Wednesday, February 19, 2025

The City Council of the City of Rollingwood, Texas held a meeting, open to the public, in the Municipal Building at 403 Nixon Drive in Rollingwood, Texas on February 19, 2025. Members of the public and the City Council were able to participate in the meeting virtually, as long as a quorum of the City Council and the presiding officer were physically present at the Municipal Building, in accordance with the Texas Open Meetings Act. A video recording of the meeting was made and will be posted to the City's website and available to the public in accordance with the Texas Public Information Act upon written request.

#### CALL REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING TO ORDER

1. Roll Call

Mayor Gavin Massingill called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

**Also Present:** Interim City Secretary Makayla Rodriguez, Development Services Manager Nikki Stautzenberger, Finance Director Abel Campos, Police Chief Kristal Munoz, Public Works Director Izzy Parra, Utility Billing Manager Veronica Hernandez, and City Attorney Charles Zech

Mayor Gavin Massingill opened the Public Hearing at 7:04 p.m.

Mayor Gavin Massingill closed the Public Hearing at 7:18 p.m.

3. Public hearing and discussion on the addition of Sections 107-5 (Residential Lighting Manual) and 107-81 (Exterior Lighting Requirements) to the city's Code of Ordinances

Mayor Gavin Massingill opened the Public Hearing at 7:04 p.m.

Mayor Gavin Massingill closed the Public Hearing at 7:18 p.m.

4. Public hearing and discussion on the addition of Section 107-81 (Fences) to the city's Code of Ordinances to provide for a standard allowable fence height of 8 feet and for a special exception for fences exceeding 8 feet in height

Mayor Gavin Massingill opened the Public Hearing at 7:04 p.m.

Mayor Gavin Massingill closed the Public Hearing at 7:18 p.m.

 Public hearing and discussion on amendments to Chapter 107 of the City of Rollingwood's Code of Ordinances Section 107-369 to Section 107-379 to Residential Landscape and Tree Canopy Management

Mayor Gavin Massingill opened the Public Hearing at 7:04 p.m.

Jay van Bavel, 5012 Timberline Drive and member of the CRCRC, expressed concern that the proposed amendments did not include critical root zone protections. Mr. van Bavel proposed and reviewed additional amendments related to critical root zones with City Council.

Members of City Council asked questions regarding the proposed language as well as critical root zones.

Mayor Gavin Massingill closed the Public Hearing at 7:18 p.m.

Public hearing and discussion on amending Chapter 107 Sec. 107-76 (Minimum required depth and width of yards) related to Residential side yard projections

Mayor Gavin Massingill opened the Public Hearing at 7:04 p.m.

Catherine Horne, 5011 Timberline Drive, discussed setbacks and requested City Council to consider implementing setback limits.

Council Member Brown explained that an ordinance regarding physical structures within setbacks will be discussed in the near future as well as discussed an amendment to the title of the draft ordinance.

Council Member Brook Brown moved to change the title for the ordinance addressing side yard projections and that in line 4 of the proposed ordinance, the word "side" should be stricken because the impact of the ordinance is broader than just the side yard. Council Member Kevin Glasheen seconded the motion. The motion carried with 3 in favor and 0 against.

Mayor Gavin Massingill closed the Public Hearing at 7:18 p.m.

#### **PRESENTATIONS**

7. Mayor's State of the City Address

Mayor Gavin Massingill stated that he will postpone the item until next month.

8. Public Works presentation regarding tree trimming and fire prevention initiative

Public Works Director Izzy Parra discussed the tree trimming and fire prevention efforts performed throughout the City by the Public Works Department.

Mayor Gavin Massingill discussed the City's process of tree trimming to meet height clearance requirements. He explained that residents are welcome to trim their own trees, but that the trees will need to be in accordance with the ordinance.

9. Police Chief presentation regarding vehicle theft and burglary

Mayor Gavin Massingill and Police Chief Kristal Munoz reviewed a report detailing vehicle theft and burglary of vehicle incidents within the City during a 12 month period. Police Chief Kristal Munoz continued to discuss a report containing dispatch calls for Travis County.

Mayor Gavin Massingill asked questions of Police Chief Kristal Munoz regarding the Police Department budget. They also discussed salaries, nationwide agency shortages, and their recruitment process.

Police Chief Kristal Munoz discussed possible solutions to supplement additional support for patrolling. She clarified that hiring a private security or private entity would not have the same jurisdiction as working with law enforcement entities.

Council Member Kevin Glasheen discussed previous conversations with Police Chief Kristal Munoz regarding possible staffing solutions.

12. Discussion and possible action to reschedule the Spring Clean-Up Event

Mayor Gavin Massingill explained the need to reschedule the Spring Clean-Up event.

