LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made this _____ day of April, 2023, by and between the City of Sheboygan, Wisconsin, a municipal corporation of the State of Wisconsin, hereinafter referred to as "LESSOR," and David L. Gartman, LLC, 5509 Moenning Road, Sheboygan, WI 53081, hereinafter referred to as "LESSEE."

IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE LESSOR AND THE LESSEE:

1. That the **LESSOR** does hereby lease and let unto the **LESSEE** approximately 193 acres of tillable land located within certain agricultural property described as follows:

All parcels are located in Section 10, Township 14 North, Range 23 East, City of Sheboygan and Town of Wilson, Sheboygan County, Wisconsin. The 193 acres of tillable land does not include the non-farmable areas that include yards and buildings which are the subject of a separate Residential Rental Agreement.

- 2. That the term of this lease shall be for the period from April 1, 2023 through March 31, 2024.
- 3. That the rental rate for the parcels being leased by **LESSEE** of land for the period from April 1, 2023 through March 31, 2024 shall be at the rate of one-hundred fifteen (\$115.00) dollars per acre, for a total of Twenty-two Thousand One Hundred Ninety-five and 00/100 Dollars (\$22,195.00), which shall be due and payable at the City of Sheboygan Finance Department located at 828 Center Avenue, Sheboygan, Wisconsin, on the 31st day of March, 2024.

- 4. That the **LESSEE** shall use the land only for agricultural purposes and that no other type of use is permitted thereon.
- 5. That the **LESSEE** agrees that the **LESSOR** may, at reasonable and proper times, and upon reasonable notice, enter upon the leased property whenever it is deemed to be in the public interest.
- 6. That the **LESSEE** shall save, protect and conserve the land to the best of his ability and commit no waste thereon.
- 7. The **LESSEE** hereby agrees that he will not assign, sublease, or otherwise grant or permit any other person to use the land for any purpose whatsoever.
- 8. The **LESSEE** agrees to make no improvements of any kind whatsoever in or on the land.
- 9. The **LESSEE** hereby agrees that he will not encumber the land or crops growing thereon.
- 10. **LESSEE** shall not erect, install, operate or allow same, in or upon the land, any signs or other similar advertising devices without first having obtained the **LESSOR'S** written consent therefor.
- 11. **LESSOR** may construct, install and operate one (1) sign on said premises identifying said property.
- 12. The parties acknowledge that the property is being actively marketed for sale by **LESSOR**. **LESSOR** may remove from the total acreage leased any part thereof upon at least seven (7) months written notice to **LESSEE**, and **LESSOR** shall not pay any damages for such taking of property from the **LESSEE**.
- 13. **LESSOR** shall be responsible for any and all taxes upon said land.
- 14. **LESSEE** shall save **LESSOR** harmless from any loss, cost or damage that may arise out of or in connection with this lease or the use of said premises by **LESSEE**, his agents, employees or any other person using said premises.
- 15. In the event the **LESSEE** shall become bankrupt or insolvent, or should a trustee or receiver be appointed to administer the **LESSEE'S** business, neither this lease nor any interest herein shall become an asset of such trustee or receiver, and, in the event of the appointment of any such trustee or receiver, this lease shall immediately terminate and end.

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- 16. Waiver by the **LESSOR** of any default in performance by the LESSEE of any of the terms, covenants, or conditions contained herein, shall not be deemed a continuing waiver of the same or any subsequent default herein.

BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS: There are existing stop signs at the intersection of S. 22nd Street and David Avenue which requires all eastbound and westbound traffic at this intersection to stop. Due to this intersection's close proximity to Madison School the Department of Public Works is recommending adding stop signs that will require all southbound and northbound traffic to also stop at this intersection, creating a four way stop at this intersection.

STAFF COMMENTS: The Department of Public Works recommends placing stop signs at the northwest corner and southeast corner of S. 22nd Street and David Avenue.

ACTION REQUESTED: Motion to recommend the Common Council adopt Gen. Ord. No. 31-22-23 placing stop signs at the northwest corner and southeast corner of S. 22nd Street and David Avenue.

AN ORDINANCE placing stop signs at the northwest corner and southeast corner of S. $22^{\rm nd}$ Street and David Avenue.

