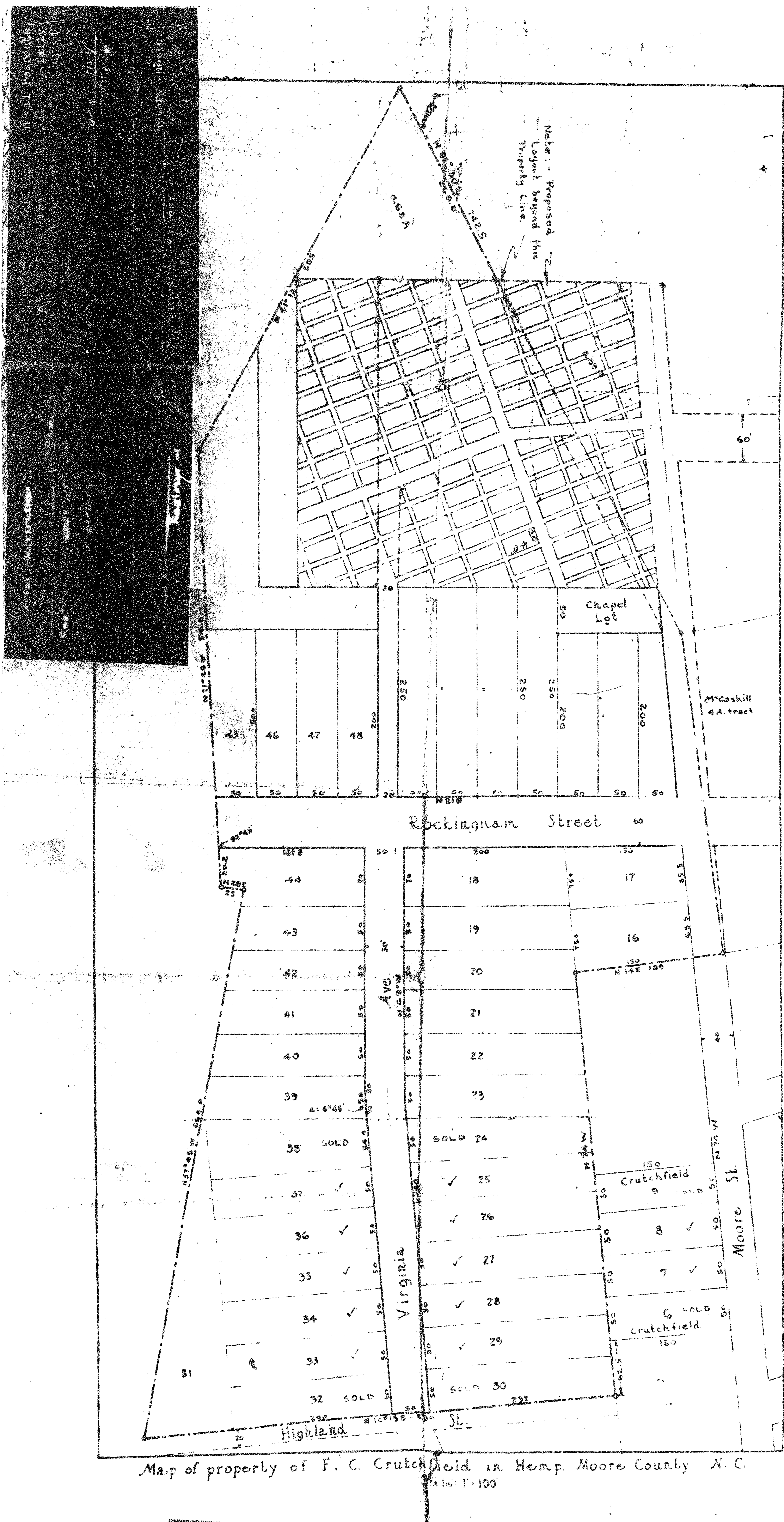

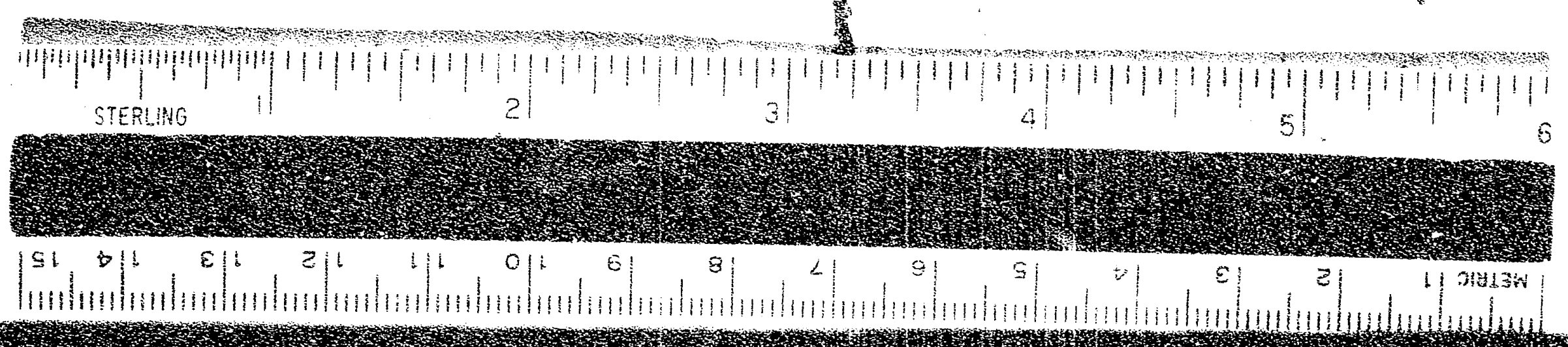

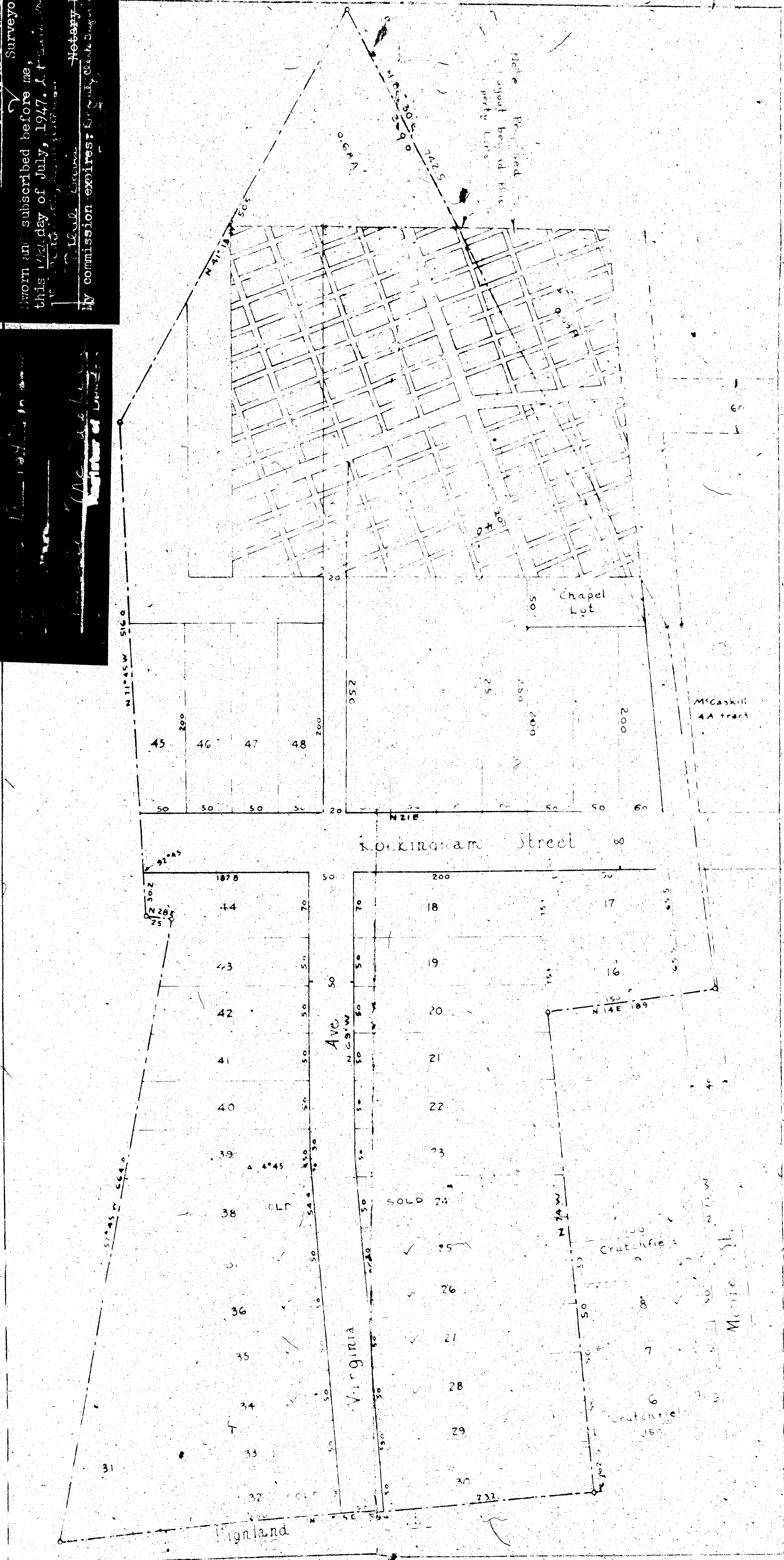

During March, Robbins Officers conducted a total of Three-Hundred and Seventy-Seven events. I would like to highlight those officers seized a total of three hundred grams of various types of narcotics. Officers conducted multiple drug investigations to achieve this positive outcome. Officers also conducted several investigations of larceny from the local businesses. Several arrests were made from the investigations.

I would like to highlight that an arrest was made that stemmed from an ordinance violation. Due to the nature of the case, the information is sealed currently until the outcome of the court case. Officers have also investigated several other ordinance violations and I am happy to report that most of the residents comply with the order/citation within the given timeframe.

Lieutenant Dunlap and Officer Prevatte have completed the General Instructor School/Training. Both are now certified to teach Officers in a wide variety of training. I will speak about this during the Board Meeting.