Council Member Alec Robinson moved approval of the Spring Clean-Up event date change to March 15-16. Council Member Brook Brown seconded the motion. The motion carried with 3 in favor and 0 against.

13. Discussion and possible action on a recommendation from the Park Commission regarding a proposal for the Rollingwood Park Tree Planting project

Mayor Gavin Massingill explained that the Park Commission received proposals for the tree planting project that was previously approved by City Council and that they made a recommendation to move forward with a proposal from Maas Verde Landscape Restoration.

Don Hudson, 4902 Rollingwood Drive and member of the Park Commission, explained the details of the project as well as the proposals received.

Interim City Secretary Makayla Rodriguez stated that tree placement will be determined at a later time and that the Park Commission welcomes suggestions from City Council as well as nearby neighbors.

Alex Robinette, 2500 Hatley Drive, discussed that the Rollingwood Women's Club are working on beautification ideas for the park and would like to ensure that all parties come together to determine where the trees are planted.

Council Member Brook Brown moved that Council approve the recommendation from the Park Commission regarding the Rollingwood Park Tree Planting Project. Council Member Alec Robinson seconded the motion. The motion carried with 3 in favor and 0 against.

14. Discussion and possible action on a joint recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission and CRCRC regarding ordinance enforcement

Dave Bench, 5 Randolph Place and Chair of the Planning and Zoning Commission, discussed the recommendation from the Planning and Zoning meeting regarding ordinance enforcement.

Council Member Brook Brown moved to accept the recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission. Council Member Alec Robinson seconded the motion. The motion carried with 3 in favor and 0 against.

15. Discussion and possible action based on a recommendation by the Planning and Zoning Commission regarding the appropriation of funds for a third party architectural firm to present graphical models of the two proposals in discussion before the Planning and Zoning Commission to address building height, building height measurement and tenting

Dave Bench gave an overview of the item and discussed the recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission to request funds from City Council for AlterStudio, a third party architectural firm, to present graphical models of the residential building height and height measurement proposals.

Council Member Brook Brown stated that she is in favor of the project and recommended to have AlterStudio present their results to City Council.

Alex Robinette shared some concern regarding the scope of work.

Council Member Brook Brown moved that the Council approve the proposal as presented by AlterStudio to do an assessment of two different models for proposed building heights with the stipulation that their scope of work include a presentation to the City Council and a price not to exceed \$2500, and that the mayor be authorized to execute the contract. Council Member Alec Robinson seconded the motion. The motion carried with 3 in favor and 0 against.

16. Discussion and possible action to set dates for public hearings before the Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council regarding an ordinance amending Chapter 107 of the City of Rollingwood Code of Ordinances related to residential building heights and height measurement

Council Member Brook Brown recommended that the City Council and Planning and Zoning Commission have joint public hearing to discuss residential building height and height measurement as well as discussed potential meeting dates.

City Council discussed the possibility of having a joint public hearing, meeting dates, and next steps.

Council Member Brook Brown moved that the Council set the date of March 26th for a joint public hearing with the City Council and the Planning and Zoning Commission regarding any ordinance amending chapter 107 to the City of Rollingwood code of ordinances related to residential building height and height measurement, and to receive the report from AlterStudio with respect to the two models under consideration. Council Member Kevin Glasheen seconded the motion. The motion carried with 3 in favor and 0 against.

Discussion and possible action on Resolution 2025-03-19-05 suspending the effective date of the implementation of interim GRIP rate adjustments by Texas Gas Service Company.

#### **Description:**

Last month, Texas Gas Service Company made filings with the City of Rollingwood and the Railroad Commission of Texas proposing to implement interim rate adjustments ("GRIP Rate Increases") of \$3.36 per customer, per month, pursuant to Texas Utilities Code § 104.301. This will increase the current residential customer charge by over 18%, from \$18.00 to \$ 21.36 per month.

This resolution, if passed and adopted, would formally suspend the April 12, 2025 effective date of the company's rate increase for the maximum period permitted by law. This suspension will allow the City, working in conjunction with other similarly situated cities and the City's legal counsel at Lloyd Gosselink Rochelle & Townsend, P.C., to evaluate the filing and determine whether the filing complies with the law, and if lawful, to determine what further strategy, including settlement, to pursue.

The City has until April 12, 2025 to adopt a resolution suspending the date the rate increase would otherwise go into effect.

#### **Action Requested:**

To take action on Resolution 2025-03-19-05 suspending the effective date of the implementation of interim GRIP rate adjustments by Texas Gas Service Company.