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHEBOYGAN DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to Section 118-51 of the Municipal Code entitled "Erection of Official Signs," stop signs shall be added requiring southbound and northbound traffic on S. 22^{nd} Street to stop at the intersection of S. 22^{nd} Street and David Avenue.

Section 2. The Department of Public Works and the Police Department are hereby authorized and directed to add the signs to give notification of the aforementioned change.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and this ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage and publication.

Dear Resident:

The City of Sheboygan Department of Public Works is asking for your support in controlling and reducing the wild turkey population in your neighborhood. The City has received concerns from several residents in your neighborhood about the large number of wild turkeys and have witnessed them becoming aggressive and destructive to landscaping and property.

The City has contacted the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and United States Department of Agriculture Fish and Wildlife Services to help with this concern. The City met on-site with a representative and witnessed the wild turkeys in backyards of neighborhood residences. The turkeys were used to the area and people, and not overly concerned with our presence. According to the Fish and Wildlife representative, they have become very comfortable with the area.

Other observations were: the neighborhood has good habitat nearby for the turkeys to shelter and populate without many predators. Many homes have bird feeders which can be good source of food. Prior to any physical options to remove or reduce the number of turkeys, non-invasive methods must be attempted, so we are asking for the entire neighborhood to cooperate and work together to help with managing the turkeys.

The first thing we need is the neighborhood to remove all potential sources of food. This means removing all bird feeders and not storing feed outside. In addition, please pickup any fruit or nuts from trees in your yard. It also means no feeding or placing food for the turkeys to eat. Once this food source is removed, the turkeys should begin to slowly move onto other areas, away from the neighborhood.

Second, start to discourage the turkeys or not make them comfortable. This can be done by erecting fencing or hazards to further discourage the turkeys from entering your yard. Consider placing decoys that discourage turkeys. Attached to this letter is additional detailed information on managing wild turkeys. These activities have been successful in other areas similar to your neighborhood. We need everyone to help and cooperate.

920/459-3440 FAX 920/459-3443 According to State and Federal representatives we are working with, all non-invasive means must be used and tried prior to any consideration of other physical methods, like capture and removal of the turkeys. Even with that said, the location – neighborhood residences in close proximity to one another will make this option highly unlikely, especially with the large number of turkeys in the area. As a result, we are again, asking for the neighborhood's cooperation and commitment to discouraging the turkeys in order to encourage them to move away from this area.

Subject: Wild Animal Control

Mr. Heidemann,

As my District 10; Ward 20 Alderman, I am writing to make you aware of the wild animal problems we are experiencing here along the west end of Sommer Drive in Sheboygan.

Specifically, I am referring to the extreme number of deer and turkey currently overtaking our neighborhood. It is not unusual to have 20-30 turkey at a time in our back yard and have counted 40+ on occasion. It is also not unusual to have 10-15+ deer at a time in our backyard. I see similar numbers of animals as I drive east on Sommer Drive. This is an entire neighborhood problem.

The sheer number of animals present destroy property and leave behind unsanitary conditions. We can't do planting in our landscapeing because the deer eat whatever we plant. We can't enjoy our backyards because of the amount of deer and turkey droppings left behind. The deer and turkey destroy our lawn due to their foraging.

Wildlife has always been present in our neighborhood but not to the extent that it is now. It has become unreasonable and we feel something needs to be done.

Contributing greatly to this problem are people who feed the wildlife. I have a neighbor who feeds the wildlife twice daily in both her front and back yard showing no courtesy or consideration as to the issues her actions are causing her neighbors.

Last fall Sheboygan Public Works Director David Biebel distributed a letter to our entire neighborhood (see attachment) asking people to refrain from feeding the wild turkey. This has not had the intended effect, as I still witness this happening every day. Feeding deer is not only a Sheboygan ordinance violation it is also against state law. Feeding deer increases the risk of CWD spreading amongst the deer herd.

Years ago when the deer herd got too large it was thinned. Now we have the same problem not only with deer but also with turkey. We are asking that something be done to bring these numbers down and also to stop people from attracting animals by feeding them. Action needs

to be taken and there needs to be consequences for people who disregard the law and continue to feed and atttract wildlife to the detriment of their neighbors.
