2. **Budget Fiscal Year 2022 (Public Hearing and Adoption).** The City of Rochelle held a Committee of the Whole meeting on November 15^{th.} to discuss the upcoming 2022 budget. During the meeting, the City Manager presented a PowerPoint highlighting the 2022 budget and answered specific questions on various line items. The City Clerk published a Public Hearing Notice, as required by State law, to consider adoption of the budget at the December 13th City Council Meeting. Final action on the 2022 Budget is required on or before December 30, 2021 to be filed with Ogle and Lee Counties. The final Proposed 2022 General Fund revenues are budgeted at \$12,117,647. This represents an increase of approximately 3% compared to the original approved 2021 budget. Budgeted expenses total \$13,072,825 which is approximately 20% higher than the 2021 budget. This results in a budget deficit of \$955,177. The combination of the General Fund, Special Revenue Funds, Enterprise Funds, Internal Service Funds, Trust and Agency Funds, and Capital Project Funds

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results in budgeted revenues of \$87,323,018 and budgeted expenses of \$89,785,184. Illinois statutes require that the City conduct a public hearing on the proposed budget to allow citizens the opportunity to provide comments. After the Council returns to regular session, members of the Council can propose modifications to the proposed budget, each of which will be voted on by the Council. The proposed budget as amended will then be subject to a final Council vote for approval. Jeff Fiegenschuh was available for questions. Motion made by Councilor D. McDermott, Seconded by Councilor Shaw-Dickey, "I move the Council recess into a Public Hearing for the Fiscal Year 2022 Budget." Voting Yea: T. McDermott, Hayes, D. McDermott, Gruben, Shaw-Dickey, Arteaga, Mayor Bearrows. Nays: None. Motion passed 7-0. There were no public comments. Motion made by Councilor D. McDermott, Seconded by Councilor Shaw-Dickey, "I move the Council return to open session." Voting Yea: T. McDermott, Hayes, D. McDermott, Gruben, Shaw-Dickey, Arteaga, Mayor Bearrows. Nays: None. Motion passed 7-0. Motion made by Councilor D. McDermott, Seconded by Councilor Hayes, "I move Ordinance 21-5312, an Ordinance Adopting the 2022 City of Rochelle Municipal Budget, be approved." Voting Yea: T. McDermott, Hayes, D. McDermott, Gruben, Shaw-Dickey, Arteaga, Mayor Bearrows. Nays: None. Motion passed 7-0.

- 3. 2022-2041 Capital Improvement Plan. The City's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) is a multi-year planning instrument for the evaluation and identification of the capital infrastructure projects in need of renovation, repair, and/or construction along with the equipment or vehicle replacement over the next twenty years. The CIP relates these projected capital needs to the financial sources that will support their realization and the timeframe in which the financing and work will take place. Capital improvement programming is the process by which these capital projects are identified, prioritized, and selected, and thus are incorporated into the long-range fiscal and strategic planning of the City. The Capital Improvement Plan document is different from the annual budget as it sets forth a twenty-year program. The first year's program contains projects that are included in the 2022 City of Rochelle Budget. The remaining nineteen years reflect staff's recommended priorities in the future. Jeff Fiegenschuh was avaiable to answer questions. Motion made by Councilor T. McDermott, Seconded by Councilor Gruben, "I move Resolution R21-60, a Resolution Approving the City of Rochelle's Capital Improvement Plan, be approved." Voting Yea: T. McDermott, Haves, D. - Resolution Approving an Amendment to the Personnel Manual. The City of Rochelle 4. "Handbook" Personnel Policies Manual had a major update in October of 2018. The Personnel Policies Manual is in constant review and revisions shall be made periodically to be consistent with all applicable laws, employment policies and current technology. There are two changes requested and would be effective January 1, 2022. The two changes are: Addition of Holiday, MLK, 3rd Monday in January (2022, January 17th) Addition of an Executive Level Leave the Martin Luther King Jr. (MLK) holiday is being added to create consistency throughout the organization with union and non-union employees. This year the police department contract included the MLK holiday and was added in the holiday list. MLK Day was also added to the City's Holiday calendar, this would keep the non-union staff consistent with the City's holiday calendar. Martin Luther King Jr. was born on Tuesday, January 15, 1929. Observing it as a Monday holiday is similar to holidays set under the Uniform Monday Holiday Act. As a tool to retain and attract quality employees, we established an Executive Level (EL) Leave schedule for Vacation and Personal leave. The EL Leave schedule includes specific positions within the organization. This allows for these positions to have additional leave above the base leave schedule. These positions are highly educated and are filled with seasoned employees with years of experience. At this level there is a higher demand of their time during a week, often working at night and over the weekend. Granting the EL Leave to these positions would allow employees the needed time off to step away and "recharge" benefiting their overall wellness and their performance for the organization. Adding this EL Leave will also benefit the new financial/HR software. This will allow us to automate the accrual process

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for those individuals with these positions, rather than keeping a spreadsheet and manually adjusting the annual accruals.

Executive Level (EL) Vacation Leave: An Executive level employee may carry over an aggregate maximum of 120 hours of unused vacation from one anniversary year to the next. If an EL employee has excessive unused accrued vacation remaining in the thirty (30) days preceding the employee's next date of accrual, the City in its discretion may require the employee to take the vacation during the thirty (30) day period or require the employee to forfeit the vacation and to receive vacation pay out not to exceed eighty (80) hours.

Human Resource Coordinator Nancy Bingham was available for questions. Motion made by Councilor Hayes, Seconded by Councilor Gruben, "I move Resolution R21-61, a Resolution Approving an Amendment to the Personnel Manual, be approved." Voting Yea: T. McDermott, Hayes, D. 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5. **Resolution Amending the City of Rochelle COVID Temporary Leave Program.** The Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) act expired on December 31, 2020; the federal/state mandates were not renewed for 2021. The City of Rochelle implemented a new leave program in January of 2021, which was approved for 30 days, then was extended until June 30, 2021. This program is not the same program or an extension of the federally mandated program that was effective in 2020. The City has created this new program to allow for benefits into 2021 for those exposed to or contracted COVID. Although COVID cases have decreased and the vaccine is available, COVID is still appearing in our community.

Program Details:

- 1) Exposure to COVID: Employee will be asked to be tested and results will determine if/when the quarantine will take place. If not tested and no symptoms, the employee will be required to quarantine and use sick leave to cover the absence.
- 2) Testing: If an employee has been exposed to COVID and is being tested, the employee will be placed on COVID Administrative Leave while awaiting test results with no use of leave.
- 3) Positive Test Results the employee will receive up to 80 hours of CTL while on quarantine. The length of quarantine will be based on the recommendation of the health department. Document of positive test results must be sent to HR within 24 hours of notification. If no letter is received to confirm test results, employee may be required to use sick leave from their leave bank.
- 4) Negative Test Results—the employee may return to work under modified quarantine guidelines: wear mask, physical distance, and monitor symptoms. Documentation of the negative results must be sent to HR prior to returning to work.

Per this program, employees will be asked to submit any documentation they may receive from testing facility and/or the designated health department. This program is monitored and based on each employee's case. The COVID Temporary Leave (CTL) hours are designated per case, but a total for all exposures until March 31, 2022. Sick Leave may be used to cover absences related to illness during this time. The COVID Temporary Leave Program does not included the mandated childcare provisions that FFCRA required for school closings and/or remote learning. Nancy Bingham was available for questions. - 6. Ordinance Approving Membership in the Illinois Municipal League Risk Management Association and Execution of an Intergovernmental Cooperation Contract. Motion made by Councilor D. McDermott, Seconded by Councilor Shaw-Dickey, "I move ordinance 21-5313 and any action taken on it be postponed until 12/20/2021." Voting Yea: T. McDermott, Hayes, D. McDermott, Gruben, Shaw-Dickey, Arteaga, Mayor Bearrows. Nays: None. Motion passed 7-0.
- 7. **Resolution to Support the Rebuild Downtowns and Main Streets Capital Grant Application.** Rebuild Downtowns & Main Streets (RDMS) will provide capital grants to support economic recovery in commercial corridors and downtowns that have experienced disinvestment, particularly in communities hardest-hit by COVID-19. RDMS is supported by State (Rebuild Illinois Capital Plan) and Federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funding.

