BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS:

The Quarterly Report of Benchmarks for the Police Department for the Period commencing July 1, 2022 and ending September 30, 2022 is presented for information and discussion as required by section 54-65 of the Municipal Code.

STAFF COMMENTS:

Highlights of the report are as follows:

- Part 1 Crime: There was an increase in violent crime year to date in comparison to the same period in 2021 and 2020 (119 vs.104 and 110) and an increase in property crime in comparison to 2021 and a decrease in comparison to 2020 (542 vs.496 vs. 662). The increase in violent crime is related to the increase in assaults reported in 2022 in comparison to the same period in 2021 and 2020 (86 vs. 70 vs.81). The largest increase occurred in the schools.
- Traffic accidents: There was an increase in year to date (1,055 vs. 1,039) in comparison to 2021. There is also an increase in traffic stops and arrests in 2022 vs. 2021.
- Involuntary commitments were relatively flat year to date in comparison to the same period in 2021 but up compared to 2020 (105 vs. 107 and 80).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Joint Powers Agreement - Sheboygan County and City of Sheboygan 911 Emergency Systems, effective for calendar year 2023, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT SHEBOYGAN COUNTY AND CITY OF SHEBOYGAN 911 EMERGENCY SYSTEMS

WHEREAS, Sheboygan County and the City of Sheboygan have each implemented an Emergency 911 System for the purposes of providing emergency services to residents and visitors of these municipalities, including fire fighting, law enforcement, ambulance, medical and other emergency services; and

WHEREAS, Sec. 256.35(9), Wis. Stats., "Joint Powers Agreement," requires that in implementing 911 systems as has been done by both Sheboygan County and the City of Sheboygan, municipalities shall annually enter into a Joint Powers Agreement, which Agreement shall be applicable on a daily basis and which shall provide that if an emergency services vehicle is dispatched in response to a request through either the Sheboygan County 911 System or the City of Sheboygan 911 System, such vehicle shall render its services to the persons needing the services, regardless of whether the vehicle is operating outside the vehicle's normal jurisdictional boundaries.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, agreements and conditions contained herein, it is hereby jointly agreed between Sheboygan County and the City of Sheboygan as follows:

- 1. That effective January 1, 2023, this Agreement shall, thereafter, be applicable on a daily basis from said date through December 31, 2023.
- 2. That if an emergency services vehicle operated by either Sheboygan County or the City of Sheboygan, or operated by an agency with which either municipality contracts for that particular emergency service, is dispatched in response to a request through the Sheboygan County emergency 911 System or the City of Sheboygan 911 System, such vehicle (whether owned and operated by the municipality or by the agency) shall render its services to the persons needing the services, regardless of whether the vehicle is operating outside the vehicle's normal jurisdictional (or as defined by contract) boundaries.

BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS:

Quarterly Benchmarks from the Fire Department for the period commencing July 1, 2022 and ending September 30, 2022 is presented for information and discussion as required by section 50-564 of the Municipal Code.

STAFF COMMENTS:

Highlights are as follows:

- Year-to-date call volume is 560 incidents higher than in 2021
- Rescue & EMS calls increased by 10%
- Fire inspections completed continue to increase due to enhanced training, follow-up and communication with property owners. Year-to-date count is 387 inspections higher than in 2021.
- This quarter the department began reporting property saved to highlight the total pre incident value less total loss.
- Both public events and station tours continue to increase in an effort to increase public engagement
- The goal of achieving a 90% fire response efficiency continues to become more difficult to achieve. With the increase in call volume, number of overlapping incidents also increase. This requires units to respond from outside of their district or once their current call clears.