#### **Fiscal Impacts:**

Approval and adoption of this resolution would not have a fiscal impact on the City.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2025-03-19-05**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF ROLLINGWOOD, TEXAS SUSPENDING THE APRIL 12, 2025 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE PROPOSAL BY TEXAS GAS SERVICE COMPANY, A DIVISION OF ONE GAS, INC. – CENTRAL-GULF SERVICE AREA, TO IMPLEMENT INTERIM GRIP RATE ADJUSTMENTS FOR GAS UTILITY INVESTMENT IN 2024 AND REQUIRING DELIVERY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE COMPANY AND LEGAL COUNSEL.

**WHEREAS,** the City of Rollingwood, Texas ("City") is a gas utility customer of Texas Gas Service Company, a Division of ONE Gas, Inc. – Central-Gulf Service Area, ("TGS" or "the Company") and a regulatory authority with an interest in the rates and charges of TGS; and

**WHEREAS**, TGS made filings with the City and the Railroad Commission of Texas ("Railroad Commission") on February 11, 2025, proposing to implement interim rate adjustments ("GRIP Rate Increases") pursuant to Texas Utilities Code § 104.301 on all customers served by TGS, effective April 12, 2025; and

**WHEREAS**, it is incumbent upon the City, as a regulatory authority, to examine the GRIP Rate Increases to determine its compliance with the Texas Utilities Code.

### NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROLLINGWOOD:

**Section 1.** The April 12, 2025 effective date of the GRIP Rate Increases proposed by TGS is hereby suspended for the maximum period allowed by Texas Utilities Code § 104.301(a) to permit adequate time to review the proposed increases, analyze all necessary information, and take appropriate action related to the proposed increases.

Section 2. A copy of this Resolution shall be sent to TGS, care of Judy Hitchye at 1301 S. Mopac, Suite 400, Austin, Texas 78746, and to Thomas Brocato, legal counsel to the City, at Lloyd Gosselink, 816 Congress Ave., Suite 1900, Austin, Texas 78701.

At the March 4, 2025 Utility Commission meeting, the Commission revisited the item and made the following motion:

Elizabeth Bray moved to amend the leak adjustment to require that in order to be eligible for a leak adjustment, one must be registered and signed up for EyeOnWater and enrolled in a leak alert. Clark Wilson seconded the motion. The motion carried with 6 in favor and 0 against.

#### Rollingwood Utility Customer Appeals Process Summary

Rollingwood Utility customers may appeal to have their water and related wastewater bill reduced. Sections 34-69 and 22-30 of the City's Code of Ordinances govern the appeals process. #### **Appeals Process**

The City Council designates the City of Rollingwood Utility Commission as the Hearing Officer for the purposes of Utility Appeals.

Appeals should be filed as soon as possible, but no later than six (6) months after issuance of the first contested utility bill. Adjustments of bills for periods exceeding three (3) months will not be considered except in extraordinary circumstances, as determined at the sole discretion of the City, with the exception of appeals under item 5 below, the "no confirmed leak" provision. Reasonable causes for appeals include:

- 1. Errors in meter reading
- 2. Water meter inaccuracy or other malfunctions (such as a leak within the meter, or a leak at the point where the meter attaches to the customer's line)
- 3. Errors in calculation of the bill

The Residential Lighting Manual may be adopted and updated from time to time by resolution approved by the City Council.

#### Sec. 107-81. Exterior Lighting requirements.

#### (a) Definitions: As used herein:

 (1) "Shielded" means "installed in such a manner that all light emitted by the fixture, either directly from the bulb or a diffusing element, or indirectly by reflection or refraction from any part of the fixture, is projected below the horizontal plane immediately beneath the fixture's lowest light-emitting part." See exhibit in the Residential Lighting Manual for examples of conforming and nonconforming light fixtures.

Discussion and possible action on an amendment to the Code of Ordinances Section 107-369 to Section 107-379 regarding Residential Landscape Tree Canopy Management

#### **Description:**

At the January 8, 2025, Planning and Zoning meeting, after the public hearing on an amendment to the Code of Ordinances Section 107-369 to Section 107-379 regarding Residential Landscape Tree Canopy Management and made a motion to recommend approval with the following changes in mind:

- 1. **Change in Terminology**: The definition of "building footprint" should be replaced with "buildable area" for clarity throughout the document.
- Review of Heritage Tree Removal Policy: Section 107-373(a)(2) prohibits the removal of a heritage tree unless a special exception is granted. This section should be reviewed and modified to address concerns about the removal of heritage trees and the special exception process.
- 3. **Tree Deaths Beyond Homeowners' Control**: Section 107-375(f) is under review because of concerns that homeowners may be unfairly penalized for trees dying due to factors outside their control. The City Council is asked to consider changes to this section.
- 4. **Impact of Tree Removal**: The City Council is asked to clarify what constitutes a significant impact to both the canopy and root zones of a tree, potentially leading to its removal. Commissioners recalled that at one point, the threshold for removal was set at 50%, and they would like to see this reinstated in the code.

