3. Review of Utility Appeals Process and ordinance

Interim City Administrator Ashley Wayman spoke regarding Assistant to City Administrator Makayla Rodriguez temporarily serving as Utility Billing Manager and about steps of the Utility Appeals Process.

Elizabeth Bray spoke regarding communication issues with Crossroads Utility Services after hours when there is a utility emergency and with the follow up afterwards.

Sam Attal discussed City staff being present or providing documentation when meters are repaired or replaced.

The Utility Commission discussed the utility billing process. Clark Wilson requested that Utility Commission appeal requests be provided on the City website.

4. Discussion regarding discovery of where issues exist with Cellular service in Rollingwood

Council Member Phil McDuffee and the Utility Commission discussed methods for obtaining which areas have Cellular service issues within the City of Rollingwood.

Chair Jonathan Miller discussed results from previous outreach regarding Cellular service issues.

Elizabeth Bray mentioned that this information is available online from the carriers which could be used to determine a baseline understanding before a community survey.

Council Member Phil McDuffee and Elizabeth Bray volunteered to work on finding this baseline understanding.

Receipt of 2021 Consumer Confidence Report as prepared by Crossroads Utility Services

Interim City Administrator Ashley Wayman stated that this water quality report has been posted to our website and delivered to City residents.

The Utility Commission discussed where these water samples are taken and who prepares this report.

The Utility Commission discussed water quality and infrastructure issues, independent testing, and coordination with the City of Austin and Crossroads Utility Services.
