

Tickle Creek Mitigation Project Progress Report, January-June 2025


2025 got off to a busy start. Crews from reforestation contractor Mosaic Ecology treated and removed holly and other weedy trees in January, and finished disposing of material along with spring weed treatments in March and April. Mosaic and AntFarm crews, as well as volunteers at March and April work parties, installed over 10,000 native trees, shrubs, and herbaceous plants throughout restoration areas in the park. Spring survival and growth have been excellent, with abundant wildflowers appearing wherever blackberries were removed. Unfortunately, we suffered a significant setback when unknown vandals uprooted and removed about 500 new plants, along with the slash and debris intended to deter public access, from two trampled areas near Bridge 3 and the playground. We are planning to replant these areas in 2026 along with implementing more forceful measures to keep people out. Maintenance treatments are planned to resume in late summer along with assessments of supplementary planting needs and/or opportunities to revegetate additional areas.