#### The motion passed by a vote of 5 in favor to 1 (Nash)

At the February 19, 2025, City Council meeting, a public hearing was held on an amendment to the Code of Ordinances Section 107-369 to Section 107-379 regarding Residential Landscape Tree Canopy Management.

Jay Van Bavel of 5012 Timberline Drive and a member of the CRCRC expressed concern regarding the proposed amendments, specifically highlighting the absence of crucial protections for critical root zones. Mr. Van Bavel presented and reviewed suggested language amendments related to critical root zones with the City Council.

City Council members asked questions about the language and the importance of critical root zones.

The information Mr. Van Bavel provided was consistent with recommendations from the Planning and Zoning Commission, which had advised reinstating this language into the code from earlier versions.

#### **Action Requested:**

To consider the recommendation to approve amendment to the Code of Ordinances Section 107-369 to Section 107-379 regarding Residential Landscape Tree Canopy Management with the Planning and Zoning revisions

#### **Fiscal Impacts:**

No significant fiscal impacts are anticipated at this time.

- (e) For purposes of subsections 107 372(c) and (d) the city and the owner may consult with an academic organization, state agency, nonprofit organization, or the city arborist to identify an area for which tree planting will best address the science based benefits of trees and other reforestation needs of the municipality within and outside of the city limits.

# Sec. 107-373. Removal of protected trees.

- (a) A person may not remove a protected tree without a tree removal permit for the removal and compliance with the terms of this subdivision.
  - (1) During removal of protected trees the tree removal permit shall be displayed on the construction board for the site in present or otherwise displayed on a sign within the first five feet of the front yard setback and if the house is not under construction the permit for tree removal shall be placed on the dashboard of the permitted vendor's vehicle.
  - (2) Removal of a Heritage tree in required yard space is prohibited unless a Heritage Tree Removal Special Exception is granted by the Board of Adjustment upon a finding that: (i) all-reasonable efforts have been made to avoid removing the tree, (ii) the location of the tree precludes all reasonable access to the property or all reasonable use of the property, and (iii) removal of the tree is not based on a condition caused by the method or design chosen by the applicant to develop the property. A Heritage Tree Removal Special Exception provided for in this code will not be required for Heritage Trees removed from the permitted building footprint buildable area but such removal isare subject to the tree removal permitting and replacement regulations provide for in this Code.
- (b) Emergency pruning or removal. Notwithstanding subsection 107-373(a), a person may perform emergency pruning or removal of a protected tree as follows:
  - (1) When the condition or location of a protected tree presents a clear and immediate danger to a structure or to the health and safety of the public, the hazardous portion of the protected tree may be removed without first obtaining a required tree removal permit. Upon the report of a certified arborist hired by the property owner that a heritage tree is either: (i) dead; (ii) is an imminent hazard to life or property, and the hazard cannot reasonably be mitigated without removing the tree, in whole or in part; or (iii) is diseased and restoration to sound condition is not practicable or the disease may be transmitted to other trees and endanger their health. This report must be confirmed by the city arborist. The city administrator shall have the authority to determine whether such documentation is in order and may consider specific safety situations in light of potential hazards to life or property. In the case of an imminent hazard to life or property under subsection (ii),

- (c) An application for removal of a protected tree on private property may be submitted by or on behalf of the owner of the property on which the tree is located.
- (d) An application for removal of one or more protected tree(s) must be submitted to the city secretary and approved prior to removal of the protected tree. If the application is approved as provided for in this subdivision, a permit shall be issued indicating each protected tree that is approved for removal and indicating the location(s) and size(s) of any required replacement trees and the dates by which replacement trees must be planted. No tree removal permit shall be issued unless an approved building permit is in place, which includes a detailed building footprint. Any permit application for tree removal must be accompanied by documentation confirming the issuance of the building permit.
- (e) An application that proposes removal of a protected tree shall include the required permit application fee.
- (f) An application for removal of a protected tree shall include any proposal for type(s) and location(s) of replacement trees on a site plan of affected property(s).
- (g) A permit for removal of a protected tree expires on the earlier of either two years after its effective date, or upon removal of the protected tree except that if any building permit issued for the associated property expires or is revoked for any reason, the permit for removal of a tree shall be revoked as well. Subject to applicable expiration, a permit for removal of tree(s) is transferable to a subsequent owner of the affected property, provided that any obligation in the permit with respect to replacement trees is assumed by the transferee.