Minimum \$250,000

Maximum \$3 million

Application Deadline: January 10, 2022

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Matching requirement is waived for units of local government but providing a match might improve the odds of receiving an award.

Eligible projects include:

- 1. Roads, parking, and sidewalks
- 2. Transit, pedestrian, or bicycle infrastructure
- 3. Broadband infrastructure
- 4. Water/sewer infrastructure
- 5. Public spaces, such as parks and plazas, including lighting and landscaping
- 6. Sustainable investment in or modernization of structures in disrepair
- 7. Mixed-use development or transit-oriented development

Potential projects could include reconstruction of City parking lots near the downtown, additional new parking, removal of blight, a public restroom facility and improvements to electric and broadband infrastructure. Community Development Director Michelle Pease was available for questions. Motion made by Councilor Arteaga, Seconded by Councilor D. McDermott, "I move Resolution R21-63, a Resolution of Support for the Rebuild Downtown & Main Streets Capital Grant, be approved." Voting Yea: T. McDermott, Hayes, D. McDermott, Gruben, Shaw-Dickey, Arteaga, Mayor Bearrows. Nays: None Motion passed 7-0.

- 8. Ordinance Rezoning Property Located at 100 Steward Road, Rochelle, Illinois. The subject property was annexed into the City of Rochelle in 2010 with an I-1 Light Industry zoning classification. In 2018 the developer rezoned the property to a B-2 Commercial Highway because he felt it created a better market for the property. Due to the recent updated zoning codes, a warehouse is no longer allowed with a special use in a B-2 zoning district. This eliminates potential developments on this property. The petitioner is requesting to amend the zoning map/rezone 100 Steward Road from a B-2, Commercial Highway to an I-1, Light Industry. The property is surrounded by B-2 Commercial Highway on the west, agricultural on the south, Illinois Tollway I-88 on the north, and Residential Single Family on the east. At the Planning & Zoning Meeting held on December 6, 2021, the Planning and Zoning Commission voted 4 to 0 to approve the proposed rezone for a B-2 to an I-1. Michelle Pease was available for questions. Motion made by Councilor Gruben, Seconded by Councilor T. McDermott, "I move Ordinance 21-5314, an Ordinance Re-Zoning Property Located at 100 Steward Rd, be approved." Voting Yea: T. McDermott, Hayes, D. McDermott, Gruben, Shaw-Dickey and Arteaga. Abstain: Mayor Bearrows. Nays: None. Motion passed 6-1.
- 9. Change Order for Project Jackpot 15kV Temporary Power Feed. In support of the overall project and interconnection for project Jackpot, we are requesting a change order that includes the installation of a 15kV UG feeder connection from the west building to the east building to relieve some load from transformer #5 at the Caron Rd substation to insure reliability of the distribution system. This feed will be the temporary excess source of power to the east building and will eventually be the sole source of power for the west building. This work was not included in the original bid package for the substation due to the ongoing negotiations with project jackpot at the time. We have now solidified the numbers and cannot support the entire load requirements in the west building with the current feeder configuration. Any future service upgrades will be the responsibility of the property owner. BHMG has received a proposal form Whittaker, for all labor, materials, and equipment to provide temporary power feed for Jackpot. RMU has already secured the cable to avoid any delay in the project. Director of Electric Operations Blake Toliver was available for questions. Motion made by Councilor D. McDermott, Seconded by Councilor Shaw-Dickey, "I move the Council Approve a Change Order for the Project Jackpot 15kV Temporary Power Feed from Whittaker Construction & Excavating, Inc. in the amount of

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\$457,123.35, be approved.'' Voting Yea: T. McDermott, Hayes, D. McDermott, Gruben, Shaw-Dickey, Arteaga, Mayor Bearrows. Nays: None. Motion passed 7-0.

- 10. Ordinance accepting and approving the proposal from UUSCO for the Distribution Transformers and Reclosures Purchase in the amount of \$616,956.00. The City received and opened three (3) bids on October 27th, 2021 for Distribution Transformers and Reclosures as part of the phase II electric distribution upgrades of the generation system. The bids have been reviewed for completeness and ability to meet the specifications requirement. The scope of work includes 4 transformers and 4 reclosures for four different locations that will back feed the 5kV system fed by the generation plant. These transformers will help to avoid a single point of failure at the diesel plant. Due to the location of the transformers the underground reclosures are best suited options for this project. UUSCO submitted two quotes and BHMG's recommendation is to accept UUSCO's bid in the amount of \$616,956.00 which is in-line with the project's specifications and acceptable lead time. RMU has worked with UUSCO and the company appears to be in good standing and has the expertise suitable for the project. Blake Toliver was available for questions. Motion made by Councilor Hayes, Seconded by Councilor Arteaga, "I move Ordinance 21-5315, an Ordinance Accepting and Approving the Proposal from UUSCO for the Distribution Transformers and Reclosures Pursuant to the Request for Proposal, be approved." Voting Yea: Councilor T. McDermott, Councilor Hayes, Councilor D. McDermott, Councilor Gruben, Councilor Shaw-Dickey, Councilor Arteaga, Mayor Bearrows. Nays: None. Motion passed 7-0.
- 11. **Resolution authorizing and approving an audit services agreement between Panoptic Solutions, LLC and the City of Rochelle.** As part of the City's efforts to improve service delivery. The City is engaging with Panoptic Solutions, LLC to provide energy efficiency auditing services as needed to RMU customers. Audits will be available for 2 customer classifications: The first classification is Residential and the second is Small Commercial Businesses with less than a 10,000 square feet footprint. These energy audits will entail a site visit, a data collection report, and an interview finding report for the customers that wish to identify and improve energy inefficiencies. With Council approval, RMU will subsidize 50% of the cost of the audit following the rate schedule below:

The term of the agreement will remain in full force and in effect until \$15,000.00 worth of deliverables and expenses have exhausted and have been billed to RMU. Jeff Fiegenschuh was available for questions. Motion made by Councilor T. McDermott, Seconded by Councilor Hayes, "I move Resolution R21-64, a Resolution Authorizing and Approving an Audit Services Agreement Between Panopotic Solutions, LLC and the City of Rochelle, be approved." Voting Yea: T. McDermott, Hayes, D. McDermott, Gruben, Shaw-Dickey, Arteaga, Mayor Bearrows. Nays: None. Motion passed 7-0.

12. An Ordinance Waiving Competitive Bidding Requirements and Accepting the Proposal of N-Trak Group for Water and Sewer Service Separation at 426 Lincoln Highway, Rochelle, Illinois. As part of the development agreement with 430 Lincoln Highway (E.'s Corner Deli), the City committed to reimburse all or a portion of expenditures for the installation of a larger watermain and sewer service. Since we expect that work to take place in January of 2022, we feel that it would be in our best interest to use the same contractor (N-Track) at that time to separate other shared water and sewer services on the block. The only other definitive shared services are at 426 Lincoln Highway, therefore separating them will avoid future problems and improve service to the business. To ensure that we cover any potential cost increases we are requesting a 15% allowance on this

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contract. Superintendent Water/Water Reclamation Adam Lanning was available for questions. Motion made by Councilor Arteaga, Seconded by Councilor Shaw-Dickey, "I move Ordinance 21-5316, an Ordinance Waiving the Competitive Bidding Requirements and Accepting the Proposal of N-Trak Group for Water and Sewer Service Separation at 426 Lincoln Highway, be approved." Voting Yea: T. McDermott, Hayes, D. McDermott, Gruben, Shaw-Dickey, Arteaga, Mayor Bearrows. Nays: None. Motion passed 7-0.

