REPORT DATE: January 19, 2023

The Quarterly Report of Benchmarks for the Police Department for the Period commencing October 1, 2023 and ending December 31, 2023 is presented for information and discussion as required by section 30-50 of the Municipal Code.

STAFF COMMENTS:

Highlights of the report are as follows:

- Part 1 Crime: There is a decrease in Part 1 crime year to date in comparison to the same period in 2022 (856 vs.888). Crimes against persons was flat (177 vs. 176) and a decrease in crimes against property (679 vs. 712).
- Traffic accidents year to date (1,390 vs.1,418) are down slightly in comparison to 2022.
- There is a decrease in involuntary commitments year to date in comparison to the same period in 2022 (110 vs. 138).

BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS:

Quarterly Benchmarks from the Fire Department for the period commencing October 1, 2023 and ending December 31, 2023 is presented for information and discussion as required by section 24-459 of the Municipal Code.

STAFF COMMENTS:

Highlights of 2023 are as follows:

- Total call volume was down slightly as compared to the previous year; However, the total call volume has increased over the past 5 years (Up 15.8% from 2019).
- Fire calls for the year remained under 90.
- Fire inspections decreased slightly due to property owners correcting violations which is expected to be a future trend.
- Fire training hours saw a major increase to over 17,000 training hours as a result of an increased focus on training and enhanced software reporting (much fire training was previously missed in recording).
- Fire average response time reached 86% of calls with response in 380 seconds or less.