## Sec. 107-375. Conditions for approval.

(a) If the a protected tree is removed from a required yard, located within a yard line and property line setback area and the total width of the setback area within the yard line and the property line is greater than ten feet or greater from the edge of a property, the protected tree shall be replaced with a total of three replacement trees that may must include a selection of replacement trees under subsections 107-371(a). (d)(1) and (d)(2). and shall include at least one replacement trees under subsection 107-371 (d)(2).

# Sec. 107-3778. Replacement procedure.

- (a) Whenever replacement trees are required by the terms of this subdivision, the owner shall submit to the eity arborist City Development Officer for approval a replacement site plan showing the locations, species and sizes of all replacement trees and vegetation for final approval by the city arborist City Development Officer. If during installation, the owner is unable to conform to the approved replacement site plan because conformance is not feasible due to subsurface conditions that could not reasonably have been foreseen that make the viability of the tree in the planned location unlikely, then the owner must submit an amended site plan to the city arborist City <u>Development Officer</u> within seven days of the discovery of unforeseen subsurface conditions for approval by the eity arborist City. An amended site plan must provide for no fewer replacement trees or cumulative size of replacement trees than provided in the originally approved replacement plan.
- (b) Installation of the replacement trees must be completed within the time period designated by the eity arborist <u>City Development</u> <u>Officer</u> in the tree removal permit, however, in no event will the time period be longer than one year, however this time period is abated while a property is under construction where replacement trees are required.
- (c) The owner shall notify the <u>eity arborist City Development Officer</u> upon completion of the installation. If more than one protected tree has been replaced, the city arborist may then inspect for compliance with the approved replacement plan.
- (d) All replacement trees must survive at least three years. The City Development Officer shall track all replacement trees, so that at three years post planting, their survival and health can be assessed, consulting with an arborist if necessary. The eity arborist City Development Officer may contact the owner during this three year period to arrange for a site visit by the city arborist in order to confirm the replacement trees have survived. Replacement trees that do not survive for three years must be removed and replaced with similar species and sized trees.
- (e) The owner of property from which the removal of one or more protected trees was permitted shall arrange for the transferee(s) of such property to submit to the city secretary a written transfer to and assumption by such transferee(s) of the permit and all obligations of such permit with respect to required replacement trees, if all such obligations have not been satisfied at the time of transfer of the property.

  - (7) To fail to submit photographs or other documentation to demonstrate a requisite clear and immediate danger pursuant to subsection 107-373(b)(3) in connection with an unpermitted removal of a protected or heritage tree.
- (b) An offense shall constitute a Class C misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00. An offense committed intentionally, knowingly, recklessly, or with criminal negligence shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$2000.00 per offense. Each protected or heritage tree removed in violation of this division shall constitute a separate offense, and a failure to plant and maintain each replacement tree shall constitute a separate offense.   - (2) Removal of a Heritage tree in required yard space is prohibited unless a Heritage Tree Removal Special Exception is granted by the Board of Adjustment upon a finding that: (i) all-reasonable efforts have been made to avoid removing the tree, (ii) the location of the tree precludes all reasonable access to the property or all reasonable use of the property, and (iii) removal of the tree is not based on a condition caused by the method or design chosen by the applicant to —develop the property. A Heritage Tree Removal Special Exception provided for in this code will not be required for Heritage Trees removed from the permitted—building footprint—buildable area but such removal isare subject to the tree removal permitting and replacement regulations provide for in this Code.
- (b) Emergency pruning or removal. Notwithstanding subsection 107-373(a), a person may perform emergency pruning or removal of a protected tree as follows:
  - (1) When the condition or location of a protected tree presents a clear and immediate danger to a structure or to the health and safety of the public, the hazardous portion of the protected tree may be removed without first obtaining a required tree removal permit. Upon the report of a certified arborist hired by the property owner that a heritage tree is

either: (i) dead; (ii) is an imminent hazard to life or property, and the hazard cannot reasonably be mitigated without removing the tree, in whole or in part; or (iii) is diseased and restoration to sound condition is not practicable or the disease may be transmitted to other trees and endanger their health. This report must be confirmed by the city arborist. The city administrator shall have the authority to determine whether such documentation is in order and may consider specific safety situations in light of potential hazards to life or property. In the case of an imminent hazard to life or property under subsection (ii), documentation may be submitted within 72 hours after the action is taken.

