Mayor Norby called the regular meeting of the Sidney City Council to order at 6:30pm.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

The Pledge of Allegiance was stated by all present.

3. Aldermen Present

6. Public Hearing

a. Transportation Alternative Grant Project

Mayor Norby called the public hearing for the Transportation Alternative Grant Project to order at 6:34pm.

City Planner Sanderson stated the planning project recommendation is from an issue that arouse during a zone change meeting that year. He stated the community brought up a serious safety issue on 22nd Ave NW because it is substandard and needs to be upgraded by being widened and adding a bike/walk path. He stated with the residential and the school property in the area impacts these safety concerns and they need to me mitigated to make this road safer. He stated in the Capital Improvement Process the bike path adjacent to 22nd Avenue NW was put as top priority. He stated because of the cost of the project, a transportation grant is an option and Glendive received this grant for just under \$1 million for a similar project, with the TA Grant funding up to 87% of the project. He stated part of that grant process is showing a need, which we have through the previous meetings and CIP, but we are also required to ask if 22nd Avenue is the right project or if there is another project that has a greater need. He stated instead of proponent or opposed, we are also looking for a supplementary project if 22nd is not the project recommended.

Mayor Norby called for any proponents, three times, with the following coming forward:

Ryleigh Kleinke stated she lives in the North Meadow Subdivision and runs both track and cross county with her runs including 22nd Avenue. She stated the narrow shoulder, 35 mph speed limit, and drivers not paying attention contribute to a huge safety issue. She stated that road is used by pedestrians for numerous reasons and there is no other options than the shoulder until bike path.

James Netzer stated he lives on Sage Lilly drive and he is in favor of the 22nd Avenue project that will be a benefit to the community. He stated he did a petition 8 years ago for same project and got 118 signatures with just a small push of going door to door in that neighborhood and he got a large turnout. He stated this would be a great benefit as he would like to bike ride into town safely and all residents will benefit with bike path and walk to dog park. He stated this will provide peace of mind for children going to pool and he feels there is more support than people realize.

Troy Jenson stated he lives in South Meadow Subdivision and owns property on 22nd Avenue. He stated he is a proponent for this project as it is important for community and area. He stated it will benefit the entire area and at other meetings he understands the challenges for the expenses and issues on 22nd and therefore is in favor of this project.

Janelle Jensen stated she lives in South Meadow Subdivision and travels 22nd Avenue 4 times a day minimum and there is always people walking for exercise, biking, children going to and

from school and sees the hazard for pedestrians. She stated she highly encourages this grant and project as it will be a safe measure for neighborhood and citizens of Sidney.

Megan Garza stated she is the Treasurer of the local run club that runs on bike path year round. She stated any addition the the bike path would awesome as well as pedestrian access on 22nd Avenue leading to the Softball field and dog park for children and walking/running. She stated the run club includes 10 to 30 people and avoid this area because no path especially if more than one person is running at a time.

Sean Riordan stated he does not live up 22nd Avenue, rather he lives next to the high school, but he does get his hair cut over there and has flown commercial drones int the area and has biked or road his one wheel on the shoulder of 22nd Avenue. He stated the shoulder is only loose gravel so you have to be careful on turns or you will spin out. He stated the truck traffic that pedestrians have to keep eye on also causes concerns and this project will add a lot of safety.

Zach Sverdrup stated he has and does Coach Softball and play adult softball and feels safety is a great aspect for adding this project. He stated safety of kids trumps but added benefit of extension to the current paths, but he feels any additional sidewalks added to the community is great.

Gary Schoepp stated he lives on 22nd Avenue and feels this would be a wonderful project to get done and hopes it can get as far up hill as possible.

Chief Kraft stated he seconds what everyone else has stated as a previous resident of the South Meadow area and the pedestrian traversing is a safety issue. He stated as the Chief of Police and in interest of public safety, this project addresses safety to the highest level and he does not feel there is any other project that would mitigate a safety issue as this one would.

Clerk/Treasurer Chamberlin stated the following people submitted testimony in support of the TA Grant and the project being the 22nd Avenue Bike Path Extension: Haralson Family on Red River Drive, Madison and Ben Miller, Garth Kallevig and Con Donovan.

Mayor Norby called for any opponents, three times, with none coming forward.

Mayor Norby closed the public hearing at 6:49pm.

Chief Kraft stated he seconded what City Attorney Kalil sated and that the Police Department is pleased with the work done.

1. New Business

a. Ace Hardware Variance Request

Chair Jones called the public hearing for the Ace Hardware (King and King LLC) to order 8:02am. The property is located at Lot 6A, Block 1 of the Amended Plat of Augustus Vaux Subdivision.

