### **BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS:**

Quarterly Benchmarks from the Fire Department for the period commencing October 1, 2022 and ending December 31, 2022, is presented for information and discussion as required by section 50-564 of the Municipal Code.

# **STAFF COMMENTS:**

Highlights are as follows:

- Fourth Quarter
  - Overlapping call percentage reached 62%
  - Over 100 more inspections were completed than in Fourth Quarter of 2021
  - There was a slight drop in Rescue & EMS calls between this quarter and the previous
- Year-to-Date
  - Call volume is 521 incidents higher than in 2021
  - Of that, Rescue & EMS calls were 337 calls higher than in 2021
  - o Fire inspections reached an all-time high as a result of positive changes to the program
  - Station tours were almost double of 2021 due to covid restrictions being scaled back
  - Fire training increased by 1,298 hours

The goal of achieving a 90% fire response efficiency continues to become more difficult to achieve. With the increase in call volume, number of overlapping incidents also increase.

# **BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS:**

The Quarterly Report of Benchmarks for the Police Department for the Period commencing October 1, 2022 and ending December 31, 2022 is presented for information and discussion as required by section 54-65 of the Municipal Code.

# **STAFF COMMENTS:**

Highlights of the report are as follows:

- Part 1 Crime: Part 1 crime year to date was flat in comparison to the same period in 2021 and a decrease in comparison to 2020 (852 vs. 841 and 973).
- Traffic accidents year to date (1418 vs. 1365 and 1340) increased slightly in comparison to 2021 and 2020.
- Involuntary commitments were relatively flat year to date in comparison to the same period in 2021 and there is an increase in comparison to 2020 (138 vs. 144 and 101).