- (2) In the course of performing emergency repairs to a road or water, wastewater, or drainage facilities, agents or contractors of the city may trim, prune or remove a protected tree as required to perform such work without first obtaining a tree removal permit. If such activities occur during normal business hours, the city shall first attempt to contact the city arborist City Development Officer to determine if the city arborist City Development Officer can provide immediate guidance and assistance. If such assistance is not immediately available, then the pruning or removal may occur in accordance with the requirements under chapter 18, article V of this Code.
- (3) Any person who prunes or removes a protected tree under the provisions of this subsection shall, within 14 days of such action or as soon as practicable if there is a coinciding declaration of a state of emergency in the city, apply for a tree removal permit providing for replacement trees as required by this subdivision. The application shall include photographs or other documentation to demonstrate the requisite clear and immediate danger. The eity arborist City Development Officer will evaluate the information to determine whether a clear and immediate danger existed. A failure to submit an application or a failure to submit information demonstrating the clear and immediate danger shall constitute a violation of this subdivision.
- (c) The requirements of this subdivision apply to trees on public and private property. To the extent of conflict with another section of the Code, this subdivision applies.

# Sec. 107-374. Application for protected tree removal and tree removal permits.

- (a) An applicant may request a tree removal permit application from the city through the City's application platform located on the City's website. by phone, U.S. mail, fax, email or in person.
- (b) An application for removal of a protected tree located on public property, a right-of-way or a public easement may be submitted by:
  - An agent of the city, a public utility, or another political subdivision with the authority to install the public facilities and perform the work necessitating the removal of the protected tree; or
  - (2) The owner of the property adjoining the site of the protected tree.
- (c) An application for removal of a protected tree on private property may be submitted by or on behalf of the owner of the property on which the tree is located.
- (d) An application for removal of one or more protected tree(s) must be submitted to the city secretary and approved prior to removal of the protected tree. If the application is approved as provided for in this subdivision, a permit shall be issued indicating each protected tree that is approved for removal and indicating the location(s) and size(s) of any required replacement trees and the dates by which replacement trees must be planted. No tree removal permit shall be issued unless an approved building permit is in place, which includes a detailed building footprint. Any permit application for tree removal must be accompanied by documentation confirming the issuance of the building permit.
- (e) An application that proposes removal of a protected tree shall include the required permit application fee.

- (e)(f) If the eity arborist City Development Officer determines that an applicant provides sufficient documentation from a certified arborist that a protected tree is diseased, dead, or poses an imminent or immediate threat to persons or property due to natural causes only, and also not as a result of intentional bleaching, root cutting, or pruning more than 25 percent of the canopy, and that the certified arborist has documented at least two prior actions performed by the certified arborist within the

 previous three years to mitigate the condition, the eity arborist City Development Officer may reduce or waive the replacement tree requirement for the protected tree and reduce or waive the tree replacement application fee.

- (f)(g) If a protected tree is required to be removed under section 18-209, the eity arborist City Development Officer may reduce or waive the replacement tree requirement for the protected tree and reduce or waive the tree replacement application fee.
- (g)(h) The mayor may act to waive the replacement tree requirement under this subsection 107-374(d) for a storm event, wildfire or other calamity that causes widespread or costly damage to multiple protected trees throughout the city.

  - (3) Damaging the root system, including, but not limited to:
    - Adjusting the grading of a lot to cover or uncover a tree trunk or root system to the extent that the adjusted grading causes or may be reasonably expected to cause the tree to die; or
    - b. Placing fixtures over the root system to the extent that the placement of the fixtures causes or may be reasonable expected to cause the tree to die.

If such assistance is not immediately available, then the pruning or removal may occur in accordance with the requirements under chapter 18, article V of this Code.
- (3) Any person who prunes or removes a protected tree under the provisions of this subsection shall, within 14 days of such action or as soon as practicable if there is a coinciding declaration of a state of emergency in the city, apply for a tree removal permit providing for replacement trees as required by this subdivision. The application shall include photographs or other documentation to demonstrate the requisite clear and immediate danger. The eity arborist City Development Officer will evaluate the information to determine whether a clear and immediate danger existed. A failure to submit an application or a failure to submit information demonstrating the clear and immediate danger shall constitute a violation of this subdivision.
- (c) The requirements of this subdivision apply to trees on public and private property. To the extent of conflict with another section of the Code, this subdivision applies.

