This letter is to support the Grand County Active Transportation and Trails (GCATT) application for a non-motorized RTP grant for the 2022 funding cycle from the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Moab Field Office. GCATT, formerly known as Grand County Trail Mix, has a long history and track record of successfully using RTP grants to establish and maintain a world class mountain bike trail system in Grand County. BLM and Grand County are very proud of this trail system, which is used extensively by the public, including both local residents and visitors.

GCATT seeks funding for the construction of Hawk's Glide and for the Kestrel Run trails, which are extensions of the popular Raptor Route, linking the Whole Enchilada Bike Trail, an alternate and shorter route to the City of Moab. For example, a local restaurant may purchase food supplies from a local wholesaler. *Induced* contributions are the employment and labor income generated because of spending the new household income generated by direct and indirect employment. For example, employees of the restaurant and food supplies wholesaler spend part of their earnings on other locally provided goods and services (e.g., rent, entertainment, groceries for personal consumption, etc.).

*Employment:* A job in IMPLAN = the annual average of monthly jobs in that industry (this is the same definition used by QCEW, BLS, and BEA nationally). Thus, 1 job lasting 12 months = 2 jobs lasting 6 months each = 3 jobs lasting 4 months each. A job can be either full-time or part-time.

*Labor income:* Labor income includes all forms of employment income, including Employee Compensation (wages and benefits) and Proprietor Income.

*Value added:* The difference between an industry's or an establishment's total output and the cost of its intermediate inputs. It equals gross output (sales or receipts and other operating income, plus inventory

change) minus intermediate inputs (consumption of goods and services purchased from other industries or imported).

*Output*: Output represents the value of industry production. In IMPLAN these are annual production estimates for the year of the data set and are in producer prices. For manufacturers this would be sales plus/minus change in inventory. For service sectors output = sales; for retail and wholesale trade, output = gross margin and not gross sales.

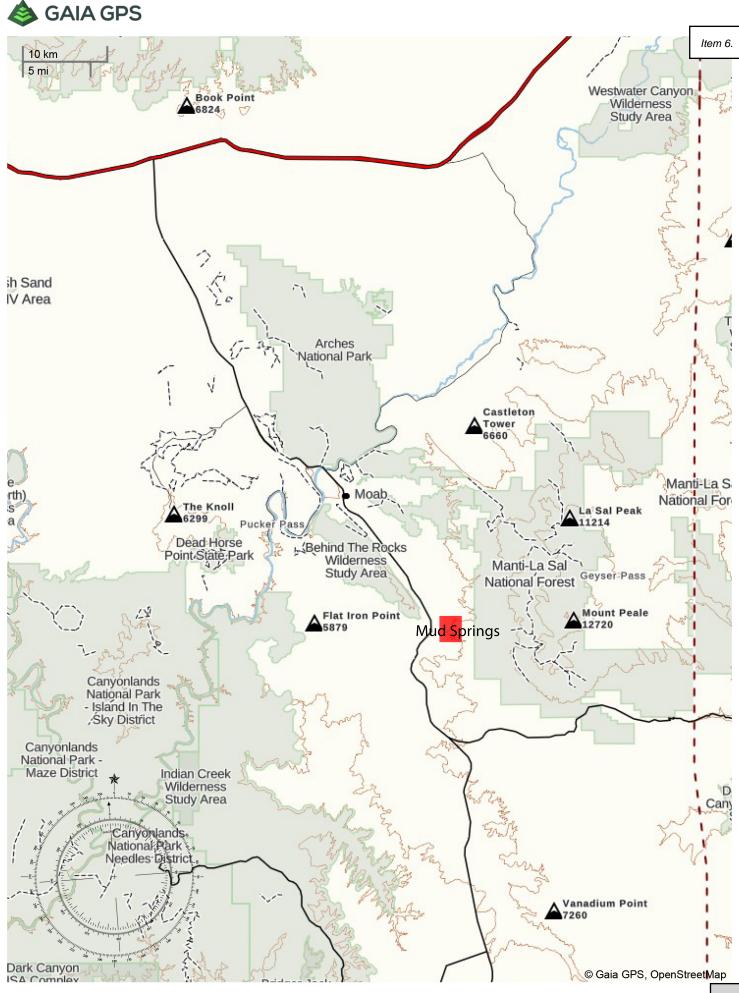

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## Mud Springs Trail Project

- Utah Outdoor Recreation Grant and the Recreational Trails Program annual grants will support this trail project
- The trail will be built following the NICA guidelines
- NICA teams will offer in-kind Building if we follow the guidelines.

