Terry Noffsinger Highway 491 in San Juan County - Has concerns about the prospect of uniting the Navajo Nation Police and the San Juan County Sheriff's Department. He asked about the cost of the service and liability. He feels that more investigation should be concerned.

Darlene Pino Navajo Nation Delegate - Has concerns about the proposed agenda item regarding the resolution of the cross-deputation.

Maria Terry (Seaton) - She touched base on the funding for the Sheriff's patrolling on the reservation. She referred to the manhunt underway in Navajo Mountain and stated the man they are having issues with down there could come off the reservation and into our cities. Encouraged the county and the Navajo Nation to be good neighbors.

Shirley Peaches Navajo Nation - Feels there is money available for more law enforcement personnel to be equally covered. Stated they put in money into the tax pool and deserve to be equally covered.