# Sec. 107-374. Application for protected tree removal and tree removal permits.

- (a) An applicant may request a tree removal permit application from the city through the City's application platform located on the City's website. by phone, U.S. mail, fax, email or in person.
- (b) An application for removal of a protected tree located on public property, a right-of-way or a public easement may be submitted by:
  - An agent of the city, a public utility, or another political subdivision with the authority to install the public facilities and perform the work necessitating the removal of the protected tree; or
  - (2) The owner of the property adjoining the site of the protected tree.
- (c) An application for removal of a protected tree on private property may be submitted by or on behalf of the owner of the property on which the tree is located.
- (d) An application for removal of one or more protected tree(s) must be submitted to the city secretary and approved prior to removal of the protected tree. If the application is approved as provided for in this subdivision, a permit shall be issued indicating each protected tree that is approved for removal and indicating the location(s) and size(s) of any required replacement trees and the dates by which replacement trees must be planted. No tree removal permit shall be issued unless an approved building permit is in place, which includes a detailed building footprint. Any permit application for tree removal must be accompanied by documentation confirming the issuance of the building permit.
- (e) An application that proposes removal of a protected tree shall include the required permit application fee.
- (f) An application for removal of a protected tree shall include any proposal for type(s) and location(s) of replacement trees on a site plan of affected property(s).
- (g) A permit for removal of a protected tree expires on the earlier of either two years after its effective date, or upon removal of the protected tree except that if any building permit issued for the associated property expires or is revoked for any reason, the permit for removal of a tree shall be revoked as well. Subject to applicable expiration, a permit for removal of tree(s) is transferable to a subsequent owner of the affected property, provided that any obligation in the permit with respect to replacement trees is assumed by the transferee.

- (c) The owner shall notify the eity arborist <u>City Development Officer</u> upon completion of the installation. If more than one protected tree has been replaced, the city arborist may then inspect for compliance with the approved replacement plan.
- (d) All replacement trees must survive at least three years. The City Development Officer shall track all replacement trees, so that at three years post planting, their survival and health can be assessed, consulting with an arborist if necessary. The eity arborist City Development Officer may contact the owner during this three year period to arrange for a site visit by the city arborist

- (b) Emergency pruning or removal. Notwithstanding subsection 107-373(a), a person may perform emergency pruning or removal of a protected tree as follows:
  - (1) When the condition or location of a protected tree presents a clear and immediate danger to a structure or to the health and safety of the public, the hazardous portion of the protected tree may be removed without first obtaining a required tree removal permit. Upon the report of a certified arborist hired by the property owner that a heritage tree is

## Sec. 107-374. Application for protected tree removal and tree removal permits.

- (a) An applicant may request a tree removal permit application from the city through the City's application platform located on the City's website. by phone, U.S. mail, fax, email or in person.

  - An agent of the city, a public utility, or another political subdivision with the authority to install the public facilities and perform the work necessitating the removal of the protected tree; or

If the application is approved as provided for in this subdivision, a permit shall be issued indicating each protected tree that is approved for removal and indicating the location(s) and size(s) of any required replacement trees and the dates by which replacement trees must be planted. No tree removal permit shall be issued unless an approved building permit is in place, which includes a detailed building footprint. Any permit application for tree removal must be accompanied by documentation confirming the issuance of the building permit.
- (e) An application that proposes removal of a protected tree shall include the required permit application fee.
- (f) An application for removal of a protected tree shall include any proposal for type(s) and location(s) of replacement trees on a site plan of affected property(s).
- (g) A permit for removal of a protected tree expires on the earlier of either two years after its effective date, or upon removal of the protected tree except that if any building permit issued for the associated property expires or is revoked for any reason, the permit for removal of a tree shall be revoked as well. Subject to applicable expiration, a permit for removal of tree(s) is transferable to a subsequent owner of the affected property, provided that any obligation in the permit with respect to replacement trees is assumed by the transferee.

- (d)(e) If the eity arborist City Development Officer determines under subsection 107-373(b)(3) that an emergency existed at the time of removal that necessitated expedited removal or an applicant provides documentation from a certified arborist that a protected tree is diseased, dead, or poses an imminent or immediate threat to persons or property due to natural causes only and the protected tree falls under subsection 107-375(a), the city arborist may reduce the replacement tree requirement to one replacement tree under either subsection 107-371(d)(1) or subsection 107-371(d)(2).
- (e)(f) If the city arborist City Development Officer determines that an applicant provides sufficient documentation from a certified arborist that a protected tree is diseased, dead, or poses an imminent or immediate threat to persons or property due to natural causes only, and also not as a result of intentional bleaching, root cutting, or pruning more than 25 percent of the canopy, and that the certified arborist has documented at least two prior actions performed by the certified arborist within the previous three years to mitigate the condition, the city arborist City Development Officer may reduce or waive the replacement tree requirement for the protected tree and reduce or waive the tree replacement application fee.

