NEW BUSINESS

2. Santaquin Senior programs update given by Senior Coordinator Miller. Programs offered include inclusive welcome feel, meals on Tuesday and Thursday, Field trips, Health Fairs, Special Events like Kentucky Derby. Additional programs include fitness classes, arts and craft classes and chair volleyball.
3. Director Bradley reviewed the Spring Activity Guide on the City website.
4. Board Member McGary recently attended an America 250 planning meeting.
Potential community program ideas included:
 - a. Art Show as part of 2026 Orchard Days (theme based)
 - b. Essay Contest as part of 2026 Orchard Days (theme based)
 - c. Quilt show as part of 2026 Orchard Days (theme based)
 - d. Parade as part of 2026 Orchard Days (theme based)
 - e. Walk 250 Utah Challenge culminating by July 2026
 - f. Museum-Research descendants of the Revolutionary War
 - g. Recognize all the service given-root beer floats. Partner with My Hometown Santaquin.
 - h. Elementary Schools/ youth involvement with the Art and Essay contests.
5. Director Bradley reviewed the Get Healthy Utah recertification process and goals for Healthy Santaquin.

6. Board Focus areas. Board Member Nilson requested a list of potential program areas to be emailed out to the Board. These are focus areas that members can volunteer additional time.
7. Director Bradley brainstormed with Board Members some names for future Recreation Building and Parks. Key recommendations:
 - a. Make sure sites can be pinned on Google Maps so people can find.
 - b. Seek identification for City amenities.
 - c. Make sure names reflect the community and public can identify with.