- 13. Ordinance Amending Section 6-46 of the Municipal Code of the City of Rochelle to Delete One R-1 Liquor License and Create One R-3 Liquor License for Alfano Enterprises, Inc. d/b/a Alfano's Pizza & Italian Restaurant. Alfano's Pizza & Italian Restaurant has submitted an application for a Class R-3 liquor license at 1115 Turkington Terrace. Alfano's wishes to upgrade from the existing Class R-1 liquor license, which allows for beer and wine, to a Class R-3 license which allows for the retail sale of alcoholic liquor by restaurants, with a bar, for consumption on the premises. The Liquor Commissioner, Mayor Bearrows, has reviewed the application and has no objection to the creation of a Class R-3 liquor license for Alfano's Pizza & Italian Restaurant. This action will result in a total of eight Class R-3 liquor licenses in the City of Rochelle. Deputy City Clerk Rose Huéramo was available for questions. Motion made by Councilor D. McDermott, Seconded by Councilor Arteaga, "I move Ordinance 21-5317, an Ordinance Amending Section 6-46 of the Municipal Code of the City of Rochelle to Delete One Class R-1 Liquor License and Create One Class R-3 Liquor License for Alfano Enterprises, Inc. d/b/a Alfano's Pizza & Italian Restaurant, be approved." Voting Yea: T. McDermott, Hayes, D. McDermott, Gruben, Shaw-Dickey, Arteaga, Mayor Bearrows, nays: None. Motion passed 7-0.
- 14. Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Execute an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Illinois Department of Public Health. Rochelle City Clerk is the Registrar of Vital Records for Ogle County. The City Clerk signs off all death certificates for the people that pass away in Ogle County. For each death certificate there is a \$12 charge, \$8 is the cities revenue, in addition the City receives a surcharge fee. In June of 2020 we received \$1760 from the State for 2019. In June of 2021 we received \$1532 for 2020. In the year of 2019, we printed a total of 3789 death certificates with a revenue of \$30,212. For the year of 2020, 3628 were printed with a revenue of \$29,024. Illinois Department of Public Health ("IDPH") will share a por of the Death Certificate Surcharge in accordance with the attached Intergovernmental Agreement. 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- 16. **Bid proposals for the Hickory Grove Demolition Project.** The Hickory Grove Project Demolition project was anticipated to begin in 2022 pending a DCEO grant approval and final development with the adjacent Hotel. The City Manager, staff and consultant Willett Hoffman and Associates has been working on the Hickory Grove Demolition project for over a year to develop an agreement with the adjacent Hotel owner to establish cross access easements, property acquisition, plating, façade improvements on the south side of the hotel after disconnection of the Hickory Grove facility and other general project specifications. The project will consist of complete removal of all above grade structures and below grade foundations where applicable, a portion of the existing pavement, outside pool area, and final restoration and seeding of the disturbed area. The above referenced project was advertised in the Rochelle News leader, and on the City website. Bids were publicly opened and read aloud on November 17, 2021 at 11am for the above referenced project. Eight complete separate bids were received as follows:
 - ➤ McDonagh Demolition submitted a base bid in the amount of \$361,900.00
 - Martin and Company Excavating submitted a base bid in the amount of \$542,000.00
 - Northern Illinois Service Company submitted a base bid in the amount of \$563,528.00
 - ➤ N-TRAK Group, LLC submitted a base bid in the amount of \$586,030.00
 - > Dore and Associates Contracting submitted a base bid in the amount of \$678,600.00
 - > Green Demolition Contractors, Inc. submitted a base bid in the amount of \$726,000.00
 - American Demolition Corp. submitted a base bid in the amount of \$742,815.00
 - ➤ Alpine Demolition Services submitted a base bid in the amount of \$978,000.00

The low bid is approximately 35% lower than the Engineer's estimate of cost of \$575,000.00. The project will be funded through the Solid Waste fund with a DCEO Rebuild Illinois grant reimbursement up to \$365,750.00. It is anticipated the construction project will be substantially complete by the end of April 2022. However, additional time will be granted for any change order work. Due to the volatile insurance market, IMIC was unable to secure a renewal policy for the cyber liability coverage earlier in the process. The City received a renewal quote \$11,386 with National Specialty Insurance through IMIC. This is in addition to the premium renewal amount of \$686,518. The City also has a loss reserve fund of approximately \$476,000 that may be utilized to help offset future rate increased (If approved by the entire IMIC board of directors). Through our Worker's Compensation carrier IPRF, the City received a safety grant in the amount of \$24,181 for safety equipment and/or training for 2022. The award amount varies from year to year based on the total worker's compensation losses and payroll amount from the previous year. Human Resources Coordinator Nancy Bingham and Utilities Management Analyst Adriana Milan and Jeff Fiegenschuh were available for questions. Motion made by Councilor T. <u>SECTION FOUR.</u> Salaries and wages for employees covered by collective bargaining units shall be as set forth in their respective agreements.

SECTION FIVE. This Wage Resolution shall supersede all previous salary and wage resolutions.

<u>SECTION SIX.</u> The provisions of this Resolution are severable and if any court of competent jurisdiction shall declare any portion of this Resolution to be invalid or unenforceable, said decision shall not affect any portion of this Resolution, other than the part declared invalid or unenforceable. A local ordinance may impose more rigorous or definite regulations in addition to those enacted by the state legislature so long as they do not conflict with the statute." (*Village of Wauconda v. Hutton*, 291 Ill. App. 3d 1058, 1060 (1997)); and

WHEREAS, three businesses in Rochelle are not going to renew their liquor licenses for 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Holiday Inn Express, located at 1240 Dement Road, Rochelle, Illinois, was issued a Class R-1 liquor license; and

WHEREAS, El Tapatio, located at 1310 N. 7th Street, Rochelle, Illinois, was issued a Class R-2 liquor license; and

WHEREAS, the Rusty's Slots, located at 901 S. 7^{th} Street, was issued a Class B liquor license; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Liquor Commissioner, John Bearrows, has determined, based upon the non-renewal of these three liquor licenses, that it is prudent to delete one Class R-1 Liquor License, one Class R-2 Liquor License, and one Class B liquor license; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Corporate Authorities of the City of Rochelle that an amendment Section 6-46 of The Municipal Code Of The City Of Rochelle creating one R-3 liquor license and deleting one R-1 liquor license is in the best interest of the City and its residents.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCHELLE, ILLINOIS:

<u>SECTION ONE</u>: That the City hereby incorporates all of the recitals above into this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

<u>SECTION TWO</u>: That Chapter 6, Article I, Section 6-46 "Number Limitations" is hereby amended by removing the following language:

SUPPLEMENTAL ENGINEERING AGREEMENT

FOR

CITY OF ROCHELLE, ILLINOIS

Hickory Grove Demolition Project Construction Observation Services

WHA#1036D20



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THIS SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT made by and between City of Rochelle, Ogle County, Illinois (hereinafter called the OWNER) and WILLETT, HOFMANN & ASSOCIATES, INC., CONSULTING ENGINEERS, 809 East 2nd Street, Dixon, Illinois, (hereinafter called the ENGINEER).

WITNESSETH, that whereas the OWNER intends to demolish the Hickory Grove Banquet Center located at 1127 North 7th Street in Rochelle, Illinois (hereinafter called the Project). It is understood this Agreement will provide or construction observation services as an Additional Service to the original Engineering Agreement for the Project. Construction observation services will include maintaining a daily log of activities, providing witness that work is being completed in accordance with the intent expressed on Contract Documents, and serving as a central contact person for the City, Contractor and adjacent property owners. It is also understood that these services shall not include dictating any means, methods, sequences, techniques, procedures, or for any health or safety precautions required by any regulatory agencies in connection with the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, The OWNER and the ENGINEER in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth agree as follows:

SECTION 1 - SERVICES OF THE ENGINEER

1.1 General

- 1.1.1. The ENGINEER agrees to perform professional services in connection with the Project as hereinafter stated.
- 1.1.2. The ENGINEER will serve as the OWNER's professional representative in the phases of the Project as described herein and will give consultation and advice to the OWNER during the performance of said services.

