BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS: Sheboygan Fire Station #4 was constructed in 1990. The windows in the fire station are original to the building and are no longer weathertight or energy efficient. The windows specified are constructed of fiberglass and have a high energy efficiency rating, as well as, being virtually maintenance free. In addition, the current window sills are constructed of high-pressure laminate and will be replaced with those constructed of a solid surface material.

STAFF COMMENTS: The City issued a Request for Bids #2033-23 for the work. A total of two (2) bids were received. The low bid received from Mike Koenig Construction, Inc. of Sheboygan has been determined to meet all of the specifications.
