Frank Smith began the meeting of the San Juan County Weed Board at 7:35 am on February 13th, 2025.

He mentioned training at the UWCA conference on Phragmites control which can be applied on the San Juan River. Re: NOTICE TO CONTROL (Pursuant to Utah Code Annotated, §4-17-101, et. seq.)

Dear Landowner:

Noxious Weeds in San Juan County are an ongoing problem and the San County Weed Department enforces the Utah Noxious Weeds Act, Section 4-17-1, *et seq*. Utah Code Annotated (1953, as amended) and accompanying rules.

The San Juan County Weed Department has documented an infestation of noxious weeds on your property parcel 34S26E191800 and 34S26E202400 in San Juan County, UT. The noxious weed of concern in this case is Field Bindweed (Wild Morning Glory).

Pursuant to Utah code you have 5 working days to address this noxious weed issue.

Means of control include definite systems of herbicide application, tilling, cropping or grazing. Please contact me about this weed issue by e-mail at fsmith@sanjuancounty.org or by voicemail or text at 435-419-0034.

If we do not hear from you or someone representing your property about your plans to control this noxious weed infestation within the next **Five Working Days** we will inspect the property again and if no signs of weed control efforts are observed the property will be deemed a **Public Nuisance**. You will then receive a notice of public nuisance in which you will be required to immediately address your noxious weed issue and inform this office of your treatment plan and timeline for the plan.

If the **Public Nuisance** is not addressed the issue will be brought before the weed board and the county may, under the provisions of the Utah Weed Act, enter the property with a county contracted herbicide applicator treat the weeds. The landowner will then be billed for this treatment at a rate 10% higher then the contractors fee as an administrative charge. Failure to pay for the treatment within 90 days will result in a tax lien on the property in question.

Weed Department Report Weed Board Meeting

March 6th, 2025

- Grant submittal for the UDAF grants will begin in mid-March this year. There will be multiple training sessions on both the new grant submittal software and geospatial database program being used for the 2025 grant program. I will be looking for a slight increase from last years grants as I plan to expand the scope of both the San Juan River and Spray Days grants.
- This year I intend to have up to 3 herbicide giveaway events. I am considering one in May, July and September. We have had increasing numbers of people taking advantage of this program and by having 3 events I believe we can reach even more persons with weed problems thus improving and beautifying San Juan County Properties.
- A session at the recent Utah Weed Control Association (UWCA) I attended a session that talked of
 using cattle grazing as an effective means of phragmites control. We do have a significant
 phragmites issue along the San Juan River and I intend to research if it is possible to address this
 using grazing.
- There was a presentation at the UWCA by Logan based member of the USU Extension office. The basic idea of the presentation is that all counties in the state have a USU Extension office and this office can provide resources in support of noxious weed control and weed control education. I intend to start working more closely with our local extension on weed education resources and ideas to improve our weed program.
- San Juan County at one point added Buffalo Bur to our county weed list. I am unaware of any
 significant infestations of Buffalo bur in San Juan County. I will do further research and try to find
 out why the weed was added and if it is time to remove this weed form the list. With the approval
 of the weed board.