## Mud Springs Trail Project

- Encouraging the San Juan County school-age kids to join Mountain Biking.
- Creating a Trails Committee in San Juan County of volunteers to maintain the trails.
- Expanding the San Juan County trail system for residents and for visitors to stay longer in the area.

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## Lodging in San Juan County Spanish Valley

- Currently, our office has identified sixty-six business licenses for overnight rentals in Spanish Valley. The average night stay is \$309.74
- Increasing the occupancy due to the addition of the trail will add \$13.00 per night in TRT.
- Estimated annual occupancy of @60% would produce \$187,902 of TRT, with the addition of the trail increasing the occupancy to 70% would yield \$219,219 in TRT or an increase of \$31,317 of TRT for the first year
- Currently, we have identified three RV Parks in San Juan County, Spanish Valley, with 29 spots. The estimated night is \$100 or \$4.20 per night.
- Estimated occupancy of @60% would produce \$26,674 of TRT. With the addition of the trail increasing the occupancy to 70%, it would yield \$31,119 or an increase of \$4,445 for the first year.

<b>RECOMMENDATION:</b>	Sign comment letter.

#### SUMMARY

BIA proposes to change existing regulations for converting tribal or tribal member ownership of fee lands to trust lands to make the transfer process more efficient, simpler and less expensive. San Juan County has tribally owned fee lands that could potentially be affected by such ownership conversion. The County has no objection to a tribe or tribal individual petitioning for such conversion. But we do have concerns with the impact such conversion to tax-exempt status would have on the county tax base and the challenge to fund continuing government services to such tax-exempt properties. Currently there is no provision in the regulations or proposed changes to compensate a county or local government for the resultant loss of tax revenue. The comment letter proposes two options offered by Duchesne County to remedy such loss. These include a requirement for BIA to make PILT payments or a requirement that the benefitting tribe and local government develop agreement on how to fund continuing county services on the tax exempt lands.

San Juan County, Utah, with nearly 1.3 million acres of tribal reservation lands including fee lands owned by the tribes within the county, has serious concerns with the proposed rule.

Even though San Juan is the largest county in the State with nearly 5.1 million acres, private lands constitute only 8% of the total acreage with the balance predominantly federal and tribal lands (Navajo and Ute Mountain Ute Reservations). These private lands include lands owned by tribes and tribal members which are subject to the proposed rule. This very limited amount of private (fee) lands severely limits our ability to fund government and community services with property tax revenues. Our county population is roughly a 50/50 mix of Native American and Anglo residents. Our school district is the major beneficiary of property tax revenues which are of course used for the education of all residents' children.

Our primary concern with the proposed rule would be the transfer of fee lands to trust lands thereby removing the fee lands from the property tax base of the County. We realize that this type of transfer can be made under current law and regulations. However, current regulations do not provide for any compensation to local governments to offset lost tax revenue resulting from such a transfer.

The proposed rule should be modified to provide for such compensation. We suggest a couple of options:

1. BIA could partly compensate tax revenue losses by making Payment In Lieu of Taxes (PILT) on past and future acquisitions. This modification would require BIA to make PILT payments just as BLM and USFS currently do.

2. If PILT requirements are not added to the proposed rule, it could be revised to include a provision requiring the local government(s) and applicable tribe to negotiate an agreement to continue government services for the newly acquired trust lands. This agreement would identify the services that would continue to be provided and how the tribe would pay its fair share to fund these services. Such agreement should be fully executed and finalized before the trust transfer is made.

San Juan County and Duchesne County, Utah, exhibit somewhat similar land ownership and tax base characteristics. For that reason, we have consulted with Duchesne County and are in agreement with and support Duchesne County's comments on this proposed rule.

We respectfully submit these comments in the spirit of improving the proposed rule to facilitate continued government services for all residents of San Juan County.

<b>RECOMMENDATION:</b>	Make a motion approving the Settlement Participation Forms.

#### SUMMARY

In 2017-2018 a majority of the Counties throughout the State along with the State of Utah and most all other states joined in lawsuits against pharmaceutical companies for the damage caused by Opioid Abuse stemming from pharmaceutical companies actions and to end years of allegedly misleading marketing practices that led people to become addicted to pain medication and, later, heroin and other opiates.

