4. ADMINISTRATION - DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Activities/Updates/Announcements/Items of Community Interest

A. Update on Police Department Activity - Chief Jonathan Sowell

Chief Sowell introduced Officer Alexis Parnell to the Council. Judge Cox swore in Officer Parnell and Chief Sowell presented her with her San Augustine Police Department badge.

Chief Sowell then gave the update on the police department's activity for the month of September, 2025. Activity included: 20 reports filed, 3 felony arrests, 9 misdemeanor arrests, 2 occasions of assisting other agencies, 303 calls for service answered, 1 juvenile case filed, 2 auto accident reports filed, 25 citations written, 150 warnings issued, and 1 code enforcement case opened.

B. Update on Municipal Court Activity - Judge Jeff Cox

Judge Cox reported the Municipal Court Activity for month of September, 2025. There were 23 citations received, with fines and court costs collected totaling \$1652.00. \$1054.00 was remitted to state, \$598.00 was kept by the City.

Judge Cox reported a correction of \$27.00 added to the monthly total for August.

C. Update on Main Street Program - Shelby Curtis

Mrs. Mosby read the Main Street report. Work is continuing on the Lighted Christmas parade. It is scheduled to start at 6:00 PM with the float lineup beginning at 5:00 PM on Grand, Market, and Planters streets. The theme this year is Classic Christmas movies.

That day before the parade, Texas Music Office Community Relations and Outreach Specialist Gini Mascorro will be presenting the San Augustine Main Street Board with the Music Friendly Texas Certification, which will give Main Street access to singers, bands, performers, etc. from all over the state, and hopefully one day become a venue for musicians.

This Thursday Shelby Curtis will be in Lufkin from 10:00 AM through 1:00 PM attending the Deep East Texas Marketing and Advertisement Cooperative to discuss how to advertise Deep East Texas as a whole region and not just as individual communities.

D. Update on Library Activity - Celeste Rainey

Celeste Rainey reported that the homeschool group is coming every other Monday. She is going to Head Start on Tuesdays and Thursdays, and they are having a Halloween festival on the 28th. She is going to the Broaddus daycare and Broaddus kindergarten class every Wednesday. She has been invited to the Broaddus Career Day on November 14th. Ms. Cary Peterson brought her Chireno 7th and 8th graders to the library to take a tour and get library cards. 42 new library cards were issued to the Broaddus kindergarten kids. The library will be participating in Sassafras this weekend, as well as Trunk or Treat next week. The library will participate in the Christmas parade and share a float with the homeschool group. Tori will be starting Story Time in November at the library.

E. Update from City Manager - Jeaneyse Mosby

Mrs. Mosby reported that flyers were going out with the next wave of bills and provided copies of the flyer, which is for TextMyGov so citizens can receive text alerts related to electric, water, and general issues within the City. She asked that the council help promote the service.

KSA is reducing the bid scale for the culvert project. With the bidding threshold increasing at the 1st of September, bid requests can be sent to different companies instead of being an open process, which should reduce the time taken to complete the procedure.

The preconstruction meeting for the installation of the water lines will be held tomorrow.

Mrs. Mosby thanked Celeste Rainey for attending the Chamber meeting and representing the City well with her Library report there.

There were discussions about the culvert project bids, the revenue report and PCA, and the AMI meters.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN AUGUSTINE, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF A GRANT APPLICATION WITH THE DEEP EAST TEXAS COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS FOR A FY 2026 REGIONAL SOLID WASTE & RECYCLING GRANT PROGRAM GRANT; AUTHORIZING LEROY HUGHES, MAYOR TO ACT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF SAN AUGUSTINE IN ALL MATTERS RELATED TO THE APPLICATION; AND PLEDGING THAT IF A GRANT IS RECEIVED THE CITY OF SAN AUGUSTINE WILL COMPLY WITH THE GRANT ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY AND THE STATE OF TEXAS.

WHEREAS, the Deep East Texas Council of Governments is directed by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality to administer solid waste grant funds for implementation to adopted regional solid waste management plan; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Augustine in the State of Texas is qualified to apply for grant funds under the Request for Applications.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN AUGUSTINE IN SAN AUGUSTINE, TEXAS;

- 1. That Leroy Hughes, Mayor is authorized to request grant funding under the Deep East Texas Council of Governments Request for Applications of the Regional Solid Waste Grants Program and act on behalf of the City of San Augustine in all matters related to the grant application and any subsequent grant contract and grant project that may result.
- 2. That if the project is funded, the City of San Augustine will comply with the grant requirements of the Deep East Texas Council of Governments, Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and the State of Texas.
- 3. The grant funds and any grant-funded equipment or facilities will be used only for the purposes for which they are intended under the grant.
- 4. That activities will comply with and support the adopted regional and local solid waste management plans adopted for the geographical area in which the activities are performed.