1.2 Construction Phase

During the construction observation phase the ENGINEER will:

- 1.2.1. Provide personnel on site at times work is being completed to observe the progress and quality of the executed work and to determine in general if the work is proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents. Observation personnel will not be responsible for the techniques and sequences of construction or demolition or the safety precautions incident thereto; and shall record observations in a daily log, keep the OWNER informed of the progress of the work, endeavor to guard the OWNER against defects and deficiencies in the work of the Contractor, and serve as a central contact person for the City, Contractor and adjacent property owners. The ENGINEER is not responsible for any testing or inspection of any materials.
- 1.2.2. Conduct, in the company with the OWNER, a final inspection of the Project for conformance with the design concept of the Project and compliance with the information given by the Contract Documents.

1.2.3. Through the on-site observations of the work in progress the ENGINEER will endeavor to provide protection for the OWNER against defects and deficiencies in the work, but the furnishing of such resident project representation shall not make the ENGINEER responsible for the Contractor's failure to perform the construction work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

<u>SECTION 2 - ADDITIONAL SERVICES OF THE ENGINEER</u>

2.1 General

If authorized in writing by the OWNER, the ENGINEER will furnish or obtain from others additional services of the following types which will be paid for by the OWNER as indicated in subsection 5.1.2.

- 2.1.1. The testing for, identification of, and/or abatement of any hazardous materials (including asbestos), other than mold, within the existing structure.
- 2.1.2. Furnish standard core borings, subsurface probings and/or subsurface explorations; for design of the sanitary sewer facilities. Furnishing of additional or nonstandard core borings, probings or subsurface explorations; hydrographic surveys; laboratory testing and inspection of samples or materials; and other special consultation.
- 2.1.2. Furnish survey plats and assist the OWNER in the preparation of easement forms.
- 2.1.3. Additional services due to significant changes in general scope of the Project or its design including, but not limited to, changes in size, complexity, or character of construction.
- 2.1.4. Revising previously approved studies, reports, design documents, drawings or specifications.
- 2.1.5. Investigations involving detailed consideration of operations, maintenance and overhead expenses; and the preparation of rate schedules, earnings and expense statements, feasibility studies, appraisals and valuations; detailed quantity surveys of material and labor; and material audits or inventories required for certification of force account construction performed by OWNER.
- 2.1.6. Preparing special change orders requested by the OWNER.
- 2.1.7. Making an inspection of the Project prior to expiration of the guarantee period and reporting observed discrepancies under guarantees provided by the construction contract.
- 2.1.10. Additional or extended services during construction made necessary by: (1) work damaged by fire or other cause during construction; (2) prolongation of the construction contract time by more than 25%; (3) acceleration of the work schedule involving services beyond normal working hours; and (4) contract default due to delinquency or insolvency.
- 2.1.11. Additional services and costs necessitated by out of town travel required of the ENGINEER other than visits to the Project as required by Section 1.
- 2.1.12. Serving as an expert witness for the OWNER in any litigation or other proceeding involving the Project.

2.1.13. Additional services in connection with the Project not otherwise provided for in this Agreement.

SECTION 3 - THE OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The OWNER will:

- 3.1. Provide full information as to his requirements for the Project.
- 3.2. Assist the ENGINEER by placing at his disposal all available information pertinent to the site of the Project including previous reports and any other data relative to design and construction of the Project.
- 3.3. Guarantee access to and make all provisions for the ENGINEER to enter upon public and private lands as required for the ENGINEER to perform his work under this Agreement.
- 3.4. Examine all studies, reports, sketches, estimates, specifications, drawings, proposals and other documents presented by the ENGINEER and shall render in writing decisions pertaining thereto within a reasonable time so as not to delay the work of the ENGINEER.
- 3.5. Advertise for Proposals from bidders, open the proposals at the appointed time and place, and pay for all costs incident thereto.
- 3.6. Provide such legal, accounting and insurance counseling services as may be required for the Project.
- 3.7. Designate in writing a person to act as OWNER's representative with respect to the work to be performed under this Agreement, and such person shall have complete authority to transmit instructions, receive information, interpret and define OWNER's policies and decisions with respect to materials, equipment elements and systems pertinent to the work covered by this Agreement.
- 3.8. Give prompt written notice to the ENGINEER whenever the OWNER observes or otherwise becomes aware of any defect in the Project.
- 3.9. Obtain approval of all governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Project and such approvals and consents from such other individuals or bodies as may be necessary for completion of the Project.
- 3.10. Furnish, or direct the ENGINEER to provide, at the OWNER's expense, necessary additional services as stipulated in Section 2 of this Agreement, or other services as required.
- 3.11. Furnish the ENGINEER with a description of and the names of owners and lien holders of property adjacent to the proposed improvement, where such data is needed for the preparation of plans and/or right of way or easement plats.

SECTION 4 - PERIOD OF SERVICE

4.1. Unless sooner terminated as provided in subsection 6.1, this Agreement shall remain in force: (1) for a period beginning with the execution of the Owner's contract with the Contractor through

the final inspection of the completed work (anticipated to be January 2022 through March 2022), including any extra work and any required extension thereto.

<u>SECTION 5 - PAYMENTS TO THE ENGINEER</u>

- 5.1. The OWNER will pay the ENGINEER for the services performed as follows:
- 5.1.1. For all work under the Construction Observation Phase of the Project, the OWNER shall pay the ENGINEER an amount equal to the established billing rates of the ENGINEER Billing Rate being defined herein as payroll, social security, retirement deductions, unemployment tax, insurance overhead and profit. In addition, all materials and out-of-pocket expenses shall be paid at their actual cost to the ENGINEER; that payment for such services will be made monthly to the ENGINEER during the course of the ENGINEER's work, upon his submission to the OWNER of an itemized statement showing such time, rates and employees' names.
- 5.1.2. For "Additional Services" performed:
- 5.1.2.1. By personnel assigned to the regularly established office of the ENGINEER, an amount equal to the established billing rates of the ENGINEER as defined in subsection 5.1.1 above.
- 5.1.2.2. In connection with administering sub-contracts for services by others than described in 5.1.2.1. ante, an amount equal to the actual costs billed to the ENGINEER, plus 5% to cover overhead and handling.
- 5.1.2.3. In addition, all materials and out-of-pocket expenses shall be paid at their actual cost to the ENGINEER; that payment for such services will be made monthly to the ENGINEER during the course of the ENGINEER's work, upon his submission to the OWNER of an itemized statement showing such time, rates and employees' names.
- 5.1.3. As per Section 2.1, the OWNER authorizes the ENGINEER to perform the work as described herein. The authorized work <u>shall not exceed</u> Thirty Five Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$35,000.00), and work will not be performed in excess of this amount without prior authorization by the OWNER.

5.2 General

- 5.2.1. If this Agreement is terminated upon completion of any phase of the ENGINEER's services, the progress payments to be made in accordance with subsection 5.1 on account of that and all prior phases shall constitute total payment for services rendered; if terminated during any phase of the work, the ENGINEER shall be paid for services performed during such phase on the basis of his reasonable estimate of the portion of such phase completed prior to termination. In the event of any termination, the ENGINEER shall be paid all terminal expenses resulting therefrom plus payment for additional services then due.
- 5.2.2. If, prior to termination of this Agreement, any work designed or specified by the ENGINEER during any phase of the work is suspended in whole or in part for more than three months, or abandoned, after written notice from the OWNER, the ENGINEER shall be paid for services performed on account of it prior to receipt of such notice from the OWNER as provided in subsection 5.2.1 for termination during any phase of the work.