The State of Utah and all other counties in Utah were separately engaged in litigation and other actions seeking to hold the Pharmaceutical Supply Chain Participants accountable for the opioid epidemic. In this, San Juan County contracted with a coalition of other County for legal representation. That representation and attorneys receive a percentage of the settlement award so there was no direct cost in the litigation from the County. Initially as the lawsuit continued and States and Counties continued to deliberate and settle, San Juan County along with Grand County considered continuing the lawsuit in an effort to seek rightful damages caused here in the County after learning that the percentage of settlement damages were not near as what was estimated in total damages caused by opioid abuse in this County. Later on, it was determined that the County needed to join in the settlement after seeing that other Counties in other States were not successful in that effort.

In July of 2022, the County joined in the settlement with all other Counties in the State and the State of Utah in the settlement with Pharmaceutical Supply Chain Participants AmerisourceBergen, Cardinal, McKesson, and Janssen for a total of 288,280.83 in payments made annually ending in 2038. It was estimated that San Juan County has over \$38 Million in damages from Opioid Abuse throughout time.

At present, nearly all of the remaining defendants are engaged in settlement talks with the state, and four settlements are being proposed. As with the prior settlements the County has already joined, the amount the County will recover is dependent upon how many of the counties in the State participate. We anticipate that all of the counties will join.

The Settlement Attorneys have advised that the County join these settlements, as this will be the County's best opportunity to recover from these settling defendants, now that the major players (those involved in the first two settlements) have settled out.

The current Participation Agreements is for the settlement for Teva, Allergan, CVS, Walmart, and Walgreens Opioid Settlements.

Based upon subdivision participation forms received on or before April 18th, the subdivision participation rate will be used to determine whether participation for each deal is sufficient for the settlement to move forward and whether a state earns its maximum potential payment under the settlement. If the settlement moves forward, your release will become effective. If a settlement does not move forward, that release will not become effective.

Any subdivision that does <u>not</u> participate cannot directly share in the settlement funds, even if the subdivision's state is settling and other participating subdivisions are sharing in settlement funds. Any subdivision that does <u>not</u> participate may also reduce the amount of money for programs to remediate the opioid crisis in its state. Please note, a subdivision will not necessarily directly receive settlement funds by participating; decisions on how settlement funds will be allocated within a state are subject to intrastate agreements or state statutes.

You are encouraged to discuss the terms and benefits of the *New National Opioid Settlements* with your counsel, your Attorney General's Office, and other contacts within your state. Many states are implementing and allocating funds for these new settlements the same as they did for the prior opioid settlements with McKesson, Cardinal, Amerisource, and J&J/Janssen, but states may choose to treat these settlements differently.

The Governmental Entity, as a Participating Subdivision, hereby becomes a Releasor for all purposes in the Walmart Settlement, including but not limited to all provisions of Section X (Release), and along with all departments, agencies, divisions, boards, commissions, districts, instrumentalities of any kind and attorneys, and any person in their official capacity elected or appointed to serve any of the foregoing and any agency, person, or other entity claiming by or through any of the foregoing, and any other entity identified in the definition of Releasor, provides for a release to the fullest extent of its authority. As a Releasor, the Governmental Entity hereby absolutely, unconditionally, and irrevocably covenants not to bring, file, or claim, or to cause, assist or permit to be brought, filed, or claimed, or to otherwise seek to establish liability for any Released Claims against any Released Entities the broadest possible bar against any liability relating in any way to Released Claims and extend to the full extent of the power of the Governmental Entity to release claims. The Walmart Settlement shall be a complete bar to any Released Claim.
- 9. In connection with the releases provided for in the Walmart Settlement, each Governmental Entity expressly waives, releases, and forever discharges any and all provisions, rights, and benefits conferred by any law of any state or territory of the United States or other jurisdiction, or principle of common law, which is similar, comparable, or equivalent to § 1542 of the California Civil Code, which reads:

**General Release; extent.** A general release does not extend to claims that the creditor or releasing party does not know or suspect to exist in his or her favor at the time of executing the release that, if known by him or her, would have materially affected his or her settlement with the debtor or released party.

A Releasor may hereafter discover facts other than or different from those which it knows, believes, or assumes to be true with respect to the Released Claims, but each Governmental Entity hereby expressly waives and fully, finally, and forever settles, releases and discharges, upon the Effective Date, any and all Released Claims that may exist as of such date but which Releasors do not know or suspect to exist, whether through ignorance, oversight, error, negligence or through no fault whatsoever, and which, if known, would materially affect the Governmental Entities' decision to participate in the Walmart Settlement.