Chair Jones called for any proponents, three times with the following coming forward:

Reece Gairrett stated he is the manager of Ace Hardware and they are wanting the fenced in area for the garden center with driving in and out access, and the height is for security. He stated it will be a black chain link fence but he is not sure if it will have a security top. PWD Hintz asked if the posts will be moved on the north side out of the right-of-way and Mr. Gairrett stated they will be coming in 6 feet more and they were mistakenly placed there. FM/BI Rasmussen stated Troy Jensen has marked property lines. Mr. Seitz asked if this will affect truck traffic in back and FM/BI Rasmussen stated he and PWD Hintz looked at the sight triangle and it shouldn't, PWD Hintz stated as long as they don't stack items 8 foot high in those corners. Mr. Seitz asked if that is paved and Mr. King stated it is paved now.

Skip King stated they have been having theft issues already for outside lawn care area. Mr. Jones asked if the propane tank moved within the fence and Mr. King stated no and that it meets code once they have bollards around it. PWD Hintz asked why there and not inside the fence and FM/BI Rasmussen stated they would have to open the fence for users and maintain inside fence during winter months and they can't bring tanks through store. Mr. Gairrett stated they want to fill RV's also. Mr. Kings stated it is more visible in the parking lot but they

will be protecting as much as possible. He stated they have it this way at other stores for more ease for customers including RV's pulling up.

Clerk/Treasurer Chamberlin stated John Reynolds called in as a proponent stating he and Fox Run are in favor of the variance. He stated in the grand scheme of things this is a small request and a net nothing. He testified that he hopes Sidney is pro-business and development and that Ace Hardware is a huge and high-quality contribution to the community and Fox Run and they are absolutely in favor of it.

Chair Jones called for any opponents with none coming forward.

Chair Jones closed the public hearing at 8:11am.

Motion was made to approve the variance with condition that north section is moved off right-ofway.

In discussion Mr. Smith asked if Public Works is ok with this and PWD Hintz stated they are. He then asked if FM/BI Rasmussen is ok with this and he stated he will be abstaining from giving a formal recommendation due to his son working at this store but he is available for technical questions.

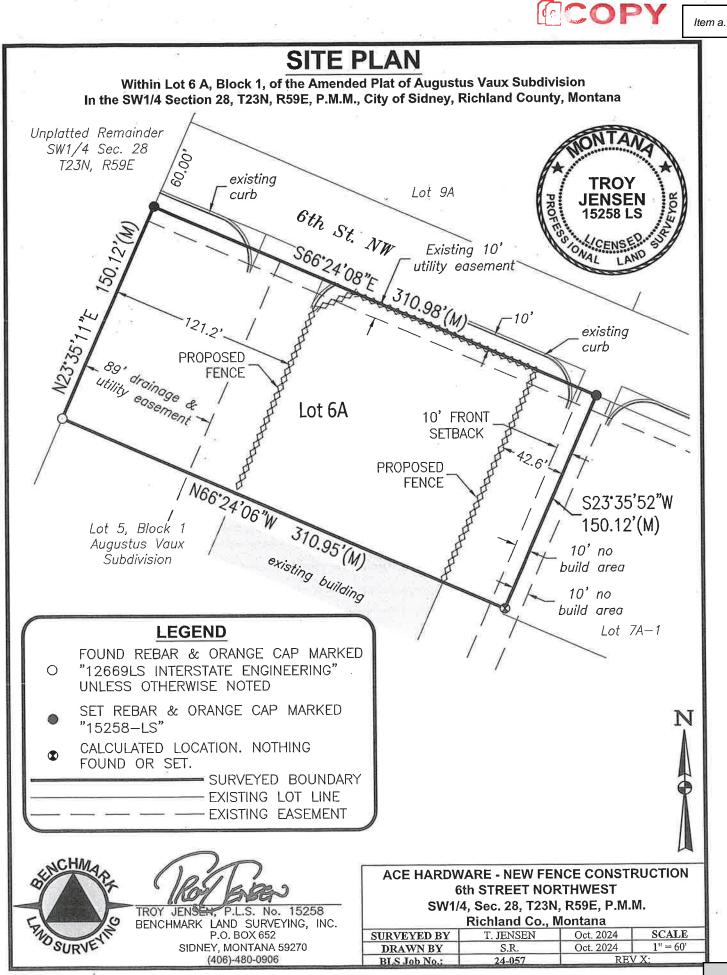

- 1. We request to take the allowed fence from 6ft to 8ft tall to make the area more secure from theft. In the current zone a building is allowed to be built to the property line up to 50ft tall.
- 2. 8 ft fence would help detour theft. This would allow us to put more merchandise in the lot with the reduced chance of theft.
- 3. This fence would help reduce theft. The Sidney store has had things that were on top of a conex storage container that were attempted to be stolen in the recent past. We believe that a 8ft fence would be proper deterrent.
- 4. This would allow Ace to bring more products to the Sidney Store, and be stored in a safer environment.
- 5. With the fence more products would be available for sale.
- 6. This would also add some parking in front of the fence.
- 7. We feel that a variance would be consistent with the ordinance.