<u>SECTION 6 - GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS</u>

6.1 Termination

This agreement may be terminated by either party by seven days written notice in the event of substantial failure to perform in accordance with the terms hereof by the other party through no fault of the terminating party. If this Agreement is so terminated, the ENGINEER shall be paid as provided in subsection 5.2.1.

6.2 Ownership of Documents

All documents, including original drawings, estimates, specifications, field notes and data are and remain the property of the ENGINEER as instruments of service. The OWNER may, at his expense, obtain a set of reproducible record prints of drawings and copies of other documents, in consideration of which the OWNER will use them solely in connection with the Project, and not for the purpose of making subsequent extensions or enlargements thereto and he will not sell, publish or display them publicly. Reuse for extensions of the Project, or for new projects, shall require written permission of the ENGINEER and shall entitle him to further compensation at a rate to be agreed upon by OWNER and ENGINEER.

6.3 Estimates

Since the ENGINEER has no control over the cost of labor and materials, or over competitive bidding and market conditions, the estimates of construction cost provided for herein are to be made on the basis of his experience and qualifications but the ENGINEER does not guarantee the accuracy of such estimates as compared to the contractor's bids or the Project construction cost.

6.4 Insurance

The ENGINEER shall secure and maintain such insurance as will protect him from claims under the Workmen's Compensation Acts and from claims for bodily injury, death, or property damage which may arise from the performance of his services under this agreement.

6.5 Successors and Assigns

The OWNER and the ENGINEER each binds himself and his partners, successors, executors, administrators and assigns to the other party of this Agreement and to the partners, successors, executors, administrators and assigns of such other party, in respect to all covenants of this Agreement; except as above, neither the OWNER nor the ENGINEER shall assign, sublet or transfer his interest in this Agreement without the written consent of the other. Nothing herein shall be construed as creating any personal liability on the part of any officer or agent of any public body which may be a party hereto.

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING AND APPROVING THE PROPOSAL FROM CORE AND MAIN, LP FOR WATERMAIN MATERIALS PURSUANT TO THE REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

WHEREAS, Section 7 of Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois provides that a municipality that is not a home rule unit shall only have the powers granted to them by law and as such the City of Rochelle, Ogle County, Illinois being a non-home rule unit pursuant to the provision of said Section 7 of Article VII, and may exercise only the powers expressly granted by law; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois General Assembly granted non-home rule municipalities broad authority to "pass all ordinances and make all rules and regulation proper or necessary, to carry into effect the powers granted to municipalities." 65 ILCS 5/1-2-1; and

WHEREAS, while "non-home rule municipalities have the authority to enact ordinances, such ordinances may in no event conflict with state law or prohibit what a state statue expressly permit. A local ordinance may impose more rigorous or definite regulation in addition to those enacted by the state legislature so long as they do not conflict with the statue." (*Village of Wauconda v. Hutton*, 291 Ill. App. 3d 1058, 1060 (1997)); and

WHEREAS, the City of Rochelle ("City") operates a water utility through the Rochelle Municipal Utilities ("RMU"), one of the City's departments; and

WHEREAS, as part of the Well 4 project, the RMU needed to procure watermain materials to connect the existing well to the new wellhouse; and

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2021 the City issued a Request for Proposals for the procurement of 2nd Avenue watermain materials ("the RFP") and also published the RFP in the Rochelle News Leader on November 17 2021, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the RFP, on November 30, 2021 the City received and properly opened one (1) sealed proposal; and

WHEREAS, after analysis of the proposals submitted, the City's staff and professional engineers has concluded that the proposal submitted by Core and Main, LP in the amount of \$55,075.13 meets the City's specifications pursuant to the RFP and is most advantageous to the City; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council finds that it is in the best interest of the City and its residents to accept and approve the Proposal of Core and Main, LP for the procurement of 2nd Avenue watermain materials in the amount of \$55,075.13; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Rochelle as follows:

<u>SECTION ONE</u>: That the City hereby incorporates all of the recitals above into this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

<u>SECTION TWO</u>: The Mayor and City Council hereby accept and approve the Proposal of McDonagh Demolition, Inc. for the Core and Main, LP for the procurement of 2nd Avenue watermain materials in the amount of \$55,075.13, and authorize the City Manager to execute any and all necessary agreements to memorialize the terms of said proposal (attached hereto as Exhibit 1) in a form to be reviewed by the City Attorney.

<u>SECTION THREE</u>: If any provision of this Ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstance is ruled unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid application or provision, and each invalid provision or invalid application of this Ordinance is severable.

<u>SECTION FOUR</u>: Where the conditions imposed by any provisions of this Ordinance are more restrictive than comparable provisions imposed elsewhere in any other local law, ordinance, resolution, rule or regulation, the regulations of this Ordinance will govern.

SECTION FIVE: The City Clerk shall publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

WHEREAS, Section 7 of Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois provides that a municipality that is not a home rule unit shall only have the powers granted to them by law and as such the City of Rochelle, Ogle County, Illinois being a non-home rule unit pursuant to the provision of said Section 7 of Article VII, and may exercise only the powers expressly granted by law; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois General Assembly granted non-home rule municipalities broad authority to "pass all ordinances and make all rules and regulation proper or necessary, to carry into effect the powers granted to municipalities." 65 ILCS 5/1-2-1; and

WHEREAS, while "non-home rule municipalities have the authority to enact ordinances, such ordinances may in no event conflict with state law or prohibit what a state statue expressly permit. A local ordinance may impose more rigorous or definite regulation in addition to those enacted by the state legislature so long as they do not conflict with the statue." (*Village of Wauconda v. Hutton*, 291 Ill. App. 3d 1058, 1060 (1997)); and

WHEREAS, the City of Rochelle ("City") operates a water utility through the Rochelle Municipal Utilities ("RMU"), one of the City's departments; and

WHEREAS, as part of the Well 4 project, the RMU needed to procure watermain piping to connect the existing well to the new wellhouse; and

WHEREAS, on December 8, 2021 the City issued a Request for Proposals for the procurement of 2nd Avenue watermain piping ("the RFP") and also published the RFP in the Rochelle News Leader on December 8, 2021, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the RFP, on December 20, 2021 the City received and properly opened one (1) sealed proposal; and

WHEREAS, after analysis of the proposals submitted, the City's staff and professional engineers has concluded that the proposal submitted by Ferguson Waterworks in the amount of \$102,522.98 meets the City's specifications pursuant to the RFP and is most advantageous to the City; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council finds that it is in the best interest of the City and its residents to accept and approve the Proposal of Ferguson Waterworks for the procurement of 2^{nd} Avenue piping materials in the amount of \$102,522.98; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Rochelle as follows:

<u>SECTION ONE</u>: That the City hereby incorporates all of the recitals above into this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

<u>SECTION TWO</u>: The Mayor and City Council hereby accept and approve the Proposal of McDonagh Demolition, Inc. for the Ferguson Waterworks for the procurement of 2nd Avenue piping materials in the amount of \$102,522.98, and authorize the City Manager to execute any and all necessary agreements to memorialize the terms of said proposal (attached hereto as Exhibit 1) in a form to be reviewed by the City Attorney.

<u>SECTION THREE</u>: If any provision of this Ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstance is ruled unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid application or provision, and each invalid provision or invalid application of this Ordinance is severable.

<u>SECTION FOUR</u>: Where the conditions imposed by any provisions of this Ordinance are more restrictive than comparable provisions imposed elsewhere in any other local law, ordinance, resolution, rule or regulation, the regulations of this Ordinance will govern.

