### CALL COMPREHENSIVE RESIDENTIAL CODE REVIEW COMMITTEE MEETING AND PUBLIC WORKSHOP TO ORDER

1. Roll Call

Chair Dave Bench called the meeting to order at 5:20 p.m.

Present Members: Jeff Marx, Alex Robinette, Dave Bench, and Duke Garwood.

Also Present: City Administrator Ashley Wayman and City Secretary Desiree Adair.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

There were no public comments.

#### **CONSENT AGENDA**

2. Discussion and possible action on the minutes from the August 1, 2023 CRCRC meeting

Duke Garwood moved to approve the minutes from August 1st. Alex Robinette seconded the motion. The motion carried with 4 in favor and 0 against.

#### **REGULAR AGENDA**

3. Discussion and possible action on emails and letters to the CRCRC from 07-28-2023 to 08-30-2023

Chair Dave Bench discussed the email from Genie Nyer.

4. Discussion and possible action on a recommendation for new CRCRC members

Chair Dave Bench discussed three names: Frank Fernandez, Brian Rider, and Jay Van Bavel. He recommended Brian Rider and Jay Van Bavel. All candidates agreed to be kept in reserve in case of another opening on the committee.

Duke Garwood moved to recommend Brian Rider and Jay Van Bavel to the Comprehensive Residential Code Review Committee. Alex Robinette seconded the motion.

The CRCRC discussed when new members could start serving on the CRCRC.

#### The motion carried with 4 in favor and 0 against.

Discussion and possible action regarding the CRCRC process document including an update on Texas Open Meetings Act requirements

Chair Dave Bench tabled this item until later in the meeting.

Chair Dave Bench returned to this item after item 8.

Chair Dave Bench discussed the guiding process document from the agenda packet including topics addressed through 6-30-2023.

The CRCRC discussed cuts, retaining walls, the leveling of lots, and setbacks.

City Administrator Ashley Wayman mentioned an initial survey verification requirement that has been recently passed by City Council.

The CRCRC split up topics of interest between members.

Shanthi Jayakumar, 3309 Park Hills Drive, stated that she felt marketing at Rollingwood Night Out is a good idea.

Jeff Marx left the meeting at 6:30 p.m.

#### The meeting was adjourned at 6:30 p.m.

6. Discussion and possible action regarding survey demographics

Chair Dave Bench discussed the survey demographics document from the agenda packet. He stated that he pulled many of these demographic questions from the previous task force survey. The CRCRC discussed the criteria for who should take the survey.

Shanthi Jayakumar, 3309 Park Hills Drive, spoke regarding inviting adult homeowners to take the survey.

City Administrator Ashley Wayman discussed components of the previous survey.

The CRCRC discussed questions regarding "homeowners" and "head of household", makeup of the household, and the previous survey demographics questions.

The CRCRC discussed authentication of the survey respondents. Jeff Marx discussed solutions for the survey vendor to provide regarding authentication.

7. Discussion and possible action regarding survey logistics and level of active participation by CRCRC members

Chair Dave Bench discussed costs of working with a survey company.

Greg Demas, 2803 Vance, spoke regarding Planning and Zoning Commission involvement including the outreach to the community.

City Administrator Ashley Wayman stated the methods for the distribution of the previous survey.

The CRCRC discussed community outreach and the marketing of the survey. They have a list of residences in Rollingwood from TCAD. Many agreed to help distribute postcards by hand to Rollingwood homes.

8. Discussion regarding Rollingwood Night Out

City Administrator Ashley Wayman discussed Rollingwood Night Out which is typically a public safety event and city staff will be present. There will be food, public safety vehicles, and the landing of a helicopter on September  $12^{th}$  from 6:00-8:00 p.m. Dave Bench will set up a table and have posters. Duke Garwood will be there for the first hour.

Chair Dave Bench returned to Item 5 at this time.

#### **RFO RESPONSE**

Based on the needs outlined in our initial conversation and below, we recommend using SurveyMonkey for the upcoming CRCRC survey. This platform allows us to share, track and analyze data in multiple ways including by individual responses and IP addresses, so we can determine how many times a survey in a single household has been submitted. SurveyMonkey also allows us to upload images throughout the survey, so that the descriptive information and graphics can be included.

We recommend moving forward with the Advantage Annual plan, which is \$468 billed annually and offers the ability to meet all of the following CRCRC requirements:

- Distribute a survey in digital form that can be pulled from a website or pushed via email.
- Determine how many surveys are received from a single household i.e. an audit trail.
- Support for all of the descriptive information and graphics included in the draft survey.
- Collect respondent data into a common file system, so that an individual's responses stay together and a complete set of answers to the 25 questions can be attributed to a single respondent.
- Manually add information from paper surveys.
- Create basic reporting of the results.

In addition to securing the survey service, Buie & Co. would also perform the following activities:

- Survey review, editing and drafting any additional demographic questions 5 hr/\$200
- Uploading survey into SurveyMonkey and sharing raw report data 5 hr/\$200
- Attend CRCRC meetings and advise on community outreach 8 hr/\$200
  - This includes suggestions on messaging, which channels to use for outreach and follow-up, media outreach and follow up.

#### Relaxation of Open Meetings Act for CRCRC

- Any deliberation by a quorum of CRCRC members regarding any matter before the CRCRC and all
  decision-making meetings of the CRCRC will be conducted under the requirements of the Open
  Meetings Act. The CRCRC intends to hold semi-monthly meetings of the full committee under
  the Open Meetings Act, although times may change to better align with committee members'
  availability.
- CRCRC members may participate remotely via Zoom in meetings otherwise conducted under the Open Meetings Act. Members attending by Zoom will count in establishing a quorum.
- A regularly scheduled CRCRC meeting posted under the Open Meetings Act as a public meeting that does not achieve a quorum may be continued as a workshop for the receipt of public comment and for receipt of, and questions regarding, any sub-committee reports posted for the meeting. No action and no deliberation of any matter before the CRCRC shall be permitted in the absence of a quorum of the committee. Such meetings will be remain open to the public throughout the duration of the meeting, will address only items posted publically 72-hours in advance of the meeting, and a video of the meeting will be made publically available.
- Members of the CRCRC in numbers less than a quorum may meet in person or virtually for the purposes of preparing reports or recommendations to the full committee.
- Any report of a subcommittee will be posted on the CRCRC website for public review and comment. Deliberation of and any action on a subcommittee report shall occur in a meeting posted and conducted under the Open Meetings Act.
- CRCRC chair may communicate with any or all CRCRC members via phone or email for the
  purposes of agenda preparation and scheduling of meetings. [Note: This limitation as to agenda
  preparation and scheduling is added here, as otherwise, if the chair were to discuss substantive
  matters or votes with a quorum or more of the members of the committee on any action that
  might be taken by the committee, then the chair could become the vehicle by which a "walking
  quorum" may occur, in violation of the commitment that the committee's deliberation and
  action will occur in a public meeting.]