Dear Rick and Jessie:

We understand the City of Sidney, Montana (the "City") intends to borrow funds to pay a portion of the costs of replacing the City's water tower and related improvements (the "Project") within the City's water system (the "System"). It is anticipated that the City would obtain financing for the Project from the State's Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Loan Program (the "Program"). We would be pleased to serve as bond counsel in connection with the issuance by the City of its Water System Revenue Bond (DNRC Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Loan Project. The purpose of this letter is to outline the services we would provide and give a cost estimate of our services.

As bond counsel our principal function is to render an opinion with respect to the authorization and issuance of the Bond. The opinion is rendered in written form at the time the Bond is delivered to the Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (the "DNRC"). The opinion addresses three basic matters:

- 1. the validity of the Bond, based upon the proceedings taken in its authorization and issuance;
- 2. certain matters relating to the security for the payment of the Bond; and
- 3. the exemptions from current federal and state income taxation of the interest payable on the Bond.

In fulfilling that function and responsibility, we will perform the following tasks:

1. prepare the bond resolution and the Bond and review proceedings of the City relating to other outstanding bonds and notes charged for the use and availability of the System, if any;

- 2. coordinate with the City Clerk, or other designated officer, the adoption of the resolution and other actions necessary to be taken by the governing body of the City;
- 3. assist the City with resolutions and ordinances establishing rates and charges;
- 4. advise the City of the statutory requirements for the issuance of the Bond and the Program rules for the purchase of the Bond by the Program;
- 5. prepare closing papers for the City and supervise closing on the Bond; and
- 6. deliver the opinion discussed above to the City and the DNRC.

The fee for our services is a function of the size of the bond issue and the amount of time expended. Based on one bond in an estimated principal amount of approximately \$5,000,000, we estimate our fee to be approximately \$20,000 to \$30,000, plus out-of-pocket disbursements. We would expect to be paid at the time of closing on the Bond. Our fees are eligible costs of the Project and can be included in the amount of the Bond, if the City intends to use that source. It is mutually understood that the services set forth in this letter are solely for the benefit of the City.

If during the course of our work on this issue we discover anything that would cause our fees to exceed this estimate, we will notify the City.

You should be aware that we have served as bond counsel to the State of Montana (the "State") with respect to establishing the Program and the issuance of the State's general obligation bonds to fund the Program. As bond counsel for the City's Bond, we would not represent the State or the DNRC in the negotiation of the terms of the Bond, the bond resolution, or other aspects of the proposed financing. At this point, the terms of the financing have been established in the approved Program documents and regulations and our principal task is to draft a bond resolution that conforms to these requirements and the terms of the commitment agreement or commitment letter that will be prepared by the DNRC (the "Commitment Agreement"). (In advising the City of the statutory and other legal requirements for the issuance of the Bond, in accordance with provisions of the Commitment Agreement and statutory provisions and Program requirements, we can advise the City with respect to the legal implications of the covenants in the Commitment Agreement or statutes or Program requirements that would be contained in the bond resolution.) Accordingly, we do not anticipate that our acting as bond counsel to the State with respect to the Program will represent any practical impediment to our acting as bond counsel to the City with respect to the Bond; and, in fact, we believe our familiarity with the Program could be an advantage to the City in completing its proceedings efficiently.

As bond counsel to the State and the Program, however, we are available to the State, and we would intend to respond to questions raised by the DNRC regarding requirements of the Program, the operative documents relating to the State's bonds and the legal issues relating to the type of obligation being purchased by the Program to evidence the Program loan, in this case a revenue bond. behalf of either the State or the City, but to respond in our capacity as bond counsel with respect to the State's outstanding bonds. While we would attempt to render independent advice, the potential for a conflict of interest or the appearance of a conflict of interest is present. The State has consented to our acting as bond counsel for the City's Bond.

We hope that this proposal to serve as bond counsel on this financing meets with the approval of the City. If there are any questions, please give us a call so that we might answer those questions or provide any additional information about our firm or our qualifications to serve the City in this capacity. Please let us know what you would like for us to do.

We trust that our serving as bond counsel to the City and as bond counsel to the State with respect to the Program is acceptable to the City. If so, will you please so acknowledge by signing the attached acknowledgment and returning a copy to us.