10. Nothing herein is intended to modify in any way the terms of the Walmart Settlement, to which Governmental Entity hereby agrees. To the extent this Election and Release is interpreted differently from the Walmart Settlement in any respect, the Walmart Settlement controls.

<b>RECOMMENDATION:</b>	Make a motion approving the amendment for an additional 2-year term.

# SUMMARY

Our existing contract for Administrative Law Judge services expires coming up in June 2023. Lyn Creswell as agreed to continue to provide these services for San Juan County at the same rate of \$100 an hour. Our Administrative Hearing and Appeal Process was established with the adoption of Ordinance No. 2020-11 which established the process for appeals with administrative, legislative, and executive decisions which are then appealed through a neutral third-party in accordance with State Code. The process decides matters relating to the violation, enforcement, or administration of the County's civil ordinances related to building code, planning, and zoning, animal control, licensing, health and safety, county employment and sanitation.

# **HISTORY/PAST ACTION**

Lyn has provided Land-Use and Employee Administrative Hearings since 2017 and continues to be the least expensive throughout the entire State.

# FISCAL IMPACT

Having an Administrative Hearings process is actually created to save the County legal fees which would be faced to pay in District Court. This process is created to avoid going directly to District Court after decisions are made at the County Level which can now be appealed to the Administrative Law Judge. The cost is \$100.00 an hour.

#### **Agreement for ALJ Services**

This agreement is entered into effective 1 July 2020 by and between the San Juan County ("County") and Lyn Loyd Creswell ("Creswell") for the purpose of retaining Creswell's services as an appointed Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ").

The County and Creswell agree as follows:

- The County appoints Creswell as its ALJ for cases involving employee appeals or disputes, and for cases involving land use, businesses, and related administrative regulations.
- 2. Creswell will provide the County the ALJ services necessary to comply with the County's obligations under various County ordinances and policies, and with any state and federal laws.
- Creswell may also be requested by the County to recommend or comment upon the creation or drafting of County ordinances and policies which relate to matters which may be appealed to the County ALJ. It is understood that Creswell will not recommend or comment upon County ordinances or policies unless specifically requested by the County.
- 4. The County will compensate Creswell at a rate of \$100.00 per hour for his ALJ services which include time spent for hearings and dispute resolution, conducting hearings or mediation, and preparing orders or findings. The County will also compensate Creswell for the actual cost of travel, lodging, and meals associated with his responsibilities. The County will also compensate Creswell at a rate of \$100.00 per hour for any requested recommendations for or comments about County ordinances or policies which relate to matters which may be appealed to the County ALJ. The County will compensate Creswell for his time spent in researching and drafting responses to requests from the County, and for his time spent in participating in discussions with the County about any requested ordinance or policy changes or additions.
- 5. The County will work with Creswell to schedule hearings or mediations to allow Creswell to arrange his schedule and travel from northern Utah to southern Utah.
- 6. The County will provide support services to fulfill his responsibilities. Such services may also include notices, files, clerical support for hearings, transcribing, and audio recordings of hearings.
- 7. The parties agree that Creswell has 60 days in which to issue any written orders or findings on any hearing he conducts for the County. Failure to issue orders or findings within 60 days will result in no payment being made to Creswell for any of his services and reimbursement of any payments already made for services or travel.

- 8. In order to perform his duties under this agreement, Creswell will maintain his status as a licensed attorney in the State of Utah and will maintain proficiency in the areas of employment and land use law. The County agrees to reimburse Creswell for registration costs only (not travel, lodging or other expenses) up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000) annually for continuing legal education relating to land use and employment law.
- 9. The relationship of Creswell to the County under this agreement is that of "independent contractor." No relationship of employee, agent, or servant of the County is created by this agreement. Accordingly, no benefits will be paid and no Internal Revenue Service withholdings will be made by the County from payments made for Creswell's services.
- 10. This agreement will terminate on 30 June 2023.
- 11. Creswell will invoice the County for services provided under this agreement. Payment by the County shall be due within 30 days of receiving the invoice.
- 12. This is the entire agreement of the parties. It may not be modified except in writing signed by the parties.

10. This Agreement will terminate on 30 June 2025.