SECTION FIVE: The City Clerk shall publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

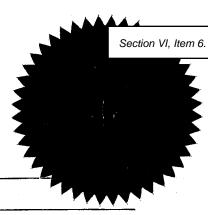

The general purpose of the project is to provide design services for a re-paint of the 1.0 million-gallon water tower in conformance with AWWA requirements. Additionally, we understand Rochelle Municipal Utilities (herein referred to as RMU) wishes to make several repairs/improvements to this tower. A total construction cost was developed nearly two years ago at \$750,000.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The following is our proposed scope of services and our estimate of fees to complete these tasks.

GENERAL CONDITIONS TO AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

- 1. The Client requests the professional services of Fehr Graham hereinafter called "The Consultant" as described herein.
- 2. The Consultant agrees to furnish and perform the professional service described in this Agreement in accordance with accepted professional standards. Consultant agrees to provide said services in a timely manner, provided, however, that Consultant shall not be responsible for delays in completing said services that cannot reasonably be foreseen on date hereof or for delays which are caused by factors beyond his control or delays resulting from the actions or inaction of any governmental agency. Consultant makes no warranty, expressed or implied, as to his findings, recommendations, plans and specifications or professional advice except that they were made or prepared in accordance with the generally accepted engineering practices.
- 3. It is agreed that the professional services described in the Agreement shall be performed for Client's account and that Client will be billed monthly for said services. A 1½% per month service charge will be incurred by Client for any payment due herein and not paid within 30 days of such billing which is equal to an ANNUAL PERCENTAGE RATE OF 18%. Partial payments will be first credited to the accrued service charges and then to the principal.

Summary: The City of Rochelle was awarded a community development block grant from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity in the amount of \$550,000 to line approximately 9,400 feet of sanitary sewer. The City was awarded this grant based on various factors such as basement back up occurrences, income levels and bypass pumping occurrences. The funding match which the City is responsible for is \$70,260, and the 2022 budget includes a total of \$738,654 for this projects full scope of lining. Based upon the most recent engineering estimate, the 2022 funding should secure lining of approximately 12,000 feet of sewer and 29 manholes in the area south of highway 38 around Turkington, MccConaughy and School Avenue.

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SECTION 1 - IDENTIFICATION OF THE PARTIES

THIS AGREEMENT made by and between Rochelle Municipal Utilities, City of Rochelle, Ogle County, Illinois (hereinafter called the OWNER) and WILLETT, HOFMANN & ASSOCIATES, INC., CONSULTING ENGINEERS, 809 East 2nd Street, Dixon, Illinois, hereinafter called the ENGINEER).

SECTION 2 - PROJECT SCOPE

- 2.1. Install a Cured-In-Place liner in approximately 9,400 feet of sanitary sewer on Lincoln Highway from Ninth Avenue to IL Route 38; IL Route 38 from IL Route 251 to Lincoln Highway; N. Main Street from Ninth Avenue to McConaughy Avenue; N. 2nd Street and N. 3rd Street from Tenth Avenue to just north of McConaughy Avenue; Meadow Lane from School Avenue to McConaughy Avenue; and Ninth Avenue from N. 3rd Street to Main Street.
- 2.2. Install a cured-in-place liner in approximately 29 sanitary manholes in the area described in Section 2.1.

<u>SECTION 3 - SERVICES OF THE ENGINEER</u>

3.1 General

- 3.1.1. The ENGINEER agrees to perform professional services in connection with the Project as hereinafter stated.
- 3.1.2. The ENGINEER will serve as the OWNER's professional representative in all phases of the Project, and will give consultation and advice to the OWNER during the performance of his services.

3.2 Design Phase

During the design phase the ENGINEER will:

- 3.2.1. Prepare detailed engineering drawings and a Project Manual that will include the bidding and contract documents and the general and technical specifications. The engineering drawings will be developed using the existing GPS surveying information for the sanitary sewer manholes, aerial photography and Lidar ground elevations.
- 3.2.2. Review all sanitary sewer televising video of the sanitary sewer segments to be lined. OWNER will provide ENGINEER will the sanitary sewer televising video.
- 3.2.3. Visually inspect all of the sanitary manholes on the sanitary sewer segments to be lined. There are approximately 29 sanitary sewer manholes to be inspected.
- 3.2.4. Assist the OWNER in obtaining an IDOT Utility Permit for the work that will be performed on the IDOT right-of-way.

- 3.2.5. Prepare an opinion of probable cost estimate for the Project based on the completed drawings and specifications.
- 3.2.6. Furnish five (5) copies and an electronic pdf format of the Construction Drawings and the Project Manual.

3.3 Construction Phase

During the construction phase the ENGINEER will:

- 3.3.1. Assist the OWNER in obtaining and evaluating bids and awarding a contract for the construction.
- 3.3.2. Conduct a pre-bid meeting conference and a pre-construction meeting conference.
- 3.3.3. Spend as much time and provide a Resident Project Representative (RPR) as the ENGINEER deems necessary to observe the progress and quality of the executed work and to determine in general if the work is proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents; the RPR will not be responsible for the techniques and sequences of construction or the safety precautions incident thereto; and during such visits and on the basis of the RPR's on-site observations as an experienced and qualified design professional, he will keep the OWNER informed of the progress of the work, will endeavor to guard the OWNER against defects and deficiencies in the work of the Contractor, and may disapprove work as failing to conform to the Contract Documents. The ENGINEER is not responsible for testing or inspection of materials other than that which may be required at the site of the work. It is estimated the project will take approximately 3 months to completed and will require one (1) part-time RPR observer or approximately 210 hours of construction observation.
- 3.3.4. Review shop drawings, diagrams, illustrations, catalog data, schedules and samples, the results of tests and inspections and other data which the Contractor is required to submit, but only for conformance with the design concept of the Project and compliance with the information given in the Contract Documents; and organize and assemble operation and maintenance manuals supplied by the equipment manufacturers and warranty certificates supplied by the equipment manufacturers and general contractor.
- 3.3.5. Consult and advise with the OWNER; act as the OWNER's representative; issue all instructions of the OWNER to the Contractor; prepare routine change orders as required; whenever he considers it necessary or advisable to insure the proper carrying out of the intent of the Contract Documents, he may, as the OWNER's representative, direct the Contractor to stop the work or require special examination or testing of the work (whether or not fabricated, installed or completed); he will act as interpreter of the terms and conditions of the Contract Documents and judge of the performance thereunder.
- 3.3.6. Based on his on-site observations as an experienced and qualified design professional and on his review of the Contractor's applications for payment, and supporting data determine the amount owed to the Contractor and approve in writing payment to the Contractor in such amounts; such approvals of payment to constitute a representation to the OWNER, based on such observations and review, that the work has progressed to the point indicated and that, to the best of his knowledge, information and belief, the quality of the work is in accordance with the Contract Documents, subject to the results of any subsequent test called for in the Contract Documents and any qualifications stated in his approval.

- 3.3.7. Conduct, in the company with the OWNER, a final inspection of the Project for conformance with the design concept of the Project and compliance with the information given by the Contract Documents and approve in writing final payment to the Contractor.
- 3.3.8. Revise the contract drawings to reflect the changes made during construction as furnished to the ENGINEER and to represent graphically the locations of the improvements and although the drawings are not warranted as to their accuracy, the location of the improvements shown can be found within reasonable tolerance.
- 3.3.9. Through the on-site observations of the work in progress and field checks of materials and equipment the ENGINEER will endeavor to provide protection for the OWNER against defects and deficiencies in the work, but the furnishing of such resident project representation shall not make the ENGINEER responsible for the Contractor's failure to perform the construction work in accordance with the Contract Documents.
- 3.3.10. Review post sanitary sewer lining televising video.

SECTION 4 - ADDITIONAL SERVICES OF THE ENGINEER

If authorized in writing by the OWNER, the ENGINEER will furnish or obtain from others additional services of the following types which will be paid for by the OWNER as indicated in subsection 6.1.4.

