5. Update on the rehabilitation project of Fields 3, 4, and 5

Council Member Kevin Glasheen announced that the rehabilitation project finished and completed a little under budget. Council Member Kevin Glasheen appreciated the effort made from the community. He discussed all the improvements that were made. Mr. Glasheen commended Public Works Field Operator Johnny Coronado for his help and knowledge as well as the rest of Public Works Department.

Council Member Kevin Glasheen explained that there are inconsistencies within parks irrigation system and reached out to a gentleman from City of Austin to make a map of the irrigation as well as recommendations on some improvements that could be made.

Chair Chad Smith thanked Council Member Kevin Glasheen for his attention and improvements in the park. Melissa Morrow also thanked Mr. Glasheen for keeping the park accessible while in the process of completing the project.

6. Discussion and possible action to install additional gate for fields 3, 4, and 5

Council Member Kevin Glasheen discussed the need for a new gate due to the volume of traffic going in and out of the fields, he also discussed that a double gate would reduce traffic in the enclosed field. Council Member Kevin Glasheen explained that RCDC approved the funding for the new double gate.

Agenda Item:

There are two items here.

First item is hiring a landscape architect or other drainage and erosion expert to formulate a plan to address erosion and drainage issues between the upper and lower areas of the park. Said person would create a set of engineering documents defining actions needed to manage drainage and erosion.

Second item is deciding which sections of the trail need to be stabilized to prevent erosion from rainwater flow. Tim Eischen has reviewed the situation with our trail, but no further action has been taken to stabilize the trail where it is eroding.

<u>Agenda Item</u>: Discussion and Action on approval of a Plan to address erosion and drainage between the upper and lower park areas.

This item would approve initial steps for the Commission adopt a plan to address erosion and drainage issues between the upper and lower areas of the park.

The first step would be to adopt a resolution seeking City Council approval at its September meeting for the Park Commission to proceed with steps to interview and recommend the hiring of a landscape architect to prepare an initial assessment of the upper and lower park and trail erosion and drainage conditions, and make recommendations as to options and cost estimates to manage upper and lower park and trail drainage and erosion. If the Council approves the resolution, then the Commission would conduct interviews, define a scope of work, and then go back to the City Council for approval of a scope of work, a recommended landscape architectural firm, and funding for the firm's initial assessment. After review of the firm's initial assessment, the Commission could then recommend to the Council a course of action to address erosion, drainage and trail management, including engineering documents and cost estimates.

Details:

- From conversation with Council member Kevin Glasheen, the drainage and erosion issues can be resolved
- Funding of the remediation is TBD, but cannot go forward without a plan and a good working cost estimate for the work

Actions:

- Seek Council approval to interview and recommend a landscape firm for an initial assessment of erosion, drainage and trail conditions
- Identify and interview landscape architects to work through the design and engineering of this project and determine scope of work, with a cost estimate for this initial assessment

For the work we discussed, I will supply labor, tools, and materials to remove the flat stone in the path and install a drain pipe from the wall to the outside of the path, then relay the stone on the path.

I will prep the ground for approximately seventy (70) linear feet of boulder stones, approximately 2' tall x 18" wide x 44" long and lay the stones.

I will install a French drain the full length of the wall, wrap the pipe with filter cloth then cover with gravel. Demo the stone basket and rebuild it about fifty (50) ft. down the wall, then backfill the wall to grade with sandy loam the full length of the wall. This is for a total of \$31,600.00.