- (i)(j) If a protected tree has a trunk on a first property and <u>CRZ roots</u> and canopy that extend into a second property, the owner of the second property is required to obtain a tree removal permit for removal of the protected tree prior to performing any actions that constitute removal under subsection 107-371(e) on the second property. For purposes of determining removal under this subsection for 107-371(e), damage to the root system is assessed within the area that is a number of feet in diameter from the outer edge of the tree trunk at four and one-half feet from the ground based on a ratio of one foot for each inch of diameter of the tree trunk. - (d) All replacement trees must survive at least three years. The City Development Officer shall track all replacement trees, so that at three years post planting, their survival and health can be assessed, consulting with an arborist if necessary. The eity arborist City Development Officer may contact the owner during this three year period to arrange for a site visit by the city arborist in order to confirm the replacement trees have survived. Replacement trees that do not survive for three years must be removed and replaced with similar species and sized trees.

Council Member Kevin Glasheen seconded the motion.

## Memo regarding proposed new subsection to apply to public utility easements

In connection with recent development activity, questions have arisen as to what structures, if any, may be placed and what types of trees may be planted within a public utility easement.

To address these questions, a new subsection is proposed, to be added to Chapter 28 - "Streets, Sidewalks, and Other Public Places", Article II - "Construction in City Row", Section 28-23 - "Construction Standards". The proposed new subsection would do the following:

- 1. Prohibit permanent structures from being placed within a public utility easement unless otherwise expressly allowed by the Code.
- 2. Require that trees planted within 20 feet of an "above-ground power, cable, or telephone line" or within 10 lateral feet of an "underground water line or other underground utility" be of the species specified in the Tree Protection ordinance as allowable for replacement within a public utility easement.
- 3. Require that trees planted within 10 lateral feet of an underground water line or other underground utility be installed with a root barrier at least 4 feet deep between the tree and the underground utility facility at a lateral distance of 5 feet from the utility.
- 4. Amend the title of Chapter 28, Article II to read: "Construction in City ROW <u>and Public Utility Easements."</u>

## Proposed new subsection addressing protection of utility easements

## 1. Add a new subsection (r) to Code Section 28-23, to read as follows:

- (q) Placement of all aboveground facilities in the public right-of-way or public utility easements must be approved in advance by the city. All aboveground facilities must be designed and installed to minimize the visual impact of the facilities on the surrounding property and the possibility of adverse impact to public safety and welfare. In addition, all aboveground facilities must be landscaped, bermed or attractively fenced in such a manner as to screen the facilities from view from adjacent streets and property owners. Landscaping, berms and fencing must be approved in advance by the city. For purposes of this subsection, the term "aboveground facilities" means equipment or structures that protrude above the natural grade or surface of the land, without regard to the existence of equipment or structural components below the natural grade or the surface of the land.
- (r) To permit utilities to be efficiently constructed, maintained and restored, utility easements shall be kept clear of all permanent structures, whether above or below ground, unless such structure is otherwise expressly authorized by this Code to be placed within a public utility easement. To prevent interference with clearances necessary for overhead lines and to protect underground utilities from root interference, trees may not be planted within 20 feet of an above-ground power, cable, or telephone line, or within 10 lateral feet of an underground water line or other underground utility, unless of the species listed in Section 107-371(c)(1)(listing tree species allowed within 20 feet of an overhead utility). For any trees planted within 10 lateral feet of an underground water line or sewer line, root barriers must be installed between the tree and the water line or sewer line equipment with a minimum installation of 4 feet deep at five lateral feet from the utility facility.
- (<u>s</u>\*) The permittee, his contractors or subcontractors may not remove locate flags. Locate flags may not be removed from a location while facilities are being constructed.
- (<u>ts</u>) Construction that requires pumping of water or mud shall be contained in accordance with city ordinances and federal and state law and the directives of the city.
- 2. Amend the title of Chapter 28, Article II to read as follows: "Construction in City Right of Way <u>and</u> Pubic Utility Easements."

- 3) implements a process by which an individual may file a complaint with the <u>ROLLINGWOOD POLICE</u> <u>DEPARTMENT</u> if the individual believes that a peace officer employed by the <u>ROLLINGWOOD POLICE</u> <u>DEPARTMENT</u> has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual;
- 4) provides public education relating to the agency's complaint process;
- 5) requires appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the <u>ROLLINGWOOD</u> <u>POLICE DEPARTMENT</u> who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the <u>ROLLINGWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT</u> policy;
- 6) requires collection of information relating to motor vehicle stops in which a warning or citation is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:
  - a. the race or ethnicity of the individual detained;
  - b. whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the individual detained consented to the search;
  - c. whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before detaining that individual:
  - d. whether the peace officer used physical force that resulted in bodily injury during the stop;
  - e. the location of the stop;
  - f. the reason for the stop.
- 7) requires the chief administrator of the agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, to submit an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) to:
  - a. the Commission on Law Enforcement; and
  - b. the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency, if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.


