball game, raising \$2,475.63 and another \$600.00 in private donations (see ledger.)
- February 19th 2025, Manager reports price quote of under \$200,000.00 for project is attainable.
- Summer 2025, Manager reports application to be submitted for ELJ Funding through OTPF from Moore County Visitors Bureau.
- December 9th 2025- Town was notified of \$75,000.00 grant contingent on matching funds.

Re: Request for Project Funding through the One Time Project Fund 2.0

Mr. Werz.

Last year it was brought to the attention of Robbins' leadership that there were no *all-inclusive*, *adaptive*, *handicap accessible* (AAH) play areas within reasonable distance from the Town of Robbins. Since learning about this shortcoming, the town staff have attended seminars and received credible training on how to support families and children with disabilities residing not only inside but also outside the Robbins community.

Furthermore, Robbins has partnered with the *Ellie Jean Project*, which has successfully built two all-inclusive parks within Moore County. With donations from the *Ellie Jean Project*, and private donations from the Inaugural "Battle for the North Charity Softball Game," we have raised over \$50,000 towards this noble public project that will appeal to a untapped demographic of local and regional visitors to the Town of Robbins; combined with the continued focus on the outdoor recreation appeal of Bear Creek, we strongly feel that this park will enhance new visitation and recreation exploration from regional travelers and adventure seekers.

While planning this project, we learned that there are 40 families within Robbins that have children categorized as handicapped or having disabilities. Additionally, ADA accessible facilities are a growing market that supports a specific tourism population worth over \$58+ billion nationally. For communities aiming to be inclusive, investing in accessible play isn't just a playground site, they're foundational to growth, cohesion, and tourism appeal. On behalf of the 40 effected families, their children, and many others, we humbly request CVB grant funding for \$100,000.00 to jumpstart and this amazing "shovel ready" project.

I also invite you at your convenience to meet the Clothier family. Leslie and her husband are both dedicated public servants who founded the *Ellie Jean Project* for the daughter. Ellie Jean was born blind from cerebral palsy with epilepsy and was not expected to live past 7 years old. Now that Ellie Jean is 10 years old, the Robbins leadership feels that this project should be prioritized to fulfill the Clothier family's dream of having an AAH park in Robbins within Ellie Jean's lifetime. We eagerly ask your organization to consider this selfless request as we continue to support and appreciate all the remarkable things your organization does for all Moore County's communities.







Hello Clint,

Congratulations on your One-Time Project Fund award of \$75,000 for the Ellie Jean Play Park. The CVB appreciates your continued support and partnership.

Now that you have been awarded funds, I need to tell you how you secure the funds. Given this is a match, the CVB needs to see documentation from a bank that shows assets dedicated to this project that meet or exceed the awarded funds. For example, for the Skatepark, they initially raised \$140,000, so we could only provide that match of the \$200,000.00. Once they raised the full amount, we provided the full match.

In Haywood County (the inspiration for the OTPF), they do their awards as a reimbursement. Their projects must be completed, all receipts provided and their CVB provides the matching funds as a reimbursement. This does two things: 1) ensures the project completion and 2) funds cannot be diverted to a different project of other use. They changed their policy recently as an award recipient used the dollars for something not associated with the project (HVAC), so they did not provide the reimbursement at all. The recipient was not happy, but he did not fulfill the terms of the match.

So, for us, we merely need to have a letter from the bank, a statement, or something that shows you have secured at least \$75,000.00 for this project. Once we have that for our files (and for us to show county finance for their files), the county will send you the funds at my request. I will also need to know to whom/what the check should be made out. I assume the Town of Robbins.

If you are wondering, for any organization that would potentially divert funds, it would result in permanent disqualification for any future considerations from the CVB on all levels. Of course, that is of no concern with the Town of Robbins! Just letting you know it does happen, so we have guardrails and safeguards to protect the CVB and to ensure we protect visitor taxpayer dollars.