- 4.1. Furnishing of additional or nonstandard core borings, probings or subsurface explorations; hydrographic surveys; laboratory testing and inspection of samples or materials; and other special consultation.
- 4.2. Additional services due to significant changes in general scope of the Project or its design including, but not limited to, changes in size, complexity, or character of construction.
- 4.3. Revising previously approved studies, reports, design documents, drawings, or specifications.
- 4.4. Preparing documents for alternate bids requested by the OWNER for work which is not executed.
- 4.5. Preparing detailed renderings, exhibits or scale models for the Project.
- 4.6. Investigations involving detailed consideration of operations, maintenance, and overhead expenses; and the preparation of rate schedules, earnings and expense statements, feasibility studies, appraisals and valuations; detailed quantity surveys of material and labor; and material audits or inventories required for certification of force account construction performed by OWNER.
- 4.7. Preparing special change orders requested by the OWNER.
- 4.8. Making an inspection of the Project prior to expiration of the guarantee period and reporting observed discrepancies under guarantees provided by the construction contract.

- 4.9. Additional or extended services during construction made necessary by: (1) work damaged by fire or other cause during construction; (2) prolongation of the construction contract time by more than 25%; (3) acceleration of the work schedule involving services beyond normal working hours; and (4) contract default due to delinquency or insolvency.
- 4.10. Additional services and costs necessitated by out-of-town travel required of the ENGINEER other than visits to the Project as required by Section 1.
- 4.11. Serving as an expert witness for the OWNER in any litigation or other proceeding involving the Project.
- 4.12. Additional services in connection with the Project not otherwise provided for in this Agreement.

SECTION 5 - THE OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The OWNER will:

- 5.1. Provide full information as to his requirements for the Project.
- 5.2. Assist the ENGINEER by placing at his disposal all available information pertinent to the site of the Project including previous reports and any other data relative to design and construction of the Project.
- 5.3. Guarantee access to and make all provisions for the ENGINEER to enter upon public and private lands as required for the ENGINEER to perform his work under this Agreement.
- 5.4. Examine all studies, reports, sketches, estimates, specifications, drawings, proposals, and other documents presented by the ENGINEER and shall render in writing decisions pertaining thereto within a reasonable time so as not to delay the work of the ENGINEER.
- 5.5. Advertise for Proposals from bidders, open the proposals at the appointed time and place, and pay for all costs incident thereto.
- 5.6. Provide such legal, accounting and insurance counseling services as may be required for the Project.
- 5.7. Designate in writing a person to act as OWNER's representative with respect to the work to be performed under this Agreement, and such person shall have complete authority to transmit instructions, receive information, interpret, and define OWNER's policies and decisions with respect to materials, equipment elements and systems pertinent to the work covered by this Agreement.
- 5.8. Give prompt written notice to the ENGINEER whenever the OWNER observes or otherwise becomes aware of any defect in the Project.
- 5.9. Obtain approval of all governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Project and such approvals and consents from such other individuals or bodies as may be necessary for completion of the Project.

- 5.10. Furnish, or direct the ENGINEER to provide, at the OWNER's expense, necessary additional services as stipulated in Section 3 of this Agreement, or other services as required.
- 5.11. Furnish the ENGINEER with a description of and the names of owners and lien holders of property adjacent to the proposed improvement, where such data is needed for the preparation of plans and/or right of way or easement plats.

SECTION 6 - PERIOD OF SERVICE

6.1. Unless sooner terminated as provided in subsection 7.1, this Agreement shall remain in force for period of sixty (60) days after the final contractor pay request and closeout documents have been approved by the OWNER.

SECTION 7 - PAYMENTS TO THE ENGINEER

- 7.1. The OWNER will pay the ENGINEER for the services performed as follows:
- 7.1.1. For all work under the Design Phase, the OWNER shall pay the ENGINEER a lump sum fee of \$42,000.00. Such basic fee shall be due and payable as follows:

Monthly during the design phase of the ENGINEER's work, he shall be paid an amount computed by multiplying the percentage of work performed by the lump sum fee. From the partial payments thus computed each month, there shall be deducted all previous partial fee payments made to the ENGINEER.

- 7.1.2. For all work under the Construction Phase of the Project, the OWNER shall pay the ENGINEER an amount equal to the established billing rates of the ENGINEER Billing Rate being defined herein as payroll, social security, retirement deductions, unemployment tax, insurance overhead and profit. In addition, all materials and out-of-pocket expenses shall be paid at their actual cost to the ENGINEER; that payment for such services will be made monthly to the ENGINEER during the course of the ENGINEER's work, upon his submission to the OWNER of an itemized statement showing such time, rates and employees' names. The Construction Phase fee budget amount is \$40,000.00.
- 7.1.3. For "Additional Services" performed:
- 7.1.3.1. By personnel assigned to the regularly established office of the ENGINEER, an amount equal to the established billing rates of the ENGINEER as defined in subsection 6.1.2 above.
- 7.1.3.2. In connection with administering sub-contracts for services by others than described in 7.1.2.1. ante, an amount equal to the actual costs billed to the ENGINEER, plus 5% to cover overhead and handling.
- 7.1.3.3. In addition, all materials and out-of-pocket expenses shall be paid at their actual cost to the ENGINEER; that payment for such services will be made monthly to the ENGINEER during the course of the ENGINEER's work, upon his submission to the OWNER of an itemized statement showing such time, rates and employees' names.

7.1.4. As per Section 1, the OWNER authorizes the ENGINEER to perform the work as detailed below. The authorized work is estimated to be \$82,000.00, and work will not be performed in excess of this amount without prior authorization by the OWNER. The estimated cost breakdown is as follows:

Design \$42,000 Construction Observation \$40,000

TOTAL \$82,000

7.2 General

- 7.2.1. If any portion of the Project is not bid or put under contract for a period of 6 months after completion of the design phase, the ENGINEER's compensation shall be in accordance with subsection 6.1.2.
- 7.2.2. If this Agreement is terminated upon completion of any phase of the ENGINEER's services, the progress payments to be made in accordance with subsection 6.1 on account of that and all prior phases shall constitute total payment for services rendered; if terminated during any phase of the work, the ENGINEER shall be paid for services performed during such phase on the basis of his reasonable estimate of the portion of such phase completed prior to termination. In the event of any termination, the ENGINEER shall be paid all terminal expenses resulting therefrom plus payment for additional services then due.
- 7.2.3. If, prior to termination of this Agreement, any work designed or specified by the ENGINEER during any phase of the work is suspended in whole or in part for more than three months, or abandoned, after written notice from the OWNER, the ENGINEER shall be paid for services performed on account of it prior to receipt of such notice from the OWNER as provided in subsection 6.2.2 for termination during any phase of the work.

SECTION 8 - GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS

8.1 Termination

8.1.1. This agreement may be terminated by either party by seven days' written notice in the event of substantial failure to perform in accordance with the terms hereof by the other party through no fault of the terminating party. If this Agreement is so terminated, the ENGINEER shall be paid as provided in subsection 7.2.2.

8.2 Ownership of Documents

8.2.1 All documents, including original drawings, estimates, specifications, field notes and data are and remain the property of the ENGINEER as instruments of service. The OWNER may, at his expense, obtain a set of reproducible record prints of drawings and copies of other documents, in consideration of which the OWNER will use them solely in connection with the Project, and not for the purpose of making subsequent extensions or enlargements thereto and he will not sell, publish, or display them publicly. Re-use for extensions of the Project, or for new projects, shall require written permission of the ENGINEER and shall entitle him to further compensation at a rate to be agreed upon by OWNER and ENGINEER.

8.3 Estimates

8.3.1. Since the ENGINEER has no control over the cost of labor and materials, or over competitive bidding and market conditions, the estimates of construction cost provided for herein are to be made on the basis of his experience and qualifications, but the ENGINEER does not guarantee the accuracy of such estimates as compared to the contractor's bids or the Project construction cost.

