### Minutes

**COMMITTEE MEMBERS PRESENT:** Terri Davis, Ron Jones

**OTHERS PRESENT:** Community Services Director John Bradley

#### WELCOME

Minutes approved April (meeting) and July (No meeting held). Motion by Committee Member Jones and seconded by Committee Member Davis.

#### NEW BUSINESS

1. Reviewed the process of getting a new committee member. Multiple names have been given to Mayor Olson to review and select a replacement.
2. Historic Sites and Historic Homes booklets were discussed. It is anticipated that on a future date we will create another Historic booklet. It could be another version of either of those or be a Historic Memories/Stories type of booklet. Funding could be acquired thru a future CLG grant.
3. It was also discussed that the city could look at providing plaques at various historic locations that are either still standing or are no longer standing. Permission from homeowners would need to be secured. Pricing for plaques and stands to be determined. Director Bradley committed to do some research and have some information by the next Committee Meeting.
  - a. A work meeting could be scheduled in November to determine locations to highlight for a future booklet or plaque locations. Committee member Davis committed to set that meeting up.
4. America 250 Celebration will take place in 2026. Director Bradley reminded that our nation will be preparing for 250-year-old celebration of our constitution. There will be opportunities for Santaquin to participate in events and programs. Potential community program ideas included:
  - a. Art Show as part of 2026 Orchard Days (theme based)
  - b. Essay Contest as part of 2026 Orchard Days (theme based)
  - c. Quilt show as part of 2026 Orchard Days (theme based)
  - d. Parade as part of 2026 Orchard Days (theme based)
  - e. Walk 250 Utah Challenge culminating by July 2026
  - f. Museum-Research descendants of the Revolutionary War
  - g. Museum-General display for Constitution
  - h. Give out special collector pins with the Utah/Santaquin 250 logo
  - i. Recognize all the service given-root beer floats. Perhaps partner with My Hometown
  - j. Elementary Schools/ youth involvement
  - k. Miss Santaquin Royalty involvement
  - l. America's Potluck- neighborhoods host their own potlucks with neighbors in July 2026
  - m. Consider community quilt or other artwork to be placed in City Hall hallway

The next step would be to have City Council pass a resolution. That way our working committee could apply for State of Utah grant funds to help with the programs/events.

Additionally, Community Services Board could brainstorm 250 activities in their November meeting and then a joint Historic Preservation and Community Services Board meeting could be held in January 2026.