8.4 Insurance

8.4.1 The ENGINEER shall secure and maintain such insurance as will protect him from claims under the Workmen's Compensation Acts and from claims for bodily injury, death, or property damage which may arise from the performance of his services under this agreement.

8.5 Successors and Assigns

8.5.1 The OWNER and the ENGINEER each binds himself and his partners, successors, executors, administrators and assigns to the other party of this Agreement and to the partners, successors, executors, administrators and assigns of such other party, in respect to all covenants of this Agreement; except as above, neither the OWNER nor the ENGINEER shall assign, sublet, or transfer his interest in this Agreement without the written consent of the other. Nothing herein shall be construed as creating any personal liability on the part of any officer or agent of any public body which may be a party hereto.

SECTION 9 - SPECIAL PROVISIONS

- 9.1. The OWNER and the ENGINEER mutually agree that this Agreement shall be subject to the following special provisions, which together with the provisions hereof and the exhibits hereto represent the entire Agreement between the OWNER and the ENGINEER; they may only be altered, amended, or repealed by a duly executed written instrument.
- 9.2. All additions and deletions made in the printed words of this Agreement were so made prior to its execution by the parties hereto.
- 9.3. The ENGINEER certifies that the services of anyone that has been debarred or suspended under the Federal Executive Order 12549 has not or will not be used for planning, design, and construction work.
- 9.4. No member of the governing body of the Unit of Local Government and no other officer, employee, public official, or agent of the Unit of Local Government who exercises any functions or responsibilities in connection with the planning or carrying out of the project, shall have any personal financial interest, direct or indirect, in this contract; and the ENGINEER shall take appropriate steps to assure compliance.
- 9.5. The ENGINEER covenants that he/she presently has no interest and shall not acquire interest, direct or indirect, in the study area or any parcels therein or any other interest which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of his/her services hereunder. The ENGINEER further covenants that in the performance of this contract, no person having such interest shall be employed.

<u>Summary:</u> Currently, within the City of Rochelle Zoning Ordinance, Article V, Division 7 (District Use Classifications) certain uses are not allowed within the Airport district. The City of Rochelle is proposing certain text amendments to the Zoning Code, Section 110-160, District Use Classification List, to permit by special use a banquet hall, brew pub (restaurant), restaurants, assembly/meeting halls, and public recreational facilities in the A - Airport District.

The Planning and Zoning Commission can recommend to the City Council a text amendment to expand or alter the official zoning code district classification list to allow these facilities within an A - Airport district with a special use.

Staff feels that by adding these uses to the zoning code district classification list with a special use that this will allow for more versatility within the Airport District to expand its uses while allowing staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission to review each potential new use on a case-by-case basis. Staff is presenting the proposed text amendment.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 110 OF THE ROCHELLE MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING TO THE AIRPORT DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Section 7 of Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois provides that a municipality that is not a home rule unit shall only have the powers granted to them by law and as such the City of Rochelle, Ogle County, Illinois being a non-home rule unit pursuant to the provisions of said Section 7 of Article VII, and may exercise only the powers expressly granted by law; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois General Assembly granted non-home rule municipalities broad authority to "pass all ordinances and make all rules and regulations proper or necessary, to carry into effect the powers granted to municipalities." 65 ILCS 5/1-2-1; and

WHEREAS, while "non-home rule municipalities have the authority to enact ordinances, such ordinances may in no event conflict with state law or prohibit what a state statute expressly permits . . . A local ordinance may impose more rigorous or definite regulations in addition to those enacted by the state legislature so long as they do not conflict with the statute." (*Village of Wauconda v. Hutton*, 291 Ill. App. 3d 1058, 1060 (1997)); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the City of Rochelle Zoning Ordinance (the "Zoning Ordinance"), certain uses are not permitted within the A - Airport District; and

WHEREAS, on January 4, 2022, the Planning and Zoning Commission voted 6 to 0 to recommend amending the Zoning Ordinance to include additional uses in the A – Airport District; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council have determined that it is appropriate and in the best interest of the welfare of City and its residents to amend Chapter 110 of the City Code to add banquet hall, brew pub (restaurant), restaurants, assembly/meeting halls, and public recreational facilities as special uses in the A - Airport District.;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Rochelle, Ogle County, Illinois, as follows:

<u>SECTION ONE</u>: The foregoing recitals shall be, and are hereby, incorporated into and made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth in this Section One.

SECTION TWO: Chapter 110, "ZONING", Article V, "DISTRICTS", of the Municipal Code of the City of Rochelle shall be hereby amended by adding the following underlined language:

SUBJECT: Special Use for Tattooing- Ricco's Salon

<u>Summary:</u> The petitioner is seeking a special use permit for tattooing at an existing business, Ricco's Hair Salon located at 306 Eagle Drive. This special use will allow the salon to perform microblading as an added service.

Microblading is a tattooing technique in which a small handheld tool made of several tiny needles is used to add semi-permanent pigment to the skin. The subject property is zoned B2, Commercial Highway.

Section 110-160 District Use Classification List requires a Special Use in a B2 zoning district for tattooing.

WHEREAS, Petitioner, seeking a Special Use Permit to allow for a tattoo business in the B-2 Commercial Highway District at 306 Eagle Drive, Rochelle, Illinois 61068 ("Subject Property") in Rochelle; and

SUBJECT: Discussion of placing limits/moratorium on issuance of new liquor licenses, thus limiting

the number of gaming machines.

Staff Contact: Jeff Fiegenschuh, City Manager

<u>Summary:</u> For the past few years, several council members approached staff about the idea of limiting the number of gaming machines in the City of Rochelle. According to state statute, gaming machines are allowed with the appropriate liquor licenses. I would like to have a discussion with the council to get a policy direction. If this is the direction a majority would like to go, I will ask our legal counsel to present an ordinance at the second meeting in January. For your reference, please see the attached draft ordinance eliminating three licenses (by request) and placing a two-year restriction on Class B licenses. Also included is a one-page document I asked our administrative staff to prepare. It includes several communities similar to Rochelle and the number of gaming machines that exist in their corporate limits.

Supporting Documents:

Recent gaming revenues Liquor and gaming info from sheet Proposed ordinance Class R licenses. Class R licenses shall authorize retail sales as follows:

a.

Class R-1 licenses. Class R-1 licenses shall authorize the retail sale of beer and wine by restaurants for consumption on the premises in connection with the sale of meals. No bar is permitted on the premises. The annual license fee for the year commencing June 1 of each year.

b.

Class R-2 licenses. Class R-2 licenses shall authorize the retail sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises by restaurants with no bar. Further, the class R-2 license shall provide for the retail sale of packaged alcoholic liquor providing that said retail sales of such liquor shall not exceed ten percent of the total sales of all alcoholic beverages. The annual license fee for the year commencing June 1 of each year.

c.

Class R-3 licenses. Class R-3 licenses shall authorize the retail sale of alcoholic liquor by restaurants, with a bar, for consumption on the premises, Further, the class R-3 license shall provide for the retail sale of packaged alcoholic liquor providing that said retail sales of such liquor shall not exceed ten percent of the total sales of all alcoholic beverages. The annual license fee for the year commencing June 1 of each year.

d.

Class R-4 licenses. Class R-4 licenses shall authorize the retail sale of alcoholic liquor by restaurants, with a bar, for consumption on the premises and on public golf course property commonly known as Fairways Golf Course. Further, the class R-4 license shall provide for and allow the retail sale of packaged alcoholic liquor for consumption on public golf course property commonly known as Fairways Golf Course. Only alcoholic liquor purchased or obtained from the holder of a valid R-4 license may be possessed or consumed on public golf course property. The holder of a class R-4 license shall be exempt from the provisions of section 6-7 (possession or consumption in public) and article III (outdoor liquor sales) of this chapter. The annual license fee shall be due June 1 of each year.
